(U) INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

(U) "This is an Operation Iraqi Freedom Investigation."

(U) On 18 Nov 05, this investigation was initiated when CPT b(6), b(7)(C)

<sup>5(6), 5(7)C)</sup>Command Judge Advocate, Office of the Staff Judge Advocate (SJA), Forward Operating Base (FOB) Central, IZ, reported Mr. AL GHURAIRI's death.

(U) Investigation revealed on 13 Nov 05, Mr. AL GHURAIRI was apprehended at his home along with his two sons by members of Iraqi 2<sup>nd</sup> Squadron, Hillah Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) members. Coalition forces were present; however, the extent of their involvement was limited to technical advice. Mr. AL GHURAIRI was taken into custody without incident and

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was transported via helicopter to Forward Operating Base (FOB) Kalsu, IZ. While en route, Mr. AL GHURAIRI began displaying signs of cardiac arrest and lost consciousness. Personnel aboard the helicopter initiated life saving measures in an attempt to resuscitate Mr. AL GHURAIRI; however, life saving measures were unsuccessful and Mr. AL GHURAIRI was pronounced dead by PO1 b(6), b(7)(C) Corpsman, Helicopter Combat Support Squadron 5 (HCS-5), Joint Special Operations Air Detachment-Arabian Peninsula (JSOAD-AP), Logistical Support Area Anaconda (LSAA), FOB Kalsu, Iraq, upon arrival to FOB Kalsu. Shortly thereafter, Mr. AL GHURAIRI's body was released by Hillah SWAT to Mr. AL GHURAIRI's sons, so an autopsy was not conducted and a death certificate was not prepared. Interviews of the apprehending personnel and personnel on the helicopter revealed Mr. AL GHURAIRI and his two sons, NFI, came willingly and did not resist apprehension. Further, the two sons indicated Mr. AL GHURAIRI had a history of high blood pressure, diabetes, and had a heart attack in the past. As no autopsy was conducted and no death certificate was prepared, the cause and manner of death could not be determined; therefore, the manner of death was listed as undetermined.

BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: About 1039, 18 Nov 05, this office was notified by CPT **b(6)**, **b(7)(C)** Office of the Staff Judge Advocate (SJA). Forward Operating Base (FOB) Central, Iraq (IZ), of the death of Mr. AL GHURAIRI. CPT **b(6)**(**b**)(7)(**C**) related on 13 Nov 05, Mr. AL GHURAIRI was apprehended at this home along with his sons by members of the Hillah Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team. All three were taken into custody without incident and transported, via helicopter, to FOB Kalsu, IZ APO AE 09325 (FOBK). All three detainees appeared to be in good health upon apprehension. While in route to FOBK, Mr. AL GHURAIRI began showing symptoms of cardiac arrest and subsequently lost consciousness. Members of the Hillah SWAT team initiated life saving measures by conducting Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR); however, all life saving measures were unsuccessful and Mr. AL GHURAIRI was pronounced dead upon arrival at FOBK. Mr. AL GHURAIRI's sons were released, and were given Mr. AL GHURAIRI's remains for burial.

About 1200, 20 Nov 05, SA<sup>b(6), b(7)(C)</sup>coordinated with LTCDR<sup>b(6), b(7)(C)</sup>

appointed AR 15-6 Investigating Officer, Combined Special Operations Task Force-Arabian Peninsula (CJSOTF-AP), IZ, who provided a copy of his appointment orders. Also, LCDR b(6), b(7)(C) provided this office with a copy of the Serious Incident Report (SIR) and copies of sworn statements provided by the Soldiers who were present during Mr. AL GHURAIRI's death. 7. While returning to EOP K loss, one of the detainees under Hillah SWAT control died of an apparent heart attack. His body was transported to the EOP Kalsu aid station. The flight surgeon from one of the HIH-60s declared him detailed to the EOP Kalsu; Cause of death- cardiac arrest. His remains were transferred to the Toms in storreturn course, strong. Two of his sons that were also detained were released by Hillah SWAT to accompany the body.

- 8. Remarks:
  - The detainee was captured by Hillah SWAT and USSF advisors during CONOP 575-021.
  - Contributing factor: Unknown prior medical history. The detainee was 66 years old. At this time there is no reason to believe that the detainee experienced any torture or abuse.
- 9. Publicity: Hillah SWAT and Tunis IPs have returned the body to the family.

Sub. Death incident Name of the diseased: Rashid Salman Mohammad Al Ghurairi.

On the morning of November 15<sup>th</sup> 20054 of the Hillah SWAT and 5 of the SF members from Kalsu raided the house of the terrorist Rashid Salman Mohammad AI Ghurairi, arrested him and his sons Mohammad and Radhi, then we handcuffed the suspects and then took them to the hello pad. None of the suspects looked sick or weak. After the hello copter landed we helped to get into the aircraft.

During the flight back to Kalsu, Rashid was shown signs of nauseas then we cut of the hand cuffs tying his hands, and 1<sup>st</sup> Sgt did everything he could to help him. We continued to try to save him by pressing his chest, then the American doctor arrived and put him on EKG. Then the doctor announced Rashid's death.

Because of this situation, and in a coherence with the humane principles and based on the fact that Rashid is the one who forced his sons to deal with terrorism, we decided to release the sons of Rashid, so they can take care of their fathers' funeral duties.

We called contacted Tunis police station and handed over the body of Rashid, and the 2 sons who were detained.

Rashid was 66 years old, and was obese. Cause of death is Heart Attack. All the detainees were treated in humane way.

AGENT'S COMMENT: All members of A CO,  $3^{ra}$  BN,  $5^{tn}$  SFG, were present when CPT **b**(6), **b**(7)(C) and SSG<sup>**b**(6), **b**(7)(C) were interviewed and verified they had no direct involvement in the raid conducted by Hillah SWAT members. Mr. AL GHURAIRI's medical condition prior to the raid was unknown. An attempt to locate Mr. AL GHURAIRI's medical records or interview of the two sons and spouse would not be conducted by this office because of the high threat level in Iraq due to ongoing terrorist and insurgency activities against US forces.</sup>

1. You are hereby appointed as an investigating officer pursuant to AR 15-6 to conduct an informal investigation into the facts and circumstances surrounding the death of the subject detainee. Relevant background materials—including the initial serious incident report and operational summary—are attached to assist you in your investigation.

2. In your investigation, use informal procedures under AR 15-6. In your findings, identify the individuals involved in the incident. Determine whether applicable detainee handling procedures were followed. Make specific findings whether proper reporting procedures were followed. If not, determine—as is possible—why proper reporting procedures were not followed. As necessary, consult subject matter experts to assist you, particularly medical experts. As appropriate, make recommendations to help prevent future incidents of this nature. Recommend disciplinary measures as appropriate.

3. Witness statements should be sworn and recorded on DA Form 2823; however, do not unduly delay your investigation to obtain sworn statements. If you come to suspect that certain individuals may have committed misconduct, you must advise them of their rights under article 31 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice. In addition, you must provide them a Privacy Act statement before you solicit any (further) personal information. You may evaluate witness statements already gathered by the ODA, but gather additional statements as necessary. You must obtain assistance with these legal matters from the CJSOTF-AP Staff Judge Advocate.

4. Submit your findings and recommendations on DA Form 1574 to the CJSOTF-AP SJA within ten days. Update me by e-mail every third day during your investigation. If you must request an extension, do so in writing. Point of contact for this action is

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SECTION IV -	FINDINGS	(para 3-10, .	18 15-6)

The Vinvestigating office) (hourse), having carefully considered the evidence, finds:

Throughout the course of this investigation the following questions were answered. These questions were posed on the Investigating Officer's appointment letter.

#### 1. Determine if applicable detainee handling procedures were followed:

Throughout the course of the investigation I interviewed 11 different persons, both U.S. and Iraqi, who had contact with the deceased detainee (Rashed Salman Mohomed Al Gurari). All 11 interviews revealed the exact same information which at no point involved any violation of the guidelines which govern the handling of detainees. None of the witnesses or persons involved in the apprehension and movement of the detainee witnessed any poor treatment of the detainee. In each case the witnesses stated that the detainee was completely compliant throughout the detention and movement process. No force was necessary to move he or his two sons as they complied with every order given to them by the Hillah SWAT members. All witnesses stated that the deceased detainee appeared to be in good health (though obese) and walked from the house to the PZ and finally boarded the helicopter by himself. Multiple witnesses stated that two minutes into the flight the detainee appeared to be having a heart attack, then closed his eyes, and then they received no response to repeated attempts to resuscitate him. The medical report (exhibit 15) from HM1<sup>(0)(0)</sup> to the stated that there were no signs of trauma and the apparent cause of detain was a heart attack that led to full cardiac arrest.

#### 2. Make specific findings whether applicable proper reporting procedures were followed. If not, determine why proper reporting procedures were not followed.

With the above guidelines in mind there does not seem to have been any specific written requirement for the U.S. forces involved in operation CT-75-021 to report the death of detainee Rashed Salman Mohomed Al Gurari. There is no specific guidance that dictates the reporting of a detainee death while that detainee is in the custody of Iraqi Police and US forces are present. However, even though US forces were not the detaining authority on this operation a unit commander should reasonably assume that there are reporting requirements when his unit is operating in an advisor capacity and when US assets are involved. It is my opinion that the ODA and AOB leadership, in the absence of specific reporting requirements, took the appropriate actions by including the incident in the OPSUM that was submitted to FOB 52. This OPSUM was subsequently forwarded from FOB 52 to CJSOTFAP where the detainee death information was removed in favor of obtaining complete information from the AOB and ODA. The FOB 52 Battle Captain stated "To my knowledge, there are no requirement to report the detain of a detainee who is in Iraqi custody." While I agree there are no requirements in writing, there is an implicit requirement to report significant events that occur on operations where US forces are present to your chain of command. I believe the death of a detainee in a US aircraft with US forces present is a significant event. With this in mind I do not feel the FOB should have removed the information on the detainee death from the initial OPSUM. I feel they had an obligation to inform the CJSOTF Commander as soon as possible.

SECTION V - RECOMMENDATIONS (para 3-11, AR 15-6)

In view of the above findings, the (investigating officer) (board) recommends:

I recommend that CJSOTFAP issue guidance to their subordinate units defining the response required to detainee deaths when US forces are present on an operation where Iraqi forces are the detaining authority.

Summary of tasks in the 16NOV05 appointment letter:

#### Summary of tasks and recommendations:

- Identify individuals involved in the incident- See exhibit 2 (Summary of Interviews) which
  identifies the persons involved which I was able to interview over the course of my investigation.
  The list of involved personnel who were on the actual objective includes 2 Special Forces
  personnel from ODA 575, 3 personnel from BCT 155, and 3 Hillah SWAT members, and one
  Navy corpsman attached to the JSOAD. With the exception of the two sons detained with the
  father, I was able to interview all persons of interest in this investigation. Due to the current
  environment I did not consider it appropriate or safe to attempt to interview the two sons detained
  during the operation.
- 2. Determine if applicable detainee handling procedures were followed- Throughout the course of the investigation I interviewed 11 different persons, both U.S. and Iraqi, who had contact with the deceased detainee (Rashed Salman Mohomed Al Gurari). All 11 interviews revealed the exact same information which at no point involved any violation of the guidelines which govern the handling of detainees. A summary of those guidelines and the specific language governing the reporting and handling of detainee deaths is included below:
  - a. Secretary of Defense Procedures for investigation into deaths of detainees in the custody of the armed forces of the United States This memorandum reiterates and clarifies procedures for investigating deaths of detainees in the custody of the Armed Forces, including the requirement for an autopsy (exhibit 16).
  - b. FRAGO-260 (291320DJUN04) MNC-I guidelines for investigating and reporting detainee deaths to MNC-I OPORD 04-01 – When any person who is held as a detainee in the custody of the U.S. armed forces dies, the commander of the detention facility or the unit exercising custody over the deceased will immediately report the death to the responsible Army, Navy, or Air Force investigating agency (exhibit 17).

  - d. FRAGO-1173 [Detention operations] to MNC-1 OPORD 04-01- Criminal detainee is any person who is suspected of having committed criminal acts and is not considered a security internee. "Criminal Detainees" shall be handed over to Iraqi authorities as soon as reasonable practical for processing into the Iraqi criminal system. (exhibit 19).

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Guidelines a, b, and c cited above specifically refer to the requirement that US forces have to report detainee deaths in their custody. These guidelines do not apply in this circumstance because the detaining and apprehension authority was not the U.S. armed forces. The apprehending and detaining authority on this operation was the Iraqi Police (Hillah SWAT) assigned to the Iraqi Ministry of the Interior. This operation was generated by a Hillah SWAT source and prosecuted by the Hillah SWAT operators under the supervision of the U.S. armed forces. The actual apprehension of this detainee and his two sons was done by Hillah SWAT members and at no time were the detainees out of the Iraqi Police's custody. The FRAGO referenced in (d.) above specifies that criminal detainees "should be transferred to Iraqi authorities as soon as reasonably practical". In this case Rashed Salman Mohomed Al Gurari was never in U.S. custody because US forces were with Iraqi policeman who had detention authority on the stated that they believed that when operating and 🎴 operation. Both with Hillah SWAT the detainees would belong to Hillah SWAT. The only exception to this was if they were apprehending a security detainee or HVI.

Following the detention and death of Salman Mohomed Al Gurari the Hillah SWAT (1916) redered that the two sons of Salman Mohomed Al Gurari be released with appropriate CERP compensation (exhibit 20) from the ODA commander. This decision was based on the Hillah SWAT's determination that the two sons were coerced into participating in the father's insurgent activity. No force was necessary to move he or his two sons as they complied with every order given to them by the Hillah SWAT members. All witnesses stated that the decased detainee appeared to be in good health (though obese) and walked from the house to the PZ and finally boarded the helicopter by himself. Multiple witnesses stated that two minutes into the flight the detainee appeared to be having a heart attack, then closed his eyes, and then they received no response to repeated attempts to resuscitate him. The medical report (exhibit 15) from HM1  $^{(0)}$  (6) and that there were no signs of trauma and the apparent cause of death was a heart attack that led to full cardiac arrest.

3. Make specific findings whether applicable proper reporting procedures were followed. Because of this they do not view the detention of criminal detainees as part of their role when they are operating with Hillah SWAT (unless those detainees are HVI or of particular interest to coalition forces). They instead leave such detention activities to the Hillah SWAT members who regularly apprehend, detain, and prosecute criminals with and without the assistance of US forces.

The FOB 52 (10) the stated "To my knowledge, there are no requirements to report the death of a detaince who is in Iraqi custody." While I agree there are no requirements in writing there is an implicit requirement to report significant events that occur on operations where US forces are present to your chain of command. I believe the death of a detainee in a US aircraft with US forces present is a significant event.

I recommend that CJSOTFAP issue guidance to their subordinate units defining the response required to detainee deaths when US forces are present on an operation where Iraqi forces are the detaining authority.

Recommend disciplinary measures as appropriate- One of the first lessons I learned in the military was that your boss should find out bad news from you early rather than from someone else later. I recommend verbal (0.6) be given by the CJSOTFAP CDR to (0.6) and that emphasizes that lesson.

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Typically, the body is handed over to the "acting" authority. In this case, I advised the FOB SOF team at Kalsu of the patient's status on scene. I advised them I would produce my medical report and forward it through my chain-of-command up my return to Balad. A copy of my report should have been forwarded to the authority command in this case and they should have compiled it with their report.

Not knowing the end result of how the patient was transferred to a coroner or physician I can not be much help in directing you to the final death certificate report.

I recommend that you contact the FOB SOF Commanding Officer as to what the chain-of-custody was.

In addition, I will discuss this issue with Lt Col "60.67/00 the AIR FORCE Flight Surgeon here at JSOAD-AP and see if there are other options.

This memorandum reiterates and clarifies procedures for investigating deaths of detainees in the custody of the Armed Forces, including the requirement for an autopsy.

References (a), (b) and (c) establish policy and procedure for investigations of possible violations of protections afforded enemy prisoners of war, retained personnel, civilian internees, and other detainces, including procedures in cases of deaths of such

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persons. References (d), (e), and (f) provide that the Office of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner has primary jurisdiction and authority within DoD to determine the cause and manner of death in any DoD death investigation. This jurisdiction may be exercised as part of DoD death investigations of enemy prisoners of war, retained personnel, civilian internees, and other detainees in the custody of the Armed Forces of the United States.

In the case of a death of such an individual, the commander of the facility (or if the death did not occur in a facility, the commander of the unit that exercised custody over the individual) shall immediately report the death to the responsible investigative agency; Army Criminal Investigation Division, Navy Criminal Investigative Service, or Air Force Office of Special Investigations. This investigative agency shall contact the Office of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner (AFME). The AFME will determine whether an autopsy will be performed. The regional combatant commander shall notify the Secretary of Defense, through the Chairman, Joint Chiefs of Staff, of all deaths occurring in US armed forces custody.

Upon declaration of death, the remains will be placed in a clean body bag and secured awaiting instructions from the appropriate investigating agency. The remains will not be washed and all items on or in the body will be left undisturbed except for weapons, ammunition, and other items that pose a threat to the living. The body will not be released from United States custody without written authorization from the investigative agency concerned or the Armed Forces Medical Examiner.

In summary, in the case of death of any individual described above, while in custody of the Armed Forces of the United States, it is presumed that an autopsy shall be performed, unless an alternative determination is made by the Armed Forces Medical Examiner. Determination of the cause and manner of death in these cases will be the sole responsibility of the AFME or other physician designated by the AFME.

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#### Chapter H – Medical Procedures

(1) FOBs will immediately notify the Commander, CJSOTF-AP, through J3 operations, if a detainee dies while in custody throughout any part of the detention process (from initial point of capture to transfer to the AGIF). CJSOTF-AP J-3 will notify the USACIDC immediately. USACIDC has primary jurisdiction over all detainee death investigations. The Special Agent will provide instructions on the actions to take to secure the scene. When all life saving measures have been exhausted and medical personnel have either transported the victim to a medical facility or if the corpse remains in place conduct the following actions:

(2) Secure the scene and do not allow anyone access except the responding CID Special Agent. No exceptions.

(3) Begin a log of all personnel that were present surrounding the time of incident i.e. before, during and after.

(4) Document who transported the victim and what facility the victim was transported to.

(5) Do not allow anyone to depart the area. If it is mission essential that a person must depart the area, document their name, unit, and contact information.

(6) If the victim was pronounced deceased at the scene, do not remove the body.

(7) CJSOTF-AP J3 Operations will immediately report the detainee death to MNCthrough operations channels.

(8) The Commander of the detention facility or the Commander of the unit in custody of the detainee at the time of death, will confirm that proper notification, as described above, has been made and submit any follow up reports. If the death occurred in any location other than a medical treatment facility the OIC/NCOIC on the ground will ensure that the corpse and scene are preserved. Upon the discovery of a detainee death all personnel other than medical and investigative personnel should be restricted from disturbing the setting of death. To determine if a death has occurred, a physician must pronounce the detainee dead. Until pronounced dead, U.S. Forces will initiate first aid steps to assist the detainee as they would a U.S. soldier. The remains will not be washed and all the items on or in the body will be left undisturbed except for weapons, ammunition, and other items that pose a threat to human life. Medical and criminal investigators will notify the facility commander when their investigation is over so that clean up can occur. The body will not be released from U.S. custody without written approval from the Armed Forces Medical Examiner. The CID or medical investigator will contact the Armed Forces Medical Examiner, who will determine whether an autopsy will be performed. The cause of death (proximal cause and other causal or contributing causes) must be identified on the death certificate or field medical card by the pronouncing physician. Additional determination of the cause of death or manner of death will be the sole responsibility of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner or other physician designated by the Armed Forces Medical Examiner when an autopsy is performed. The remains should then be released to the local hospital or Iraqi Police Station for processing.
