This investigation was initiated upon notification from SFC (b)(6).(b)(7)(C) 3rd Armored Cavalry
Regiment, FOB Marez, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334, who reported the death of Mr. HAMDAN

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at the Mosul Detention Facility, FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334.

Investigation determined Mr. HAMDAN's cause of death was Atherosclerotic Cardiovascular Disease and manner of death was natural.

Based on the totality of a thorough investigation, the evaluation of evidence, scene examination and witness interviews, this investigation supports the findings of the autopsy report.

BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: About 2315, 29 Dec 07, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) this office, was notified by SFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Provost Marshal Office NCOIC, 3rd Armored Cavalry Regiment (ACR), FOB Marez, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334, who reported the death of a detainee, Mr. Isam Y. HAMDAN, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Mosul, Iraq (NFI), at Military Detention Facility (MDF), FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334.

About 2340, 29 Dec 07, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) coordinated with MAJ (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 86th Combat Support Hospital (CSH), FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334, who related he pronounced Mr. HAMDAN deceased at 2256, 29 Dec 07. MAJ (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) related Mr. HAMDAN appeared to be dead upon arrival, with no breathing and discoloration of his skin. MAJ (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) related the detainee did not appear to have any injuries.

SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) obtained postmortem fingerprints of Mr. HAMDAN and SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) exposed digital images of Mr. HAMDAN's remains by utilizing a Canon EOS 1Ds camera. All images were transferred to a compact disc (CD) for preservation.

About 0300, 30 Dec 07, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) medic, 396th Medical Company, 86th CSH, FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334, who related she responded to the detainment facility and transferred Mr. HAMDAN to the CSH. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) related she did not see any injuries on Mr. HAMDAN and that he was unresponsive during transport to the CSH.

About 0300, 30 Dec 07, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 396th Medical Company, 86th CSH, FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334, who stated he was notified at approximately 2219 to respond to the MDF for a patient. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he was unsure of what the exact details of the call were because his partner took the call and he just responded to her direction. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated when they arrived at the MDF Mr. HAMDAN was in a medical room on his side in the recovery position with fluid coming out his mouth. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated they placed Mr. HAMDAN on a litter and moved him to the ambulance. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he continued chest compressions for the short move, but when they reached the ambulance he stopped as he was the driver. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated they requested two guards accompany them in the ambulance and transported Mr. HAMDAN to the CSH. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated when they arrived at the CSH, the Emergency Room personnel took over.

About 0300, 30 Dec 07, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed SSG (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 89th Chemical Company, 3rd ACR, FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334, who provided a sworn statement wherein he detailed his knowledge of the incident.

About 0312, 30 Dec 07, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed PV2 (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 89th Chemical Company, 3rd ACR, FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334, who provided a sworn statement wherein he stated while he escorted the detainee from his cell to the medic to get screened, the detainee complained of stomach pain, hunger and then chest pain. PV2 (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated the detainee was moved into the medic room and life saving measures were performed.

About 0343, 30 Dec 07, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 89th Chemical Company, 3rd ACR, FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334, who provided a sworn statement. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he took Mr. HAMDAN from his cell to take him to see the medic before he was to speak with military intelligence. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated as he was taking Mr. HAMDAN to see the medic he started complaining his stomach was hurting. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated Mr. HAMDAN was taken to see the medic, whereupon, Mr. HAMDAN became ill and emergency life saving measures were performed.

I, **SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:
 When I returned from the CSH I went back to the medical office and saw the detainee on the floor with a medic taking the vitals. He started to dry heave. After that we picked him up and put him in the medical office on the stretcher and laid him down. We kept resuming to take his vitals. The vitals kept fluctuating up and down. The medic attempted to put MPH in the detainee's nose, but the detainee would refuse swallow making it impossible to do. To us it looked like the detainee was faking it because they do that a lot, but once he started to foam at the mouth and his heart rate when down, he stopped breathing and we knew it was serious. That's when the other medic came in and started to perform CPR. After a little while we moved him from the stretcher to the floor and continued with CPR. They tried to put the automated defib on the detainee but it would not register. We informed the CSH and when they came we were still performing CPR. Then we took him to the CSH.

The machine instructed no shock continue CPR. We continue CPR until Medics from the Combat Support Hospital came and they took over CPR. After they left we cleaned up and updated the detainee's chart.

I am a medic (68w) with Med Troop, Regimental Support Squadron, 3d ACR. I am currently working at the Mosul Detention Facility as a medic for 89th Chemical Co, Regimental Support Squadron, 3d ACR. At around 2150 a detainee was brought to me for a routine Military Intelligence screening. The detainee began to complain in Arabic so I asked him in English "what's wrong?" and he replied in english that he was hungry. Then he began speaking in Arabic and motioning to his head and chest. I went and got the interpreter and asked him to tell me what the detainee was saying. The interpreter said that the detainee was complaining of dizziness. Then the detainee began speaking in Arabic again. The detainee was complaining that he was having chest pains. I asked the guards that were escorting the detainee if he was showing any signs of problems on his way over to see me. They had replied saying that he was acting fine and that he was showing no signs of being in any pain. Then the detainee threw himself down on the ground and landed on his butt, hunched over, motioning to his chest, speaking in Arabic. The interpreter said the detainee was complaining of chest pains. We told the detainee to get up in Arabic and he did with some help from the guards. Then the detainee threw himself down on the ground again and landed on his back near a shelf. He then, what seemed to be purposefully, lifted his head up and then proceeded to bang his head against the shelf that he fell near. We then told him to get up in Arabic again. He did so with help from the guards but then threw himself down on the ground again and started to dry heave. I then went and got my blood pressure cuff and SpO2 monitor to check his vitals. At that time his pulse was 98 and his SpO2 was at 90. I could not get a manual blood pressure reading at that time. He conitued to dry heave and then he laid down on his back. I checked his vitals a few 30-60 seconds later and his pulse had dropped down to 48 and SpO2 was at 60. I was still unable to get a manual blood pressure reading. I then had him brought into my office and had moved onto the litter. I checked his vitals once more and they had gone back up. Pulse was at 60 and SpO2 was at 80 I then called one of my Physician Assistants and explained all of the above to him and I asked if I should just give him an IV and oxygen he said yes and to call back if there are any further problems. Immediately after I got off the phone with the PA the detainee started to foam at the mouth and his breathing sounded like he was snoring. At that time I had someone call for an ambulance to come over. I attempted an IV and was unable to get one started. I then notice he was becoming unresponsive at that time and did a sternal rub to get him to respond. I attempted another IV stick in his right hand and was successful. He was still unresponsive. I then noticed he had stopped breathing and started to do compressions, when Spc (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (68w) came into help. We had the guards bring him down off the litter to the ground so we could continue to do CPR on the detainee. As we were doing CPR we also got out the AED and hooked him up to the deffibulator. We could not get a reading on it and continued CPR. We checked for a pulse periodically and was unable to find one through out CPR. We were still doing CPR when the medics from the CSH had arrived at around 2245. One of the medics at that time checked for a pulse and could not find one either.  On 29 DEC 07 at approximately 2130hrs. I arrived at the Detention facility to relieve SSG **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** and his guards. When I entered the front (ECP) the gate guard, PV2 **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** mentioned to me that a detainee was being moved the CSH. I entered the front door and proceeded to the control office. I was told that two of my guards would escort the detainee **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** to the CSH. I then walked back to the front door with my two escorts. At that same time the detainee was being taken out of the facility. The detainee was then loaded into the ambulance and the two escorts rode with the detainee. I went back in to the control office to place the rest of my guards in their positions. At 2150, an MI and an interpreter arrived to interview detainee **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)**. I sent out two escorts, SPC **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** & PV2 **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** to the outside cell to retrieve the detainee **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** in order to have him screened by the medic (PFC **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)**). When my guards entered the building PV2 **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** asked me for the keys to side gate. At that point PV2 **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** mentioned to me that the detainee was complaining stomach pain. A few moments later PV2 **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** returned the keys and stated that the detainee was now complaining of being hungry. I placed the keys back in the key box and proceeded to talk to SGT **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)**. I started to hear the intrepter **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** speak in a loud voice. Seconds later PV2 **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** runs to the door of the control office and states that the detainee was hitting his head against the wall. I then went to the out into the hall by the medics office and saw the detainee seated on the floor. The guards were holding him up in the seated position. The medic (PFC **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)**) then attempted to get vitals off the detainee. The detainee started to dry hive and the medic was unable to place the cuff of the blood presature reader onto the detainee arm. Once the medic was able to place the cuff on, she still could not place the stefascope on his arm in order to read his vitals. The detainee would dry hive and move his arm slightly not allowing PFC **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** to listen to his pulse. She was able to place an oxygen reader on his finger and the readings would rise and fall. At this time the medic asked my guards to place the detainee on the gurney. She attempted to place a nose flange but, was unsuccessful. She mentioned that he was having trouble breathing. I went to the control office to inform my admin section about the situation. When I returned to the medic's office the medic me that the detainees vitals were dropping. She then told me to go and call the CSH and to send an ambulance. I then proceeded to the control office to make the call.

 I arrived at work about 2115, 29 Dec 07, and there was a lot of people dealing with a detainee that had passed out and was unresponsive. There was an ambulance at the detention facility that took that detainee to the hospital. Around 2215, 29 Dec 07, SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and I were told to go get detainee number (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) from outside cell number 7 and escort him to the medic to get prescreened. We escorted him from the outside cell to inside the facility. While we were getting the keys to the gate, detainee number (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) turned towards me and pointed to his stomach. I told him to tell the medic when he gets screened. We took the detainee to the medic, PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and I told her the detainee was pointing to his stomach as if something was wrong. The medic asked the detainee if his stomach was hurting, he said no, he was just hungry. The medic asked when the last time he had eaten and the detainee told him he last ate at dinner time. The detainee then started talking to the interpreter in Arabic and the interpreter told the medic the detainee said his chest was hurting. The medic had the interpreter ask a series of questions regarding his chest hurting. About the same time the detainee started acting like he could not stand on his own, SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) held the detainee by the arm to help him stand. The detainee fell to the ground like he had passed out, but his eyes were still open and he was still responsive to the medic. The medic told him to stand up and the detainee stood back up. The medic started asking more questions and the detainee fell to the ground again. The medic then started taking the detainee's vital signs and I went to tell the Military Intelligence soldiers the detainee was passing out and they said they would come back later and signed out. I walked back to the medic's office and the detainee was on a stretcher and the medic was attempting to put something in the detainee's nose. The detainee was resisting. The medic told me to go call the Physician's Assistant. The medic then told me to go call the ambulance because the detainee stopped breathing. I then went and opened up the big gates so the ambulance could drive into the facility. I then went and prepared my gear to ride in the ambulance with the detainee as an escort. I came back to the medic room and looked through the doorway and saw a second medic in the room and they were trying to revive the detainee by conducting CPR. I asked PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) if the detainee was still breathing and she told me no. By that time ambulance arrived, SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and I escorted the detainee to the FOB Diamondback CSH. During transport the medic in the ambulance continued CPR on the detainee. Once we arrived at the hospital, the medics from the hospital took the detainee and continued life saving measures. About 2256, 29 Dec 07, one of the doctors pronounced the detainee dead. At 2120 I (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) report to the front sally port of MDF (Mosul detention facility) as I do every work day. But on 29 December 2007 while reporting to the gate I was greeted by a group of my peers half from the previous shift and half from my shift. During which time I noticed that they were taking a detainee out on a stretcher, in order to place him into a medical vehicle. As the workers walked by me I notice that the detainee gave the thumbs up to his escorts as they put him into the medical vehicle. I turned in my weapon to the guard at the sally port and continued my way into the facility.

At approximately 2150 our command NCO told me and PV2 (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) to go and prepare number twenty five so he could speak to MI (military intelligence). I and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) walked into cell number seven to obtain the detainee as me and PV2 (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) entered the cell we noticed that the detainee had just finished using the restroom. Before we take a detainee to see MI we have to take him to see a medic. Before we got to the corner of the medic hall the detainee started saying that his stomach was hurting. I informed him that he could speak to a medic in a minute because we are on our way to take you there. When the medic viewed the detainee he started talking about how he was hungry and wanted something to eat. At this point I told the medic (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) that he must be just playing. There is no way he said his stomach hurts less than a minute ago and now he's hungry. At this time she and PV2 (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) agreed that this guy was just the pretending. Approximately two minutes later the detainee started to fall; at that point I laid my hands behind his head so he will not hurt himself because he hit his head against the wall after I sat him down on the floor. PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) proceeded to take his pulse during which time it started fluctuating. She then instructed me and the interpreter to place the detainee on her medical bed. Once the detainee was on the bed we all tried to call the PA and inform him of the situation. During this time the detainee started to spit up saliva, as a child would, PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) then started to give the detainee an IV first in the arm then in the hand. Then she noticed that the detainee was not breathing at this time she started CPR. Later another medic assisted in the procedure, during which time they had me and the interpreter laid the detainee on the floor. The medics then tried a deliberator but to no avail, five minutes later an ambulance rolled in and took the detainee away. Once the detainee arrived at the hospital he was the doctors worked to revive him, he was pronounced dead at 2255.

DETAILS

SCENE EXAMINATION: About 0344, 30 Dec 07, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) this office, conducted an examination of the medic room in the Mosul Detention Facility, FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334.

Characteristics of Scene: The Mosul Detention Facility was a single-story hard structure building, cement and metal type construction, which was utilized for a temporary detainee facility. The medic room was located in the detention facility. The medic room was approximately 20 feet long by 9 1/2 feet wide. The entry/exit (E/E) way was located in the east wall of the room. There was a ladder located in the southeast corner of the room. There were two wall lockers adjacent the ladder on the south wall. There was a table along the south wall in the south west corner of the room. There was another table along the west wall in the south west corner of the room. There was a refrigerator located in the north west corner of the room. There were two plastic shelving units located along the north wall. East of the shelving units was a metal filing cabinet along the north wall. East of the filing cabinet was a gurney in the north east corner of the room.

Condition of Scene: The medic room was clean and in order at the time of examination. The plastic shelving along the north wall contained various medical supplies. There was a television located on the north east corner of the table along the west wall. There was a chair located near the north east corner of the table along the south wall and there was another chair located on the south side of the plastic shelving along the north wall.

Environmental Conditions: The interior temperature was approximately 72 degrees Fahrenheit, and the outside temperature was approximately 42 degrees Fahrenheit. There was a strong odor of suspected pine sole during the scene examination.

Factors Pertinent to E/E: The Mosul Detention Facility could only be accessed via a locked gate under guard on FOB Diamondback. The entrance to the compound was located south of the facility. The medic room could be accessed via the E/E, which was located in the east wall and was constructed of metal.

Scene Documentation: SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) completed a crime scene sketch of the medic room. SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) exposed photographs of the scene utilizing a Nikon Coolpix, L11, digital camera with internal flash. (See Crime Scene Sketch and Photographic Packet for details)

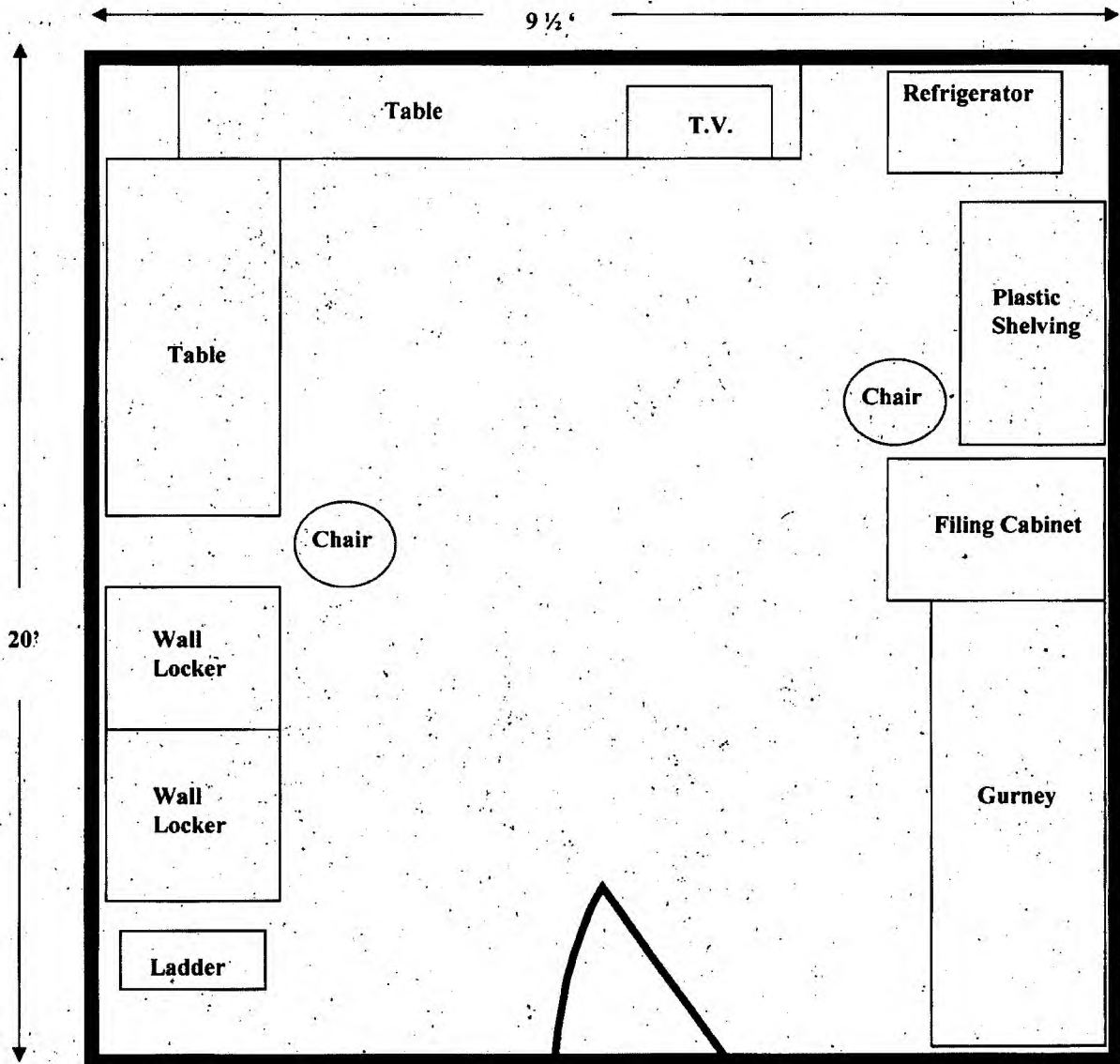

The teeth are in poor condition with several missing; injuries of the lower incisors are described below; however the sockets of missing molars are unremarkable, consistent with remote loss. The neck is straight, and the trachea is midline and mobile.

The chest is symmetric. The abdomen is protuberant. The genitalia are those of a normal adult circumcised male. The testes are descended. Pubic hair is present in a normal distribution. The back is symmetric. The buttocks and anus are unremarkable.

The upper and lower extremities are symmetric and without clubbing or edema. A plastic cuff with the number sequence "#1-03126" is secured around the right wrist. The fingernails are intact. Identifying marks consist of a tattoo (illegible pattern) on the left forearm; irregular scars on the left forearm (3 scars, 3/4" to 1" in greatest dimension) and left foot (3/4" in greatest dimension), and a 3/4" x 1/2" hyperpigmented macule on the right leg.

CLOTHING AND PERSONAL EFFECTS

No clothing items or personal effects are present on the body at the time of autopsy.

MEDICAL INTERVENTION

Medical intervention present on the body at the time of autopsy includes:

- Needle puncture mark, right subclavian region (with underlying soft tissue hemorrhage)
- Cluster of needle puncture marks, left subclavian region (with underlying soft tissue hemorrhage extending into the fascial planes of the anterior strap muscles of the neck)
- Cluster of needle puncture marks, left groin

RADIOGRAPHS

A complete set of postmortem radiographs is obtained and demonstrates the following:

- No fractures
- No foreign bodies

EVIDENCE OF INJURY

The ordering of the following injuries is for descriptive purposes only, and is not intended to imply order of infliction or relative severity. All wound pathways are given relative to standard anatomic position.

I. Blunt force injuries

The two central lower incisors are missing with fresh hemorrhage in the sockets. A 1.5 cm x 1 cm subgaleal hemorrhage covers a focal area of the right parietal region of the skull. Focal hemorrhage is in the soft tissues on the dorsum of the right wrist.

INTERNAL EXAMINATIONHEAD AND CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM:

(See Evidence of Injury)

There are no skull fractures. The dura mater is intact with no evidence of hemorrhage. The leptomeninges are thin and delicate. Clear cerebrospinal fluid surrounds the 1330 gm brain, which has unremarkable gyri and sulci. The cerebral hemispheres are symmetrical and the structures at the base of the brain, including the cranial nerves and blood vessels are intact. Coronal sections demonstrate sharp demarcation between white and gray matter, without hemorrhage or contusive injury. The ventricles are not enlarged. The basal ganglia, brainstem, and cerebellum are free of injury or other abnormalities. The atlanto-occipital joint is stable.

NECK:

(See Medical Intervention)

Layer-by-layer dissection of the anterior neck demonstrates that the strap muscles of the neck are homogenous and red-brown. The thyroid cartilage and hyoid are intact. The larynx is lined by intact white mucosa. The thyroid gland is symmetric and red-brown, without cystic or nodular change. The parathyroid glands are not identified. The major vessels of the neck are intact. The tongue is free of bite marks, hemorrhage, or other injuries.

The ribs, sternum, and vertebral bodies are visibly and palpably intact. No excess fluid is in the pleural, pericardial, or peritoneal cavities. The organs occupy their usual anatomic positions.

MUSCULOSKELETAL:

(See Evidence of Injury)

No non-traumatic abnormalities of the muscles or bones of the appendicular and axial skeletons are identified.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM:

The airways are clear of debris and foreign material and the mucosal surfaces are smooth, yellow-tan, and unremarkable. The right and left lungs weigh 450 and 420 gm, respectively. The external surfaces are smooth and deep red-purple. The pulmonary parenchyma is diffusely congested and edematous. No mass lesions or areas of consolidation are present. The pulmonary arteries are normally developed and patent. The diaphragm is intact.

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM:

The 360 gm heart is contained in an intact pericardial sac. The epicardial surface is smooth. The coronary arteries are unremarkable in distribution, with a right dominant pattern. Cross sections of the vessels show no luminal narrowing of the left main coronary artery, severe (greater than 75%) stenosis of the left anterior descending coronary artery, moderate (greater than 50%) stenosis of the left circumflex coronary artery, and moderate (greater than 50%) stenosis of the right coronary artery. The myocardium is homogenous, red-brown, and firm; the atrial and ventricular septae are intact. The valve leaflets are thin and mobile. The walls of the left ventricle, interventricular septum, and right ventricle are 1.5, 1.3, and 0.4-cm thick, respectively. The endocardium is smooth and glistening. The aorta gives rise to three intact and patent arch vessels. The renal, mesenteric, and iliac vessels as well as the venae cavae are unremarkable.

HEPATOBIILIARY SYSTEM:

The 1850 gm liver has an intact, smooth capsule and a sharp anterior border. The parenchyma is tan-brown and congested, with unremarkable lobular architecture. No mass lesions or other non-traumatic abnormalities are seen. The gallbladder contains 10 ml of green-black bile and no stones. The mucosal surface is velvety and green with yellow spots.

LYMPHORETICULAR SYSTEM:

The 170 gm spleen has a smooth, intact, red-purple capsule. The parenchyma is maroon and congested, with distinct Malpighian corpuscles. There is an enlarged cervical lymph node. Lymph nodes in the hilar, periaortic, and iliac regions are unremarkable.

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ENDOCRINE SYSTEM:

The pituitary gland is unremarkable. The thyroid gland has been described (see NECK, above). The right and left adrenal glands are symmetric, with bright yellow cortices and red-brown medullae. No masses or areas of hemorrhage are identified.

GENITOURINARY SYSTEM:

The right and left kidneys both weigh 130 gm. The external surfaces are intact and smooth. The cut surfaces are red-tan and congested, with uniformly thick cortices and sharp corticomedullary junctions. A black stone is recovered from the pelvis of the right kidney. The left renal pelvis and both ureters are unremarkable. White bladder mucosa overlies an intact bladder wall. The bladder contains less than 10 ml of clear urine. The prostate has lobular, yellow-tan parenchyma and is not enlarged. The seminal vesicles are unremarkable. The testes are free of mass lesions, contusions, or other abnormalities.

GASTROINTESTINAL TRACT:

The esophagus is intact and lined by smooth, gray-white mucosa. The stomach contains approximately 10 ml of brown viscous fluid. The gastric wall is intact. The duodenum, distal loops of intestine, and colon are unremarkable. The pancreas is firm and yellow-tan, with lobular architecture. No mass lesions or other abnormalities are seen. The appendix is present.

ADDITIONAL PROCEDURES

1. Documentary photographs are taken by OAFME staff.
2. Personal effects are released to the appropriate mortuary operations representatives.
3. Specimens retained for toxicology testing and/or DNA identification are: brain, liver, kidney, lung, spleen, heart, adipose tissue, urine, gastric contents, vitreous fluid, bile, blood, and psoas muscle.
4. The dissected organs are forwarded with body.
5. Trace evidence and/or foreign material are collected and retained by the attending Army CID agent.

OPINION

This Detainee, Isam Yunis Hamdan, died of atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease. Severe atherosclerosis of his coronary arteries was identified at autopsy. Non-lethal injuries, including a focal subgaleal hemorrhage, loose teeth, and hemorrhage in the soft tissues of the right wrist, may have been sustained from the struggle during the period when therapeutic measures were attempted. Toxicology tests for ethanol, screened drugs of abuse, carbon monoxide, and cyanide were negative. The manner of death is natural.

CYANIDE: There was no cyanide detected in the blood. The limit of quantitation for cyanide is 0.25 mg/L. Normal blood cyanide concentrations are less than 0.15 mg/L. Lethal concentrations of cyanide are greater than 3 mg/L.

VOLATILES: The **BLOOD AND VITREOUS FLUID** were examined for the presence of ethanol at a cutoff of 20 mg/dL. No ethanol was detected.
