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
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

want to make the following statement under I. Mr. oath: On 3 January 2004, I woke up in Baghdad where me and my cousin were visiting a friend and going shopping to pick-up plumbing supplies. My cousin that was with me was Mr. Zaydun Ma'mun FADHIL, he was born in 1984. We woke up between 8-9 am and went shopping for the plumbing supplies we then went back to visit our friend for a while ¿*id then we left to go back home to Samarra about 5pm. It was me and my cousin and we were driving a 2001 white Kia Pickup Truck. The vehicle began to act up and something was wrong. The engine seemed not be getting enough gas. I tried to fix it and it continued to run but only very slowly. It was only going about 20mph all the way until we got to Balad. We got to Balad around 2130-2145 and they though about staying in Balad because the vehicle was driving so slowly but he was able to fix it to make the vehicle drive faster. They then left Balad around 2215 and they continued to Samarra. Between 2230-2245 we arrived at the ICDC (Iraqi Civil Defense Corp) check point where they searched our vehicle and the both of us. They did not find anything and they reminded us that it was getting close to curfew, which is at 2300 for Samarra. I knew I was close to home and that I would make it before curfew. There was two guys at the check point who searched us and the vehicle and I noticed a few other guys around the check point but I don't how many of them there were. We left the checkpoint and I don't remember how long I was at the checkpoint before I left but we left the checkpoint and I was speeding to make it home before curfew. We were about 2-3 miles away from the checkpoint and we could see a US Military Convoy coming down the road in the opposite direction. As soon as they noticed us the convoy surrounded us with three vehicles. The US Soldiers then got out and two soldiers got them out of the vehicle and others were in the area and the soldiers searched my vehicle and searched us. We were both put into a Bradley vehicle and we were both handcuffed with a soft type of handcuff that they tied up on our wrists behind our backs. I could hear the soldiers trying to talk Arabic and I asked them if they knew Arabic and one of the soldiers said he spoke a little bit in Arabic. The one that spoke Arabic a little was white and the other one who helped with the searches was a little darker skinned about my complexion. They then let us go and we got into our vehicle and we only drove about 20 meters down the road before the same US Soldiers stopped us again. We were told to get out of the vehicle and that's when we were handcuffed and put into the back of the vehicle. That happened about 2255 and we were notfold why we were being arrested, if they told us, I did not understand what they said. We were both put into a Bradley vehicle and we were both handcuffed with a soft type of handcuff that they tied up on our wrists behind our backs. After we were put into the vehicle

the door was shut and we were in there with five other soldiers. The vehicle began to move and we did not know where we were going. My cousin and me could not see where we were going. We were moving in the vehicle about 10-15 minutes and then we stopped. I could see the lights from the ICDC check point people and I think the soldiers believed they were too close to the check point. We then keep on going farther away and then that's when they stopped again. They got us both out of the vehicle and we were on a bridge and we were facing the water and they un-handcuffed me and my cousin and were telling us to jump into the water. We refused to jump into the water and I knew my cousin could not swim and even I cannot swim very well. My cousin did not jump into the water and then one of the soldiers pushed him from behind. I did see the soldier who pushed my cousin, he looked skinny and not very tall and his skin was a little darker than white. I could see him in the water trying to swim and then one of the soldiers pushed me too. I did not see who pushed me because they were behind me. After we were pushed into the water, my cousin and me were screaming each other's name trying to find each other but then after a few minutes I did hear him anymore. I saw him in the water after I was pushed in too and I could only hear him but I never got close enough to help him. I then made it to the side on the water and I was very scared. I got out of the water and I was hiding until the American Soldiers were gone. They initially had stayed by the bridge for a few minutes and I could hear them laughing at us after we were pushed into the water and then they left. I walked back to the ICDC check point but it took me a while to walk there because I was making sure nobody saw me and I did not want the soldiers to get me again. I finally got to the same ICDC checkpoint that I was searched at earlier and I told them what happened. I told them that US Soldiers pushed my cousin and me into the water by the bridge. I was still soak and wet from the incident. The ICDC people and myself went back to the area where we were pushed and we began to search for my cousin. Q: Where was your cousin's body found?

A: It was found by about I kilometer from the bridge that takes you to Tikrit, family and locals have been searching for the body since 3 Jan 04.

Q: Would you be able to identify the soldier who pushed your cousin?

A: Yes.

Q: A letter written by your cousin's mother and translated to English which states that you said the soldiers appeared drunk and tired that day, did you say that?

A: No, I never said that. The soldiers were happy and laughing and I was even laughing with them even though I didn't really understand what they were saying. That must be an error in translation of that letter or something. I never said the soldiers appeared drunk or tires. They were ok.

Q: What was your cousin wearing on the night of the incident?

A: He was wearing blue jeans, a white short sleeve shirt, a short leather jacket, and shoes.

Q: I just showed you a picture of your cousin, Mr. FADHIL, is this the same man that was with you on the night this incident occurred?

A: Yes, that is him.

Q: Did you see your cousin's body after it was found?

A: Yes.

Q: What injuries did the body have?

A: His face appeared to be hit, his nose and upper lip were cut and there was bruising on his head. His head was intact but it looked like it was hit or like it banged on something while in the water.

Q: Where was the body buried?

A: The new cemetery "Aldoleyah Road" on the south end of Samarra.

Q: When was the body buried?

A: Yesterday, we found the body at 1130-1200 and we buried him by 1500.

Q: Did you photograph the body before it was buried?

A: Yes we took photos which are being developed and we also took video on a CD which I can get a copy for you by tomorrow.

Q: Why do you think soldiers would push you into the water?

A: I would like to know why. I have no idea.

Q: Do you believe the soldiers were trying to kill you and your cousin?

A: I don't know, maybe they were trying to teach us a lesson about being out after curfew but the lesson is very painful and my cousin is now dead.

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


