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“This is an Operation Iraqi Freedom Investigation.”

The 96TH Military Police Battalion (MP BN), Camp Cropper, Baghdad, Iraq APO AE 09342 (CCI) reported the death of a detainee.

Investigation disclosed Mr. ABBASS AL ZUBAIDI was found in his cell unresponsive and not breathing, and was pronounced deceased at 0250, 8 Oct 06. An autopsy conducted by the Office of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner revealed Mr. ABBASS AL ZUBAIDI died as a result of hypertensive and arteriosclerotic cardiovascular disease and the manner of death was natural. The results of this investigation were consistent with their findings.

About 0320, 8 Oct 06, this office was notified by SGT **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** Headquarters and Headquarters Company (HHC), 96<sup>TH</sup> Military Police Battalion (MP BN), Camp Cropper, Baghdad, Iraq APO AE 09342 (CCI) that Mr. Najim Mohammed ABBASS AL ZUBAIDI, Internment Serial Number (ISN) US **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** had died inside Bravo Block, Special Housing Unit (SHU), Camp Remembrance II Internment Facility, CCI.

About 0435, 8 Oct 06, SA **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** interviewed MAJ **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** Officer in Charge (OIC), Detainee Medical Clinic (DMC), 21<sup>ST</sup> Combat Support Hospital (CSH), CCI concerning Mr. ABBASS AL ZUBAIDI. MAJ **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** stated she had spoken with Mr. ABBASS AL ZUBAIDI the morning of 7 Oct 06 concerning the reason he was in the SHU and why he was on medication. MAJ **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** stated she informed Mr. ABBASS AL ZUBAIDI that he was in the SHU and on medication because he had active Tuberculosis (TB). MAJ **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** stated he was being treated for TB with Isoniazid, Rifampin, Pyridoxine, Ethambutol, Pyrazinamide, and an Albuterol inhaler. MAJ **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** stated Mr. ABBASS AL ZUBAIDI had no other known medical conditions.

About 0536, 8 Oct 06, SFC **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** Bravo Company (B CO) 181 Engineers (ENG), CCI, took custody of the body to transport to the Inprocessing Holding Area (IHA), CCI.

About 0605, 8 Oct 06, SA **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** coordinated with MAJ **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** and obtained copies of Mr. ABBASS AL ZUBAIDI's medical records. (See Medical Records for details)

CPT **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** stated that medical personnel were performing life cardio pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and an intravenous line (IV) was already started on the detainee when he arrived. CPT **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** stated he instructed CPT **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** to intubate the detainee and was informed by CPT **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** that CPR had been performed for approximately 13 minutes prior to his arrival. CPT **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** stated he took over CPR for approximately the last minute or so before pronouncing the detainee dead at 0250, 8 Oct 06 with a preliminary cause of death as cardio pulmonary arrest. CPT **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** stated that life saving measures included CPR, intubation, and administering Epinephrine and Atropine.

The detainee's eyes were shut and his cell seemed to be orderly. At 0236, medical arrived and began taking there required actions. I was instructed by MAJ b(6), b(7)(C) to contact the trauma unit and did so at the Command Post. It was at this time that my fellow guards and I remained at a distance to allow the medical team ample room to work. At 0245, the trauma team arrived and assisted the already present medical team and at 0251 we were notified that the detainee was pronounced dead. My staff and I continued normal operations within the block and assisted the MP's which were on site at 0300 by briefing them on the events that took place. At 0404, CID arrived to investigate and at 0545 the body of detainee b(6), b(7)(C) was transported offsite by SFC b(6), b(7)(C) b(6), b(7)(C)

On Sunday, 8 Oct 06, approximately 0235, we received a call at the DMC from the SHU stating there was a detainee that was unresponsive with no pulse and was not breathing. Myself, SGT b(6), b(7)(C) CPT b(6), b(7)(C) and MAJ b(6), b(7)(C) responded. Upon arrival on the scene, I entered the cell to find an elderly detainee lying on his bed. I checked for responsiveness with no response to verbal or painful stimuli. I checked for a pulse and respirations of which I found neither. At that time, we moved him to the floor where I began chest compressions and CPT b(6), b(7)(C) began respirations with a bag valve mask. SGT b(6), b(7)(C) started IV with normal saline, 18 gauge catheter was used in left AC at which time we moved the detainee to the hallway for better light and more room to work. CPT b(6), b(7)(C) arrived on the scene with Epinephrine, Atropine and an intubation kit at which time CPT b(6), b(7)(C) successfully intubated the detainee. CPT b(6), b(7)(C) ordered EPI and ATROPINE IV push. AED was placed on detainee. After analyzing, there was no shock advised. CPR continued and at 0251, 8 Oct 06, CPR was stopped and the detainee was pronounced dead. All interventions were left in place b(6), b(7)(C)

 On Sunday, 8 Oct 06, approximately 0230, I was visiting the Detainee Medical Clinic in the course of my duties when the clinic personnel were informed that a detainee in the SHU, ISN <sup>b(6), b(7)(C)</sup> was found by the guards not breathing and without a pulse. I, with MAJ <sup>b(6), b(7)(C)</sup> SGT <sup>b(6), b(7)(C)</sup> and SPC <sup>b(6), b(7)(C)</sup> went to the SHU and arrived about 0234. In the cell, the detainee was assessed and noted to be apneic (not breathing) and without a carotid pulse. All personnel donned protective equipment (masks and gloves) by this time. The detainee was not responsive on efforts to raise him and was moved to the floor of his cell to facilitate control of his airway and breathing and in case CPR needed to be performed. His airway did not improve with a jaw thrust maneuver. It was also noted on observation of his bed that he had been incontinent of urine. Artificial respiration was provided by myself with a bag-valve mask. No pulse was present and at the direction of MAJ <sup>b(6), b(7)(C)</sup> CPR was initiated at about 0237. After 1 minute of CPR, no spontaneous breathing or pulse was noted so bag-valve mask and CPR were continued. The Emergency Room personnel were contacted for additional equipment, support and transport if needed. Due to very limited space and light availability in the room, the decision was made by the team to move the detainee into the corridor. During this time frame a number of events occurred: intravenous access was obtained; CPL <sup>b(6), b(7)(C)</sup> brought a crash cart with additional equipment; at about 0245 CPT <sup>b(6), b(7)(C)</sup> and PFC <sup>b(6), b(7)(C)</sup> arrived from the 21<sup>ST</sup> CSH ER; the patient was intubated and an endotracheal tube; the position of the tube was verified by auscultation (listening to stethoscope) and an end-tidal <sup>b(6), b(7)(C)</sup> CO<sup>2</sup> monitor at about 0247; an automatic defibrillator was placed but no shock was advised to perform, most likely indicative no heart electrical activity; no pulse or spontaneous breathing were noted at this point; the pupils were fixed and dilated at about 6mm in diameter. In addition, during this time, 2-3 doses of atropine and epinephrine were administered with no improvement in cardiac activity, and pupillary function. Dr. <sup>b(6), b(7)(C)</sup> with a consensus, pronounced the detainee dead at approximately 0251, 8 Oct 06. Therefore the SHU was the place of death and no transport to the ER was indicated. A TB mask was placed on the patients face but otherwise he and the medical equipment were left at the scene <sup>b(6), b(7)(C)</sup>

Q: What is the purpose of the automatic defibrillator? **b(6), b(7)(C)**

A: It's designed to assess if someone has cardiac activity and if there's an irregular heartbeat that can be converted to a regular heartbeat with an electrical charge. **b(6), b(7)(C)**

Q: Was it ever used?

A: It was used to assess for the rhythm but the AED is used to assess whether a pattern of heartbeat was shockable. It signaled not shockable which either indicated no heartbeat at all or that there was a pulseless heartbeat. **b(6), b(7)(C)**

Q: Pulseless heartbeat?

A: It means there is cardiac heartbeat but does not move blood. **b(6), b(7)(C)**

Q: Had the detainee ever had a pulse when your medical team arrived and assessed him to the point of discontinuing resuscitative efforts?

A: There was no pulse upon arrival but about 5 to 7 minutes, it was believed a weak thready carotid pulse was found, about 100 beats a minute, but it was so weak we weren't sure we had one so continued CPR. **b(6), b(7)(C)**

A: We started about 0236 up until 0251. **b(6), b(7)(C)**

On 08 Oct 2006 at 0233 the DMC (Detainee Medical Center) received a call from the CP at the SHU about a detainee who appeared to be unresponsive and not breathing. The MP's stated that at the 0200 and 0215 checks the detainee appeared well and was reading the Koran. He had no complaints at the time. At the 0230 check the detainee appeared unresponsive and so the CP called the DMC.

NOT USED
CPT b(6), b(7)(C) SPC b(6), b(7)(C) SGT b(6), b(7)(C) and myself (Maj b(6), b(7)(C)) responded to the SHU immediately. The detainee was in cell #74. On arrival to the cell the detainee was found lying on his back on his mattress and was unresponsive. The detainee had a pool of red fluid between his legs. The detainee appeared dusky and was not breathing. The detainee was placed on the floor in order to perform further medical care. Once placed on the floor the detainee's airway was assessed. He was found to not be breathing and rescue breathing was initiated with a bag valve mask. The detainee did not have a pulse so CPR was initiated. SPC b(6), b(7)(C) began chest compressions. SGT b(6), b(7)(C) placed an IV and started normal saline.

NOT USED
I spoke with CPT b(6), b(7)(C) in the EMT and stated that we had a detainee who was in cardiopulmonary arrest. He dispatched the trauma team and personally ran down to the SHU with ACLS (Advanced Cardiac Life Support) medications. After speaking with the EMT, I called the DMC and spoke with CPT b(6), b(7)(C) and requested that he bring ACLS medications and resuscitation equipment to the SHU immediately. CPT b(6), b(7)(C) then came to the SHU with the crash cart. I returned to the cell and CPT b(6), b(7)(C) and the team were continuing CPR. SPC b(6), b(7)(C) arrived at the SHU with ACLS medication from the DMC at around 0244 and the first dose of Epinephrine was given through the IV. CPT b(6), b(7)(C) arrived at 0245. At this time the detainee was intubated by CPT b(6), b(7)(C). CPT b(6), b(7)(C) placed the AED on the detainee. The detainee was successfully intubated. The AED stated that the patient did not have a cardiac rhythm which required electric shock. CPR was continued and the patient received a total of 4mg Epinephrine and 2mg Atropine. At 0250 the patient continued to have no pulse and was pronounced dead by CPT b(6), b(7)(C).

**DEATH SCENE EXAMINATION:** About 0407, 8 Oct 06, SA **b(6), b(7)(C)** and SA **b(6), b(7)(C)** conducted a death scene examination of the corridor and Cell #TB74 of Bravo Block, Special Housing Unit (SHU), Camp Remembrance II Internment Facility, Camp Cropper, Iraq APO AE 09342 (CCI).

**Characteristics of Scene: (Bravo Block Corridor)** Bravo Block was located on the East (E) side of the SHU and was a white, gray and yellow in color metal, concrete and glass type construction building utilized as housing for detainees who are segregated due to medical, disciplinary or intelligence issues. The corridor of Bravo Block was approximately 160' in length from N to S by 8' wide from the E wall to the W wall. The ceiling had steel beams running perpendicular of each cell with individual air ducts leading into each cell from the top of the cell. The lights in the corridor were on at the time of the examination of the scene and provided sufficient lighting for the area. There were no windows visible that allowed light into the corridor from outside. The floor appeared level and met the walls on the W and E side. There were two black in color office chairs one by each wall S of the victim. Located on the floor of the corridor of Bravo Block near the E/E of Cell #TB74 was the victim who was covered with a blanket upon arrival. The blanket was removed to obtain measurements and pictures. The victim was lying on his back in an N to S direction with his feet towards N. The victim's arms were lying parallel his body with his palms facing in towards his body and his legs were straight with the toes of his feet pointed out. Attached to the victim's left arm was an intravenous line held in place by several strips of medical tape. There appeared to be the onset of livor mortis on the left side of the victim's body but no visible signs of trauma. The victim's head was turned facing the W wall of the corridor and had a medical mask covering his nose and mouth. The victim appeared to be an elderly male approximately 64 years old, 140 pounds, 5'11" and graying short hair. The victim's eyes were partially open. The victim was wearing the standard issue yellow jumpsuit button up shirt, pants and white t-shirt but did not have any footwear on. The victim's yellow button up shirt was opened and his white t-shirt appeared to be pulled over his chest exposing his midsection and torso. The sleeves of the yellow button up shirt were rolled up exposing the victim's forearms. The pant legs were rolled up as well exposing his calves. The victim was damp around his pelvic region.

**Condition of Scene: (Bravo Block Corridor)** The interior of the corridor had numerous medical items around the body but appeared clean and well maintained throughout the rest of the corridor. The floor of the corridor was dry and there were no unusual odors noted.

**DETAILS:**

**Characteristics of Scene: (Cell #TB74)** The floor appeared level, met all four walls, appeared painted and was yellow in color, metal type construction as were the walls which extend from floor to ceiling. The door to Cell #TB74, which was open at the time of the examination of the scene, appeared to fit the frame of the Entrance/Exit (E/E) and was yellow and black in color metal type construction. The door was approximately 6'11" tall by 2'6" wide and opened outward. On the outside of the door were markings "TB 74" which indicated it was a cell inhabited by a detainee with tuberculosis. There were two openings, one above the other, located in the approximate center of the door and a third opening at the base of the door. Each opening was secured by a chain and locking device and were closed at the time of the examination of the scene. The door was held in place by two hinges on the outside of the cell and could be secured from the outside by a rotating hasp that connected to a ring which a lock could then be placed into. Inside Cell #TB74 is a silver in color metal type construction wash basin located in the SE corner of the room and appeared to be dry. Approximately 5" north of the wash basin against the E wall is a silver in color metal type construction toilet that was placed into the floor of the cell. The toilet appeared to be clean and dry. The toilet appeared to be designed to conform to cultural standards as it had a single opening and two elevated foot holds as the toilet was convex in shape and was embedded into the floor. Against the entire length of the N wall was the bed frame which was yellow in color metal type construction. The bed frame was elevated approximately 3' off the floor from the bottom edge of the frame to the floor. On top of the bed frame was a gray in color canvass type mattress which was against the NE corner of the wall. The mattress did not cover the entire bed frame. On the E end of the mattress, against the E wall, were two blankets stacked one on top of the other and it did not appear as though they had been used. Located against the N wall near the approximate center of the mattress was an inhaler. An orange in color liquid, suspected to be urine, was also on the mattress near the approximate center. Near the W wall where the mattress did not cover the bed frame were a standard issue Koran, a water bottle containing a clear fluid suspected to be water and a body fluids barrier kit that did not appear as though it had been used. On the floor of the cell near the S wall near the approximate center of the room were a sundry of medical items that had been used during the resuscitation of the victim. Under the bed frame was a Combat Life Saver (CLS) bag that was opened and appeared used as well. There was very minimal lighting in Cell #TB74.

**Condition of Scene: (Cell #TB74)** The interior of Cell #TB74 appeared cluttered as medical supplies had been strewn about during resuscitative efforts. There was an irregular shaped orange in color liquid substance on the mattress the victim slept on suspected to be urine. Both the toilet and wash basin were dry and appeared clean. Other than the medical supplies, the cell appeared clean and well maintained. There were no unusual odors noted.

**Environmental Conditions:** At the time of the death scene examination the temperature in the corridor and Cell #TB74 of Bravo Block, SHU, Camp Remembrance II Internment Facility, CCI was

approximately 77 degrees Fahrenheit. It was still dark outside as the sun had not risen but the areas outside and inside were well lit.

**Factors Pertinent to Entry/Exit:** Access to the corridor could be gained through E/E's on both the N and S ends of the corridor. Access to Cell #TB74 could only be gained through the E/E located on the W wall of the cell. No access could be gained from the window in Cell #TB74 as it was barred over and did not appear to open.

**Scene Documentation:** Two death scene sketches were prepared by SA [b(6), b(7)(C)]. Photographs of the death scene were exposed using a Nikon CoolPix 5900, digital camera by SA [b(6), b(7)(C)]. (See Death Scene Sketches, Photographic Packet and Compact Disc for details)

**Search for Latent Impressions:** A search for latent impressions was not conducted.

**Collection of Crime Scene Evidence:** About 0610, 8 Oct 06, SA [b(6), b(7)(C)] collected as evidence one inhaler from the mattress of Cell #TB74. The evidence was collected on an Evidence/Property Custody Document (EPCD); Voucher Number (VN) 0832-06. (See EPCD for details)

- A. Right renal calculi: Four irregular, green-brown calculi are recovered from the renal pelvis, and range in size from 0.3 to 0.5-centimeters
- B. Prostatic hypertrophy: The prostate is enlarged in size, 5.0 x 3.0 x 3.0-centimeters (no discrete nodules are identified), with associated muscular hypertrophy of the bladder
- C. Bullae of the right and left upper lobes of the lungs

- B. The urine is screened for medications and drugs of abuse; Ethambutol (an antimycobacterial medication) is detected in the urine but is not quantitated in the blood.

### EXTERNAL EXAMINATION

The body is that of a well-developed, well-nourished appearing, 70 ½-inch and 150-pound (estimated) male whose appearance is consistent with the reported age of 64-years. Lividity is posterior and fixed. Rigor is absent (passed), and the temperature is cold to touch.

The scalp is covered with gray hair in a normal distribution; facial hair consists of a moustache. The irides are hazel, the corneae are cloudy and the pupils are round and equal in diameter. The external auditory canals are patent and free of foreign material. The ears are unremarkable. The nares are patent and the lips are atraumatic. The nose and maxillae are palpably stable. The teeth appear natural and in fair condition.

The neck is straight, and the trachea is midline and mobile. The chest is symmetric. The abdomen is flat. The genitalia are those of a normal adult male. The testes are descended and free of masses. Pubic hair is present in a normal distribution. The buttocks and anus are unremarkable. There is a 0.7 x 0.5-centimeter soft brown papule in the left inguinal fold.

The upper and lower extremities are symmetric and without clubbing or edema. The fingernails are trimmed and intact.

### CLOTHING AND PERSONAL EFFECTS

The following clothing items and personal effects are present on the body at the time of autopsy:

- Yellow top
- Yellow pants
- White boxer shorts

### MEDICAL INTERVENTION

- A properly located endotracheal tube

### RADIOGRAPHS

A complete set of postmortem radiographs is obtained and demonstrates the following:

- No fractures of the skull, axial skeleton, or long bones
- No metallic foreign bodies other than medical therapy

### EVIDENCE OF INJURY

There is no evidence of recent, significant injury.

### INTERNAL EXAMINATION

#### HEAD AND CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM:

The galeal and subgaleal soft tissues of the scalp are free of injury. The calvarium is intact, as is the dura mater beneath it. Clear cerebrospinal fluid surrounds the 1,240-gram brain, which has unremarkable gyri and sulci. Coronal sections demonstrate sharp demarcation between white and gray matter, without hemorrhage or contusive injury. The ventricles are of normal size. The basal ganglia, brainstem, and cerebellum are free of injury or other abnormalities. There is mild atherosclerosis of the arteries at the base of the brain. There are no skull fractures. The atlanto-occipital joint is stable.

#### NECK:

By layer-wise dissection, the anterior strap muscles of the neck are homogenous and red-brown, without hemorrhage. The thyroid cartilage and hyoid bone are intact. The larynx is lined by intact white mucosa. The thyroid gland is symmetric and red-brown, without cystic or nodular change. The tongue is free of bite marks, hemorrhage, or other injuries.

#### BODY CAVITIES:

The sternum and vertebral bodies are visibly and palpably intact. Injuries to the ribs are described above (see "Medical Intervention," above). No excess fluid is in the pleural, pericardial, or peritoneal cavities. The organs occupy their usual anatomic positions.

#### RESPIRATORY SYSTEM:

The right and left lungs weigh 840 and 725-grams, respectively. The external surfaces are smooth and deep red-purple. Bullae are grossly identifiable in the apices of both lungs. The pulmonary parenchyma is diffusely congested and edematous. No mass lesions or areas of consolidation are present.

#### CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM:

The 510-gram heart is contained in an intact pericardial sac. The epicardial surface is smooth, with moderate fat investment. The coronary arteries are present in a normal distribution, with a right-dominant pattern. Cross sections of the vessels show moderate to marked luminal narrowing of the left main coronary artery and severe luminal narrowing of the left anterior descending and left circumflex coronary arteries. lumen of the right coronary artery appears to be of a pinpoint diameter. All of the coronary arteries are focally calcified. The myocardium is homogenous, red-brown, and firm except in the posterior left ventricle and posterior septum where there is a dense white scar. The valve leaflets are thin and mobile. The walls of the left and right ventricles are 1.2 and 0.3-centimeters thick, respectively. The endocardium is smooth and glistening. The aorta gives rise to three intact and patent arch vessels and has multiple atherosclerotic plaques and ulceration with calcification along the entire length. The renal and mesenteric vessels are unremarkable.

**LIVER & BILIARY SYSTEM:**

The 1,440-gram liver has an intact, smooth capsule and a sharp anterior border. The parenchyma is tan-brown and congested, with the usual lobular architecture. No mass lesions or other abnormalities are seen. The gallbladder contains 2-milliliters of green-black bile and no stones. The mucosal surface is green and velvety. The extrahepatic biliary tree is patent.

**SPLEEN:**

The 130-gram spleen has a smooth, intact, red-purple capsule. The parenchyma is maroon and congested, with distinct lymphoid follicles.

**PANCREAS:**

The pancreas is autolytic and saponified, with the usual lobular architecture. No mass lesions or other abnormalities are seen.

**ADRENALS:**

The right and left adrenal glands are autolytic and symmetric, with bright yellow cortices and gray medullae. No masses or areas of hemorrhage are identified.

**GENITOURINARY SYSTEM:**

The right and left kidneys weigh 200 and 160-grams, respectively. The external surfaces are intact and smooth. The cut surfaces are red-tan and congested, with uniformly thick cortices and sharp cortico-medullary junctions. The pelvis of the right kidney contains four irregular brown stones which range in size from 0.3 to 0.5-centimeters; the left kidney pelvis is unremarkable. Both ureters are normal in course and caliber. Gray-pink bladder mucosa overlies an intact, hypertrophic bladder wall with trabeculae. The bladder contains approximately 30-milliliters of cloudy yellow urine. The prostate is enlarged, with cysts containing viscous brown fluid and yellow-tan parenchyma. The seminal vesicles are unremarkable. The testes are free of mass lesions, contusions, or other abnormalities.

**GASTROINTESTINAL TRACT:**

The esophagus is intact and lined by smooth, gray-white mucosa. The stomach contains approximately 200-milliliters of brown-green fluid with food particles. The gastric wall is intact. The duodenum, loops of small bowel and colon are unremarkable. The appendix is present.

**MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM:**

There is no non-traumatic bone or joint abnormalities. Skeletal muscle development is normal. Superficial incisions of the posterior torso and extremities are negative for soft tissue trauma.

**MICROSCOPIC EXAMINATION**

Selected portions of organs are retained in formalin, with preparation of selected histological slides.

**RESPIRATORY SYSTEM**

Lung (Slides 1-5): Multiple sections are examined which demonstrate mild interstitial fibrosis and macrophages with anthracotic pigment. Mild to moderate emphysematous changes and vascular congestion are noted. Special stains fail to demonstrate mycobacteria (see Attachment 1 for complete details).

Hilar lymph node (Slide 6): Anthracotic pigment is present in macrophages; otherwise an unremarkable lymph node. Special stains fail to demonstrate mycobacteria (see Attachment 1 for complete details).

**GENITOURINARY SYSTEM**

Seminal Vesicle (Slide 7): Cystic dilatation and inspissation of secretions

Kidneys (Slides 8 and 9): Focal, diffuse glomerulosclerosis and arteriolosclerosis. Mild, focal chronic inflammation and focal calcification is present.

**CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM**

Left ventricular myocardium and scar (Slide 10): Hypertrophic myocytes with enlarged nuclei, interstitial fibrosis and dense endocardial-based scar.

Left main coronary artery (Slide 11): Luminal narrowing (75%) by intimal hypertrophy, cholesterol clefts and chronic inflammation.

Left anterior descending coronary artery (Slide 12): Luminal narrowing (90%) by intimal hypertrophy, cholesterol clefts and chronic inflammation. Recanalization of the artery and focal calcification are also present.

Left circumflex coronary artery (Slide 13): Luminal narrowing (90%) by intimal hypertrophy, cholesterol clefts and chronic inflammation.

Right coronary artery (Slide 14): Luminal narrowing (>90%) by intimal hypertrophy, cholesterol clefts and chronic inflammation. Plaque rupture with hemorrhage into the media and fresh thrombus formation are noted.

**OPINION**

This 64-year-old Iraqi civilian detainee, Najim Mohammed Abbass, died of hypertensive and arteriosclerotic cardiovascular disease. The observed cardiomegaly, microscopic evidence of cardiac hypertrophy and the microscopic changes in the kidneys are typical of this condition. There is evidence of a remote myocardial infarction, as well as a fresh thrombus in the right coronary artery. It was reported that he was being treated for tuberculosis, but no microscopic evidence of this disease was observed. Toxicological testing for ethanol was negative. Ethambutol (an antimycobacterial medication) was detected in the urine but not quantitated in the blood. There is no evidence of physical abuse. The rib fractures are most likely an artifact of cardiopulmonary resuscitation. The manner of death is natural.
