## MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT

72<sup>nd</sup> MP BN

1. (FOUO) On 6 June 2004, while conducting an interview of Commander, 72<sup>nd</sup> MP Company, Henderson, NV, he identified a previously unknown "older, unit armorer who maintained a diary of abuse" as was not the unit armorer and served in Abu Ghraib for a short period as an MP, her secondary MOS. She arrived in Abu Ghraib with the main body of the 72<sup>nd</sup> MP Company circa 21-25 May 2003. Within weeks of her arrival she had a "nervous breakdown" as a result of shootings she witnessed during a detainee escape and riots. She was referred to the 581<sup>st</sup> Combat Stress Team, underwent counseling and was reattached to the 400<sup>th</sup> MP BN at Baghdad International Airport (BIAP). She redeployed with the 72<sup>nd</sup> MP CO circa November 2003

had been identified by the Press as advised that maintaining a diary of abuses (Associated Press Article-Attachment #1). She was interviewed and confirmed she maintained a diary but neither observed nor documented any detainee abuse. Subsequent to the Press interview the Nevada National Guard also sent a team to interview her regarding the allegation. She again denied knowledge or described documentation of any abuse.
