This letter confirms our previous oral advice that would not violate the Geneva Convention. Based on the information you have provided, we have determined that the second is not a "protected person" and that his would accordingly not violate the Convention. We have further determined that even if the were a "protected person," his the would not constitute a prohibited "deportation" or "transfer" within the meaning of Article 49 or Article 147 of the Convention.
