1. ACTION REQUIRED: ACTION REQUIRED: -- PLEASE ENSURE THAT SUBSTANTIVE PORTIONS OF INFORMATION BELOW ARE SHARED WITH FBI HQ

2. OVERALL STATE OF PLAY: SUBJECT IS CURRENTLY IN THE 12TH DAY OF THE ISOLATION PHASE. AS REPORTED PREVIOUSLY, [Redacted] (SUBJECT) BEGAN THE ISOLATION PHASE OF THE [Redacted] CYCLE ON 18 JUNE 2002 AT APPROXIMATELY 1600 HOURS. THE ISOLATION WILL CONTINUE FOR APPROXIMATELY THREE WEEKS UNTIL THE [Redacted] RESUME CIRCA 11 JULY 2002. WE UNDERSTAND THAT IT MAY BE NECESSARY UNDER EXCEPTIONAL/EXCEPTIONAL AND URGENT CRISIS CIRCUMSTANCES TO INTERRUPT THE CAREFULLY SCRIPTED ISOLATION AN RISK LOSING ITS INTENDED EFFECTS. WE ARE PREPARED TO COVER THIS CONTINGENCY. JUST TO REVIEW, THE GOAL OF ISOLATION IS TO INDUCE DOUBT AND UNCERTAINTY ON THE PART OF THE SUBJECT ABOUT HIS DISPOSITION. DISRUPTING THE ROUTINE TO WHICH SUBJECT HAS BECOME ACCUSTOMED AND LIMITING HIS CONTACT WITH PEOPLE WILL INCREASE PSYCHOLOGICAL PRESSURE. ISOLATION WILL LIKELY BE HIGHLY DISCONCERTING TO THE SUBJECT GIVEN THE EXTENT OF HIS PRE-CAPTURE LEVEL OF ACTIVITY AND AFFINITY FOR INTERACTION WITH [Redacted] AND HIS GENERALLY INTENSIVE POST-CAPTURE RATE OF INTERACTION WITH [Redacted] TEAM MEMBERS. IN THE OPINION OF TEAM PSYCHOLOGISTS, INTERRUPTING INSOLATION FOR ANYTHING LESS THAN EXCEPTIONAL/EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES MAY UNDERMINE THE PROCESS IN A WAY FROM WHICH IT IS DIFFICULT TO RECOVER. HOWEVER, IF AN EXCEPTIONAL/EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCE OCCURS [Redacted]

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[REDACTED] A PREPARED PACKET WITH SPECIFIC WRITTEN INSTRUCTIONS WILL BE PRESENTED TO SUBJECT FOR HIS FEEDBACK WITHIN THE STRUCTURE OF THE ISOLATION PHASE. SUCH CONTACT WILL BE ACCOMPLISHED A WAY THAT MINIMIZES THE DISRUPTIVE EFFECT. THE RESULTS OBTAINED WITH THE SUBJECT'S RESPONSE WILL BE IMMEDIATELY FORWARDED TO ALEC/HQS. [REDACTED] TEAM MEMBERS IC SERE PSYCHOLOGIST, OPERATIONAL/SERE PSYCHOLOGIST, [REDACTED] OFFICER ARE PREPARED TO HANDLE ANY DEVELOPMENTS WHICH MAY ARISE. INTERROGATORS WILL RETURN ON SHORT NOTICE, AS REQUIRED.

3. ATMOSPHERICS/BEHAVIORAL COMMENTS: SUBJECT SPENT THE TIME BETWEEN THE LAST REPORTING PERIOD AND THIS ONE COMPLETELY ISOLATED EXCEPT FOR A SINGLE ROUTINE 20-MINUTE MEDICAL CARE SESSION (16:00-16:20, 30 JUNE 2002). DURING THE NIGHT AND DAY, THE SUBJECT'S ACTIVITY INCLUDED EATING FROM HIS BOWL OF BEANS AND RICE (AUGMENTED BY VITAMINS), DRINKING WATER AND ENSURE, WALKING ABOUT HIS CELL, SINGING, PRAYING, AND SLEEPING. THE SUBJECT CONTINUES TO SET ASIDE A FEW MINUTES IN HIS DAILY ROUTINE FOR STRETCHING HIS BACK, SHOULDERS, AND NECK. HE APPEARS TO BE STEADILY INCREASING HIS OVERALL AMOUNT OF EXERCISE. HE DID A FEW MORE STANDING PUSH-UPS AND WALKED NEARLY 30 LAPS AROUND THE CELL. AT TIMES, SUBJECT APPEARS TO BE TALKING OUT LOUD TO HIMSELF BUT MAY ALSO BE PRAYING, SINGING, OR CHANTING. FINGERING AND/OR MANIPULATING HIS NOSE, TOES, AND OTHER APPENDAGES REMAINS A STABLE PART OF HIS DAILY ACTIVITY. WHEN AWAKE, THE SUBJECT DOES APPEAR SOMEWHAT TENSE AND RESTLESS AT TIMES. FOR THE MOST PART, HE CONTINUES TO APPEAR QUITE BORED. MEDICAL STAFF NOTED THAT HE DID APPEAR MILDLY TENSE DURING THE MEDICAL EXAMINATION (BREATHED HEAVILY FOR A FEW SECONDS AND CLUTCHED TIGHTLY AT THE GURNEY SIDE RAILS DURING THE INITIAL MOMENTS OF THE MEDICAL EXAM. THIS MAY BE AN ANTICIPATORY REACTION GIVEN HIS RECENT UNEXPECTED RECTAL EXAM. HE SHOWED NO SIGNS OF SEVERE EMOTIONAL DISTRESS. THE SUBJECT DID NOT WRITE ON HIS NOTE PAPER OR ON THE LARGE RESPONSE SHEET LEFT FOR HIM TO USE TO IDENTIFY DETAILS RELATED TO CURRENT OR FUTURE THREATS.

4. ADDITIONAL OBSERVATIONS AND PLANS: NONE.

5. THREAT UPDATE: NO NEW THREAT INFORMATION TO REPORT AS OF THIS WRITING.

6. MEDICAL UPDATE: MEDICAL STATUS STABLE. WOUND CONTINUES TO HEAL WELL. NO APPARENT DISTRESS OR DISCOMFORT REPORTED OR OBSERVED.
