Government informed me that they desire to try the cases, 5 the co-accused cases in this order: United States versus 6 first, United States versus 7 second, United States versus Canjar third. And that they have seventeen witnesses flying from the 8 United States and that they have Iraqi witnesses that are not 9 permitted into Kuwait, so they anticipate the need for a bifurcated 10 trial, that is to hold part of the trial in Iraq to hear the 11 testimony of the Iraqi witnesses and part of the trial here in Camp 12 Doha to hear the remainder of the witnesses. Defense did indicate 13 that they anticipate requesting one or more witnesses from the United 14 States and to the extent that that is an issue then we may need to 15 litigate that prior to trial. I have thus set the 12<sup>th</sup> of January 16 aside for motions if needed. Though in United States versus Canjar 17 in particular, it seems to me that even if there's an issue with 18 overseas witnesses, we can probably litigate that on the  $20^{th}$  of 19 January as opposed to the 12<sup>th</sup> of January. You all consider that. 20 The 20<sup>th</sup> of January, I will hear the motions on multiplicity and 21 Article 13 and an unlawful command influence to the extent that one 22 lies and any other motions that are raised. We won't try the case of 23
