~~(SECRET//NOFORN)~~ This investigation was initiated upon a review of a Memorandum for Record(MFR) written by CPT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Office of the Staff Judge Advocate (OSJA), Interrogation Legal Advisor, Joint Interrogation and Debriefing Center (JDIC), Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, Iraq (ABI), of a possible detainee death which occurred while in the custody of a Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA), Operative (NFI), and a U.S. Air Force Lieutenant Colonel (LTC) (suspected to be the Post Commander) (NFI) in Iraq (NFI).

~~(SECRET//NOFORN)~~ Investigation revealed through a sworn statement rendered by SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Interrogator, JIDC, BCCF, ABI, on 1 Nov 05, who outlined a conversation between himself and U.S. Air Force SSGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Medical Screener, JIDC South, Camp Bucca, Iraq (NFI), that on a previous deployment to Iraq (NFI), SSGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) possibly witnessed the death of a detainee during the course of life saving measures conducted by SSGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and a doctor (NFI) after the detainee was brought in from an interrogation.

~~(SECRET//NOFORN)~~ SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) further explained that SSGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) related the detainee was brought in under emergency care by interrogators (NFI) and while they were

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performing cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), the U.S. Air Force Colonel told the DIA agent to get a truck and take the detainee off post and dispose of him in a ditch. Furthermore, when SSGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) objected, he was advised by the doctor to not say anything.

(U) On 19 Nov 05, coordination was made with SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) DIA Office of Inspector General (OIG), Building 6000, Washington, DC 20340, who was offered and accepted investigative jurisdiction of this investigation.

SUBJECT: Statement of Possible Detainee Abuse

1. On 26 October 2005, Sergeant (SGT) (b)(6) made the following report of possible detainee abuse. While at Camp Bucca, Iraq, on 26 August 2005, Air Force Staff Sergeant (b)(6) a medical screener at JIDC South, relayed to SGT (b)(6) the following account which occurred in a previous deployment to Iraq, where he had been working with DIA agents and (b)(6)

(b)(6) explained to me techniques that would force detainees to provide information, such as placing a detainee in a box small enough to keep them from sitting down, forcing them to remain standing for up to 14 hours. He claimed that when the boxes were opened the detainees would fall out and if they were interrogated immediately, right then and there, and told that unless they provided information on the whereabouts of such and such person then 'I'll do this to you again only ten times worse,' then the detainees would provide the information. (b)(6) then relayed to me that he had once received a call, after interrogators had been performing one such technique on a detainee, to treat the detainee for chest pains; upon arriving at the treatment room, however, he witnessed the interrogators wheeling the detainee in on a gurney while performing CPR and providing air by 'bagging' him. He then told me that a security person, of some sort, tried to enter the treatment room to get a situational report on the incident, but was stopped by one of the DIA agents, who told the security person to 'get out,' and when the security person tried to explain what his duties were, the DIA agent told him that it was none of his concern and to, "get the fuck out." He then told me that as he was performing CPR on the detainee with his doctor, he overheard the post commander, a LTC (I believe) tell one of the DIA agents that they should get a truck, take the body off post and dump it in a ditch. (b)(6) told me that he then mouthed, "what the fuck?," to his doctor, who shook his head, indicating he should not say anything. (b)(6) then explained to me that he had just negated his sworn statement. I'm sure that (b)(6) is an excellent medical professional and was merely put into an extraordinary situation where he felt undue pressure from his coworkers to remain quiet about the incident. (b)(6) indicated he did not want to report this and would deny telling me this if I reported it.

I, SGT (b)(6), WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:
On 26 August 2005, at Camp Bucca, Iraq, SSGT of the Air Force (b)(6) relayed to me the circumstances surrounding an abuse incident that occurred during a previous deployment to the Iraq area of operations, where he claimed he was working with DIA and CIA agents, as well as (b)(6).

(b)(6) began by explaining to me techniques that would force detainees to provide information, such as placing a detainee in a box small enough to keep them from sitting down, forcing them to remain standing for up to 14 hours. He claimed that when the boxes were opened the detainees would fall out and if they were interrogated immediately, and were told that unless they provided information on the whereabouts of such and such person then 'I'll do this to you again only ten times worse,' then the detainees would provide the information. (b)(6) then relayed to me that he had once received a call, after interrogators had been performing one such technique on a detainee, to treat the detainee for chest pains; upon arriving at the treatment room, however, he claimed that the interrogators were already performing CPR and providing air to the detainee by 'bagging' him. He then told me that a security person, of some sort, tried to enter the treatment room to get a situational report on the incident, but was stopped by a DIA agent, who told the security person to 'get out,' and when the security person tried to explain what his duties were, the DIA agent told him that it was none of his concern and to, "get the fuck out." He then told me that as he was performing CPR on the detainee with his doctor, he overheard the post commander, a LTC of the Air Force (I believe) tell one of the DIA agents that they should get a truck, take the body off post and dump it in a ditch. (b)(6) told me that he then mouthed, "what the fuck?," to his doctor, who shook his head, indicating he should not say anything. (b)(6) then explained to me that he had just negated his sworn statement by telling me the abovementioned.

(b)(6) expressed a concern that no one else should know about the incident.

A: No.

Q: When he said "and that's what they did", can you provide anymore details on that?

A: I can't remember the context, but it was shortly after the LTC suggested they take the body and dump it in a ditch. I can only assume that he may have seen them take the body away.

Q: How do you know SSGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

A: I am an Interrogator and he was medical staff. We were both serving at Bucca.

Q: Did this incident occur at the detention facility at Camp Bucca, Iraq?

A: No, this happened in his previous deployment not at Camp Bucca, I don't know where it was.

Q: Whom did you report this to and what was their professional role?

A: I reported it to CPT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Legal Advisor for JIDC, and he asked me if I wanted him (CPT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)) to be the reporting chain for this incident. I stated yes, and I subsequently rendered a sworn statement on 1 Nov 05, to him. He told me he would send this forward to the Commander and go through official channels.

The rumor said that the detainee was brought in by the interrogators which might have been CIA or DIA. I don't know who was actually there because the rumors did not specify. They also said in the rumor that they were ~~got~~ had to get rid of the body by dumping it off base. I don't think they would have done that but at the time it would not have been that difficult. During my deployment Col. [REDACTED] was my Colony Commander and Col. [REDACTED] was the EMEDS Commander. Other people that worked in the hospital were MSgt. [REDACTED] MSgt. [REDACTED]? SSgt. [REDACTED]? Sgt. [REDACTED] I believe, has mis-interpreted what I said. Although I can't remember the whole conversation word for word, I was never a witness to the complaint at hand. What I believe I told [REDACTED] was that I had heard that a detainee might have come in from the interrogators at the EPW camp. When he came in I heard that he was intubated and they had to do CPR. I have never done CPR on an Iraqi, or any other detainee type. I have never witnessed any abuse to a detainee. "Supposedly the interrogators were going to dump the body." I have no idea if any of this took place because this was all third party rumors. I do not remember who actually told me this but I do know from the medic side of things there is no way for us to know if a detainee has been abused when they come in. So if this rumor is true we still have no way of knowing what happened to him. EMEDS facility was located in Camp Letter, Iraq. — End of Statement —
