

DETAILS

BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: About 2100, 26 Jun 08, this office was notified by COLb(6), b(7)(C) SJA, CJTF-101, Bagram Airfield (BAF), that an Afghan civilian detained by the Afghan National Police (ANP) was killed during a struggle with members of Operational Detachment Alpha (ODA) 7115, Fire Base (FB) Lane, Afghanistan.

About 0515, 29 Jun 08, SAb(6), b(7)(C)SAb(6), b(7)(C) and SA b(6), b(7)(C) responded to Mortuary Affairs, BAF, to examine and photograph the remains following notification of arrival. SA b(6), b(7)(C) exposed photographs of the remains and SA b(6), b(7)(C) and SA b(6), b(7)(C) assisted in the examination. Minor injuries were noted on the remains of Mr. TOR JAN. Mr. TOR JAN had two small contusions/abrasions on his abdomen and to his left hip. Further, it appeared as though there was faint bruising around Mr. TOR JAN's eyes and a small linear abrasion on his left upper eye lid with a small circular contusion on his forehead above the left eye. He had a small abrasion on the right side of his lower lip, abrasions to the front and back of the left forearm, and abrasions and bruising to the lower back. Lividity was fixed and present along Mr. TOR JAN's back, which corresponded with his positioning. Rigor mortis had fully dissipated. No significant head trauma was observed. Mr. TOR JAN's abdominal region was beginning to reveal green in color discoloration, showing early signs of decomposition.

About 2150, 30 Jul 08, SAb(6), b(7)(C) coordinated with MAJb(6), b(7)(C)Command Judge Advocate, CJSOTF-A, Camp Vance, BAF, who provided a copy of the AR 15-6 Investigation conducted by COL b(6), b(7)(C) Investigating Officer, CJSOTF-A, Camp Vance, BAF. COL b(6), b(7)(C) findings were that members of ODA 7113 applied the appropriate level of force and acted in accordance with the rules of engagement. Further, COLb(6), b(7)(C) ound that Mr. TOR JAN received the appropriate standard of care under the circumstances. ///Last Entry///

DETAILS BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: On 30 Jun 08, this office received a Request for Assistance (RFA) from SA b(6), b(7)(C)11th MP Det (CID), Afghanistan CID office, to attend the autopsy of Tor JAN, AFHGAN civilian, NFI, who was in Afghan National Police custody and was killed during a struggle between himself and several US Soldiers.

About 1040, 1 Jul 08, SA $\frac{b(6), b(7)(C)}{c}$ attended the autopsy of Mr. TOR JAN (ME#08-0515), which was performed by Dr. (MAJ) b(6), b(7)(C)Office of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner (OAFME), Armed Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP), 1413 Research Blvd., Bldg 102, Rockville, MD, 20850. preliminary cause of death is pending and the manner of death is pending. A photographer from AFIP exposed all digital photographs of the autopsy and prepared two compact disc (CD) containing all images exposed, which was provided to $SA^{b(6), b(7)(C)}$ $SA^{b(6), b(7)(C)}$ Fingerprint Physical Scientist, FBI obtained the fingerprints of Mr. TOR JAN. (See fingerprints and CD for details)

DETAILS About 2030, 13 Aug 08, SAb(6), b(7)(C) interviewed LCDR (Dr)b(6), b(7)(C) CJSOTF, Forward Surgical Team (FST), FB Ripley, who confirmed he treated Mr. TOR JAN at the FB Ripley FST. Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) related he was not told what caused Mr. TOR JAN's injury or where he was medically evacuated (MEDEVAC) from. Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) related Mr. TOR JAN was first brought to the Dutch hospital on FOB Ripley where he remained for approximately two hours before he was transferred to the FST around midnight due to his presumed detainee status. Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) related Mr. TOR JAN exhibited signs and symptoms of a serious brain injury; however, there were no outward symptoms such as a bump, bleeding, or skull fracture to the head. Mr. TOR JAN's vital signs also revealed he suffered from hypoxia, a shortage of oxygen in the body specifically in the blood, which would indicate his heart stopped beating or lungs were not functioning at some point. Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) related it was his understanding Mr. TOR JAN was coded for approximately one hour. Mr. TOR JAN was treated for approximately eight hours at the FST; however, his condition deteriorated through out the night and he was "brain dead." Mr. TOR JAN was given an IV and a ventilator was inserted into his airway as the only method of life support. Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) discussed Mr. TOR at the FST. Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) related he told JAN's options with a Special Forces medic, b(6), b(7)(C) the medic Mr. TOR JAN could either be extubated or moved to another location. However, Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) related that if Mr. TOR JAN was moved, it was only to transport him to another location and not for further treatment as he did not have any chance of recovery without life support. Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) related it was his intent to extubate Mr. TOR JAN which he verbally implied to b(6), b(7)(C) who took it as his order. Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) related it was not a misunderstanding but rather his verbal intent as given to b(6), b(7)(C) and not decision to make. Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) intended to write up an order but was not able to as he was called into the other room for another matter. Dr.b(6), b(7)(C) related it was his understanding that b(6), b(7)(C) called his higher headquarters in regard to moving Mr. TOR JAN and was told that he would not be moved. Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) related b(6), b(7)(C) removed the ventilator from Mr. TOR JAN's airway while he was in the other room. When Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) returned several minutes later, Mr. TOR JAN was still alive; however, since it was his intent to extubate him, he did not attempt to re-insert the ventilator. Mr. TOR JAN died approximately nine minutes later as expected at around 0900 hours. Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) related b(6), b(7)(C) was a well trained Special Forces medic with Operational Detachment Bravo (ODB) who was trained at a higher level than other field medics. It was not outside of what he was capable of doing to extubate Mr. TOR JAN. Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) related b(6), b(7)(C) assisted at the FST often and worked with him on many occasions before and since the incident. Additionally, Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) related the explanation for Mr. TOR JAN's injury was plausible if he had bleeding to the back of the brain which could affect breathing causing lack of oxygen to the head and abnormal heart beat. ///Last Entry///

About 1930, 30 Sep 08, SAb(6), b(7)(C) interviewed SSGb(6), b(7)(C) C Co, 1/7th Special Forces Group (SFG), FB Ripley, who verified he assisted Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) in the medical treatment of Mr. TOR JAN. SSG b(6), b(7)(C) related he was informed the<u>re was a "personnel under control"</u> (PUC) who was brain dead and his assistance was needed at the clinic. SSG b(6), b(7)(C) related it was his understanding the PUC was to be turned over to the Afghan National Police (ANP), and in order to do so Mr. TOR JAN would be extubated. SSG **b(6)**, **b(7)(C)** related he understood Mr. TOR JAN would expire once extubated; however, related it was the standard of care for someone in Mr. TOR JAN's condition. SSGb(6), b(7)(C) related he told Dr. b(6), b(7)(C) ne would extubate Mr. TOR JAN in preparation for movement and understood that Dr. b(6), b(7)(C)_{concurred}. SSG b(6), b(7)(C) related Mr. TOR JAN passed away on the table almost immediately after being extubated. SSGb(6), b(7)(C) related he used a suction device to clear any secretion from the mouth of Mr. TOR JAN. There were members of the Afghan National Army (ANA) present when Mr. TOR JAN passed who were to take custody of the remains for proper burial procedures. SSGb(6), b(7)(C) related he inspected Mr. TOR JAN upon arrival to the clinic; however, he was unable to locate any visible injuries. SSG **b(6), b(7)(C)** related he checked Mr. TOR JAN's eyes, nose, and ears and ran his hands through his hair to check for signs of injury; however, could find no evidence of bumps, lacerations, or contusions; although Mr. TOR JAN's eyes were fixed and dilated. ///Last Entry///



On the day in question, my Operational Detachment Alpha (ODA) and I were on a Combat Reconnaissance Patrol (CRP) in order to disrupt Taliban activity. Prior to us receiving enemy fire, while we were in a security posture. Afghan National Police (ANP) entered a village near by to bring out all of the adult fighting age males to ensure we would not be attacked from this village. After all of the males were brought out and searched by the ANP, pictures of a Taliban Commander and one of the individuals who was sitting with the males from this village was found on one of the other males. The ANP chief at the time, who was also the previous ANP chief of the location in which we were operating in, recognized both of these individuals and stated that both were Taliban Commanders from an area south of where we were operating. The ANP chief then stated that they were going to arrest this man from the picture that was sitting in front of us. The ANP took the man, who's name was TOOR JAN, into custody and brought him back to the ANP station after the mission was complete. Upon b(6), b(7)(C) and I went to the completion of the mission and arrival at Fire Base (FB) Mizan, SSG ANP station to collect biometrics using the Crossmatch Biometrics System. Upon arrival at the station, TOOR JAN was being brought to a secluded room by the ANP Chief so that SSG CW2 CW2 and I could gather biometrics on TOOR JAN, in which we had already set up the biometrics station consisting of our toughbook computer and fingerprint wand. The detainee was not restrained and was walking casually to the room. Upon entry of the room, CW2 (b(6), b(7)(C) told our interpreter to tell the detainee to stand against the wall in order for us to take a front and side profile picture. The detainee allowed us to take the picture and CW2 b(6), b(7)(C) sat back down on the floor in front of the detainee as SSG and I stood on either sides of the detainee, SSG b(6), b(7)(C) on the detainee's left side, and I stood on the detainee's right side. CW2 b(6), b(7)(C) then began asking the detainee questions in order to fill out the biometric data to send to our SSE department. These questions include: Name, Age, Tribe, Ethnicity, etc. The detainee answered all of these questions with out hesitation. CW2 (6), b(7)(C) then asked the detainee if he was an insurgent or part of the Taliban Regime. The detained then became hostile towards CW2 b(6), b(7)(C) by screaming and flailing his arms in the direction of SSG and 1. CW2 (6), b(7)(C) then told our interpreter to tell him to calm down, this is the point in time that the detained lunged for both SSG b(6), b(7)(C) and I in hate, attempting to push us out of the way. CW2 b(6), b(7)(C) then yelled, "Grab Him!!" and SSG grabbed his left arm and I grabbed his right arm to prevent him from hitting either one of us. The detainee became more hostile, yelling and swinging his arms in aggression at SSG b(6), b(7)(C) and I. CW2 b(6), b(7)(C) then lunged for the detainee's legs in order to quell the hostility that was progressing uncontrollably towards CW2 b(6), b(7)(C) SSG b(6), b(7)(C) and I. As he did this, we took the detainee to the ground to restrain him and protect the welfare of ourselves. During the fall, SSG b(6), b(7)(C) ell against the wall and CW2 b(6), b(7)(C) and I fell on top of the detainee. As we all stood up, we noticed that the detainee was unconscious. CW2 b(6), b(7)(C) SSG b(6), b(7)(C) and I all performed an initial assessment on the detainee in order to make sure that the detainee was just unconscious. At this point in time, the hostility and aggression of the detaince was quelled, CW2 (6), (7)(C) and I, took fingerprints of the detainee to complete our biometrics. After

the fingerprints were taken, we conducted another assessment of the detainee to ensure that the detainee was only unconscious and nothing more serious. The detainee was not conscious and this time and was still not responsive, however was breating nomally. CW2 b(6), b(7)(C) then sent me to bring back one of our 18D'S (medic), to get a better assessment on the detainee. Upon arrival of our 18D, SSG b(6), b(7)(C) SSG did an initial assessment and quickly told us that we needed to call a medevac to save the detainee's life. I then retrieved my Team Sgt and Team Leader and informed them of the severity of the incident and that a medevac needed to be spun up immediately. The medevac was called and at this point in time both 18D's, SSG b(6), b(7)(C) and SSG b(6), b(7)(C) were treating and stabilizing the detainee. The detainee was then safely transported to the FB Mizan PZ were he was medevaced to the QALAT FST.

Q: Was TOOR JAN arrested by the ANP at the request of US forces?

A: No, they arrested him. They knew the guy was bad and they were the ones who wanted to arrest him. This was all from the ANP chief.

Q: When the ANP took TOOR JAN into custody, did you see them handle him roughly in any way?

A: No. They handcuffed him and put him in the truck, that was it.

Q: Once TOOR JAN was brought into the room, who stayed in the room?

A: Me b(6), b(7)(C) and the interpreter b(6), b(7)(C)

♦: So the ANP did not have anyone stay in the room?

A: No.

Q: Once TOOR JAN was brought into the room unrestrained, did your team restrain him with flexcuffs or any other device?

A: No. We didn't think he was going to get hostile.

Q: What was TOOR JAN's demeanor when he first entered the room?

A: Casual, He was casual, just walked in. He didn't seem angry, didn't seem hostile. He was calm.

Q: Was CW2 b(6), b(7)(C) asking the detainee questions directly or through the interpreter?

A: Through the interpreter.

Q: Was the question about whether the detainee was an insurgent part of the normal question set for collecting biometrics?

A: Yes, it's part of the crossmatch. You have to fill out if he is a civilian, enemy combatant, insurgent, etc, from a drop down list.

Q: Was the detainee's change in demeanor from calm hostile gradual or sudden?

A: It was sudden, and it gradually got worse.

Q: When you say TOOR JAN was flailing his arms at SSG b(6), b(7)(C) and yourself, was he gesturing or attempting to hit you?

A: It was threatening towards all three of us.

Q: When TOOR JAN lunged toward you and SSG b(6), b(7)(C) was he successful in pushing you?

A: No. because I stepped back. I don't know if he made contact with SSG b(6), b(7)(C)

Q. Once SSG b(6), b(7)(C) and you grabbed the detainee's arms, do you feel he was under control?

A: No, the situation was still gradually becoming worse, and his aggression and hostility was increasing.



1. $cw_2b(6)$, b(7)(C)Would like to provide the following statement under oath: The incident occurred on or around 27 May 08. It was part of my duties to collect biometrics on persons of interest, who are quite often found to be terrorists who work for the Taliban. The Afghan Police contacted me and stated a soldier by the name of TOURJAN was apprehended by the Afghan Police Chief, Arghan District. He was known to be a Taliban Terrorist, and myself, SSG b(6), b(7)(C) and SSG b(6), b(7)(C) responded to get biometrics data on TOURJAN. We arrived to speak with TOURJAN around 1830. At first TOURJAN was calm when I was encountered him. He did not appear to be combative at first. This is why I did not have him restrained. We went into a room in the Mizan Police headquarters, SSG $^{b(6)}$, $^{b(7)(C)}$ AND SSG $^{b(6)}$, $^{b(7)(C)}$ were present along with our two interpreters, I can't remember the names of the interpreters. I told TOURJAN that we were going to collect some fingerprints and some basic data with pictures. I then sat down on the computer. He didn't say much, he may have said ok or whatever, he was still calm at this point. I then asked him what his name was. He told me it was TOURJAN and then he started to get a little aggressive with my interpreter. He was screaming and yelling at my interpreter. I was unsure what he was saying because I could not understand him. I asked the interpreter what he was screaming about. The interpreter told TOURJAN that he needs to respect the Chief and answer his questions correctly. The interpreter did not actually tell me what TOURJAN was screaming and yelling at me about. I asked TOURJAN what his father's name was and he started yelling. TOURJAN gave me one name, and then I asked him what his father's whole name was. It was at this point when he started to get aggressive. He pushed my interpreter and then he started screaming his father's whole name. I do not remember what his father's whole name was. I told the interpreter to tell TOURJAN that he needs to calm down or I am going to have to restrain him. He then pushed my interpreter again. Once he pushed my interpreter for a second time, I felt that things were getting out of hand. I told SSG b(6), b(7)(C) and SSG b(6), b(7)(C) to restrain him by grabbing his arms. He became combative by kicking his legs and trying to get away. I felt he needed to be further restrained. I picked up his legs and grabbed his waist. Once I had his legs, SSG (6), b(7)(C) fell, he tripped over something and fell to the side. The result of SSG (6), b(7)(C) tripping or falling was we lost balance with TOUR IN because he was resisting us, and then TOURJAN fell to the ground and hit his hand on the concrete floor. There was a thin carpet on the floor, but it was only a $\frac{1}{4}$ " in thickness I would guess. He was knocked unconscious when he hit the floor. I asked SSG $\frac{b(6)}{b(7)}$ to check his breathing and make sure he didn't show any signs of duress. After SSG $\frac{b(6)}{b(7)}$ told me that TOURJAN was good to go, I collected my fingerprints. About 10 to 15 minutes after I collected his fingerprints I noticed that TOURJAN was still knocked out. I asked SSG b(6), b(7)(C) to check him again. TOURJAN's eyes were dilated and he started to bite down on his tongue. I swept his tongue out and opened his airway with my finger. We then immediately reacted to treating a casualty. Lithen asked SSG b(6), b(7)(C) to go get the medics because TOURJAN's condition had worsened. My medic SSG b(6), b(7 arrived to the scene. He immediate started to check TOURJAN and told me that TOURJAN needed to me medical dilated and the other pupil was pinpointed. SSG b(6), b(7)(C) started conducting his medical evaluation on TOURJAN. A: He was about 5'10", skinny face, skinny beard, he was bearing blue man jammies with a black vest. Sunken in face. About 150lbs maybe.

A: No

Q: Did you intentionally drop TOURJAN on his head?

A: No, we were just trying to restrain him.

A: No, they grabbed him to take control of the situation.

A: He was being aggressive, and I didn't want it to escalate. Q: Where exactly did SSG b(6), b(7)(C) grab TOURJAN?

A: He grabbed TOURJAN on the left arm with both of his arms.

Q: Where exactly did SSG b(6), b(7)(C) grab TOURJAN?

Q: By the right arm.

Q: Where exactly did you grab TOURJAN?

A: By the legs below the waist.

Q: At any point during the struggle did you intend to hurt TOURJAN?

A: No, I only wanted to restrain him.

Q: Is it usual for you to physically restrain someone when they are getting aggressive or posing a threat?

A: Yes, because we have to protect ourselves.

Q: Was TOURJAN placed in zip tie hand cuffs at anytime?

A: No, because initially he was not posing a threat.

Q: If you wouldn't have given the order to restrain TOURJAN, what do you believe would have happened?

A: He would have got out of hand and became physically combative.

Q: Were you or your men armed during the altercation? A: The only person who was armed was $SSG_{b(6), b(7)(C)}$ and his weapon was out of sight.

Q: How do you feel you were treated today by myself and SAb(6), b(7)(C)

A: Good.

Q Is there anything you would like to add to this statement?

A: When TOURJAN arrived to Tarinkout, Afghanistan, they found explosives in his vest.



Circumstances of Death: This Civilian was, by report, in the process of being detained on 24 JUN 08 when he became aggressive. During the struggle, the deceased fell to the floor and struck his head rendering him unconscious. He was taken to a local field support clinic and was noted to have a significant head injury. Despite all resuscitative efforts, he died on 26 JUN 08.

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EXTERNAL EXAMINATION

The body is that of a cachectic male. The body is approximately 75 inches in length and weighs 115 pounds. Lividity is fixed on the posterior surface of the body except in the areas exposed to pressure. Rigor is resolving in all four extremities. There is green discoloration of the skin of the lower abdomen. Injuries are described in "Evidence of Injury".

The scalp hair is black. Facial hair consists of a black beard and black moustache. The irides appear blue. The corneae are cloudy. The conjunctivae are pale with no petechiae. The sclerae are white. The external nares, external auditory canals and oral cavity are free of foreign material or abnormal secretions. There are no palpable fractures of the facial bones. The teeth are natural.

The chest is symmetric. There are numbers and letters on the chest that are written with a black marker (photographed for documentation). The genitalia are those of a circumcised adult male. A 2 x 1-inch area of hyperpigmented skin is on the middle of the lower back. The anus is non-traumatic. The upper and lower extremities are symmetric and without clubbing or edema. The fingernails are intact. There is a ¼ x ¼-inch of black discoloration of the fingernail of the right index finger. A ¼ x ¼-inch scar is on the lateral right arm. On the right thumb is a callous and on the back of the right hand are multiple scars. A 1 x ¾-inch scar is on the medial right knee and a ½ x ¼-inch scar is on the right foot. No tattoos are noted.

CLOTHING AND PERSONAL EFFECTS

The body is wrapped in a green sheet. A white sheet is wrapped around the green sheet. The body is unclad. A brown tag with "BTB Tor Jan" is on the left great toe. A white Dover tag with (b)(6) is secured around the left ankle.

MEDICAL INTERVENTION

There are needle puncture marks with overlying gauze secured with tape on the right arm, right forearm and left forearm.

RADIOGRAPHS

A complete set of post-mortem radiographs is obtained and the findings are incorporated into this report.

EVIDENCE OF INJURY

I. Blunt force injury of the head:

On the upper right eyelid is a $\frac{1}{4}$ x $\frac{1}{8}$ -inch abrasion. Superior to the left eyebrow is a $\frac{1}{4}$ x $\frac{1}{8}$ -inch abrasion. A $\frac{1}{2}$ x $\frac{1}{8}$ -inch abrasion is on the upper left eyelid. Lateral to the left eye is a $\frac{1}{2}$ x $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch contusion. Two, $\frac{1}{2}$ x $\frac{1}{8}$ -inch abrasions are on the mucosa of the lower lip. On the left side of the upper lip is a $\frac{1}{4}$ x $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch contusion.

There is a ½ x ½-inch contusion of the right temporalis muscle. There is subdural hemorrhage over the right side of the brain (approximately 15 milliliters of blood)¹.

II. Additional injuries:

On the anterior left torso are three abrasions the measure up to 1-inch in maximum dimension. On the anterior left hip is a $1 \times \frac{1}{2}$ -inch yellow abrasion. There is a $\frac{1}{2} \times \frac{1}{4}$ -inch abrasion on the upper left back. On the midline of the back are three, $\frac{1}{4} \times \frac{1}{4}$ -inch abrasions. On the lower left back are a $1 \times \frac{1}{4}$ -inch abrasion and a $\frac{1}{2} \times \frac{1}{4}$ -inch abrasion is on the right wrist. There are three, $\frac{1}{4} \times \frac{1}{8}$ -inch abrasions on the lateral left arm and a $1 \times \frac{1}{4}$ -inch abrasion on the left elbow. There are three $1 \times \frac{1}{4}$ -inch abrasions on the left forearm. Incision of the skin of the torso and extremities does not reveal any contusions or hemorrhage of the soft tissue or muscle.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION

BODY CAVITIES:

The ribs, sternum, and vertebral bodies are visibly and palpably intact. There is 50 milliliters of serous fluid in each of the chest cavities. The organs occupy their usual anatomic positions.

HEAD (CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM) and NECK:

See "Evidence of Injury". The unfixed brain weighs 1620 grams. See Neuropathology consultation for complete description of the brain. The atlanto-occipital joint is stable.

The anterior strap muscles of the neck are homogenous and red-brown without hemorrhage by layer-wise dissection. The thyroid cartilage and hyoid bone are intact. The larynx is lined by intact white mucosa. The tongue is free of bite marks, hemorrhage, or other injuries. The thyroid gland is symmetric and red-brown, without cystic or nodular change. Incision and dissection of the posterior neck demonstrates no deep paracervical muscular injury and no cervical spine fractures.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM:

The upper airway is clear of debris and foreign material. The mucosal surfaces are smooth, red-tan and unremarkable. The right and left lungs weigh 830 and 670 grams, respectively. The pulmonary parenchyma is red-purple exuding mild amounts of blood and frothy fluid. There are multiple, calcified hilar lymph nodes. The pulmonary arteries are normally developed and patent without thrombus or embolus.

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM:

The heart is contained in an intact pericardial sac. The heart weighs 310 grams. The coronary arteries are present in a normal distribution, with a right-dominant pattern and are widely patent. The walls of the left ventricle, interventricular septum, and right ventricle are 1.2, 1.3, and 0.2 centimeters thick respectively. The right ventricle is dilated. The aorta gives rise to three intact and patent arch vessels. The renal and mesenteric vessels are unremarkable. The vena cava and its major tributaries return to the heart in the usual distribution and are free of thrombi.

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LIVER & BILIARY SYSTEM:

The 1720 gram liver has an intact, smooth capsule and a sharp anterior border. The parenchyma is tan-brown. No mass lesions are identified. The gallbladder contains 10 milliliters bile. The extrahepatic biliary tree is patent.

SPLEEN:

The 90 gram spleen has a smooth, intact, red-purple capsule. The parenchyma is maroon with unremarkable lymphoid follicles.

PANCREAS:

The pancreas is red-tan with a lobulated appearance. No mass lesions or other abnormalities are identified.

ADRENALS:

The right and left adrenal glands are symmetric. No masses or areas of hemorrhage are identified.

GENITOURINARY SYSTEM:

The right and left kidneys weigh 180 grams and 200 grams, respectively. The external surfaces are intact and smooth. The cut surfaces are red-brown and the cortices are delineated from the medullary pyramids. The pelves are unremarkable and the ureters are normal in course and caliber. The bladder contains 10 milliliters of clear urine. The prostate and testes are unremarkable.

GASTROINTESTINAL TRACT:

The esophagus is intact and lined by smooth, tan mucosa. The stomach, small bowel, colon, and appendix are unremarkable. The stomach contains 600 milliliters of brown fluid.

MUSCULOSKELETAL:

Muscle development is normal. There are degenerative changes of the 11th and 12th thoracic vertebrae.

ADDITIONAL PROCEDURES

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NEUROPATHOLOGY CONSULTATION (AFIP)²

GROSS DESCRIPTION:

Brain weight: 1660 gm

The specimen consists of the intracranial dura and brain of an adult.

Fragments of red-black coagulated blood, averaging 0.5 cm thick, lie loosely on the inner surface of the right cerebral convexity dura and outer surface of the underlying right cerebral leptomeninges. This extends from the mid-frontal to the mid-occipital lobes and from the falx cerebri to the lateral resection margin. The venous sinuses are patent.

The brain is diffusely swollen (the right cerebral hemisphere slightly more than the left). In both hemispheres the gyri are widened and the sulci are compressed but the gyri have an otherwise normal anatomic configuration. The perimesencephalic and basal cisterns are completely effaced due to brain swelling. Moderately deep tentorial grooves indent each uncus (R>L) 1.2 cm from the medial margin on the right and 0.5 cm on the left. The right uncal groove continues over the surface of the parahippocampal gyrus approximately 1 cm from its medial margin. There is prominent distortion of the cerebellar tonsils due to impression from the foramen magnum. The mamillary bodies are pressed downward and caudal into the interpeduncular fossa. The leptomeninges are thin, delicate and acutely congested.

Except as noted, the external aspects of the brainstem and cerebellum are not remarkable. The arteries at the base of the brain follow a normal distribution an there are no aneurysmal dilatations or sites of occlusion. All the identifiable cranial nerve roots are not remarkable.

Coronal sections of the cerebrum reveal no focal lesions in the cortex, white matter or deep nuclear structures. There is moderate rightward midline shift of the cerebral hemispheres with a resultant slight enlargement of the left lateral ventricle consistent with compression of the foramen of Munro. There is cavum septum pellucidum. The cross section of the midbrain is narrow and elongated (dorsal/ventral) due to compression from the swollen cerebral hemispheres. The medulla is not remarkable. Except as noted, the cerebellum shows no diffuse or focal abnormalities. The substantia nigra and locus coeruleus are well pigmented.

Except as noted, the ventricular system and aqueduct of Sylvius are patent with a normal anatomic configuration. The choroid plexus is unremarkable and the ependymal surfaces are smooth and glistening.

PATHOLOGIC FINDINGS:

The acute subdural hematoma, while not thick, covers an extensive area of the right cerebral hemisphere and is associated with significant brain swelling with downward herniation (early transtentorial and trans-foramen magnum herniation and slight right to left cerebral midline shift). The fact that the coagulated blood does no adhere to the inner surface of the dura when the dura is lifted (at least as much blood remains lying on the surface of the brain as adheres to the inner surface of the dura) suggests a recent injury such as within 36 hours.

The microscopic findings reveal widespread, predominantly subcortical white matter edema. In these areas, the GFAP reveals diffuse swollen astrocytes in the white matter and also in a perivascular pattern. There is no acute ischemic neuronal injury ("red neurons").

The beta amyloid precursor reaction demonstrates extensive axonal injuring in the vascular pattern in the corpus callosum, the subcortical cingulate white matter, the anterior limb of the internal capsule and the base of the pons. This is a result of vascular compromise of these areas due to a rising intracranial pressure. In addition, there are small groups and individual positively stained axons in the septum pellucidum, the internal capsule, the periventricular white matter around the third ventricle, the periventricular white matter around the temporal horn of the lateral ventricle and in the basses of the pons and midbrain that suggest traumatic axonal strain.

There is striking ependymal cell loss and gliosis with ependymal granulations along the ventricular surface of the corpus callosum, the septum pellucidum and the occipital horn of the lateral ventricle. The gliosis appears chronic and there are associated hyalinized small blood vessels. This is a degenerative change that is not expected in one of this age group.

OPINION

This Civilian, **BTB** Tor Jan, died of blunt force head injury sustained while he was being detained. By report, he hit his head during a struggle. Autopsy revealed a right-sided subdural hematoma, swelling of the brain, and evidence of brain herniation. In addition, histologic sections of the brain are suggestive of diffuse axonal injury of the brain. The additional abrasions and contusions on the body are consistent with a struggle. The toxicology screen was negative. The manner of death is homicide.
