This is an "Operation Iraqi Freedom" investigation.

This Corrected Final (C) Report was generated to document the limited distribution of Exhibits 14 thorugh 20 and to correct the order of Exhibits 10 and 11.
On 28 Jan 08, CPT Staff Judge Advocate, 3rd Brigade Combat Team (BCT), 101st Airborne Division (ABN DIV), Camp Striker, Iraq APO AE 09322 (CSTIZ), reported Mrs (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) Dwesat, Yusifiyah, Iraq, reported her son, Mr. FARHAN, was murgered by U.S. forces.
Investigation determined the offense of Murder did not occur as initially alleged by Mrs.  (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) Investigation determined significant discrepancies existed between all identified witnesses pertaining to the date, location and details of the incident. Mrs.  (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) related she witnessed a U.S. Soldier shoot and kill Mr. FARHAN in front of her residence around the fall of 2006 in the presence of two sisters. However, a review of Ms. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) medical records disclosed she was treated for an abdominal wound on 29 Apr 06 while Mr. FARHAN's death certificate listed his date of death as 3 Oct 06. Further, coordination with the Joint Operations Center, Multi-National Corps-Iraq, Camp Victory, Iraq, did not identify any military operation during either dates or locations as described by the alleged witnesses of the incident.  Investigation also determined although Mr. FARHAN's death certificate listed his cause of death as gunshot wound of the head and chest, Mr. FARHAN's death certificate was based on the word of a village representative provided to a medical officials several days after his death. The cause of Mr. FARHAN's death was unknown, and the manner of death was undetermined.

taking local nationals as a detainee was not an unit activity which would warrant SIGACT, however if the unit in question were fired upon or fired back for any reason at any given time, the engagement would be documented. MAJ (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated some SIGACTs may not have been recorded because the commander on the ground did not think it warranted a report and thus did not report the activity.

About 1220, 10 Mar 08, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and SA<sup>(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)</sup>Interviewed Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)Owesat, Iraq, and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) in Arabic through interpreter Mr. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) L3 Communications, Camp Slayer, Iraq. Mrs (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated her son, Mr. FARHAN, was murdered by an U.S. Soldier during a raid on their village. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) could not recall the date of the raid, but (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated it was the 17<sup>th</sup> day of Ramadan, 2006.. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated after dinner round 2100 to 2200 hours about 50 American Soldiers from five or six helicopters descended on her village to conduct a raid which the American's stated was to search for terrorists. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)stated her entire village was rounded up and taken out of their houses and her son, Mr. FARHAN, was singled out by two or three Soldiers to remove his clothes. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) further stated Mr. FARHAN was standing in front of a group of women and only removed his dishdashda because he was embarrassed. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) related the incident occurred outside of her residence in the village. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated the Soldiers then told her son to remove his underwear. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated her son asked, "and the underwear," and an American Soldier shot him in the chest and head. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) could not provide any distinguishing characteristics of the Soldier other than he did not have a beard and was Caucasian. When asked to describe the type of patches the Soldiers wore, Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated she was nearly blind and related it was very dark during the incident, but swore her son was killed right in front of her. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) did not provide much information on the raid in which her son was killed. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated all of the Soldiers wore ACUs and told the villagers they were looking for terrorists. Mrs (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) further stated all movements by the U.S. Soldiers were conducted at night. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) both stated two village women were injured when the Soldier killed Mr. FARHAN. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) did not know the names of the women, but (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he would find that information out. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) produced the original copy of her son's death certificate. Examination of the death certificate stated the cause of death was a gunshot wound to the head. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated the hospital doctor never saw the body of her son when generating the death certificate. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)stated because her son was killed on her property, his remains were never transported to a hospital. Mrs(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated the death certificate was issued without the issuing authority having ever seen the victim's body. Mrs.(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) further stated she did not know exactly where her son was buried other than he was buried in the village cemetery. Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)stated the victim's brother and uncles took his body to the cemetery about 5 kilometers upriver from PB Kemple and buried him.

About 1320, 10 Mar 08, SA collected an interview sketch from (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) provided which documented the location Mrs. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) house in relation to PB Kemple and the cemetery where Mr. FARHAN was buried. #### MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Claims at the Owesat CMOC

- On 05 December 2007 the Owesat CMOC accepted local nationals to prepare claims for an upcoming claims day by 3BCT 101<sup>st</sup> ABN(AA) JAG. Most of the local national claims are from the time period when 2-10MTN operated in the area of operations.
- 2. Due to tribal feuds the people of Owesat have no access to roads to the north and south. There is no medical care in the area and no way to produce death certificates. The local markets have a limited inventory because they can not get to Baghdad or Fallujah for replenishment and the people have no money to purchase cameras to document damages to their property.
- 3. We accepted people who had some documentation or witnesses to the event in which they were claiming. We understand that 3BCT 101<sup>st</sup> ABN(AA) JAG is the approving authority for claims and tried to convey this to the local nationals as they made their claim.





records disclosed she was treated for an abdominal wound on 29 Apr 06 while Mr. FARHAN's death certificate listed his date of death as 3 Oct 06. Further coordination with the Joint Operations Center, Multi-National Corps-Iraq, Camp Victory, Iraq, did not identify any military operation during either dates or locations as described by the alleged witnesses of the incident. Additionally, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(c) related although Mr. FARHAN's death certificate listed his cause of death as gunshot wound of the head and chest, Mr. FARHAN's death certificate was based on the word of a village representative provided to medical officials several days after his death. The official cause of Mr. FARHAN's death was unknown, and the manner of death was b)(6), (b)(7)(C) related due to the inability to located the remains of Mr. FARHAN, an exhumation undetermined. SA for Mr. FARHAN's remains was not possible. Due to the village being located in a hostile area and the lack of a functioning government, further interviews could not be conducted by this office. CPT opined due to the significant conflicting details significant discrepancies existed between all identified witnesses pertaining to the date, location and details of the incident, the investigation supported the offense of Murder did not occur as there was no credibly information to establish any criminality. CPT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) concurred Mr. FARHAN's manner of death was undetermined. Lastly, CPT (6)(6), (6)(7)(C) stated no other investigative activity was required by this office. ///LAST ENTRY///




