(U) INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

(U) This is an Operation Iraqi Freedom and a Detainee Abuse investigation.

(U) The Non-commissioned Officer in Charge (NCOIC) of the Brigade – Detainee Internment Facility (B-DIF), FOB Remagen, notified this office of a detainee abuse allegation.

(U) Investigation established probable cause to believe the death of AHMED was a justifiable homicide, in that the shooting was lawful and in accordance with the Rules of Engagement (ROE) in place at the time of the incident. The scene of the incident was a known point of origin for sniper fire, with specific intelligence data that a sniper team was operating in the area. Further, the unit was investigating gunshots at the time of the incident and their discovery of two Iraqi males at the scene matched the known Techniques and Procedures (TTP) for enemy sniper teams. (b)(6),(b) the On Scene Commander, reasonably believed AHMED was a threat based on his failure to comply with instructions, the inability to tell if he was armed due to his bulky clothing, his continually putting his hands into his pockets and his attempt to run from the scene. (b)(6),(b) said he was concerned AHMED was running to a stashed weapon or a trigger location for an Improvised Explosive Device. Other members of the unit also felt AHMED was a threat based on his lack of compliance and their inability to ascertain his intentions.

(U) Investigation established insufficient evidence to prove or disprove US forces committed a criminal offense as it related to $\binom{(b)(6)}{(b)(6)}$ allegation of abuse. Investigation indicated US forces used the level of force proportional to what they believed to be needed to subdue and apprehend $\binom{(b)(6)}{(b)(6)}$. There were indications of excessive force that does not rise to the level of a criminal assault; however, the investigation was initially impeded by lack of cooperation by members of the capturing team. The few Soldiers who agreed to be interviewed all denied wrongdoing or witnessing anyone assault $\binom{(b)(6)}{(b)(6)}$. The unit's translator stated after the discovery of the sniper rifles, a Soldier (NFI) began questioning $\binom{(b)}{(b)}$ and appeared to kick him and step on his back while questioning him.

About 0900, 11 Jan 06, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) conducted a screening interview of with the assistance of Mr. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Category II Interpreter, Titan Corporation.

About 1300, 11 Jan 06, SA(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) re-interviewed with assistance of (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) with assistance of (b)(7)(C) with statement that he was walking on the road when he was approached by his uncle(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)and his uncle's friend, Ahmed Salih Khtheer. His uncle supposedly asked to go with AHMED and help to retrieve two sniper rifles from the nearby marsh. The two men traveled to the location, found the rifles and were in the process of leaving the area when they were surprised by an American Patrol. When the first High Mobility Multi-purpose Wheeled Vehicle (HMMWV) pulled in, was sitting in the driver's seat and AHMED was about to get into the car. The lead HMMWV stopped and Soldiers dismounted. The Soldiers velled "Stop" "Stop" but AHMED decided to run while throwing the rounds from his packet. He was engaged by multiple shots and killed was ordered to get out of the car and walked around to the other side. The Soldiers told him to squat on the ground and then someone pushed him down and tied his hands with plasticcuffs. According to there were six Soldiers standing around him. The two Soldiers standing next to his head kicked him, twice on the left side and once on the right side. We stated the kicks were with the inner side of the foot. Afterwards the Soldiers discovered the two Dragonov sniper rifles inside of the vehicle's trunk and they began hitting (0)(0), (0)(7)(C) He stated after two minutes of beating he lost consciousness and did not wake up until about half an hour later. Later on he was escorted by two Soldiers to the last vehicle and placed in the rear right seat (b)(0, (b)(0)C) indicated that there were three Soldiers in that vehicle. The convoy moved out from the area but stopped after 15 minutes and one of the Soldiers took took but of the vehicle. The Soldier snapped three photos of the people. The convoy moved out again and stopped at another location where again the Soldiers attempted to identify by asking locals for identification. want to make the following statement under oath:

On Monday after I had breakfast I went to the farm at 8 o'clock with my helper (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) We were digging, fixing the water channel. About 10:30 a.m. I decided to go to (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)my Uncle^{(b)(0), (b)(7)(C)} house (mother's brother) like I described it in the sketch (house number 2). About half an hour into my walk I met my uncle (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (father's brother) and Ahmed Salih KHTHEER. My uncle asked me to go with Ahmed and bring back two sniper rifles. Ahmed knew the location. I got into the Ahmed's vehicle and we took the Alashaqy Road. By the way, my uncle told me to bring the two sniper rifles and meet him at 2:00 o'clock at the closed-up bridge. I set in the vehicle and Ahmed was driving. After about 10 minutes we reached the location where the sniper rifles were. Ahmed turned from right side of the road to the left side and then he asked me (after he stepped out of the vehicle) to drive in reverse to get closer to the rifles location. Then Ahmed went, got the two rifles and placed them inside of a trunk. Then he opened the right side door. At that moment the American Forces arrived. Ahmed took off running and started throwing the rifle bullets from his packet. The American Forces started yelling "Stop, stop!". When he did not stop the American Forces started shooting at him, deadly shots. Then one of the Soldiers asked me to get out the vehicle and go to the other side, away from the street side. The rest of the Soldiers were standing pointing their weapons at me. They asked me to sit on the ground and put my hands above my head. They were talking to me but I did not understand. Then they pushed me to the ground and tied my hand behind my back. Then they hit me on my face, the left side two times and on my right side one time. One of the Soldiers put his foot on my back, same Soldier who ordered the rest of the Soldiers (there was about six of them) to search the area. Then they opened the trunk of the vehicle and found the two sniper rifles. Then they started to hit me until I lost consciousness. Then they put me in the hummer and droved for fifteen minutes. After that they moved me out of the hummer and took three pictures. Then they put me back inside of the hummer and took me to the Wattban Street where they asked the public to identify me. But there was no one who could identify me. Then they took me to the base and this is my statement.

About 2200, 18 Jan 06, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), (b)(7)(F) coordinated with CPT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) CDR, C CO, 3-187 INF, FOB Brassfield-Mora, who provided statements previously rendered by (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C). (See statements for details)

About 0745, 19 Jan 06, SA^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)} interviewed SPC(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

690th Medical Company, FOB Brassfield-Mora, who rendered a sworn statement that the detainee (0,0,0,0) was brought straight to Aid Station and not to the holding cell as expected. (0,0,0,0,0) stated the detainee was undernourished and dressed in layers of wet, filthy clothes. When (0,0,0,0,0) inquired about the circumstances of capture the Soldiers who escorted the detainee told (0,0,0,0,0) that they came under fire and had engaged in a short fire fight which resulted in the death of the detainee's companion. The Soldiers remembered that the detainee had resisted and had to be "subdued" by force but did not provide explanation how it was done. (0,0,0,0,0) remembered that he asked the guard to remove the flexi-cuffs and had the detainee remove his clothing down to his underwear. He stated the detainee had several layers of clothing and he witnessed three rounds being found on him. The detainee's face had bruising, specifically discoloration around his left eye, a laceration near his left temple, broken skin over the bridge of his nose and few abrasions on his forehead. The detainee also had difficulty opening his mouth because of the swollen jaw. (See sworn statement for details)

DETAILS About 1632, 19 Jan 06, SA^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)} interviewed (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who rendered a sworn statement detailing how the patrol surprised the two Iraqi men acting suspiciously by the side of the road. When the first HMMWV pulled up, the vehicle (a blue sedan), was angled from the road with one man sitting in the driver's seat. The second man (AHMED) was down near the water. The lead HMMWV stopped and all four Soldiers dismounted. The only one who was left behind was (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) the turret gunner. The dismounted soldiers yelled "Stop" "Stop" and kept raising their hands up, to let the two men know what they want them to do. The man in the car did not move at first. The second man started to empty his packets and then began to run. b)(6), (b)(7)(C) engaged the man with a single shot and he fell down. The other man exited the car and stood there. The Soldiers kept yelling at him to put his hands up; however, he continued to keep his hands by his side and just stood there. He finally walked around to the other side as he was being told to do. The second man got up and began to run again and at that point the whole team engaged him with small arms fire. The Soldiers from the lead vehicle kept moving forward and apprehended the man by the car. At this point(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and b)(6), (b)(7)(C) checked on the man who had been shot and determined he was dead. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated did not see the other man putting up resistance when being apprehended by the capturing team. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) related when he turned his attention back to the first man, the man's hands were tied with flexi-cuffs. He stated a Soldier gave the detainee the keys to the car, backed him up to the trunk and ordered him to open it. When he fumbled and had problem with opening the trunk they moved him away and got access to the trunk by dropping the rear seats. Inside the trunk SGT(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) found two Dragonov sniper rifles and two loaded magazines. Afterwards the Soldiers did a sweep of the area and found 6 rounds and a lighter on the ground where they initially encountered the man. In the meantime the two lead HMMWVs had moved forward about 150 meters past the civilian car to provide front security. After about half an hour two Soldiers escorted the detainee to the fourth vehicle and placed him in the rear right seat. They placed the body of the other man in the trunk of the car and then towed the car. Since the area had been sealed off and all traffic on the road had been stopped the convoy moved down the road to pass about 30 cars. They stopped after 15 minutes and took the detainee out of the vehicle. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) ook three photos of the detainee and he and the translator went down the road showing the photos to the people in the cars. They stopped after about half an hour and the convoy moved out and proceeded to the fish market in the nearby city. One or more photos were taken there and again the Soldiers canvassed the crowd to positively identify the detainee. Afterwards the convoy traveled to FOB Brassfield-Mora. (See sworn statement for details)

AGENT'S COMMENT: (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) asked if SA(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) had a copy of the sworn statement he completed right after the incident took place. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated that the night after the shooting took place all the Soldiers from the first HMMWV were asked to complete sworn statements. He stated (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) collected the statements and told them he was going to combine them into one complete statement.

About 2200, 18 Jan 06, SA^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)}traveled with CPT(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Cdr, C Company (Co), 3/187 In, FOB BM, to his living quarters, where CPT^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)}provided SA^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)}with digital photographs taken of Mr.^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)} at point of capture.

AGENT's COMMENT: During the transfer of these photos to a USB drive, CPT (0,0,0,0) inquired in general about detainee abuse. The question was avoided, due to an inability to share information about other cases. Inquiries were made regarding what happens to Soldiers who are found to have committed detainee abuse. It was explained CID's role in the UCMJ process is to find and report facts, that the command prefers charges, and CID only titles individuals. CPT (0,0,0,0,0) was unfamiliar with the term "title", therefore a quick explanation was provided. CPT (0,0,0,0,0) he was unsure if anyone was titled to date in this case, but offered to travel to the TOC, where SA(0,0,0,0,0,0) and CPT (0,0,0,0,0) traveled to the TOC, where the report was read, confirming no one was titled to date. AGENT's COMMENT: 1LT (b)(0, b)(7)(C) stated after invoking his legal rights he had taken a law class in college and was told the best thing to do was say nothing. After photographing 1LT (b)(0, b)(7)(C) SA (b)(0, b)(7)(C) asked if the patrol manifest for the mission conducted 9 Jan 06 was in his possession, and if so, requested he provided it. 1LT (b)(0, b)(7)(C) stated he was unwilling to provide the roster without a "Court Order or Subpoena." SA (b)(0, b)(7)(C) explained the roster was not 1LT (b)(0, b)(7)(C) property, but instead part of an Army mission plan and record. SA (b)(0, b)(7)(C) informed 1LT (b)(0, b)(7)(C) of the differences between the civilian law concepts he was citing and military law; therefore this office had a right to receive a copy of the roster. 1LT (b)(0, b)(7)(C) again denied the request.



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About 1015, 19 Jan 06 SA^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)}coordinated with 1SG((b)(6), (b)(7)(C) C C Co, 3/187 In, FOB BM, who agreed to provide this office with the patrol manifest as soon as possible.

About 1018, 19 Jan 06, SA^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)} was approached by 1LT^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)} who asked if a Soldier had to provide personal information to this office. He was told they do have to provide the information, and he walked outside to a group of Soldiers, later known to be future interviewees, and stated "you have to tell him."

About 1059, 19 Jan 06, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) advised SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) C Co, 3/187 In, FOB BM, of his legal rights, which he invoked (See Non-Waiver Certificate of SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) for details).

About 1105, 19 Jan 06, SA^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)} interviewed CPL(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) C C Co, 3/187 In, FOB BM, who refused to answer any questions or say anything about the patrol on 9 Jan 06. CPL(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was reminded he was not suspected of detainee abuse, and was being questioned as a witness. CPL(b)(6), (b)(7)(C), although reminded he could be compelled to provide testimony in the future, still refused to speak on the matter, stating the unit was "very tight."

About 1124, 19 Jan 06, SA^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)} interviewed SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) C Co, 3/187 In, FOB BM, who refused to provide any information other than he saw nothing occur on the day of the alleged incident, but did remember the day. SPC^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)} stated he was a Radio Telephone Operator (RTO) and had to stay with the radios in the vehicle. SPC^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)} stated he saw nothing, although he was outside of the vehicle, but stated he had a bad memory when asked any detail whatsoever about the incident. SPC^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)} was reminded he could be compelled to provide testimony in the future.

AGENT's COMMENT: Immediately following the interview of SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) it became clear after multiple witnesses had refused to share any information, including operational information about the patrol not specifically related to the incident, someone or a group of people compelled these individuals to maintain their silence. At this same time, 1LT(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) approached SA(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) questioning why some Soldiers were being advised of their legal rights and some were not. It was explained not all of them were suspected of a crime, at which point he responded that they all should have been advised. SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) informed 1LT(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) unless an individual is suspected of committing an offense, it is not required to advise them of their legal rights.

About 1250, 19 Jan 06, SA^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)}interviewed SSG(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) C Co, 3/187 In, FOB BM, who rendered a sworn statement wherein he related he did not see the apprehension of

AGENT's COMMENT: SSG (0,0,0,0) seemed frustrated he was being interviewed regarding an incident about which he had already made a sworn statement as part of a Commander's Inquiry. SSG (0,0,0,0) was relatively cooperative, but stated he did not wish to be asked any questions about the apprehension of Mr. (0,0,0) He also expressed apprehension about making a statement when he did not know the exact words he put down on the first statement. As such, he did not wish to answer any questions on paper beyond a narrative statement. When asked if anyone was telling the Soldiers not to speak to us, SSG (0,0,0) stated he did not know, but he expressed a general concern younger Soldiers could be heavily influenced during an interview and was concerned their words could be twisted. SA (0,0,0) assured him this office did not intend to influence Soldiers or twist their words in any way.

About 1314, 19 Jan 06, SA ^{(b)(0, (b)(7)(C)} advised SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), C Co, 3/187 In, FOB BM, of his legal rights, which he invoked (See Non-Waiver Certificate of SGT ^{(b)(0, (b)(7)(C)}) for details).

AGENT's COMMENT: Initially, SPC (b)(0), (b)(7)(C) did not wish to share any information regarding the interview of Mr. b(0), (0)(7)(C) Assuming she was concerned about the classified nature of her job, she was assured this office had no interest in any intelligence related information gleaned from the interview, and that Mr b(0), (b)(7)(C) made an allegation he was abused at point of capture and efforts were being made to ensure he did not make the complaint prior to his arrival at FOB Remagen, IZ. SPC b(0), (b)(7)(C) again stated that she was unable to talk about it, citing she wished not to talk about it at all. She was informed her job was to interview people in the Army, and the results and content of those interviews, either in writing or in memory, are Army record. She again refused to cooperate. SA b(0), (b)(7)(C) was told to wait in the office in which she was being interviewed.

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SA^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)} immediately met with MAJ (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who stated words to the effect that "if people do not want to talk, they do not have to." Regarding the issue with SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) MAJ (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) took the same stance, stating she did not have to talk if she did not want to, even after an explanation that the interviews she conducts are Army record, just as are the interviews conducted by CID. The findings and content of those interviews are not personal property or personal knowledge, and sharing them with the Army is not optional. He continued to state he saw the issue differently. MAJ (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) proceeded to explain SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) should not have come to FOB BM and threatened people from the start with "titling" and that arriving like the "Gestapo" was not an effective investigative technique, and was why Soldiers were unwilling to speak. SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) saw no resolution or assistance coming from this argument, and left. Upon arrival back to the interview room, SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) apologized for her earlier insistence on not speaking and divulged information reference the interview of Mr.

SA^{(b)(0), (b)(7)(C)} was unaware of the basis for MAJ (b)(0), (b)(7)(C) allegations, as all interviews were cordial in nature, no one was threatened, and the word "titling" was never once said by members of this office, except when asked by CPT^{(0)(0), (b)(7)(C)} to define it.

AGENT's COMMENT: SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) is the brother of CPL (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) C Co, 3/187 In, a Soldier who was on the patrol during the incident under investigation.

About 1630, 19 Jan 06, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), C Co, 3/187 In, FOB BM, who refused to provide any information regarding the incident other than "nothing bad happened," and the two "Dragunov's were real clean," referring to the two sniper rifles found at point of capture. PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) also stated he was not close to the scene and had a poor memory. PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) had no response when asked how he could remember the cleanliness of a rifle, implying he looked inside of it, without being close to the point of capture, or how he remembered the cleanliness of a rifle but does not remember much more significant events, such as the killing of an insurgent and the capture of Mr. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was informed he could be compelled to provide testimony in the future.

AGENT's COMMENT: Before the interview began, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) went into the hallway of the TOC to bring PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) in for interview. SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated to him "Hi, my name is PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) responded in question with "Where do I sign so I don't have to talk?"

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About 2045, 19 Jan 06, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) briefed LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) on all aspects of the investigation. Also present for the meeting were MAJ (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and CSM (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) HHC, 3/187 In, FOB BM. LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) expressed concern Soldiers were threatened with "titling" during interview, which may have caused the lack of cooperation. Additionally, LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he thought these investigations were done to supplement previously conducted Commander's Inquiries and to "collect statements."

AGENT's COMMENT: During the meeting, MAJ (0,0,0) stated CID conducted a bad ' investigation, used bad tactics, and repeatedly ignored his counsel. He also stated this office should have advised the witnesses of their legal rights and that he had taken multiple statements in the past where Soldiers were advised and offered full confessions. Although MAJ (0,0,0) stated rights advisements are of constant necessity, Soldiers who were suspected of detainee abuse due to the allegation of Mr. (0,0) were not advised of their legal rights during the Commander's Inquiry, which according to unit personnel, was a complete, thorough, and legally acceptable investigation. SA (0,0,0) stated witnesses to this incident did not have to be advised and would not be advised. MAJ (0,0,0) was unruly and attempted to instigate an argument, prior to LTC (0,0,0) telling everyone to be quiet. Additionally, the topic of photographing all individuals interviewed was brought up. At that time, CSM (0,0,0) stated he had pictures of all Soldiers in the Bn in the event they were killed in action and would provide those photos to this office. The meeting ended with a discussion and explanation of the titling process. Overall, LTC (0,0,0) (0,0) expressed the desire to have a strong working relationship with CID now and in the future.

AGENT's COMMENT: During this incident, having a confrontation with $1LT_{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)}^{(b)(7)(C)}$ was seen as unnecessary, due to his Commander, CPT being less than 10 feet away at the time. CPT did not intervene, nor did multiple officers senior to $1LT_{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)}^{(b)(7)(C)}$ in the immediate area. Unknown at that time, two interviewees, a Soldier and an Iraqi National translator, were in the same area awaiting interview.

Mr(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he had only been on patrols with C Co since mid-Jan 06, and was not the interpreter present during the incident in question. Mr. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) identified the interpreter present during the mission as a man nicknamed (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who was on leave at the time.

About 2155, 19 Jan 06, MAJ(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) approached SA(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and SA(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) in the Bn HQ foyer and began yelling, apparently angry about Soldiers being photographed. MAJ(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) yelled words to the effect of "You bastards are a bunch of dirty ass weasels!" At this time, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) responded with "I'm leaving now," and SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) responded with words to the effect of "that is not right, sir." On Monday, coincide Jan-09-2006 went out for duty after 10:00 AM while we were in the rural area where the homes were scatter here and there. While we were traveling on the dirt road we ran into a car parked on the road where no other vehicle traveled on. Wherever the other vehicles were traveling on pebble road the vehicle which we surprised was taking the other road. Suddenly we stopped wherever I was in the last hummer. Our convoy was made of four vehicles. When we stopped, the one in charge asked me to step out of the vehicle quickly and go with him. We stepped out of vehicle and started running for about100-200 meters until we reached the first vehicle in the convoy. When we reached the first vehicle I saw a man laying face forward. He was 20 years of age or more. When I got there I saw one of the Soldiers had his knee on his back and he was tying his hands behind his back with the flexi cuffs. The Soldier in charge asked me to talk to him and ask him his name, his address and the reason he was there. Before we reached there the other soldiers they found three bullets on the ground while in the process of asking him he did not answer anything. Then I asked him "Are you Iraqi or from different country?" I understood he was Iraqi but I did know his name. Then I asked him if he had any weapons on him. He answered me by signaling he had. We did not know what kind of weapon he had but he had signal at the vehicle as the location where weapon is. The person I was talking to was in very exhausted shape, he did not make any movement without our help. When he signaled there is weapon in the vehicle the Soldier in charge asked us to stay 25 meters from the vehicle. Then he asked that person opens the trunk while his hand tied behind his back. He tried but failed to open the trunk. One of the Soldiers folded the back seat down and saw that there were two Sniper Rifles inside, complete with scope and ammo. When the Soldiers saw the sniper weapons they became very alert and suspicious. They did not know he had this kind of weapon. The sniper weapon is considered one of the most danger weapons for their safety. Then one of the Soldiers came toward him and lay him on the ground face first. He was hitting him on his shoulder and asking with laud and rough voice if there was anyone near the vicinity with same kind of weapon or different type of weapon. What was the reason to have this kind of weapon and how did they came to this area. He continued questioned him for about one minute or more. He was hitting him with the bottom of his boots on his shoulder and his back. I told the Soldier in charge that this was not a good way to obtain any information. I ask the one who is in charge to un-tied his hands. When they did I started cleaning of his face. I was using his head cover (shmagh) he had it in the vehicle where I dunked it in the channel to our left. This channel is very dense with bamboo and grass. Then I brought him a bottle of water from the hammer and gave him some. Then I started rubbing his hand and moving them. Then I gave him a piece of paper and pen, this way he could write his name, his address and reason for being at this location. He did not say a word. During the questioning we learn his name was (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (b)(6)(b) and the weapons were put here two days ago. Today he was picking them up but we did not know where he wanted to take them. Also we found out he was a Ramadi resident in the AL Unbar Province. Then one of the Soldiers asked me to write down his name, make of the vehicle and the



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license plate. The license plate showed that those were temporary plates from the Alan Bar province. I wrote this info in the Soldiers notebook. Then he asked me to write his name on a piece of paper in Arabic and English. Then the Soldier put that piece of paper on his chest near the left side of his face and took his picture. Then the Soldier asked me to go with him. We went down to the main traffic road where there were approximately 30 vehicle stopped. We showed the picture to all passengers but no one knew him. That took us about one hour. Then the Soldiers tied the vehicle behind the humvee and they towed it. Also they put this person in the one of the humvees while his hands were tied behind his back.

SUBJECT: Commander's Inquiry to C/3-187IN AIF Shooting on 09JAN06

1. The following are the facts of the C/3-187IN actions on 09JAN06:

On the morning of 9 Jan 2006 1/C/3-187IN was conducting mounted and dismounted patrols in the Canal Road area of TF Iron's Area of Operation. They were in this area looking for a local national who had information on an IED blast that had occurred on 8 Jan 2006. At approximately 1230 on 9 Jan 2006 the platoon responded to two shots fired approximately 800m north along Canal Road, vicinity 38S LC 9628 7665. The platoon mounted their vehicles and moved north to where the gunshots originated from. The patrol was traveling north along the low road beside the canal when the patrol moved up to the road on the top of the dike they encountered a blue Nissan Primera car and two military aged, local national males. One male was seen throwing a white bag into the canal. The lead military vehicle stopped approximately 10-25 meters from the vehicle. The crew dismounted and began to yell and gesture for both men to put their hands up and stop what they were doing. The first male attempted to flee the scene in the Nissan Primera but, the vehicle became stuck in the mud. He then exited the vehicle, moved to the rear of the vehicle and began to obey the directions of the soldiers. The second male was backing away from the soldiers continually reaching into his pockets and dropping items onto the ground (these items were later identified as 7.62mm x 54 rounds). The four soldiers and the vehicle gunner (10) (6)

b) (6) continued to yell and gesture with their weapons for the second male to stop and raise his hands. The second male continued to reach into his pockets and drop items on the ground. He then turned his back to the four soldiers and began to run north, away from the soldiers. At this point, (b)

engaged the second man with one shot. The man fell down and the soldiers shifted their attention to the first man who was standing at the back of the blue Nissan. The second man got up and continued to run. At this point all four soldiers engaged the man (b) (6) ordered two soldiers to move forward to detain the first man at the back of the car. After the man was detained,

(b) (6) and another soldier move forward to inspect the man who had been shot. After confirming that the man was no longer a threat to them, the patrols established local security and reports were called to their higher elements. A search of the blue Nissan Primera was conducted and two Dragonov SVD style sniper rifles were found in the trunk of the vehicle. Also found were two loaded magazines and loose rounds of 7.62mm x 54 ammunition. The platoon then cordoned off the area and began to question locals and the one detainee. The locals in the area had nothing significant to say to the patrol. The detainee told the soldiers he was from Ramadi and the license plates on the blue Nissan confirmed his story. The platoon exfilled back to FOB Brassfield-Mora with one detainee, one enemy KIA, two Dragonov rifles, ammunition and the blue Nissan.

2. The following are the findings of the C/3-187IN AIF Shooting on 09JAN06:

All of the soldiers stated that during their RIP operations with C/3-69AR, they were told that in the vicinity of Combat Outpost 1, Canal Road, and the Haji Man trail area that there was an active sniper or sniper team (exhibits 1-6). (b) (6) stated that the sniper attacks on the Combat Out Posts

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happened between mid morning and early afternoon (exhibit 1). This situation fits the profile of the sniper/sniper team active in the AO. According to (b) (6) the platoon leader for 1/C/3-187IN, two weeks prior to this incident he had two soldiers engaged by sniper fire from the same area in question (exhibit 5). The presence of a sniper or sniper team was also confirmed by (b) (6) and (b) (6) from the Sniper Section HHC/3-187IN. Both soldiers stated that during their RIP with the Sniper Section from HHC/3-69AR the outgoing unit briefed them about sniper activity in the area around the Haji-man Trail area (exhibits 2, 3) (b) (6) both stated that they were in the area to look for friendly sniper hide sites to prevent enemy sniper operation in the area (exhibits 2, 3). A reasonable conclusion is that the soldiers operating in this area would be looking for a one or two man element, the composition of a known sniper/sniper team associated with single shots of gunfire. This is what multiple units during the RIP operation had briefed to the soldiers of 3-187IN.

In (b) (6) sworn statement (exhibit 1) he stated that the two military aged men were "surprised to see us" and one immediately tried to flee the scene by car. This was also substantiated by the other soldiers present in the lead vehicle (exhibits 2-6). When the car became stuck in the mud the local national exited his vehicle and started to take commands from the soldiers. The second man was seen throwing a white bag of unknown contents into the canal when the patrol encountered the two men (exhibits 1-4). The second man continued disobeying the orders of the soldiers and acted in a "nervous manner" (exhibits 2, 4). This second man also continued to reach into his pockets multiple times. The soldiers stated that the man's clothing was baggy (exhibits 1, 2) or he had multiple layers of clothing on (exhibit 4) and it was hard to tell if the man was armed with a weapon. At this point, there was one local national who tried to flee complying with the soldier's commands and the other local national who continued to distance himself from the patrol, all the while digging in the pockets of his baggy clothing that the soldiers are unable to tell if he was armed. It is reasonable to assume that the soldiers in this situation would deem the non compliant man as a threat based on his lack of compliance to their directives and the soldier's inability to ascertain if the man was armed or not based on his baggy clothing.

The second man then turn his back and ran towards the north (exhibit 7). When the second man ran he was blocked by the blue Nissan (exhibit 3) as he was headed towards the reeds along the canal (exhibit 5). This is when (b) (6) engaged the second man with one round. The man fell to the stated that he didn't know if the second man was running to retrieve a weapon or ground. (b) (6) to get help (exhibit 1) and he deemed the actions of the second man hostile to him and his soldiers. also states that he was fearful of the second man "going for his weapon" (exhibit 5). (b) (6) made the decision as the On Scene Commander (OSC) that the second man's actions were a threat to him and his unit and used proportional force (one shot) to eliminate the threat. The second man got up and continued to flee. This is when(b) (6) and the three other soldiers engaged the second man running. This use of force is in accordance with the Division Office of the Staff Judge Advocate (DIV OSLA) Information paper discussing the right to self defense and determination of hostile intent (exhibit 8). The information paper states that the OSC is the approving authority for "reactive fire, including organic and non- organic weapons systems" (exhibit 8). In Annex E (rules of Engagement) to Operations Order 02-06 (RIP), 3BCT, 101st ABN DIV (AASLT) Hostile Intent is defined as: "when hostile intent is present, the right exists to use proportional force, including armed force, in self-defense by necessary means available to deter or neutralize the potential attacker or, if necessary, destroy the threat." (exhibit 9). In determining what constitutes hostile intent the soldier must be able to tie the AIF activity in the AO to specific enemy TTPs (exhibit 8). In the sworn statements, the soldiers all articulated that there was specific intelligence and historical data to support the presence of a sniper team in the AO. The two men in this instance were located by a known historical point of origin of sniper fire, and the area of two single shots that caused the platoon to move to the location in question that morning. The two men matched the description of an AIF TTP for a sniper team. Therefore the determination of hostile intent can be made by a reasonable person. 3. Recommendations by the Investigating Officer (IO) in reference to the findings of the C/3-187IN AIF Shooting on 09JAN06:

Based on my findings, the use of deadly force was lawful and within the Rules of Engagement. I recommend no further administrative or UCMJ action against (b) (6) for any other soldier. Also recommend that C/3-187IN continue to review and discuss Rakkasan ROE before each operation and continue to apply deadly force in situations IAW Rakkasan ROE and EOF guidance as done in this case.

1230: 1/C/3-187 IN responded to audible shots to their north. Driving up a canal road, they came upon two Iraqi males standing beside a Blue Nissan Primera.

1231: One of the men threw a white bag into the canal and began emptying his pockets. The leady vehicle stopped, and the TC dismounted and canad shouted "Hands up!" and made the motion for hands up. The man who had thrown the bag turned and began to run.

1232: The TC shot him with his M4, and he fell to the ground. The other Iraqi attempted to drive away, but the vehicle quickly got stuck. He stepped out of the vehicle and stood next to the door shaking. The injured Iraqi got back up and tried to evade the patrol at which point all occupants of the lead vehicle engaged and killed him.

1235: The platoon apprehended the other Iraqiand established security around the site (LC9623476762).

1236: The dead and live suspects were searched and six 7.62 x 54R rifle rounds were found among them. In the vehicle's trunk, the searching element discovered two Dragonov sniper rifles, well-lubed and in excellent condition, two magazines with 20 rounds, and one high-power scope.

1240: Approximately 30 to 40 vehicles in the vicinity were then cordoned off, and the occupants questioned regarding the identity of the detainee. None of the locals said they knew him. The detainee said he was from Ramadi and his license plates (#49842) were from Al Anbar, confirming his story.

1250: 1/C/3187 exfilled to the north along a different route than their infil, towing the Nissan and enemy KIA back to FOB Brassfield-Mora. The detainee is undergoing screening and tactical questioning.

About 1015, 3 Apr 06, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) met with LTC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and CSM (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and briefed them regarding the intended interviews of the members of the capture team.

About 1050, 3 Apr 06, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), (b)(7)(F) , interviewed PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) C CO, 3-187 INF, FOB Brassfield-Mora, who provided a sworn statement denying any involvement or knowledge of anyone abused the detainee. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he was performing duties as a gunner during the incident; however, he did not have line of sight to the car or the detainee in question. (See sworn statement for details)

About 1205, 3 Apr 06, SA(b(6), (b(7)(C) and SA(b(6), (b(7)(C) interviewed CPL(b(6), (b(7)(C), who provided a sworn statement wherein he stated was the gunner of the third vehicle in a convoy of four. (b(6), (b(7)(C) stated he heard shots fired once the convoy came to a halt and the vehicle Commander told him to face the rear and pull security, as the last vehicle was unable to get on the elevated road where the rest of the convoy was halted. (b(6), (b(7)(C) added he did not witness the abuse of any detainees. (See sworn statement for details)

About 1330, 3 Apr 06, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and SA(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed who provided a sworn statement wherein denying any involvement or knowledge of anyone abused the detainee. AGENTS COMMENT: (b(0, b)(7)(C)) mentioned that he and the rest of the members of the capture team were upset and angry over learning that CID was investigating allegations that someone on the team had abused the detainee. When asked why most of the members of the capturing team initially refused to be interviewed, (b(0, b)(7)(C)) stated words to the effect "we basically said we were not going to tell these dicks anything".

About Jan 06, SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and I were involved in mounted recon mission with 1st Platoon, C CO, 3-187, to look for possible sniper hide sites. We were riding in the back seats of the first truck. We were going to recon a specific area based on the previous unit taking sniper fire from that area. They gave us the pamphlet and all the information they had. They had collected brass at a possible enemy sniper position. Right before we turned north on Hajiman Trail we heard two to three shots from the north. It sounded like a bolt-action rifle, indicating a sniper rifle. All I knew was that the possible enemy sniper location was north of where we were at the time. We drove up the road to where the pamphlet indicated the sniper position was. I pointed it out to SSG^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)}, who was in the truck that we were riding. There was no one there. There were two roads running parallel. One road was low and one road was high, on top of a berm, maybe five meters higher than the lower road. We were on the lower road at the time and SSG (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said let's check the top road. There was a path going from the lower road up to the higher road about 30 meters north of where we were stopped. We drove up the path onto the high road and immediately saw a vehicle off to the right side of the road and two guys in the road to the left of the vehicle. The vehicle was 50-75 meters north from the point where we pulled up onto the high road. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who was the gunner, starting yelling down to all of us in the vehicle that the guy on the left threw a bag in the river. We floored it and tried to get to them as soon as possible. We stopped about ten meters from them. The guy on the left was messing with his pockets, throwing stuff out of his pockets. The second guy just froze up. We got out and pointed our weapons at them. I gestured to them to put their hands up and stop moving. Me, SSG^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)} and SGT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) started walking toward them. During this whole time the guy on the left looked like he was getting more frightened and scared. He was messing with his pockets and backing up slowly. When we were about five meters away from them, the guy who had been messing with his pockets turned around and started running. He was still messing with his pockets. The first guy that was shot got up and started running again. Still not knowing what his intentions were. and because we could not see his hands, (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and I opened fire. We fired about eight to ten rounds, until he went down. We bounded up to his location and checked him for signs of life, but he was dead. I think it was me and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) that moved up to him. SSG (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) may have came to. I am not sure. We turned our attention to the other guy. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) had him covered and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) from our HMMWV, also had him covered. He was sitting there and seemed to be in shock. Someone said later that he tried to go around and get into the vehicle but I do not recall that. It happened so fast. When I turned around he was sitting by the right rear tire of the car. We gestured for him to get up and moved him away from the vehicle. Someone else flexi-cuffed him, but I am not sure who. At that point there were a lot of guys running up to us. I opened the front and back doors on the right side of the car and started looking around in the vehicle. Someone might have gone on the left side too, but I am not sure. I got up from searching the car and told the detainee we needed the keys. He just looked at me. Either somebody already had the keys or they were in his pockets. Someone handed me the keys and I put them into the detainee's hands, which were behind his back. I pulled him over to the trunk and told him to open it. I did this because of possible IED in the trunk. I told everyone to back up and let him open the trunk. The detainee tried to get the keys into the trunk but could not get them into the lock. I grabbed the keys and put them into the lock and then he tried to unlock it, but it would not open. He was just standing there, kind of limp and leaning against the trunk. Seeing that it did not work, I went over there and tried to turn the key and it would not open. SSG^{(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)}said to try to get in through the back seat so I folded the back seat down and stuck my head into the trunk. I immediately saw the two Dragonov rifles. I reached in and handed one of them out and then reached back in and got the other one. I handed it off to someone else and then I went back into the trunk and continued searching it. I was in the back seat with my upper torso leaning into the trunk area. When I finished searching the trunk and got out of the car the detainee was standing in the road by the car.

DETAILS

About 1600, 1 Sep 06, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) conducted face to face coordination with CPT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who opined there was insufficient evidence to prove or disprove US forces committed a criminal offense as it related to (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) allegation of abuse.

INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY: Investigation established US forces used the level of force proportional to what they believed to be needed to subdue and apprehend the Investigation revealed indications of excessive force that does not rise to the level of a criminal assault. The investigation into the alleged abuse was significantly impeded however, by the initial lack of cooperation by almost all members of the capturing team, including potential suspects and witnesses alike.

Investigation established the shooting of AHMED was lawful and in accordance with the ROE in place at the time of the incident. (0,0,0,0,0) the On Scene Commander (OSC) initially shot AHMED once, knocking AHMED to the ground. AHMED got back to his feet and (0,0,0,0,0) and several other members of the unit shot him again, resulting in his death. (0,0,0,0,0) reasonably believed AHMED was a threat based on AHMED's failure to comply with instructions, AHMED continually placing his hands into his pockets, the inability to tell if AHMED was armed due to his bulky clothing and AHMED's attempt to run from the scene. (0,0,0,0) stated he was concerned AHMED was running to a secondary sniper position, a stashed weapon or the trigger location for an IED.

Other members of the unit echoed (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) concerns and stated they also felt AHMED as a threat based on his lack of compliance and their inability to ascertain his intentions when he began running. The scene of the incident was a known historical point of origin for sniper fire, with specific intelligence data that a sniper team was operating in the area. Further, the unit was investigating gunshots at the time of the incident and their discovery of two Iraqi males at the scene matched the known Anti-Iraqi Forces (AIF) Tactics, Techniques and Procedures (TTP) for two-man sniper teams. ///LAST ENTRY///
