This is an "Operation Iraqi Freedom" investigation.

This investigation was initiated upon notification from SFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Superintendent, Detainee Operations, BCCF, Abu Ghraib, Iraq (AGI), that a detainee died as a result of a gunshot wound.

Investigation established probable cause to believe Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) while detained at the BCCF, Iraq, died after being struck in the chest by a bullet, which was fired from outside of FOB Abu Ghraib, during an enemy ambush of a passing convoy.

A preliminary autopsy, conducted by the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP), determined Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) death was caused by a Perforating Ballistic Injury of the Torso and the manner of death to be Homicide.

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A forensic examination, conducted by the US Army Criminal Investigation Laboratory (USACIL), determined the bullet recovered at the scene to have likely originated from a Degtyarev 12.7mm Caliber Heavy Machine Gun, commonly used by Anti-Iraqi forces.

**BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION:** On 20 Sep 04, this office was notified by SFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Superintendent, Detainee Operations, BCCF, Abu Ghraib, Iraq (AGI), of the death of an unidentified detainee.

About 2240, 20 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) coordinated with SFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who stated he was informed of a detainee was transported to the BCCF Hospital due to a gunshot wound to the torso. Upon arrival at the hospital, he was informed by medical staff that the detainee had expired. SFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) went to the Level 2 compound and coordinated with the guards to determine what happened. He was told several guards heard a loud noise and saw a flash and then several detainees yelled for assistance. The guards discovered one detainee was injured and had what appeared to be a gunshot wound to his torso. Several personnel at the compound transported the detainee to the hospital for treatment. A projectile of unknown caliber was discovered in the area where the detainee was injured and it was provided to the guards.

**AGENT'S COMMENT:** A preliminary examination of the projectile revealed it was similar in size and shape to a .50 caliber round and contained a white powder-like residue on the rear of the projectile, which was suspected to be concrete residue from the impact with the concrete bunker.

At 2245, 20 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) collected one projectile as evidence. The projectile was documented upon an Evidence/Property Custody Document. (See EPCD)

About 2320, 20 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and Investigator (INV) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) this office, exposed photographs of the body, suspected to be Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Internment Serial Number (ISN) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (See Photographs)

About 2345, 20 Aug 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) coordinated with PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 391<sup>st</sup> Military Police (MP) Battalion, Detainee In-Processing Section, BCCF, AGI, who performed a Biometrics Automated System Toolset (BATS) Retinal Scan on the body, which subsequently confirmed the victim was (b)(6), (b)(7)(C). PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) provided the dossier pertaining to (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (See Dossier)

About 2350, 20 Aug 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) conducted canvass interviews of Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) ISN (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Camp Chief/Translator; Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who were all sitting with Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) at the time of the incident. Each detainee described that (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was leaning against the West side of the concrete bunker wall located on the West side of Tent 7, while sitting on a standard military five gallon water jug. They described they were all sitting teaching Arabic to the MP Guards, when they heard a bang and saw (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) fall forward onto the ground. They yelled for help, at which time the MP's brought a vehicle to the gate. The detainees brought (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) to the gate and Detainee DAIM helped the MP's load (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) into the rear of the vehicle and rode with (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) in the vehicle to the hospital. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated that he observed a wound about two inches by two inches in the middle of (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) chest. He said (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was still breathing shallow, but not talking. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said he helped the MP hold pressure on (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) chest. Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated he found the bullet on the ground near the bunker soon after (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was taken from the scene and gave the bullet to SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C)

About 2355, 20 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and INV (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) conducted a death scene examination of the area surrounding Tent 7 inside Level 2 Compound, Camp Redemption, BCCF, AGI:

**Characteristics of the Scene:** Camp Redemption is located near the center of the East wall of the Baghdad Central Confinement Facility Inside the Abu Ghraib Prison, which is approximately (approx.) 15 miles West of Baghdad, Iraq. Camp Redemption was separated into five levels numbered 1 through 5, with Levels 2 through 5 being located in the Northern portion of the compound and separated by additional fence and concertina wire. The Level 2 compound is located in the center section of the Camp Redemption and consisted of 12 separate tents each separated and enclosed on all four sides by a chain link-type fence and concertina wire. The main gate into the compound was located in the center of the West wall. A road extended from the main gate through the middle of the compound and there were six tents on the North side of the road and six tents on the South of the road. Tent 7 was the third compound on the South side of the road. There was a guard shack and two concrete bunkers in the space between the enclosures for Tents 5 and 7. The fence surrounding Tent 7 was approx. 50' by 75' by 10' with concertina wire at the inside of the base of the fence and on the top of the fence. There was a military type tent in the approx. center of the enclosure, measuring approx 15' by 20' by 10'. There was a gate in the center of the North side of the fence and a plastic portable toilet in the Northeast corner of the enclosure. There was a concrete bunker located between the tent and the West side of the fence. The victim was reported to have been seated near the center of the West side of the bunker, facing the guard shack.

**Condition of the Scene:** The concrete bunker was located approx. eight feet from the fence and consisted of two sections adjacent each other with a combined length of approx. eight feet and a height of approx. five feet. There was concertina wire at the base of the fence, which was approx. three feet in diameter. The ground was covered by a combination of dirt and rock. There was an indentation in the concrete bunker approx. two inches in diameter, which was located in the approx. of center of the North section. There was a trail of a red liquid approx. five feet in length, suspected to be blood, approx. three feet from the base of the bunker. There were several red spots located on the lower portion of the South section of the bunker, which were suspected to be blood spatter. The projectile was reported to have been discovered approx. one foot from the base of the bunker near the North edge.

**Environmental Conditions:** The temperature approximately 85 degrees Fahrenheit with low humidity. The skies were clear, no detectible winds or odors were present, and no signs of pollution.

**Documentation of the Scene:** INV (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) exposed photographs of the area inside and outside of Tent 7 using an Olympus C765 digital camera. SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) prepared a crime scene sketch. (See Photographs and Crime Scene Sketch)

**Collection of Evidence:** A search of the scene did not reveal any items of evidentiary value.

**Factors Pertinent to Entry/Exit:** Entry into the area surrounding Tent 7 could be gained through the "Sally Port" gate located in the center of the North side of the fence surrounding the tent. The gate was secured with a lock. Additionally, there were two holes in the top of Tent 5, which were also consistent with the suspected path of the projectile.

Search Beyond the Immediate Scene: A search of the immediate area revealed a section of the fence between Tent 5 and the guard shack had a bent link that extended towards the area where (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was when he was injured. The bent section was in a portion of the fence that was in the suspected path of the projectile.

AGENT's COMMENT: Due to limited visibility and security concerns, a secondary examination of the scene during daylight hours was deemed appropriate.

About 0015, 21 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) exposed photographs of the area inside of Tent 5, Level 2, Camp Redemption, using an Olympus Digital Camera. (See Photographs)

About 1015, 21 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) coordinated with 1LT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Battle Captain, 152nd Field Artillery (FA) Company, 391st MP BN, BCCF, AGI, who provided a copy of the duty logs, outlining the time line of events. In addition, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) reviewed the SPOT report, dated 20 Sep 04, that documented enemy activity near the southwest corner of FOB Abu Ghraib, which involved an ambush against a convoy. (See Duty Logs)

About 1025, 21 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) coordinated with SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Magistrates Cell Legal Specialist, BCCF, AGI, and obtained and reviewed the detainee file for ABRAHEMY. The file contained nothing of evidentiary value pertaining to his death.

About 1040, 21 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) coordinated with 1LT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Charge Nurse, 115th Field Hospital, BCCF Hospital, BCCF, AGI, and obtained copies of the detainee's medical trauma records, listing the cause of death as cardiac arrest, as a result of a gunshot wound to the chest, at 2215, 20 Sep 04. (See Medical Records and Death Certificate)

About 1330, 21 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) demonstrated the suspected trajectory of the projectile using yellow crime scene tape and exposed photographs of the area of Tent 5 and 7, Level 2, Camp Redemption, using a Sony Cybershot DCS-P31 Digital Camera. (See Photographs)

About 1400, 21 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C), INV (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) this office, conducted a secondary examination of the scene during daylight hours. INV (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) exposed additional photographs. (See Photographs and Crime Scene Sketch)

About 1410, 21 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 152 FA Company, BCCF, AGI, who provided a sworn statement wherein he stated he was a guard in Level 2 on 20 Sep 04, when (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was injured. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) provided a sketch documenting the locations of the detainees and guards when the incident occurred. (See Statement and Sketch of SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C))

About 1510, 21 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Headquarters and Headquarters Company (HHC), 391st MP BN, BCCF, AGI, who was the assigned Combat Life Saver for the incident area. SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated that he was located about two tents away when the incident occurred. He ran up and saw someone was injured. He observed the detainee through the fence and realized the severity of the injury and went to retrieve a vehicle. He returned with a 2-1/2 ton military truck and loaded (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) onto the vehicle, along with (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 391st MP BN, BCCF, AGI. He observed that (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was not

responsive, but still breathing, with a 3X3 inch wound to the center of his center. He instructed SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) to apply pressure to (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) chest. He then drove the victim to the BCCF Hospital.

About 1530, 21 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who stated he was on duty as the gate guard for Level 2, Camp Redemption. He stated he, SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) loaded (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) onto the truck and SPC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) instructed him to apply pressure to the wound on the chest. He stated that he observed an open wound to the center of the chest about 2X2 inches. He further stated that (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was breathing but not responsive.

About 1530, 21 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed SSG (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 391<sup>st</sup> MP Battalion (BN), BCCF, AGI, who provided a sworn statement wherein he stated he was inside the guard shack between tents 5 and 7 when the detainee was struck by the projectile. (See Statement)

About 1545, 21 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who stated he was located inside tent 5 area during the incident. He stated he had just asked the MP for a light for his cigarette, when he heard a bang and saw a flash of light near the fence closest to Tent 7.

About 2010, 21 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) this office, and INV (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) conducted canvass interviews of LCPL (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and CPL (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) both assigned to E Company, 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion (BN), 10<sup>th</sup> Marine Regiment, Camp Lejuene, NC, (deployed to Iraq), who stated they were on guard at Tower 7 on the evening of 20 Sep 04 when an incident occurred near the intersection of Main Supply Route (MSR) Market and MSR Mobile, approx. 600 meter West of AGI. It was determined that CPL (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) had the most information pertinent to this investigation and a sworn statement would be obtained at a later date.

About 2020, 21 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and INV (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) conducted canvass interviews of LCPL (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and LCPL (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) both assigned to E Company, 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion (BN), 10<sup>th</sup> Marine Regiment, Camp Lejuene, NC, (deployed to Iraq), who stated they were on guard at Tower 6 on the evening of 20 Sep 04 when an incident occurred near the intersection of Main Supply Route (MSR) Market and MSR Mobile, approx. 600 meter West of AGI. About 2030, 21 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and INV (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) conducted canvass interviews of PFC (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and CPL (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) both assigned to E Company, 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion (BN), 10<sup>th</sup> Marine Regiment, Camp Lejuene, NC, (deployed to Iraq), who stated they were on guard at Tower 5 on the evening of 20 Sep 04 when an incident occurred near the intersection of Main Supply Route (MSR) Market and MSR Mobile, approx. 600 meter West of AGI. It was determined that CPL (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) had the most information pertinent to this investigation and a sworn statement would be obtained at a later date.

About 1300, 22 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed CPL (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who provided a sworn statement wherein he stated he was on guard at Tower 7 and witnessed tracer rounds being fired in the direction of AGI. (See Statement of CPL (b)(6), (b)(7)(C))

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About 1324, 22 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed LCPL (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who provided a sworn statement wherein he stated he was on guard at Tower 6 and witnessed tracer rounds being fired in the direction of AGI. (See Statement of LCPL (b)(6), (b)(7)(C))

About 1718, 22 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed CPL (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who provided a sworn statement wherein he stated he was on guard at Tower 5 and witnessed tracer rounds being fired in the direction of AGI. (See Statement of CPL (b)(6), (b)(7)(C))

About 1630, 23 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed CPT (DR) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 115<sup>th</sup> Field Hospital, BCCF, AGI, who stated she was in the Emergency Room when (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was admitted. She stated as she approached him, he took one deep breath and went unconscious. She then intubated him and attempted to find a pulse. She was unable to locate a pulse and opened his chest cavity and injected intracardial epinephrine. He regained a pulse and she inserted a femoral intravenous line (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) again went unresponsive and an examination of his wounds revealed he had a lacerated liver and an exposed bowel, which was leaking fluid into the chest cavity. Further attempts to revive (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) were unsuccessful and he was pronounced dead at 2215, 20 Sep 04. CPT (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated the wound to the victim's chest was about 1/2" wide by about 2" long in a vertical "line" near the base of the sternum and the wound to the back was about 1/4" in diameter.

About 1000, 30 Sep 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) obtained a copy of the Serious Incident Report (SIR), pertaining to the incident. (See SIR)

About 2310, 8 Oct 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed SSG (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) who confirmed there were four scratches on the left forearm on (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) that were self-inflicted about 7 days prior to his death.

About 1000, 16 Oct 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) interviewed MAJ (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) 115<sup>th</sup> Field Hospital, BCCF, AGI, who confirmed there were four scratches on the left forearm on (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) that were self-inflicted about 7 days prior to his death.

About 0900, 15 Nov 04, this office received the USACIL Lab Report 2004-CID131-1940, which determined the recovered bullet was a 12.7 mm caliber which could have been fired from a Degtyarev Machine Gun, commonly used by the opposing forces. (See Lab Report)

About 1200, 15 Nov 04, SA (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) obtained the approximate azimuth of the path of the bullet. The 273-degree azimuth was obtained from the point of impact on the bunker to the hole in the camouflage netting and the impact mark on the fence. The tent had been replaced. The azimuth places the approximate point of origin in the area where enemy fighting was reported to have occurred on 20 Aug 04.///LAST ENTRY///







Soon Omar, a detainee in Compound 5, yelled for me and showed me where the round actually hit the chain link fence which caused the "flash and bang". Not 5 minutes later the other detainees in Compound 7 got my attention and called me over. They found the round and gave it to me to be turned in. For a split second, myself and SPC **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** asked each other what it was, then immediately, SPC **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** and I ran into the bunker. We were there less than 15 seconds and we heard a couple of detainees screaming. I was telling the detainees to get into their bunker. I heard one of the detainees scream **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** "help!". I remember I looked out of the bunker and saw an unidentified detainee on the ground. SPC **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** and I then ran out of the bunker over to the entrance of tent 7. The detainees brought the unidentified detainee up to the entrance. SPC **(b)(6), (b)(7)(C)** opened the gate and the detainees placed the unidentified on the cot. I then saw that the unidentified detainee had a wound, about lower chest area, and was bleeding. 4 detainees picked the cot up and myself and the 4 detainees started running the injured detainee towards the main Sally Port of Level 2. The detainee was really upset crying, and screaming in arabic. The detainee began fighting with other detainees, who were trying to calm him down. I had SSG (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) call medics, who (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) already in route for the injured detainee. The medics (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) began trying to calm down the detainee. I began going to other tents trying to calm down other detainees. I began looking around CP2 trying to figure out what happened. Summary of incident:** At 202140DSEP04 the BCCF came under indirect and automatic machine gun fire from vicinity MB (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) the field southwest of the overpass at MSR Mobile and Kandari Market Street. Muzzle flashes were also seen from the overpass itself. The attack alarm was given over the FOB. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) were in Level II sitting between compounds 5 and 7. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) said he heard a loud crack and saw a flash of light. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) then jumped into a bunker. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) stated that detainees then began yelling from compound 7. The detainees in that compound brought up detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) the front gate. Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) had a gunshot wound to the chest. A field dressing was applied and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) directed that the detainee be placed on a cot and taken to the Sally Port at Level II. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) and (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) then put detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) in the back of a 2 ½ ton truck and transported the detainee to the 115<sup>th</sup> Field Hospital. Detainee (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) was pronounced dead on 202215DSEP04 by (b)(6), (b)(7)(C). No other injuries or damage to property was reported.

1. Exhibit 1 (bullet) is a 12.7 MM caliber full metal jacketed bullet with eight lands and grooves with a right twist. Microscopic examination revealed sufficient individual characteristics for comparison purposes.
2. Based on class characteristics, a common firearm through which Exhibit 1 could have been fired is the Degtyarev (DshK 38/46) 12.7 MM caliber heavy machine gun. This type machine gun is known to be used by the opposing forces. All suspect 12.7 MM caliber machine guns should be forwarded along with Exhibit 1 for comparative analysis.



**DETAILS**

About 1230, 4 Oct 04, the undersigned attended the autopsy of Mr. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) which was performed by Dr. (MAJ) (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) Armed Forces Medical Examiner, Rockville, MD. Dr. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) determined the preliminary cause of death was a perforating ballistic injury of the chest and the preliminary manner of death was homicide. There was no projectile or foreign object recovered from the torso, but a small metal fragment was recovered from the lower left leg. This was a superficial injury. In addition, four small scratches were noted on the left arm. Investigation by the requesting office determined these wounds were self-inflicted. (b)(6), (b)(7)(C) provided the undersigned with a copy of the Preliminary Autopsy Diagnosis (PAD). (See PAD for additional details)

The victim's shirt was collected as evidence, as well as the metal fragment.

**Circumstances of Death:** This believed to be 27 year old Iraqi National was a detainee in the Abu Gharib Prison, Iraq, that died of a perforating ballistic injury of the torso he sustained while in the prison yard. The decedent was witnessed to suddenly collapse while with a group of detainees and was found to have a possible gunshot wound of the chest. CID investigation indicated victim was injured when a gunfight occurred outside the prison and the decedent was hit with shrapnel from this fight. The suspected shrapnel was recovered on the ground near the decedent. Despite an emergent thoracotomy, the decedent died of his injury.

**Authorization for Autopsy:** Office of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner, IAW 10 USC 1471.

**Identification:** Identification is established by visual inspection of prison records.

**CAUSE OF DEATH:** Perforating Ballistic Injury of the Torso

**MANNER OF DEATH:** Homicide

**PRELIMINARY AUTOPSY DIAGNOSES:**

- I. Perforating Ballistic Injury of the Torso
  - A. Injuries of the Torso
    - 1. Probable entry injury is incorporated into thoracotomy incision and is identified as a 1.0 cm area of irregularity along the incision near the xiphoid process that is 18 inches below the top of the head (19 inches when re-approximated) and in the anterior midline.
    - 2. A 1.0 x 1.0 cm shored exit wound that has a triangular skin tag at 5 o'clock and a 3.5 x 1.4 cm rectangular abrasion

**These findings are preliminary, and subject to modification pending further investigation and laboratory testing.**

surrounding the defect, is 22 1/2 inches below the top of the head and 2 inches right of the posterior midline.

3. Projectile path: Perforation of the skin and muscle immediately right of the xiphoid process at the right sixth costal cartilage, the left lobe of the liver, the intrahepatic portion of the inferior vena cava, the head of the pancreas, the right adrenal gland, the right renal vein, a superior branch of the right renal artery, the upper pole of the right kidney, the posterior aspect of the right leaflet of the diaphragm, the right twelfth rib and the lateral portion of the body of the first lumbar vertebra and perforation of the muscle and skin of the mid-right back.
4. Projectile direction: Front to back, left to right and slightly down.
5. Associated findings: Bilateral hemothorax (approximately 500 ml right and 200 ml left; hemoperitoneum (approximately 50 ml surrounding spleen)
6. Trace evidence recovered: None

B. Penetrating Injury of the Left Lower Leg

1. A 0.7 x 0.3 cm crusted superficial penetrating injury of the lateral surface of the left lower leg into the skin only.
2. Trace evidence recovered: small gray-black metallic fragment.

C. Other injuries

1. Four recent (days) superficial incised wounds of the left forearm.

II. Medical Intervention

1. Thoracotomy incision of the bilateral fifth intercostal space and sternum.
2. Chest tube insertion site in the left 7<sup>th</sup> intercostal space.
3. Needle puncture wound with surrounding ecchymosis on the left side of the neck.
4. Needle puncture marks over the veins of the anterior surface of the right arm.
5. Right femoral triangle puncture site with remaining suture material in the skin.

III. No significant natural diseases identified, within limitations of the examination.

IV. Identifying marks

1. A monochrome tattoo of an animal head is on the right chest.
2. A monochrome tattoo of a mermaid is on the left back.
3. A monochrome tattoo of the word "HANIN" is on the right back.

4. A monochrome tattoo of the words "HLOL HAMEED" are on the upper right arm.
6. A monochrome tattoo of an animal is on the medial surface of the left lower leg.
7. Multiple linear scars on the left upper extremity, the chest, and the abdomen.


