Summary: Prime Minister Gilani's acceptance of the 10-point "reform agenda" of PML-N chief Nawaz Sharif dominated headlines in all major newspapers on Monday. Some papers characterized Gilani as "caving in" to the opposition's demands in order to save his government.

The controversy over the Taseer assassination and the blasphemy law remained a major story throughout the weekend and on Monday. pages in the English press over the weekend were replete with denunciations of the murder, navel-gazing over popular support for

the murderer, and predictions of a dark future for Pakistan unless  $\overline{\mathrm{UNCLASSIFIED}}$ the liberal voices speak out against the forces of intolerance, while the much more widely-read and influential Urdu press displayed no such introspection or concern. Nearly all Monday morning papers front-paged reports that tens of thousands of people rallied in Karachi against changes to the country's blasphemy law. Most carried the remarks of Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam Fazle (JUI-F) Chief Fazalur Rehman that to "bring change in blasphemy law is a U.S. agenda, as Western powers want to change Islamic laws." Several leading Urdu and English papers reported over the weekend the Washington Post's story that U.S. Vice President Joe Biden will soon visit Pakistan to announce more military and economic assistance for Pakistan. On Monday, "The News" in English front-paged a story stating that the "U.S. [is] intervening to handle the economic crisis of Pakistan" because it is displeased at the failure of the politicians to handle the country's serious On the same day, two major Urdu papers penned economic issues. editorials tying the Biden visit to other recent statements by USG officials regarding Pakistan. The Urdu daily "Express," stated "It is commendable that the U.S. has decided to provide more assistance to Pakistan, but there is a possibility that we will get a fresh list of things to do, as the U.S. does not provide aid to anyone without its own interests." The second largest Urdu daily, "Nawa-i-Waqt" decried repeated violations of Pakistani sovereignty by the U.S. and advised that Pakistan must become a self-reliant country not dependent on foreign aid, particularly from the U.S. Some English- and Urdu-language papers over the weekend commented on Ambassador Munter's Friday evening remarks at the Islamabad Program for Global Studies. Some dailies selectively interpreted or quoted the Ambassador out of context, conveying the mistaken impression that the Ambassador had said that the U.S. had a right to intervene in Pakistan's internal affairs because it gives large amounts of aid. Minor-circulation rightist daily "The Nation" went as far as to call his remarks "highly reprehensible." "The News," in an editorial published on Sunday, noted that there may be some truth in Munter's comments, but ultimately his comments are not the way to win the hearts and minds of the Pakistani people. However, more significant was a Sunday editorial in leading English daily "Dawn," which the paper published after the Embassy press officer called to complain about the paper's misleading Saturday article on the Ambassador's speech. In a wry, almost affectionate piece, the paper positively appraised the Ambassador's prescription of Pakistan's ills, opining that "even if it sounded harsh and against diplomatic convention, it is better that we have it on authority today instead of Mr. Assange telling us who thought what of us a few years down the road. . . . Since we cannot leave the grant that we are dished out, neither can we escape the occasional scolding that comes with it." End Summary.
