MR Highlights: Following several days of controversy caused by the media-reported remarks by Amb. Khalilzad that "Pakistan needs to do more," reported positive comments this morning by Secretary Rumsfeld, Gen. Pace, and Gen. Barno have provided some good news to an excited Pakistan press. Headlines such as: "US Satisfied With Pak Cooperation" and "Pakistan Made Bold Moves Against Terrorists" (paras 1-5) were prominently played up, and papers used it as an opportunity to remind the readers that "such positive statements from the U.S. are coming immediately after one of its Ambassadors asked Pakistan 'to do more'."

Along with front-page stories announcing that her husband, Asif Ali Zardari, has decided not to accept the government's offer to got to Switzerland, there is also a story that Benazir Bhutto has offered " to share power with President Musharraf" (paras 6-7).

While the news pages of the papers have moved on, editorial pages are still somewhat fixated with Ambassador Khalilzad's remarks. Today the point of reference is the MFA's reaction to Ambassador Khalilzad's remarks; papers throw their own weight behind the MFA spokesman. "Pakistan should ask the U.S. to keep its envoy in his limits and mind his language so that Zalmay Khalilzad would not repeat this stupid thing again." (para 12, 13, 14, 15, 16). End highlights.

Quote: US Secretary of State Donald Rumsfeld on Tuesday said the United States appreciated the "degree of cooperation" that the US "is currently receiving from Pakistan." He characterized the cooperation from Pakistan along the Afghan-Pakistan border as "very good." Quote: U.S. Defense Secretary Donald Rumsfeld has praised high level of cooperation by Pakistan. He said that the extent of Pakistani cooperation at Pak-Afghan border was worth praising. He said so at a press briefing at Pentagon with a reference to American Ambassador Zalmay Khalilzad's statement in which he had said that Pakistan was not doing enough against foreign terrorists in its tribal areas. 4. "Pakistan Has Disrupted Al-Qaeda Network: US" "Dawn" (04/21)

Quote: Top US military commander in Afghanistan has credited Pakistan for successfully disrupting the Al Qaeda network in tribal areas bordering Afghanistan, saying it had significantly affected its ability to support a suspected Taliban insurgency across the border in Afghanistan. in Kabul Zalmay Khalilzad accused Pakistan of not doing UNCLASSIFIED

enough to check the activities of Al-Qaeda and Taliban remnants, the top American general in Afghanistan gave full marks to Islamabad for making 'bold moves' against the terrorist groups. In what amounted to be a snub to the Afghan-born Khalilzad, Lt. Gen. David Barno said that Pakistan had successfully disrupted Al-Qaeda's network in the tribal areas bordering Afghanistan and significantly affected its ability to support the Taliban insurgency across the border. In Islamabad, taking strong exception to Khalilzad's statement, Foreign Office Spokesman Masood Khan said Monday that Pakistan will be lodging a protest with the US government over his irresponsible utterances. General Barno, who was interviewed by the New York Times in Kabul, commended the Pakistani military for its 'bold moves' against foreign fighters in the Pakistani tribal area of Waziristan in March, and said it had so far prevented an anticipated spring offensive by the Taliban in Afghanistan.... Quote: Chairperson of Pakistan Peoples Party Parliamentarians has yet again extended her offer of

sharing power with President Musharraf saying "we are willing to find the middle ground with President Musharraf without compromising on basic principles". Talking to a private television channel, she said in order to reach a "meaningful settlement of the issues, President Musharraf will have to accept our conditions". When asked to comment on the alleged differences within the rulers, she said something is "brewing" and a lot is going to happen very soon. End quote.

7. "Musharraf Refuses To Let Him Proceed Abroad As Free Man" "Daily Times" (04/21)

Quote: Asif Ali Zardari, the detained spouse of former Prime Minister Benazir Bhutto, on Tuesday turned down the government's offer to travel to Switzerland and appear in a Swiss court as a prisoner, after President Musharraf refused to let him go abroad as a free man.... Information Minister Sheikh Rashid Ahmed had claimed at a press conference to have with him a handwritten

request from Mr. Zardari to have the President release UNCLASSIFIED him from jail. But Senator Babar categorically said that this request should not be misconstrued as a 'mercy petition'. "It has been our long-standing demand that Mr. Zardari be released. But there is no question of filing a mercy petition," Senator Babar said, adding that Mr. Zardari's decision to appear in the Swiss court, if the hearing is deferred, would be made at the time of next hearing keeping in view doctors' advice. - 12. "Conduct Unbecoming," an editorial in the Karachi-based center-left independent national English daily, "Dawn" (04/21)

Quote: ... Mr. Khalilzad's thoughtless remarks will make no difference to the degree of understanding between Islamabad and Washington on the broad contours of the fight against terror. The campaign against Al-Qaeda and Taliban is not going to be easy. Both enjoy a degree of support among certain sections of the population in Afghanistan and Pakistan's tribal belt.
