INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

This investigation was initiated upon notification from SFC (b)(6). (b)(7)(C) 3rd Armored Cavalry Regiment, FOB Marez, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334, who reported the death of Mr. HAMDAN

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at the Mosul Detention Facility, FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334.

Investigation determined Mr. HAMDAN's cause of death was Atherosclerotic Cardiovascular Disease and manner of death was natural.

Based on the totality of a thorough investigation, the evaluation of evidence, scene examination and witness interviews, this investigation supports the findings of the autopsy report.

DETAIL.

About 0300, 30 Dec 07, SA third, third interviewed SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) medic, 396th Medical Company, 86th CSH, FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334, who related she responded to the detainment facility and transferred Mr. HAMDAN to the CSH. SPC related she did not see any injuries on Mr. HAMDAN and that he was unresponsive during transport to the CSH.

About 0300, 30 Dec 07, SA(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 396th Medical Company, 86th CSH, FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334, who stated he was notified at approximately 2219 to respond to the MDF for a patient. SPC(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he was unsure of what the exact details of the call were because his partner took the call and he just responded to her direction. SPC(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated when they arrived at the MDF Mr. HAMDAN was in a medical room on his side in the recovery position with fluid coming out his mouth. SPC(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated they placed Mr. HAMDAN on a litter and moved him to the ambulance. SPC(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he continued chest compressions for the short move, but when they reached the ambulance he stopped as he was the driver. SPC(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated they requested two guards accompany them in the ambulance and transported Mr. HAMDAN to the CSH. SPC(b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated when they arrived at the CSH, the Emergency Room personnel took over.

About 0300, 30 Dec 07, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed SSG (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 89th Chemical Company, 3rd ACR, FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334, who provided a sworn statement wherein he detailed his knowledge of the incident.

About 0312, 30 Dec 07, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed PV2 (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 89th Chemical Company, 3rd ACR, FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334, who provided a sworn statement wherein he stated while he escorted the detainee from his cell to the medic to get screened, the detainee complained of stomach pain, hunger and then chest pain. PV2 (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated the detainee was moved into the medic room and life saving measures were performed.

About 0343, 30 Dec 07, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 89th Chemical Company, 3rd ACR, FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334, who provided a sworn statement. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he took Mr. HAMDAN from his cell to take him to see the medic before he was to speak with military intelligence. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated as he was taking Mr. HAMDAN to see the medic he started complaining his stomach was hurting. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated Mr. HAMDAN was taken to see the medic, whereupon, Mr. HAMDAN became ill and emergency life saving measures were performed.

To us it looked like the detainee was faking it because they do that a lot, but once he started to foam at the mouth and his heart rate when down, he stopped breathing and we knew it was serious. That's when the other medic came in and started to perform CPR. After a little while we moved him from the stretcher to the floor and continued with CPR. They tried to put the automated defib on the detainee but it would not register. We informed the CSH and when they came we were still performing CPR. Then we took him to the CSH. Q. 



SCENE EXAMINATION: About 0344, 30 Dec 07, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) this office, conducted an examination of the medic room in the Mosul Detention Facility, FOB Diamondback, Mosul, Iraq, APO AE 09334.

Characteristics of Scene: The Mosul Detention Facility was a single story hard structure building, cement and metal type construction, which was utilized for a temporary detainee facility. The medic room was located in the detention facility. The medic room was approximately 20 feet long by 9 ½ feet wide. The entry/exit (E/E) way was located in the east wall of the room. There was a ladder located in the southeast corner of the room. There were two wall lockers adjacent the ladder on the south wall. There was a table along the south wall in the south west corner of the room. There was a refrigerator located in the north west corner of the room. There were two plastic shelving units located along the north wall. East of the shelving units was a metal filing cabinet along the north wall. East of the filing cabinet was a gurney in the north east corner of the room.

Condition of Scene: The medic room was clean and in order at the time of examination. The plastic shelving along the north wall contained various medical supplies. There was a television located on the north east corner of the table along the west wall. There was a chair located near the north east corner of the table along the south wall and there was another chair located on the south side of the plastic shelving along the north wall.

Environmental Conditions: The interior temperature was approximately 72 degrees Fahrenheit, and the outside temperature was approximately 42 degrees Fahrenheit. There was a strong odor of suspected pine sole during the scene examination.

Factors Pertinent to E/E: The Mosul Detention Facility could only be accessed via a locked gate under guard on FOB Diamondback. The entrance to the compound was located south of the facility. The medic room could be accessed via the E/E, which was located in the east wall and was constructed of metal.

Scene Documentation: SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) completed a crime scene sketch of the medic room. SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) exposed photographs of the scene utilizing a Nikon Coolpix, L11, digital camera with internal flash. (See Crime Scene Sketch and Photographic Packet for details)

Search for Latent Impressions: A search for latent impressions was not conducted as all witnesses verified the detainee, Mr. HAMDAN, was in the medic room.

Collection of Evidence: Nothing of evidentiary value was discovered during the scene examination.

1. CARDIAC ARREST

Comments: The patient is a 42yo Iraqi detainee who was brought to the EMT from the MDF for evaluation of chest pain followed by loss of vital signs and breathing. The patient was initially assessed and intubated. After US confirmed lack of cardiac activity in the setting of a lack of a pulse and no spontaneous breathing, he was pronounced dead at 2256. Given the antecedent chest pain prior to his relatively sudden death, myocardial infarction and pulmonary embolism are the 2 most likely causes of death although the exact cause is impossible to state from our limited data at this time.

This was unknown to both of us from the call. So they unlocked the gate: There was a 1SG that was telling us to go in there. I told him I did not know my way around: He told us to go through. Some people directed us to a back room. There was a detainee laying there, 40's, Iraqi Male, laying on his side in the recovery position with some fluid that looked like blood and mucus coming out his nose. They had the defib hooked up his chest. I asked if they had shocked him. A medic told me he was flat-lined and it didn't shock him. We decided to put him on a litter and carried him out to the ambulance. We told them we needed two guards to go with us. I started doing chest compressions and SPC $^{(b)(6),(b)(7)(C)}$ started bag valve mask procedures while we waited for the 2 guards to get there. The two guards arrived and jumped in the back off the ambulance. SPC [big]. (b)(7)(C) had one of the guards resume chest compressions and I drove. We took him to the ER and ER personnel took over.

Circumstances of Death: As reported, this Detainee, Isam Yunis Hamdan, complained of stomach and chest pains during an interview with military intelligence personnel. He became agitated, fell to the ground, and began to bang his head against a shelf on a wall. Subsequently, he became unresponsive and died despite resuscitative efforts.

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EXTERNAL EXAMINATION

The body is that of a well-developed, well-nourished Caucasoid male. The body weighs 179 pounds and measures 66-1/2 inches in length. Lividity is fixed on the posterior surfaces of the body. Rigor has passed. The body temperature is cold to touch. Decomposition changes are not grossly evident.

The head is normocephalic and the face is congested. The scalp is covered with brown hair of medium length with typical male pattern baldness. Facial hair consists of a beard and moustache. The irides are brown, the corneae are hazy, the conjunctivae are congested, and the sclerae are white. The external auditory canals are clear. The ears are atraumatic. The nares are bloody. The lips are atraumatic. The nose and maxillae are palpably stable. The teeth are in poor condition with several missing, injuries of the lower incisors are described below, however the sockets of missing molars are unremarkable, consistent with remote loss. The neck is straight, and the trachea is midline and mobile.

The chest is symmetric. The abdomen is protuberant. The genitalia are those of a normal adult circumcised male. The testes are descended. Pubic hair is present in a normal distribution. The back is symmetric. The buttocks and anus are unremarkable.

The upper and lower extremities are symmetric and without clubbing or edema. A plastic cuff with the number sequence "#1-03126" is secured around the right wrist. The fingernails are intact. Identifying marks consist of a tattoo (illegible pattern) on the left forearm; irregular scars on the left forearm (3 scars, 3/4" to 1" in greatest dimension) and left foot (3/4" in greatest dimension), and a 3/4" x 1/2" hyperpigmented macule on the right leg.


CLOTHING AND PERSONAL EFFECTS

No clothing items or personal effects are present on the body at the time of autopsy.

MEDICAL INTERVENTION

Medical intervention present on the body at the time of autopsy includes:

- Needle puncture mark, right subclavian region (with underlying soft tissue hemorrhage)
- Cluster of needle puncture marks, left subclavian region (with underlying soft tissue hemorrhage extending into the fascial planes of the anterior strap muscles of the neck)
- Cluster of needle puncture marks, left groin

RADIOGRAPHS

A complete set of postmortem radiographs is obtained and demonstrates the following:

- No fractures
- No foreign bodies

EVIDENCE OF INJURY

The ordering of the following injuries is for descriptive purposes only, and is not intended to imply order of infliction or relative severity. All wound pathways are given relative to standard anatomic position.

I. Blunt force injuries

The two central lower incisors are missing with fresh hemorrhage in the sockets. A 1.5 cm x 1 cm subgaleal hemorrhage covers a focal area of the right parietal region of the skull. Focal hemorrhage is in the soft tissues on the dorsum of the right wrist.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION

HEAD AND CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM:


(See: Evidence of Injury)

There are no skull fractures. The dura mater is intact with no evidence of hemorrhage. The leptomeninges are thin and delicate. Clear cerebrospinal fluid surrounds the 1330 gm brain, which has unremarkable gyri and sulci. The cerebral hemispheres are symmetrical and the structures at the base of the brain, including the cranial nerves and blood vessels are intact. Coronal sections demonstrate sharp demarcation between white and gray matter, without hemorrhage or contusive injury. The ventricles are not enlarged. The basal ganglia, brainstem, and cerebellum are free of injury or other abnormalities. The atlanto-occipital joint is stable.

NECK:

(See Medical Intervention)

Layer-by-layer dissection of the anterior neck demonstrates that the strap muscles of the neck are homogenous and red-brown. The thyroid cartilage and hyoid are intact. The larynx is lined by intact white mucosa. The thyroid gland is symmetric and red-brown, without cystic or nodular change. The parathyroid glands are not identified. The major vessels of the neck are intact. The tongue is free of bite marks, hemorrhage, or other injuries.



BODY CAVITIES

The ribs, sternum, and vertebral bodies are visibly and palpably intact. No excess fluid is in the pleural, pericardial, or peritoneal cavities. The organs occupy their usual anatomic positions.

MUSCULOSKELETAL

(See Evidence of Injury)

No non-traumatic abnormalities of the muscles or bones of the appendicular and axial skeletons are identified.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM:

The airways are clear of debris and foreign material and the mucosal surfaces are smooth, yellow-tan, and unremarkable. The right and left lungs weigh 450 and 420 gm, respectively. The external surfaces are smooth and deep red-purple. The pulmonary parenchyma is diffusely congested and edematous. No mass lesions or areas of consolidation are present. The pulmonary arteries are normally developed and patent. The diaphragm is intact.

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM:

The 360 gm heart is contained in an intact pericardial sac. The epicardial surface is smooth. The coronary arteries are unremarkable in distribution, with a right dominant pattern. Cross sections of the vessels show no luminal narrowing of the left main coronary artery, severe (greater than 75%) stenosis of the left anterior descending coronary artery; moderate (greater than 50%) stenosis of the left circumflex coronary artery, and moderate (greater than 50%) stenosis of the right coronary artery. The myocardium is homogenous, red-brown, and firm; the atrial and ventricular septace are intact. The valve leaflets are thin and mobile. The walls of the left ventricle, interventricular septum, and right ventricle are 1.5, 1.3, and 0.4-cm thick, respectively. The endocardium is smooth and glistening. The aorta gives rise to three intact and patent arch vessels. The renal, mesenteric, and iliac vessels as well as the venae cavae are unremarkable.

HEPATOBILIARY SYSTEM:

The 1850 gm liver has an intact, smooth capsule and a sharp anterior border. The parenchyma is tan-brown and congested, with unremarkable lobular architecture. No mass lesions or other non-traumatic abnormalities are seen. The gallbladder contains 10 ml of green-black bile and no stones. The mucosal surface is velvety and green with yellow spots.

LYMPHORETICULAR SYSTEM:

The 170 gm spleen has a smooth, intact, red-purple capsule. The parenchyma is maroon and congested, with distinct Malpighian corpuscles. There is an enlarged cervical lymph node. Lymph nodes in the hilar, periaortic, and iliac regions are unremarkable.

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ENDOCRINE SYSTEM:

The pituitary gland is unremarkable. The thyroid gland has been described (see <u>NECK</u>, above). The right and left adrenal glands are symmetric, with bright yellow cortices and red-brown medullae. No masses or areas of hemorrhage are identified.

GENITOURINARY SYSTEM:

The right and left kidneys both weigh 130 gm. The external surfaces are intact and smooth. The cut surfaces are red-tan and congested, with uniformly thick cortices and sharp corticomedulary junctions. A black stone is recovered from the pelvis of the right kidney. The left renal pelvis and both ureters are unremarkable. White bladder mucosa overlies an intact bladder wall. The bladder contains less than 10 ml of clear urine. The prostate has lobular, yellow-tan parenchyma and is not enlarged. The seminal vesicles are unremarkable. The testes are free of mass lesions, contusions, or other abnormalities.

GASTROINTESTINAL TRACT:

The esophagus is intact and lined by smooth, gray-white mucosa. The stomach contains approximately 10 ml of brown viscous fluid. The gastric wall is intact. The duodenum, distal loops of intestine, and colon are unremarkable. The pancreas is firm and yellow-tan, with lobular architecture. No mass lesions or other abnormalities are seen. The appendix is present.

ADDITIONAL PROCEDURES

- 1. Documentary photographs are taken by OAFME staff.

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

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
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DINION

This Detainee, Isam Yunis Hamdan, died of atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease. Severe atherosclerosis of his coronary arteries was identified at autopsy. Non-lethal injuries, including a focal subgaleal hemorrhage, loose teeth, and hemorrhage in the soft tissues of the right wrist, may have been sustained from the struggle during the period when therapeutic measures were attempted. Toxicology tests for ethanol, screened drugs of abuse, carbon monoxide, and cyanide were negative. The manner of death is natural.

CARBON MONOXIDE: The carboxyhemoglobin saturation in the blood was less than 1% as determined by spectrophotometry with a limit of quantitation of 1%. Carboxyhemoglobin saturations of 0-3% are expected for non-smokers and 3-10% for smokers. Saturations above 10% are considered elevated and are confirmed by gas chromatography.

VOLATILES: The BLOOD AND VITREOUS FLUID were examined for the presence of ethanol at a cutoff of 20 mg/dl... No ethanol was detected.

DRUGS: The BLOOD was screened for acetaminophen, amphetamine, antidepressants, antihistamines, barbiturates, benzodiazepines, cannabinoids, chloroquine, mefloquine, cocaine, dextromethorphan, lidocaine, narcotic analgesics, opiates, phencyclidine, phenothiazines, salicylates, sympathomimetic amines and verapamil by gas chromatography, color test or immunoassay.
