EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. This investigation was initiated on 22Dec07, upon notification by Command regarding the death of V/AL ALWANI, a detainee who was being transferred from Combat Outpost (COP) Manion to the Camp Fallujah, Iraq Regional Detention Facility (RDF) by personnel assigned to the Military Transition Team (MiTT), Regimental Combat Team 6 (RCT-6), Camp Fallujah, Iraq. V/AL ALWANI was being transported to the RDF for allegedly producing Improvised Explosive Devices (IED) and attacks against Coalition Forces (CF). V/AL ALWANI was being transported to the RDF via a Mine Resistant Ambush Protected (MRAP) vehicle; wherein, he grabbed (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) M4 rifle and fired a round below (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) groin area. (b)(6) (b)(7)(retrieved his Beretta pistol and shot V/AL ALWANI. V/AL ALWANI was pronounced dead by a MiTT corpsman immediately after the shooting. A death scene examination was conducted, evidence was recovered, and photos were obtained. USMC personnel in the vehicle during the shooting indicated they did not witness the shooting but heard one shot that was followed by a rapid succession of additional shots. Interpreter (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) who was sitting beside V/AL ALWANI, heard a shot; he turned to look and saw((b)(6),(b)(7)(C) shoot V/AL ALWANI. - 1. This investigation was initiated on 22Dec07, upon notification by Command regarding the death of V/AL ALWANI, a detainee who was being transferred from Combat Outpost (COP) Manion to the Camp Fallujah, Iraq Regional Detention Facility (RDF) by personnel assigned to the Military Transition Team (MiTT), Regimental Combat Team 6 (RCT-6), Camp Fallujah, Iraq. V/AL ALWANI was being transported to the RDF for allegedly producing Improvised Explosive Devices (IED) and attacks against Coalition Forces (CF). V/AL ALWANI was being transported to the RDF via a Mine Resistant Ambush Protected (MRAP) vehicle; wherein, he grabbed (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) M4 rifle and fired a round below (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) groin area. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) retrieved his Beretta pistol and shot V/AL ALWANI. V/AL ALWANI was pronounced dead by a MiTT corpsman immediately after the shooting.

(h)(6)(h)(7)(confirmed that (b)(6).(told him to translate to V/AL ALWANI on three occasions to sit up straight and keep his hands to his chest. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C stated on all three occasions, V/AL ALWANI was leaning so much that his hands were down by his feet. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) stated (b)(6) warned V/AL ALWANI on the third occasion and said, "Sit up straight and place your hands on your chest, this is the last time I am telling you to sit up straight. "(b)(6)(b)(7)(could not recall how much time had passed after the third occasion when (b)(6), told him to tell the detainee to sit up and the time he heard the first shot. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) stated after (b)(6),(b)(6) shot his pistol, he immediately checked V/AL ALWANI for a pulse, and then said "Clear." (b)(6) (b)(7)(stated (b)(6), checked the V/AL ALWANI for a pulse. (b)(6),(b)(7)(stated he did look at (b)(6) (check V/AL ALWANI for a pulse but did not look at where V/AL ALWANI's hands were placed nor witness where the rifle was positioned after the shooting occurred because he (b)(6),(b)(7)(C)(b)(6),(b)(7) was in shock, and moved to the front of the vehicle shortly thereafter. (b)(6),(b)(7)(stated while traveling to Camp Fallujah after the shooting occurred, he overheard (b)(6),(b)(tell the vehicle commander, (b)(6),(b)(7)(C)USMC, "I'm done, I'm going to jail." (b)(6),(b)(7) stated (b)(6),(b) replied, "No, you're OK, you did the right thing. (b)(6)(b)(7)(stated(b)(6), replied, "No, my officer will make sure I go to jail," exhibit (16) pertains.






Investigation was initiated on 22Dec07, upon notification from (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) Regimental Combat Team 6 (RCT-6) Military Transition Team (MiTT), Camp Fallujah, Iraq regarding a detainee (V/AL ALWANI) that was shot and killed by a USMC member (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) while in USMC custody in transit from Combat Outpost (COP) Manion to the Camp Fallujah, Iraq Regional Detention Facility (RDF) (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) indicated the vehicle being used to transport the detainee was a Mine Resistant Ambush Protected (MRAP) vehicle and was located at the Iraqi Training Center (ITC), aboard Camp Fallujah, Iraq.
 - On 22Dec07, NCISRA Iraq responded to the death scene at the ITC, Camp Fallujah, Iraq. A death scene examination was conducted in MRAP vehicle, number USMC 633019. Two death scene sketches were created. One death scene sketch was the seating arrangement during the actual shooting and the second death scene sketch was evidence placement upon examination along with measurements. The death scene determined five shots were fired from a 9mm pistol and one shot was fired from an M-4 rifle. The interior of the MRAP passenger area contained four identified impact shots behind where V/AL ALWANI was sitting, two in the interior ballistic glass above V/AL ALWANI's seat and two through V/AL ALWANI's seat. Another identified bullet hole was underneath the seat where (b)(6),(b)(7)(was seated. The bullet hole was angled from the opposite seat. Five projectiles were identified; three of which were recovered. Five 9mm shell casings, one 5.56 shell casing and multiple ballistic jackets were recovered, exhibit (1) pertains. Photographs of the death scene were obtained, exhibits (2) and (3) pertains.

Two projectiles were stuck inside the ballistic interior glass (window) behind where V/AL ALWANI was seated; however, the projectiles could not be recovered during the scene processing, exhibit (4) pertains.
 - On 22Dec07, V/AL ALWANI was transported from the ITC to the Personnel Retrieval and Processing (PRP), Camp Fallujah, Iraq. Upon USN, Combat Logistics Battalion arrival, (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) - 8 (CLB-8), Emergency Room Physician, examined V/AL ALWANI... Photographs were obtained of V/AL ALWANI during the examination, exhibit (5) pertains. (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) examination determined V/AL ALWANI had two gunshot wounds in the chest, two gunshot wounds in the back, and two gunshot wounds in the head. (b)(6),(b)(provided a copy of V/AL ALWANI's medical treatment record, exhibit (6) pertains.
- On 22Dec07, an interview was conducted with ((b)(6),(b)(7)(C) (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) an Iraqi interpreter employed by L3 Communications Titan Linguistics assigned to MiTT. As background, (b)(6),(b)(7)(was sitting next to V/AL ALWANI and diagonally across from (h)(5)(h)(7) during the transport to the Camp Fallujah RDF from COP Manion. (b)(6),(b)(7)(stated he learned V/AL ALWANI was suspected of insurgent activity. On 04Jan08, items of evidence to include (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) M-4 Rifle, (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) M9 9mm handgun, projectiles and shell casings were submitted to USACIL for latent print analysis, ballistics matching and weapon functionality testing via registered mail numbers RE 178 540 332 US and RE 178 540 346 US. Shipment of items of evidence seized from V/AL ALWANI's autopsy at the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP) by NCIS Washington DC Field Office under Evidence Log Number 337-07 will be sent separately to USACIL. Items of evidence will include major case prints of V/AL ALWANI and projectiles taken from V/AL ALWANI's head and on his clothing.

DEATH SCENE EXAMINATION

- 1. On 22Dec07, at approximately 1400, a death scene examination was conducted at the Iraqi Training Center (ITC), Camp Fallujah, Iraq, inside a Mine Resistant Ambush Protected (MRAP) vehicle, USMC 633019, Vin #4VZKR2MN07C059785. The death scene was conducted as a result of the death of V/AL ALWANI which occurred while he was being transported to Camp Fallujah. The temperature was 51 degrees Fahrenheit and the skies were clear and sunny.
- 2. The MRAP vehicle exterior dimensions taken were a height of 8'6", length of 22'll.5", and a width of 9'2". The MRAP was facing the west in a parking lot/staging area at the ITC, Camp Fallujah, Iraq. The MRAP rear doors were open, which consisted of two hatches that open outward from the MRAP, with a two step stairwell leading into the interior passenger compartment. The remains of V/AL ALWANI were located outside the MRAP rear doors, lying on the ground on top of a black body bag. Initial observations of V/AL ALWANI's could not determine wounds. V/AL ALWANI was bound in the front by white plastic flexi-cuffs. V/AL ALWANI had a red and white turban, which was wrapped around his head and face, just below the nose so that his face was covered. V/AL ALWANI's feet were not bound. He was wearing a grey in color coat over a tan in color robe and grey pants with brown open toed sandals.
- 3. Upon initial observation of the death scene, and from preliminary interviews gleaned from witnesses, it was revealed the death scene, which was in the passenger compartment of the MRAP, was disturbed before the arrival of NCISRA Iraq, Camp Fallujah personnel. Seating arrangement of the personnel aboard the vehicle was obtained from the vehicle commander, (b)(6),(b)(7)(C) USMC, enclosure (A) pertains.
- 4. The passenger compartment measurements of the MRAP vehicle was approximately 12' in length from the cab (cab indicates where the driver of the MRAP and vehicle commander are seated) area to the rear exit doors and a 5'7" wide interior from bulkhead to bulkhead. From floor to ceiling was 4'6". The seats were spaced apart from edge to edge at 1'4". The floor in the passenger compartment was metal with ridged grooves. The passenger compartment had six seats, three on either side facing each other, bolted to the floorboard and walls of the MRAP. There were three portals on either side of the passenger compartment, each consisting of an interior and exterior pane of ballistic glass. The portals were elevated above the top of the seats. A small bench was located past the six facing seats (closer to the cab area) centered and bolted in the middle of the floor. The bench is utilized as a stand for the turret gunner position. Above

the bench is a circular hatch, which had straps hanging down. Behind the driver's seat (cab area) was communication equipment. Behind the passenger's seat (cab area) was a storage locker area.

- 5. Upon entry, there were three rifles positioned against the driver's side passenger compartment rear corner. The three rifles were two (2) AK-47s and one (1) Enfield bolt action rifle. An M-4 service rifle was lying on the deck partway underneath the rear seat in the passenger compartment (driver's side), barrel facing the front of the vehicle. The M-4 serial number was W249925. A cardboard box was on the deck up against the corner in the rear corner of the passenger compartment (passenger's side). A white plastic bag of clothing was in front of the turret gunner's bench on the deck, between the two seats facing each other closest to the cab (front of passenger compartment). A digitally camouflaged helmet and medical bag were on the seat closest to the driver's seat in the passenger compartment.
- 6. The rear seat in the passenger compartment on the passenger's side revealed a bullet hole in the metal floor panel underneath the seat carriage with was 1" in diameter. The hole was angled towards the right wall underneath the seat. On the deck from the seat (with the bullet hole underneath the carriage) was a small projectile. On the deck close to the seat (with the bullet hole underneath the carriage) was a 5.56 brass shell casing. Two 9mm brass shell casing were found on the deck close to the third seat (going toward the cab on the passenger's side) in the passenger compartment. One 9mm brass shell casing was discovered underneath the turret gunner's bench. One 9mm brass shell casing was discovered lying on a green laundry bag on the other side of the turret gunner's bench closer to the cab. One 9mm brass shell casing was discovered on the deck past the turret gunner's bench closer to the cab.
- 7. On the driver's side of the passenger compartment, the seat that had an M-4 service rifle underneath was discovered to have two small puncture holes in it (rear seat, driver's side). The back of the seat indicated exit holes. The seat had stains on the seat and backrest. Above the seat was a portal with two projectiles stuck in the interior ballistic glass; one projectile was centered on the top of the ballistic glass portal 3'10" from the floor and one projectile was centered on the right of the ballistic glass portal 3'7" from the floor. The projectiles were angled slightly in a rightward (facing the glass). Facing the glass, the right corner panel had been grazed before the projectile impacted, which also reveals a slight rightwards angle. On the right side of the portal was an apparent scuff with biological material surrounding it. The scuff was approximately one and a half inches long, horizontal, with the center approximately 3'8" from the floor.
