INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

This is an "Operation Iraqi Freedom 2004-2006" investigation.

Tsgt (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) TIF Control, CBI, reported Detainee HACHIM died about 0845, 19 Apr 05, at Compound 4, TIF, CBI.

Investigation determined Detainee HACHIM died while eating breakfast on 19 Apr 05, in Compound 4, TIF, CBI. The cause of death was Arteriosclerotic Cardiovascular Disease and the manner of death was natural.

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DETAILS

Basis for Investigation: About 1210, 19 Apr 05, TSGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Theater Internment Facility (TIF) Control, Camp Bucca, Iraq APO AE 09375 (CBI), reported HACHIM died in Compound 4 of the TIF.

About 1255, 19 Apr 05, the undersigned interviewed TSGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who stated he was initially notified that HACHIM required medical attention about 0828, 19 Apr 05. Medical personnel were called to the scene. About 0845, a medical doctor pronounced HACHIM dead, and indicated the cause of death might have been choking. TSGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated the remains were transported to the TIF medical facility.

About 1305, 19 Apr 05, the undersigned interviewed SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 566th Area Support Medical Company (ASMC), CBI. SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) provided a sworn statement wherein she described how she provided medical aid to HACHIM. SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) did not observe any signs of injury or trauma. (See Sworn Statement)

Agent's Comment: SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) indicated in her statement that SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (NFI) transported HACHIM's remains to the hospital. She was mistaken; actually SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and A1C (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) see page 2 of AIR) transported the remains.

About 1345, 19 Apr 05, the undersigned interviewed LTC (DR) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 105th MP Battalion (BN), CBI. LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he arrived at Compound 4 about 0830, 19 Apr 05. He explained that Compound 4 was his normal duty assignment. Upon arrival, LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) observed a male detainee (later identified as HACHIM) near the Sallyport (access control point) and quickly noted he was not breathing. LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) carried him out of the Sallyport to an area where he could effectively perform medical aid. LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) noted that HACHIM was not responsive, had no pulse, was not breathing, and had no gag reflex. LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) tried to open his airway by digitally sweeping his mouth and throat. He removed food (eggs) from HACHIM's airway during this process. LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) believed HACHIM was dead prior to initiating first aid and pronounced him dead at 0845. LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) performed a cursory examination at the scene and did not notice any signs of injury or trauma. After he pronounced HACHIM dead, numerous detainees gathered at the perimeter and requested the remains be brought back into Compound 4 so they could pray and cleanse the body. LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) consented, and the remains were placed on a litter and provided to the detainees. LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) felt this act would help quell any potential hostility which he felt could have resulted from this death. LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said the detainees took the remains to their mosque and into the shower and returned after about 30 minutes. Once the remains were given back to U.S. military control, they were transported to the TIF Emergency Room (ER).

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DETAILS

About 1355, 19 Apr 05, the undersigned interviewed PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 105th MP BN, CBI. PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) provided a sworn statement, wherein he related he provided first aid to HACHIM. PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) did not notice any injuries. (See Sworn Statement)

About 1420, 19 Apr 05, the undersigned viewed HACHIM's remains at the Morgue, CBI. The deceased was presumptively identified by visual methods. HACHIM was dark complected, average height, with a slight build. His body was wrapped in a multi-colored blanket, furnished by detainees in Compound 4. A green towel, also provided by detainees, was wrapped around his midsection. HACHIM had black and grey hair on his head and a grey mustache. His body was positioned on its back. No signs of injury or trauma were visible, with an exception of a healing abrasion to his right shin/ankle. This injury was clearly in the healing stage as scab tissue was well formed. A small piece of an unknown substance was visible inside HACHIM's mouth, on his tongue. Livor mortis was present on the underside of HACHIM's body. The undersigned exposed photographs of the remains using a Fujifilm Finepix S2 Pro digital camera with Nikon lenses and flash. (See Photographs)

About 1450, 19 Apr 05, the undersigned interviewed SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 566th ASMC, CBI. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated that this morning (19 Apr), he was dispatched to Compound 4. Upon arrival, LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) briefed him that a detainee died. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) allowed detainees to take the body back into the compound for 15 to 20 minutes. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) observed the detainees take HACHIM into the shower tent and later laid the body outside, where they gathered around and prayed. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) then transported the remains to the Trauma Room of the ER at the TIF. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) did not observe any injuries on HACHIM.

About 1455, 19 Apr 05, the undersigned interviewed Airman First Class (A1C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 586th Expeditionary Security Forces Squadron (ESFS), CBI, who said he received a call over the radio regarding a possible Dead On Arrival (DOA) detainee. A1C (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) went to the compound and initially did not see the body. He then saw the body being taken into the shower tent by detainees. The detainees brought the body back out after about 10 to 15 minutes. Detainees then assembled in rows and appeared to be praying. A1C (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) could not see the body during this time. After a few moments, the detainees brought HACHIM back to the Sallyport. A1C (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) noted the body was now covered with a blanket. Once the body was released to U.S. military control, he and SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) transported the body to the ER Trauma Room.

About 1503, 19 Apr 05, the undersigned interviewed SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 566th ASMC, CBI. SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said he put HACHIM into a body bag once it arrived at the ER. SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) did not observe any injuries or trauma to HACHIM's remains, but only clearly saw his face.

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DETAILS

Once a medical examination was complete, SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) transported the remains to the morgue, which was located adjacent to the hospital ER.

About 1515, 19 Apr 05, SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 115th Field Hospital, CBI, provided the undersigned with medical records pertaining to HACHIM's death. The records consisted of a Chronological Record of Medical Care which documented medical observations and treatment, a Hospital Report of Death, an Overseas Certificate of Death, an Authorization for Autopsy, a Statement of Identification, a Record of Personnel Effects, and a Statement of Medical Examination and Duty Status, which described the results of a medical examination. A review of the documents revealed there were no signs of injury or trauma indicated, and the cause of death was suspected to be related to choking or food aspiration. (See medical records)

About 1525, 19 Apr 05, the undersigned interviewed PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 566th ASMC, CBI. PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated HACHIM's remains were brought to the Trauma Room. She examined the body for broken bones by visual inspection and touch. She observed what appeared to be food particles in his throat, but noted no signs of injury or illness. PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) assisted SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) place the body into a body bag and transport the remains to the morgue.

About 1535, 19 Apr 05, the undersigned interviewed CPT (DR) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) General Medical Officer, 566th ASMC. CP (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said he arrived for duty about 0840, 19 Apr 05, and was told that LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) tried to resuscitate a detainee, without success. CP (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said that the detainee (HACHIM) was transported to the Trauma Room, where he performed a full external examination. CP (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said he noted no external signs of injury or trauma. CP (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) further related he observed what appeared to be food inside of HACHIM's mouth. CP (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said he prepared various medical records which documented his examination.

Agent's Comment: The medical records mentioned by CP (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) were collected and reviewed by the undersigned about 1515, 19 Apr 05.

About 1542, 19 Apr 05, the undersigned reviewed a Medical Logbook, which documented medications prescribed to detainees residing in Compound 4. The review revealed HACHIM was given an antacid on 18 Jan 05 for stomach pain. There were no other documented prescribed medications.

About 1730, 19 Apr 05, the undersigned obtained documentation of HACHIM's complete medical history since becoming a detainee. In May 04, he reported he was a diabetic. In Nov 04, he again reported he was a diabetic; however, within this record he self-reported he was using medication for

the condition. On 5 Apr 05, he received treatment for dental pain, and indicated he was unable to eat for three days because of the pain. (See medical records)

About 1440, 20 Apr 05, the undersigned interviewed LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who reviewed HACHIM's medical records. LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated that if the medical logbook did not indicate HACHIM had been receiving medication for diabetes, then he was not receiving the medicine. LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he would have conducted further testing on HACHIM based on the medical screening on 13 Nov 04; however, this was either not conducted or not documented. LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated that if HACHIM did not eat for three days as detainee witnesses claim, then his sugar stores could potentially have been depleted enough to cause a hypoglycemic seizure.

About 1500, 20 Apr 05, the undersigned coordinated with CPT (DDS) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) OIC, Dental Clinic, TIF, CBI. CPT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) viewed his records as well as HACHIM's medical records jacket and noted that HACHIM had never been seen by the Dental Clinic.

Agent's Comment: A review of the HACHIM's medical records disclosed he claimed he was not able to eat on 5 Apr 05, due to dental pain. HACHIM was again seen by a medic on 9 Apr 05 for dental problems.

About 1515, 20 Apr 05, the undersigned interviewed Senior Airman (SRA) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 86th ESFS, CBI, who stated Compound 4 detainees were punished for burning jump suits by limiting their regular meals to one per day, beginning on 9 Apr 05. SRA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated detainees received two packaged meals (similar to M.R.E.'s) per day, in addition to the regular meal, which was served at breakfast. SR (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said he observed detainees carry HACHIM out of tent 2-8 on the morning of 19 Apr 05, and approach the Sally port requesting assistance.

About 1520, 20 Apr 05, the undersigned interviewed SRA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 586th ESFS, CBI, who stated he saw some detainees carrying another detainee (HACHIM) to the access point of Compound 4. He determined there was something wrong with HACHIM and contacted TIF control by radio and requested assistance.

About 1030, 21 Apr 05, the undersigned interviewed SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Medic, Compound 4, 105th MP BN, CBI. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he was not aware that HACHIM was diabetic and did not believe HACHIM had been receiving medication. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated his unit assumed control of Compound 4 in late Nov 04 or early Dec 04. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said there was only one insulin dependent detainee in the compound. He indicated it was unit policy to complete a five

day test of blood sugar levels for any detainee suspected of having diabetes. He could not explain why HACHIM was not evaluated, but thought that maybe previous medical records were lost.

About 1040, 21 Apr 05, the undersigned interviewed PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who verified that he treated HACHIM for dental pain about 5 Apr 05. PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said he remembered HACHIM indicated that he was having trouble eating, but did not remember him saying that he had not eaten at all. PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he referred HACHIM to the Dental Clinic, but that takes time due to the vast numbers of detainees who require dental treatment. PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was not aware that HACHIM was diabetic, and did not know if he received medication for that condition.

About 1100, 21 Apr 05, the undersigned viewed Compound 4 from a guard tower. The compound was barricaded by fence and concertina wire and consisted of four rows of tents. The shower tent was separated from the other tents and was on the west side of the compound. The mosque tents were located on the east side of the compound. According to witnesses, the fatal event initialized in tent 2-8. This tent was located on the north end of the compound, in the second row of tents from the west. A sketch was prepared by the undersigned to depict this location and the compound layout. (See Sketch)

About 1520, 25 Apr 05, the undersigned interviewed SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Medic, 105th MP BN, CBI. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he was a medic assigned to Compound 4 and was not aware HACHIM had diabetes, or received medication for this condition.

Agent's Comment: All medics assigned to Compound 4 were interviewed. None was aware HACHIM was diabetic.

Between 0630 and 0900, 26 Apr 05, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Investigative Assistant (IA) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 4th MP Detachment, USACIDC, Fort Lewis, WA 98433 (FLWA) conducted canvass interviews of the 520th Area Support Medical Company (AMSC), FLWA, which met with the following results:

SSG (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was the only person who could remember HACHIM and she only remembered his ISN. The unit stated there were two ways of knowing if someone had a medical condition and/or needed medication. One, the detainees would bring paperwork with them from the facility they came from. Secondly, the detainees would tell someone that they had a medical condition and/or needed medication at which time they would be evaluated. The unit personnel stated if HACHIM had reported he was diabetic, they would have evaluated and treated him. The unit was very adamant that it was not common to lose or misplace records. The unit stated they were not

at CBI on 13 Nov 04; they turned the compound over on 1 Nov 04, to the 105th MP BN. The unit also stated they did not bring back any documentation and all medical records were left with the 105th.

About 1045, 3 May 05, the undersigned, with assistance from Interpreter (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) this office, interviewed Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) ISN (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) provided an Arabic language written statement which described HACHIM's actions near the time of his death. (See Statement and English translation, prepared by Mr. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C))

Agent's Comment: Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) mentioned (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) in his written statement. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) is the nickname of Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

About 1400, 3 May 05, the undersigned, with assistance from Interpreter (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) ISN (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who provided an Arabic language written statement. In his statement, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said he observed HACHIM die. (See Statement and English translation, prepared by Mr. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C))

About 1500, 3 May 05, the undersigned, with assistance from Interpreter (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) attempted to obtain a written statement from Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) ISN (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) but he could not read or write.

About 1535, 3 May 05, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) this office, with assistance from Interpreter (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) ISN (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who provided a written statement. In his statement, Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said he witnessed HACHIM die. (See Statement and English translation, prepared by Mr. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C))

About 1500, 4 May 05, the undersigned, with assistance from Interpreter (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) ISN (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who stated he could not write well. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) reiterated his previous statement he provided to SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C). He said HACHIM had not been eating well for four or five days prior to his death, and was tired and sluggish during this time period. He said HACHIM had been taking medicine for diabetes, but he did not know anything about the medicine or where it came from. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said HACHIM was rasping immediately prior to his death.

Agent's Comment: All names of detainees listed in this report and on the Final C Report of Investigation are according to official U.S. Army records. Some of the statements display different names based on what the detainees document on their statements, but the ISN's remain consistent.

On 4 Jun 05, this office received the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP) Autopsy Examination Report, 26 May 05, which listed the cause of death as Arteriosclerotic Cardiovascular Disease and

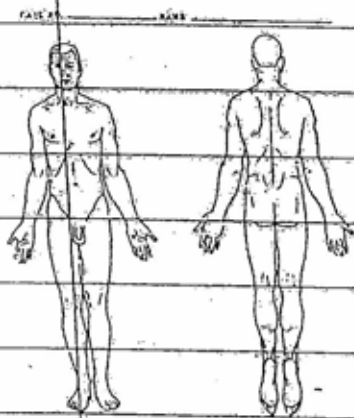

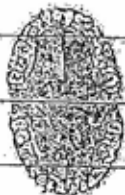

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION

The body is that of a thin, 69 inch, 150 pound elderly male whose appearance is consistent with the reported age of 55 years. Lividity is red-purple, posterior, and fixed. Rigor is easily broken.

The scalp is covered with short, gray-black hair in a normal distribution. Corneal clouding obscures the irides. The conjunctivae and sclera are markedly injected, however, there are no petechiae. There are bilateral earlobe creases (Frank's sign). The external auditory canals are unremarkable. The nares are patent and the lips are atraumatic. The nose and maxillae are palpably stable. The teeth appear in severe disrepair with absence of the majority of the upper dentition. There are no foreign bodies within the oropharynx.

The neck is straight, and the trachea is midline and mobile. The chest is symmetric. The abdomen is flat. The genitalia are those of a normal adult male. The testes are descended and free of masses. Pubic hair is present in a normal distribution. The buttocks and anus are unremarkable.

The upper and lower extremities are symmetric and without clubbing or edema.

CLOTHING AND PERSONAL EFFECTS

The body is received nude at the time of autopsy.

MEDICAL INTERVENTION

There are no attached medical devices at the time of autopsy.

RADIOGRAPHS

A complete set of postmortem radiographs is obtained and demonstrates no fractures or radiopaque foreign bodies.

EVIDENCE OF INJURY

On the right cheek is a small red abrasion and on the lower right leg near the ankle are several small healing red abrasions.

Dissection of the back and buttocks reveal no contusions.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION

HEAD:

The galeal and subgaleal soft tissues of the scalp are free of injury. The calvarium is intact, as is the dura mater beneath it. Clear cerebrospinal fluid surrounds the 1260 gm brain, which has unremarkable gyri and sulci. Coronal sections demonstrate sharp demarcation between white and grey matter, without hemorrhage or contusive injury. The ventricles are mildly enlarged. The basal ganglia, brainstem, cerebellum, and arterial systems are free of injury or other abnormalities. There are no skull fractures. The atlanto-occipital joint is stable.

Layer-wise dissection of the neck reveals the anterior strap muscles of the neck are homogenous and red-brown, without hemorrhage. The thyroid cartilage and hyoid are intact. The larynx is lined by intact white mucosa. The thyroid is nodular and red-brown without cystic change. The tongue is free of bite marks, hemorrhage, or other injuries.

Incision and dissection of the posterior neck demonstrates no deep paracervical muscular injury and no posterior cervical spine fractures. There is no hemorrhage or laxity of the spinal ligaments. The cervical spinous processes are bifid.

BODY CAVITIES:

The ribs, sternum, and vertebral bodies are visibly and palpably intact. No excess fluid is in the pleural, pericardial, or peritoneal cavities. The organs occupy their usual anatomic positions.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM:

The right and left lungs weigh 670 and 580 gm, respectively. The external surfaces are smooth and deep red-purple. The pulmonary parenchyma is diffusely congested and edematous. No mass lesions or areas of consolidation are present. The mainstem bronchi and branches are free of obstruction.

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM:

The 400 gm heart (predicted=306 grams for weight) is contained in an intact pericardial sac. The epicardial surface is smooth, with minimal fat investment. The coronary arteries are present in a normal distribution, with a right-dominant pattern. Cross sections of the vessels show mild atherosclerosis of the coronary ostia. The left main coronary artery has a focal 75% stenosis. The left anterior descending coronary artery has an 80-90% proximal stenosis, 50-75% mid stenoses, and an 80% stenosis of the proximal portion of the first diagonal branch. The left circumflex coronary artery has a 50% proximal stenosis and a focal 75% mid stenosis. The right coronary artery has 50-80% proximal stenoses and 50-75% mid and distal stenoses. The myocardium is homogenous, red-brown, and firm. The valve leaflets are thin and mobile. The walls of the left and right ventricles are 1.5 and 0.5-cm thick, respectively. The septum measures 1.8-cm in thickness. The endocardium is smooth and glistening. The aorta gives rise to three intact and patent arch vessels. There is severe calcific plaque formation of the distal aorta slightly proximal to the iliac bifurcation. The renal and mesenteric vessels are unremarkable.

LIVER & BILIARY SYSTEM:

The 1530 gm liver has an intact, smooth capsule and a sharp anterior border. The parenchyma is tan-brown and congested, with the usual lobular architecture. No mass lesions or other abnormalities are seen. The gallbladder contains a minute amount of

green-black bile and no stones. The mucosal surface is green and velvety. The extrahepatic biliary tree is patent.

SPLEEN:

The 150 gm spleen has a smooth, intact, red-purple capsule. The parenchyma is maroon and congested, with distinct Malpighian corpuscles.

PANCREAS:

The pancreas is firm and yellow-tan, with the usual lobular architecture. No mass lesions or other abnormalities are seen.

ADRENALS:

The right and left adrenal glands are symmetric, with bright yellow cortices and grey medullae. No masses or areas of hemorrhage are identified.

GENITOURINARY SYSTEM:

The right and left kidneys weigh 190 and 220 gm, respectively. There is a simple cortical cyst of the right kidney. Otherwise, the external surfaces are intact and smooth. The cut surfaces are red-tan and congested, with uniformly thick cortices and sharp corticomedullary junctions. The pelves are unremarkable and the ureters are normal in course and caliber. White bladder mucosa overlies an intact bladder wall. The bladder contains approximately 10 ml of cloudy yellow urine. The prostate is normal in size, with lobular, yellow-tan parenchyma. The seminal vesicles are unremarkable. The testes are free of mass lesions, contusions, or other abnormalities.

GASTROINTESTINAL TRACT:

The esophagus is intact and lined by smooth, grey-white mucosa. The stomach contains approximately 30 ml of brown liquid. The gastric wall is intact. The duodenum, loops of small bowel, and colon are unremarkable. The appendix is present and unremarkable.

ADDITIONAL PROCEDURES

- Documentary photographs are taken by AFMES photographers
- Specimens retained for toxicologic testing and/or DNA identification are: vitreous, blood, urine, spleen, liver, lung, kidney, brain, bile, gastric, adipose and psoas

This elderly male civilian detainee died of severe arteriosclerotic coronary artery disease (hardening and blockage of the blood vessels supplying blood to the heart).

Microscopic sections of the heart showed the blockages of the arteries and evidence of chronic myocardial ischemia. Toxicology was negative for ethanol and drugs of abuse. Carbon monoxide and cyanide were not detected.

Vitreous glucose was reported as less than 10 mg/dL, consistent with a long interval from death to time of testing.

Detailed examination of the internal organs as well as dissection of the back, anterior neck, and posterior neck did not reveal occult trauma.

Sudden collapse due to arteriosclerotic coronary artery disease is common and is frequently the initial presentation of underlying heart disease. The finding of food within the mouth at the time of the collapse is felt to be secondary to the collapse and not causal. There were no food particles impacted within the airway at the time of autopsy. Severe coronary artery disease and chronic ischemic changes of the heart were noted by visual and microscopic examination.

The manner of death is natural.

Coronary arteries: Sections show atheromatous stenoses corresponding with the gross impression.

Myocardium: Sections show a mild increase in perivascular and interstitial fibrosis. No acute ischemic changes are noted microscopically.

Lungs: Sections show vascular congestion and atelectasis.

Liver: Section shows mild increase in periportal fibrosis and focal periportal chronic inflammation

Kidney: Nodular Kimmelstiel-Wilson lesions are not noted. There is no inflammatory infiltrate.

TOXICOLOGY

Toxicologic analysis of blood was negative for carbon monoxide, cyanide, ethanol, and drugs of abuse.

VITREOUS

Glucose was reported as less than 10 mg/dL.

DETAILS

About 1515, 19 Apr 05, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) with assistance from Linguist Mr. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) this office, interviewed Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Internment Serial Number (ISN) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who stated he slept next to HACHIM in tent 15. This morning, about 0800, they were about to start eating breakfast, which consisted of one hard boiled egg and 2 pieces of toast when HACHIM took a bite of bread with egg and choked. He fell immediately to the ground and made one noise like he was choking. They immediately took him to the sally port. The guards and medics tried to do life saving measures. After HACHIM was pronounced dead they requested to bring him in to the shower, clean him up and have a prayer, which they were allowed to do. They then brought him up to the sally port. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) claimed HACHIM was a diabetic and had not eaten in four days.

About 1520, 19 Apr 05, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), (b)(7)(F) this office, interviewed TSgt (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 586th Expeditionary Security Forces Squadron (ESFS), Camp Bucca, Iraq APO AE 09375 (CBI). TSgt (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he was the Non Commissioned Officer In Charge (NCOIC) of Compound 4 and came on duty at 0600, 19 Apr 05. About 0828, 19 Apr 05, detainees from Compound 4 brought a detainee out to the Medical Shack where life saving efforts were performed by medical personnel. TSgt (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated the detainees requested the body for washing, preparation for burial, and prayer. About 0900, the detainees carried the body back into Compound 4. About 0930, the detainees brought the body back to the sally port and carried the body to the escort vehicle.

About 1525, 19 Apr 05, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) with assistance from Mr. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) ISN (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who stated he was eating breakfast with HACHIM this morning about 0800, when HACHIM took a bite of bread and egg and collapsed. He made one choking sound, but did not vomit or spit up any food. He stated they had been on food restriction for 13 days and had started to get hard boiled eggs and bread for breakfast for the last three days. He stated HACHIM was a diabetic and had not eaten in four days.

About 1530, 19 Apr 05, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed Senior Airman (SrA) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 586th ESFS, CBI. SrA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he came on duty at Compound 4 about 0600, 19 Apr 05, and was in the CCT Shack at 0828 when the detainees brought a limp body to the sally port. SrA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said the deceased appeared to have lost bladder control, was limp, and had eggs on his mouth.

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DETAILS

About 1540, 19 Apr 05, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed SrA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 586th ESFS, CBI. SrA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he was on duty at Compound 4 on 19 Apr 05, and was on the sally port gate about 0828, when the detainees brought up a limp detainee. SrA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said he saw egg yoke on the detainee's chin.

About 1730, 19 Apr 05, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) with assistance from Linguist (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who stated he slept in the same tent as HACHIM. This morning about 0800, they were preparing to eat breakfast when HACHIM took one bite of bread and egg and immediately fell over. They carried him up to the sally port where the guards and medics worked on him. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated HACHIM was diabetic and had not received any medication in two months. They have been on food restriction and HACHIM had not eaten in three days. He only made one sound when he fell down, and it sounded like he was choking.

About 1735, 19 Apr 05, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) with assistance from Linguist OADDAH, interviewed Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) ISN (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who stated after the doctors finished working on HACHIM, they asked if they could bring the body back in, clean it and pray. They were allowed to bring the body into the shower, clean it, and then pray. It took about 15 minutes. They then brought the body up to the sally port and turned him over to the guards.

About 1740, 19 Apr 05, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) with assistance from Linguist (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) ISN (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) ISN (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) related they slept in the same tent as HACHIM and were right across from him during breakfast. HACHIM took his first bite of bread and eggs and immediately fell over. They brought him up to the sally port immediately where the guards and medics worked on him. He had been complaining about being hungry for three days. He did not like the packaged meals they had been given, and would not eat them. They stated he was a diabetic and had not been given any medication in two months.

About 1747, 19 Apr 05, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) coordinated with SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 105th Military Police (MP) Battalion (BN), CBI, who stated he was one of the medics who administered medications to the detainees. He and had never given HACHIM any medicine for

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DETAILS

About 0700, 3 May 05, this office was notified by SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Operational Investigations, Office of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner (OAFME), Armed Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP), 1413 Research Blvd, Building 102, Rockville, MD 20850, that the remains of Mr. Ibrahim M. HACHIM/AL HAJEM, Internment Serial Number (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Camp Bucca, Iraq, APO, AE 09375, had arrived at Dover Air Force Base (DAFB), DE 19902, and an autopsy would be conducted later that morning.

This is an "Operation Iraqi Freedom 2004-2006" Investigation.

About 1100, 3 May 05, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) attended the autopsy of Mr. HACIM/AL HAJEM (ME 05-384), which was conducted by MAJ(Dr.) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) JSA, Deputy Medical Examiner, OAFME, AFIP, Rockville, MD 20850. **The preliminary Cause of Death was Atherosclerotic Cardiovascular Disease; and the Manner of Death was listed as Natural.** No evidence was identified or collected. Photographers from AFIP exposed digital photographs of the autopsy and prepared a compact disk containing all images exposed. A copy of the compact disk containing those images was obtained. Also obtained was a copy of a fingerprint taken by the FBI pertaining to ME 05-384. (See Compact Disk containing all autopsy digital images/copy of fingerprint)
