#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- On 05Feb07, NCIS Al Asad was advised that Marines from Kilo Company (Kilo), 3rd Battalion, 4th Marines (3/4), Battle Position (BP) Tarawa, Iraq, reported that V/MOHAMMED, an Iraqi detainee, had died during a Task Force 88 raid earlier that morning, and had been left on the makeshift helicopter landing zone (HLZ) for turnover to the Iraqi Police (IP). Information from Task Force 88, initially reported between 0530 and 0600, indicated V/MOHAMMED had a heart attack and expired prior to helicopter extraction. At the time of death, three Navy corpsman quickly examined V/MOHAMMED and opined he expired of natural causes. Approximately 3 1/2 hours later, a fourth corpsman, while on patrol with 3/4, located V/MOHAMMED's body and noted moderate bruising around the neck and heavier (deeper in color) bruising from the clavicle up. Additionally, the corpsman allegedly felt crepitus midline of the right side of the neck, and observed the trachea was abnormal, not centered, and opined that V/MOHAMMED had a broken neck.
- 2. V/MOHAMMED's body was released to the IP's, taken to Husaybah nospital, and later released to a person purporting to be his son (NFI). V/MOHAMMED's body was allegedly taken back to Beyji, Iraq for burial (NFI). A copy of the Iraqi death certificate was obtained and the doctor,  $\frac{(b)(6),(b)(7)(C)}{(b)(6),(b)(7)(C)}$  noted bruising around the neck and shoulder area, as well as bruising around the wrist. The Iraqi death certificate did not specifically state cause or manner of death and information obtained from the doctor revealed the cause and manner of death was unknown, but no foul play was suspected. Photographic coverage of the death scene and interviews of Kilo Company Marines, Iraq Police, Iraqi locals from the raided houses, and Task Force 88 members were completed. This investigation remains open pending feasibility of interviewing detainees captured during the raid and locating and possibly exhuming V/MOHAMMED's remains.

#### NARRATIVE

- 1. This reactive investigation was initiated to determine the circumstances surrounding the death of V/MOHAMMED. No criminal statues apply at this time.
- 2. References (A)-(D) detail investigative activities to date.

  Subsequent to submission of Reference (D), an in-depth review of the case file was conducted and consolidated the following information pertaining to the medical assessments that were rendered to V/MOHAMMED on 05Feb07; Exhibit (33) pertains. Based upon statements provided by three hospital corpsman, (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) and
- (b)(6).(b)(7)(C) the victim possibly died of natural causes. All three corpsman were present with V/MOHAMMED on the night of the raid and the helicopter extraction. All three stated V/MOHAMMED was walking on his own to the HLZ when he fell face first into the ground. V/MOHAMMED was put onto a ladder as a makeshift litter and further carried by members of 3/4 to the HLZ. All three corpsman attempted quick life saving measures but were unable to resuscitate V/MOHAMMED. From approximately 0530-0600, V/MOHAMMED's body was left at the HLZ for turnover to the IP's. Approximately 3 1/2 hours later, at 0900, a Marine patrol from 3/4 located V/MOHAMMED's body near the HLZ in an unsecured open area. It was at this time that another Navy corpsman, (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) examined the body and opined V/MOHAMMED possibly had a broken neck.
  - 3. On 15Jul07, (b)(6),(b)(7)(C)Officer in Charge, Joint Prosecution and Exploitation Cell (JPEC),
    Camp Al Asad, Iraq was contacted. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) located one individual rounded up in the same raid as V/MOHAMMED. (b)(6),(b) related the name of (b)(6),(b)(7)(C), Iraqi National, and a detainee currently being held at Camp Bucca, Iraq. According to (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) no other detainees were processed through the JPEC at Camp Al Asad, Iraq, from the raid on or about 05Feb07.

  - 5. On 02Aug07 (b)(6),(b)(7)(C)

    Task Force 714, and Regimental Combat Team Two (RCT-2) SJA (b)(6),(b)(7)(C)

    (b)(6),(b)(7)(C)

    USNC. were briefed on the status of this investigation. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) were queried as to the feasibility of locating V/MOHAMMED's family members in Beyji, Iraq, for permission to exhume the body for an autopsy. Efforts are ongoing to determine the best course of action. A copy of this case report will be provided to the RCT-2 SJA for forwarding to 3/4 Command. Completion of active investigation is pending the feasibility of locating and possibly exhuming V/MOHAMMED's remains.

REVIEW OF INVESTIGATIVE EFFORTS

1. On 14Jul07, Reporting Agent (RA) conducted an in-depth review of the case file and consolidated the following information pertaining to the medical assessments that were rendered to V/MOHAMMED on 05Feb07. As background, V/MOHAMMED was rounded up in a Task Force 88 raid near Battle Position Tarawa, Iraq during the early morning hours of 05Feb07. V/MOHAMMED allegedly collapsed on the way to a helicopter landing zone (HLZ) and his body was left at the HLZ between 0530 and 0600. Approximately 3 1/2 hours later, a Marine patrol from 3/4 Kilo Co., recovered V/MOHAMMED's body in an unsecured open area believed to be near the HLZ.

2. According to a statement provided by Navy corpsman (b)(6),(b)(7)(C)

(b)(6),(b)(7) he was with another detainee when V/MOHAMMED went down.

According to (b)(6), V/MOHAMMED was walking on his own for approximately 10 minutes before he collapsed. (b)(6), was the first to examine V/MOHAMMED. (b)(6), stated he did a shake and shout, meaning he tapped the detainee and yelled "hey" to see if he was conscious.

(b)(6),(b)(7)(C )id a quick ABC (airway, breathing, and circulation) on V/MOHAMMED, to include a quick check of the carotid for a pulse.

(b)(6),(b)(7)( stated V/MOHAMMED had a strong pulse and spontaneous respirations. (b)(6), did a sternal rub and V/MOHAMMED made a little movement and groaned. V/MOHAMMED was placed onto an aircraft ladder to act as a litter and carried to the wild of the corpsman, (b)(6),(b)(c) came to assist and (b)(6), stated he checked V/MOHAMMED's radial and there was no pulse. (b)(6), checked V/MOHAMMED's carotid for a pulse and leaned in to feel for any air movement. (b)(6),(b) also checked with a pulse ox machine on both of V/MOHAMMED's hands. (b)(6), stated V/MOHAMMED had no pulse and no respirations. (b)(6), stated he did not check for any trauma or head and neck injuries due to the fact that V/MOHAMMED was (b)(6), for about 10 minutes without incident before he collapsed. (b)(6), has been a paramedic since 2000, and was last recertified in February 2006.

(b)(6),(b)(7)( opined V/MOHAMMED had a medical problem and was not injured and incurred no neck injury during transport to the HLZ.

3. According to a statement provided by Navy corpsmar (b)(6),(b)(7)(C)

(b)(6),(b)(7)(C) he was the second to assist with the assessment of .

V/MOHAMMED. (b)(6),(b)( stated he put his head down by V/MOHAMMED's mouth and his hand on the chest to look, listen, and feel for breath and the chest to rise and fall. (b)(6),(b)(7 checked V/MOHAMMED's pulse with both the radial and carotid and it was absent (b)(6),(b)(7) necked V/MOHAMMED's eyes to see if his pupil would react to light and they were fixed and dilated. (b)(6),(b)(1) stated he did not notice any redness or blood in the eyes (b)(6),(b)(7) tated he put the pulse ox machine on

V/MOHAMMED's index finger and it showed zero. (b)(6),(b) checked his cap refill and no blood returned to V/MOHAMMED's fingernail. (b)(6),(b)(7)(6) did a quick sweep of the body, checked his neck, and did not feel any crepitus, though (b)(6),(b) was not specifically looking for it.

(b)(6),(b)(7)(C) opined V/MOHAMMED likely died from a heart attack (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) is a nationally registered paramedic since 2001,(b)(6),(b)( stated he has experience with cardiac patients in hospital type settings while becoming nationally certified, and was recertified in December 2006.

4. According to a statement provided by Navy corpsmar(b)(6),(b)(7)(C)

(b)(6),(b)(7) he was in the target house when all the detainees were consolidated. (b)(6),(b) stated all the detainees were sitting upright and there was no one that appeared to have any medical problems. On the way to the HLZ, V/MOHAMMED allegedly collapsed. When (b)(6),(got to V/MOHAMMED on the ground, he stated (b)(6) was assessing the victim.

to V/MOHAMMED on the ground, he stated (b)(6) was assessing the victim.

(b)(6),(b)(7)( stated he could see that V/MOHAMMED was moving around. (b)(6),(b)(7)( stated (b)(6) relayed V/MOHAMMED had labored breathing but was conscious and just needed to be carried out (b)(6),(b) could not remember if V/MOHAMMED was talking or not, but V/MOHAMMED was looking around while being assessed by (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) stated V/MOHAMMED was put onto a ladder to act as a litter to carry V/MOHAMMED to the HLZ. While on the litter (b)(6),(b) stated (b)(6), was near V/MOHAMMED's head so he could continue to assess V/MOHAMMED. Upon reaching the HLZ (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) stated (b)(6) and (b)(6),(b) told him V/MOHAMMED was not breathing. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) saw(b) and (b)(6),(b) theck V/MOHAMMED's wrist and carotid with no pulse. (b)(6),( saw(b)(6), and (b)(6),(b)(try a sternal rub with no effect. Again, they checked a pulse ox machine twice with negative results. At that time, (b)(6),( opined V/MOHAMMED had expired (b)(6),(b) opined V/MOHAMMED died of a heart attack. (b)(6),(b) has been a Navy corpsman for 13 years and is a nationally registered paramedic (b)(6),(b) stated he has been involved with the assessment and treatment of patients that have had heart attacks and traumatic injuries.

- 5. On 05Feb07, approximately 3 1/2 hours after being left by the Task Force 88 unit, a security patrol from Kilo Company, 3rd Battalion, 4th Marines located V/MOHAMMED in an unsecured open area near a makeshift HLZ. Navy corpsman (b)(6),(b)(7)( was with the security patrol and upon locating V/MOHAMMED, (b)(6), performed an examination. (b)(6),( stated he found no gunshot would no blood shot vessels in the eyes, no cerebral spinal fluid in the ears or nose but allegedly felt crepitus along the midline of the neck (b)(6),( noted bruising on V/MOHAMMED's neck and shoulders that were described as heavy to mild shades of purple. (b)(6),( spined from the limited information at the scene and a hour hysical examination, V/MOHAMMED appeared to have a broken neck. (b)(6),( stated he has been a Navy corpsman since January 2006.
- 6. On 06Feb07, the day after the raid, (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) USMC, was tasked to locate the Iraqi hospital and any hospital records pertaining to the death of V/MOHAMMED. (b)(6),(b)(7) stated he and his interpreter spoke to the director of the hospital (NFI) about V/MOHAMMED's death. The director located medical records pertaining to V/MOHAMMED and the documents related V/MOHAMMED had died of natural causes. According to the paperwork, V/MOHAMMED had bruises

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
