

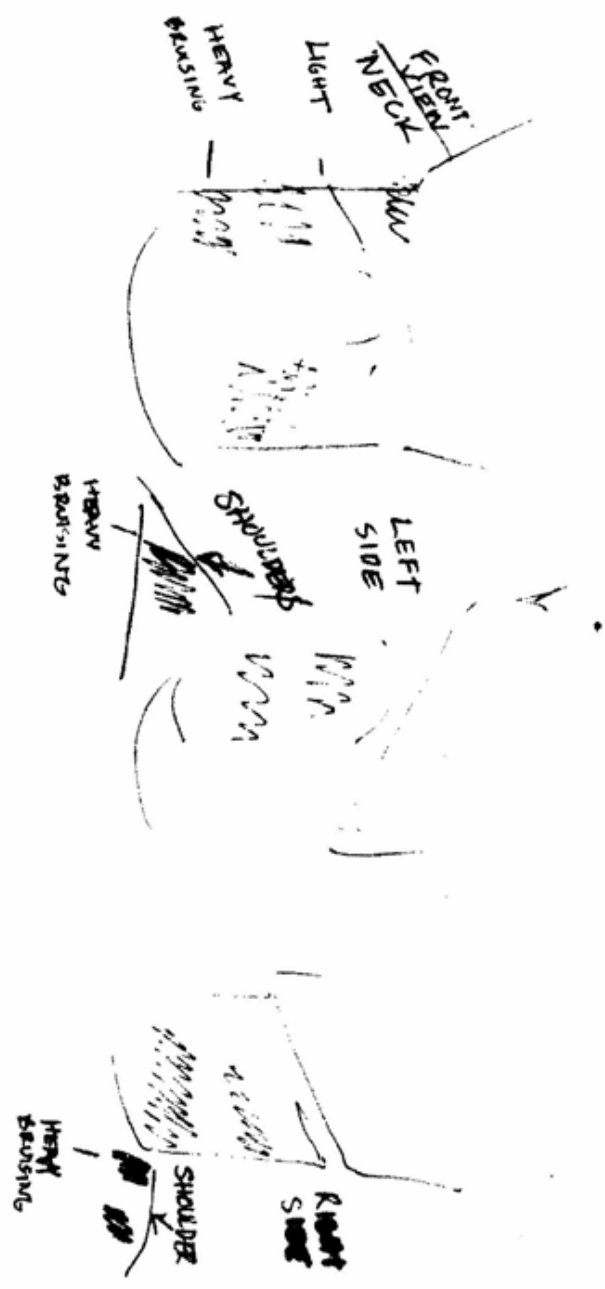

RESULTS OF INTERVIEW OF (b)(6),(b)(7)(C)

1. On 08Feb07, Reporting Agent (RA) interviewed (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) Kilo Company, 3rd Battalion, 4th Marines, Battle Position (BP) Tarawa, Iraq, regarding his knowledge of the events leading to the discovery of V/MOHAMMED's body.
2. Upon arriving at BP Tarawa there was no generator electricity at therefore a statement was not obtained from (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) provided a drawing depicting the area in which they located V/MOHAMMED's body, GPS coordinate (b)(2) and where a cordon was set while waiting on Iraqi Police (IP) to arrive on scene enclosure (A) pertains (b)(6),(b)(7) advised when the GPS was taken the information was called into to BP Tarawa and they should have a record of time on scene. Additionally (b)(6),(b)(7) related he had completed a typed statement of his activities to provide command, which was provided to RA on 09Feb07, enclosure (B) pertains.
3. For background, (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) related at approximately 0330 on 05Feb07 he had woken up to explosions associated with the raid near BP Tarawa and at approximately 0530 (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) recalled they (Kilo Company) was informed a body had expired and had been left at the LZ. On 08Feb07 (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) advised that upon returning to BP Tarawa his joint Marine and Iraqi Army (IA) patrol unit was advised to go back out and locate a body that had been left at a Landing Zone (LZ) after the raid. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) reported they moved over Bronze (a main street) approximately 300 meters West of BP Tarawa and located the body. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) indicated he recalled seeing some locals in the open area headed to the town market area but he did not see anyone close to the body. (b)(6),(b)(7) reported that when they reached the body he noticed a cooking oil can with a large rock on top of it had been placed near the head of the body, as if to mark the area, in his opinion.
4. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) advised the head of the body (V/MOHAMMED) was towards the West and his feet towards the East. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) related V/MOHAMMED was lying on his back and he had his left eye closed and his right eye appeared to have a little bit of blood in the tear duct. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) recalled his legs were slightly bent but flat and he was wearing grey sweatpants. (b)(6),(b)(7) reported the back of V/MOHAMMED's pants were slightly lower than the front and that he was wearing a gray collarless shirt. V/MOHAMMED had nothing on his feet and nothing on his head. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) reported V/MOHAMMED's hands were lying down to his side with palms facing up to the best of his memory. (b)(6),(b)(7) came up to examine the body and the GPS coordinate was taken directly over the body. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) examined the body. (b)(6),(b)(7) related he observed a lot of bruising, described as dark purple to reddish colored, on the left and right side of V/MOHAMMED's shoulder and chest area. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C)

stated he did not see bruising on V/MOHAMMED's neck, abdomen, feet or wrist. (b)(6),(b)(7) asked (b)(6),(b)(7) what he thought had happened and (b)(6),(b)(7) related he thought he (V/MOHAMMED) had a broken neck. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) advised he had all the men cordon off the expired body and waited until the IP's arrived on scene.

5. According to (b)(6),(b)(7) approximately 30 meters South of the body's location an IA found one black flex cuff that was cut, which he brought up and placed with the body. (b)(6),(b)(7) indicated he did not notice footprints around the area of the body and saw no bullet casings. (b)(6),(b)(7) reported it took approximately thirty minutes before the IP's arrived on scene with two pickup trucks, an ambulance, two officers and approximately twenty Iraqi Police with them.

6. (b)(6),(b)(7) reported later, on 06Feb07, a patrol was out and intersected with the raid area where multiple people were upset and wanted the Marines to do something about the raids. (b)(6),(b)(7) related he was not out on the patrol but (b)(6),(b)(7) was and he ended up walking through the houses hit during the raid. (b)(6),(b)(7) advised the patrol attempted to talk with the people to calm them down even though they did not have an interpreter with them.
