The interrogation ended rather quickly when the UT objected to the tactic and refused to continue with the interrogation. The tactic seemed to be on the edge and I reported the incident, both the rolling down of the jumpsuit and the fact that the I/T had walked out on the interrogation, to and the said he would "take care of it". I asked bout it and he responded that it was an operationally effective technique because that particular detained was a hard case that they had been trying to break attention that such treatment would likely for awhile. walking out on the interrogation, saying that the I/I was one of the hener ones. However, he never asked or confronted me about why I had reported him for the incident. Also in early Oct 03, I participated in what would have been my third or fourth interrogation. We were interviewing a detained for the first time; though this was not a screening or KB interview and asked me if I thought we should place one of the detainers in solitary confinement for a few hours in the middle of the interrogation. I told him that I did not think it was a very effective tactic and would harm any support with the detained, but that he was the interrogator and it was his call. Decided to place the detained in solitary and an MP came to the both to escor him to Cell Block 1A. The MP jammed a rag over his head, grabbed the handcuffs restraining the detained, and said some thing like "come with me piggy" and he lead the decisinee to solitary. We went to lunch and the incident continued to bother me, and I returned to IA after lunch (we shid not have an I/T with us) and entered the decisinee's cell. We found him lying on me tuser, completely maked except for a heed that covered his head from his upper lip, whimpering, but there were no bruises. or marks on him. I was simply unprepared and horrified at what I saw. We instructed the MPs to clothe the detainer, which they did. I asked the said that he did not know. All I could think about was how disastrous the incident was. I didn't even think to ask the MPs why they had done it. The MP made the statement If he knew the MPs were going to strip the detainee, and he said that he did not know. All I could think "I want to thank you guys, because up until a week or two ago, I was a good Christian". The statement was almost "TV-like" perhaps unered for theatric offect, and I am not sure what the MP meant by it. From digital photographs shown to me this day, I believe the MP was either Both look very similar and I only saw the MP one time, so I can not say with certainty which one it was. The MP did not wear glasses. After the detained was clothed, we escurted him to the general population and release him without interrogating him again. The "striping incident" was never reported in any "interrogator notes" or "interrogation plan"; to my knowledge. This was not uncommon, and the general lack of interrogation nears was one of the GTMO Tiger Team findings. I reported this incident to hd he said that he would report the incident to COL PAPPAS. In late New 03 there was a showing incident in the hard site. At about 1730 hours called a meeting at the dinning facility, explained that over the just few days there had been some things brought into AG and it had culminated in a shooting uncident at the hard site. He asked for volunteers to go down to the hard site. I volunteered along there were a number of others but I do not recall their we graphed our radde radde and weapons and arrived at the hard site about a half hour after the actual shooting. There was an MP captain and several MPs already on the seene and a group of several Iraqi Police (IPs). The IPs were lined up and were taken one by one to be searched and questioned about their possible involvement. The detainees were all secured in their cells. My responsibility was to guard the IPs and transport them from the holding area to be search. Some of the IPs were strip-scarched and two were left only in their underwear and held in the hallway. Someone at the site said enarge of directing the interrogations, though I did not see him conduct one personally. I saw one interrogation in the halfway, but was concentrated on watching the IPs, so I did not see much of what else was occurring. There were working does present, but I did not see, not hear of, working dogs being used in any interrogations. I heard the next day that were working together, but I did not see them that night. I also found out the next day that one of the dogs. I stayed throughout the night and finally departed at about dawn. I heard about the incident where a detained supposedly died of congenial heart problems during an OGA metrogration at AG, but I did not believe it until I saw it on the news, about four months after my release from active duty. I also heard about an incident that involved naked detained out of an interrogation, but I do not have any first hand knowledge of the meident. We never used stripping or makedness as a technique at GTMO, nor did we use military working dogs. We never advised any personnel at AG to utilize any of these techniques. Sleep deprivation and management had been discontinued much earlier than the GTMO detachment visit to AG. There was one occasion in which my AG Tiger Team; requested that a detained be placed on Sleep management but my detachment had departed AG before the request was processed and I am not personally aware of any sleep management being employed at AG. I never gave a tour of AG facilities to incoming personnel, and, to the best of my knowledge, no one from the INITIALS OF PERSON MAKING STATEMENT
