



was present and fixed in the lower arms and lower back. Congestion appeared to be present in the arms. The examination revealed numerous contusions on MG MOWHOUSH's abdomen, legs, buttocks, chest, back and arms. Several abrasions were found on the back, arms and legs. Some of the contusions appeared to be made by a long straight edged object. Other contusions appeared to be made by an object similar to the butt of a rifle. The contusions varied in color from red to dark purple. Zipties were present on each wrist, but were not connected. An identification band bearing the writing "3 ACR, 03-76" was found on the right wrist. Body fluids were being purged through the nasal cavity. There were no obvious signs of petechial hemorrhages present in the eyes or mouth. There were pinpoint abrasions present slightly above the right knee on the medial side. There was an abrasion present over the sternum. SA exposed digital photographs of the injuries using a Fuji Finepix Camera. (See Photographic Log and CD ROM for details)

(FOUO) AGENT'S COMMENT: SA coordinated with SSG NCOIC, Mortuary Affairs, 54th QM Co, Fort Lee, VA, Al Asad, Iraq during the examination. SSG related MG MOWHOUSH's remains were photographed about 2030, 26 Nov 03 by CPT (NFI). No one else examined the remains. SSG related he received the body from CPT RS-3, 3rd Armored Cavalry Regiment (ACR), Fort Carson, CO (FCCO), at 1700, 26 Nov 03.

About 2030, 27 Nov 03, SA Long, SA Long and SA Compensation of MG Commander 3rd ACR, FCCO, on the results of the examination of MG MOWHOUSH's remains. 

(FOUO) Paragraph 1-5.a(4): The inhumane treatment of EPW, CI, RP is prohibited and is not justified by the stress of combat or with deep provocation. Inhumane treatment is a serious and punishable violation under international law and the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ).

(FOUO) Paragraph 2-1.a(1)(d): Prisoners may be interrogated in the combat zone. The use of physical or mental torture or any coercion to compel prisoners to provide information is prohibited. Prisoners may voluntarily cooperate with PSYOP personnel in the development, evaluation, or dissemination of PSYOP messages or products. Prisoners may not be threatened, insulted, or exposed to unpleasant or disparate treatment of any kind because of their refusal to answer questions. Interrogations will normally be performed by intelligence or counterintelligence personnel.

(FOUO) Paragraph 3-7.e(3): No EPW or RP will be handcuffed or tied, except to ensure safe custody or when prescribed by a responsible medical officer as needed to control a medical case requiring restraint.

WHEN SUSPECT/ACCUSED REFUSES TO SIGN WAIVER CERTIFICATE: If the suspect/accused orally waives his/her rights but refuses to sign the waiver certificate; you may proceed with the questioning. Make notations on the waiver certificate to the effect that he/she has stated that he/she understands his/her rights, does not want a lawyer, wants to discuss the offense(s) under investigation, and refuses to sign the

The questioning may not be utilized to discourage a suspect/accused from exercising his/her rights. (For example, do not make such comments as "if you didn't do anything wrong, you shouldn't need an attorney,")

At 0945, 19 Aug 05, SA coordinated with MAJ S-2, 3rd Armored Cavalry Regiment (ACR), related he Iraq. MAJ was the S-2 with the 3rd ACR during the initial incident involving MG MOVVHOUSH. MAJ believed the original capture file was a part of the investigation packet in 2003 and that his office did not Regimental Staff Judge Advocate, 3rd ACR, FOB SYKES stated LTC may know the location of the detainee packet. MAJ stated CW3 66th Military Intelligence Company (MI CO), Fort Carson, CO didn't prepare intelligence briefs for him. Rear Detachment, S-2, 66th MI CO may have knowledge of this edetainee file.
