INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

THIS IS AN "OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM" INVESTIGATION.

About 0900, 21 May 04, CPT [REDACTED] (b)(6)-2; (7)(C)-2, Assistant S-5, 300<sup>th</sup> Area Support Group (ASG), LSA Adder, Tallil, Iraq, notified this office that three Iraqi nationals reported they were robbed by U.S. soldiers at a checkpoint on Main Supply Route (MSR) Tampa, Iraq.

Investigation established probable cause to believe CPL AGUILAR and SPC [REDACTED] (b)(6)5; (b)(7)(C)-5 committed the offense of Robbery when they stole \$1,250.00 dollars in U.S. currency and 159,000 Iraqi Dinar, from Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED] at gunpoint. Further, (b)(6)4; (7)(C)-4 investigation established probable cause to believe CPT [REDACTED] and 1LT [REDACTED] (b)(6)5; (7)(C)-5 committed the offense of Obstructing Justice when they impeded the conduct of this investigation.

## DETAILS:

About 0900, 21 May 04, CPT [REDACTED], Assistant S-5, 300<sup>th</sup> Area Support Group (ASG), LSA Adder, Tallil, Iraq, notified this office that three Iraqi nationals reported they were robbed by U.S. soldiers at a checkpoint on Main Supply Route (MSR) Tampa, Iraq.

About 0905, 21 May 04, SA [REDACTED] this office, interviewed CPT [REDACTED] who related he met with Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED], brothers from An Najaf, Iraq, who stated about 1130, 11 May 04, they were traveling south, in a silver Toyota Camry with Dubai export plates, on MSR Tampa to purchase a vehicle in Kuwait with their friend, Mr. [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] Alhindia District, Karbala, Iraq, NFI, when they were stopped at a U.S. checkpoint at Convoy Support Center (CSC) Kenworth, Iraq, and searched by two U.S. soldiers. CPT [REDACTED] related Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED] described the two U.S. soldiers as young white males, both about 5'7" tall, blonde hair and clean shaven, wearing sunglasses. CPT [REDACTED] related Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED] stated they were detained for about 30 minutes while the two U.S. soldiers searched their vehicle and their person. CPT [REDACTED] related Mr. [REDACTED] stated he had about 750,000 Iraqi Dinar and \$2,500.00 in U.S. Currency, all of which belonged to Mr. [REDACTED] CPT [REDACTED] related Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED] stated the two U.S. soldiers confiscated \$1,250.00 in U.S. Currency and 159,000 Iraq Dinar and subsequently released them. CPT [REDACTED] related Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED] stated the U.S. Currency was in large denominations and was stamped with a 1/4" square image of a burning campfire, in black ink, which the brothers used to identify their currency. CPT [REDACTED] provided this office with a copy of the Spot Report on this incident. (See spot report for details)

About 0900, 22 May 04, SA [REDACTED] coordinated with Mr. [REDACTED] Manager, Army and Air Force Exchange Service (AAFES), LSA Adder, Iraq APO AE 09331, and briefed him on the U.S. Currency containing a campfire stamp. Mr. [REDACTED] related he would have his cashiers examine U.S. Currency for this stamp. Mr. [REDACTED] further related he would ensure the cashiers at Camp Cedar II and Camp Scania, Iraq, were examining all U.S. currency for this stamp. Mr. [REDACTED] examined all currency on hand, which met with negative results. Requested Mr. [REDACTED] detain any person attempting to negotiate U.S. currency with this stamp and notify CID immediately.

Between 0830 and 1000, 7 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] and SA [REDACTED] this office, with the assistance of Civil Affairs Interpreter Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED] Mr. [REDACTED] LSA Adder, Tallil, Iraq, interviewed Mr. [REDACTED] Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED] who all provided written statements detailing how two U.S. soldiers stole \$1,250.00 in U.S. currency and 159,000 Iraqi Dinar from Mr. [REDACTED]. They indicated Mr. [REDACTED] was holding the money; however Mr. [REDACTED] owned it. (See hand written statements for details)

## DETAILS:

About 1045, 7 Jun 04, [REDACTED] and SA [REDACTED] followed Mr. [REDACTED], Mr. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED] to the location at which they claimed the incident occurred. The location of the incident indicated by Mr. SALIH and Mr. HUSSAIN was a checkpoint on MSR Tampa, where convoys heading north enter the Refuel On the Move (ROM) site, CSC Kenworth, Iraq.

About 1610, 9 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] coordinated with CPT [REDACTED] who provided the English translations of the statements of Mr. [REDACTED], Mr. [REDACTED], and Mr. [REDACTED]. The translations were completed by Mr. [REDACTED] and are hand written. (See translated statements for details)

About 1020, 17 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] coordinated with CPT [REDACTED], C CO 1/185th AR BN, Camp Cedar II, Iraq, and briefed him on all aspects of this investigation. CPT [REDACTED] related he conducted an Army Regulation (AR) 15-6 Investigation with the results being inconclusive. CPT [REDACTED] related a Health and Welfare Inspection of his soldiers was conducted, which met with negative results. CPT [REDACTED] further related he would supply this office with a copy of the 15-6 Investigation.

About 0938, 23 Jun 04, this office received a copy of the AR 15-6 Investigation conducted by CPT [REDACTED], however it did not contain any of the statements taken by CPT [REDACTED]. (See AR 15-6 investigation for details)

About 1110, 23 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] coordinated with CPT [REDACTED] who provided hand written statements of SPC [REDACTED], SGT [REDACTED], and SGT [REDACTED], all of C CO, 1/185th AR BN, Camp Cedar II, Iraq. (See AR 15-6 investigation for details)

About 0815, 23 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] interviewed SPC [REDACTED] who related on 11 May 04, he was working the Traffic Control Point (TCP) at the North ROM Point on MSR Tampa. SPC [REDACTED] related he was unaware of any vehicle searched on the south side of the ROM. SPC [REDACTED] did not have any other pertinent information to provide to this investigation.

About 0820, 23 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] this office, interviewed SPC [REDACTED] who related on 11 May 04, he was working the TCP at the North ROM Point on MSR Tampa. SPC [REDACTED] related he was working with SGT [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED]. SPC [REDACTED] related on the day of the incident they only stopped one civilian vehicle, which was a red pickup truck, and thought it was either a Nissan or Toyota. SPC [REDACTED] related they were instructed to search the vehicle, as there was normally no civilian traffic allowed going north on MSR Tampa from their TCP. SPC [REDACTED]

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## DETAILS:

[REDACTED] related there were three males in the vehicle all wearing the red and white headdresses and white body dresses. SPC [REDACTED] related they searched the individuals who related they were going to Al Basrah and then instructed them to turn around and use the civilian route to Al Basrah. SPC [REDACTED] related he did not have any knowledge of the incident that occurred at the TCP of the South ROM on MSR Tampa. SPC [REDACTED] did not have any other pertinent information to provide to this investigation.

About 0840, 23 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] interviewed SGT [REDACTED] who related on 11 May 04, he was working the TCP at the North ROM on MSR Tampa. SGT [REDACTED] related he was working with SPC [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED]. SGT [REDACTED] related he was in charge of the north checkpoint during this shift. SGT [REDACTED] related they searched one small red pickup truck with three males in the pickup. SGT [REDACTED] related they were wearing white body dresses. SGT [REDACTED] related he was manning the radio and heard a transmission that said something about a large amount of money at the TCP of the South ROM. SGT [REDACTED] related SPC [REDACTED] 7, C CO 1/185<sup>th</sup> AR BN, Camp Cedar II, Iraq, told him that there was \$1,800.00 in one hundred dollar bills and that the money was counted in front of the Iraqi national and given back to him. SGT [REDACTED] did not have any other pertinent information to provide to this investigation.

SPC [REDACTED] claimed to have given the money he confiscated from Mr. [REDACTED] to 1LT [REDACTED], 563-91-4618, Platoon Leader, C CO, 1/185<sup>th</sup> AR BN, Camp Cedar II, Iraq, who then returned the money to Mr. [REDACTED] (See waiver certificate and sworn statement for details)

CPL AGUILAR related he only had possession of the money for a brief period of time when SPC [REDACTED] took it from Mr. [REDACTED] and handed it to him at which time he placed it on a cement barricade. 


I, David J. AGUILAR, want to make the following statement under oath and of my own free will: I am not sure about the time, but it was on 11 May 04. We stopped a vehicle headed south bound on the Iraqi by pass. There were three Iraqi men in the vehicle. We pulled them off to the side of the road, there was two in the front and one in the back. The driver was wearing a business suit, and the other two were wearing civilian clothes. As SPC [REDACTED] and myself ask the persons to get out of the vehicle we asked them to make sure all the doors were open. Prior to searching the vehicle SPC [REDACTED] searched all the persons individually. The Iraqi with the suit on was the first to be searched. SPC [REDACTED] found documentation, Dinars and some U.S currency, at that point we did not know what it was, as it was wrapped up. SPC [REDACTED] handed it to me and I place it on the K rail. SPC [REDACTED] searched the other two individuals, and found about the same stuff. SPC [REDACTED] sat all the property from all three persons on the cement K rail. We put the three individuals in front of the vehicle and I provided over watch while SPC [REDACTED] searched the vehicle. I am not sure where he started. When he was searching the trunk, I told him to search under the spare tire. I was just assisting him on telling him were to search. They had a lot of bags, so we had the driver open all the bags, as I told SPC [REDACTED] not to open them. The driver opened all the bags. After completing the search we questioned them as to where they were going and what they were doing. Finding that they had an abundance of money I questioned them on why they had the money. The Iraqi in the business suit told me he was a banker, a police man and a professor. He was just trying to show us what it meant and we told him we could not understand it. We did not believe what he was saying. That's when I told him he needed to follow us. We then took him to the south Entry Control Point (ECP), I led the way, the Iraqi was in the middle and SPC [REDACTED] was behind him. When we approached the ECP (b)(6)2;(7)(C)-2 1LT [REDACTED] was there, and we told him the situation he had, the guy giving several stories about what he did. He told me to call it up, I started walking away and SPC [REDACTED] and the Iraqi arrived up to 1LT [REDACTED] walked to the M113, to call it up. It took a while for Hell fighter base to get back with me. Hell fighter base came back saying to take a picture of the Iraqi and his car. SGT [REDACTED] came over the radio and informed them that he already had a picture of it. Hell fighter base said to go a head and let them go. I came out of the M113 and the Iraqi was leaving. I didn't see anyone give the Iraqi back his money. (b)(6)2;(7)(C)-2

A: It was a lightish color, silver or tan, I think it was a Camry, I don't know what year, it might have just been a Toyota.

Q: Was the vehicle trying to enter the ROM?

A: No, it was going southbound.

Q: Why was this vehicle stopped and searched?

A: It was a random search, we have done these in the past and came up successful on confiscating weapons.

Q: While SPC [REDACTED] was searching the Iraqi men, what were you doing?

A: I was observing, for security reasons.

Q: Where were you in relation to the Iraqi men?

A: I was off to the right of SPC [REDACTED] and parallel, I had visual on SPC [REDACTED] and the men being searched.

Q: Did you search any of the Iraqi men?

A: No.

Q: What did SPC [REDACTED] do with the items that were taken off the Iraqi man with the business suit on?

A: Handed the items to me.

I, [REDACTED] want to make the following statement under oath: I deployed to Kuwait on 17 Mar 04 and got to Iraq on 4 Apr 04. My company is assigned Force Protection. We have a roving patrol around Cedar 2 along with a QRF, Refuel on the Move (ROM) security and the third mission is South Entry Control Point (ECP) of Cedar 2. On 11 May 04, my squad was security and force protection on the ROM site which is on MSR Tampa. Sometime mid morning before lunch I was on my way to the South TCP to check on my guys there. It was a routine roving check. En-route I heard a radio transmission in which CPL AGUILAR contacted our HQ's (Hellfighter Base) and wanted to know the amount of cash a local national could have on their person. That got my attention because we had been through it before that the amount of cash is not an issue due to there being no national banks or credit cards. I arrived at the South TCP on MSR Tampa and observed an Iraqi national at the guard shack with CPT AGUILAR, SPC [REDACTED] and 1LT [REDACTED]. I asked what the situation was and they briefly explained they searched the vehicle and found a large quantity of American Money on the individual and that the individual's story changed as for the reason he had so much money and what he did for a living. I talked to the Iraqi national and took his identification cards and they looked legitimate and then consulted with 1LT [REDACTED] who stated from what he saw it was legitimate for the Iraqi national to have the money. I concurred and asked the gentleman if he had the money and he said he did and pulled out the folded money. I proceeded to take his picture along with ID card. I escorted him back to his vehicle and then took a picture of the vehicle. Then he departed the scene.

A. We did not have a written SOP. This incident brought out a need for a written SOP. Our unit was doing what we were taught by 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne when we did our relief in

place. They taught us to do random searches especially southbound, to be on the look out for large amounts of money and weapons or anything out of the ordinary. Their thinking was if we did random searches word would get out this was not a good place to try and transport illegal things through.

Q. Was there a policy on taking cash from the possession of Iraqi civilians to count?

A. No, there was no set policy. It was common practice that when we searched, my self included, we would empty their pockets in view of them, usually on the hood of the car, look through their wallets. In the past it was all in plain view.

Q. Why did it get your attention when CPL AGUILAR asked about how much cash an Iraqi civilian could carry?

A. Because we had gone over that having large sums of money was not justification alone to alert to suspicion of any wrong doing. All of the guys squad knew this that is why I got upset when he brought it up and bothered HQ.

Q. What exactly was going on when you arrived at the South TCP?

(b)(6);(7)(C) A. The Iraqi national was standing by the shack and CPL AGUILAR was on his left, and SPC [REDACTED] was on his right and 1LT [REDACTED] was on his right. I think they were waiting for me to show up.

Q. Did they tell you how the Iraqi nationals story keep changing?

A. Yes, from what SPC [REDACTED] said, the guy claimed to be a professor, then something to do with a bank and then some type of businessman. I never got what the money was for and did not ask because there was no reason to suspect the Iraqi national.

Q. Do you remember the Iraqi nationals name?

A. No, but the ID's he presented were; from a University and one was some type of bank consultant.

Q. What did the Iraqi national look like?

A. Older gentleman, late 40's early 50's, business suit, dark hair, I want to say mustache, no beard, glasses. Looked like a businessman.

Q. Where is the picture you took of the Iraqi national and his vehicle?

A. It is on my personnel computer back at Camp Cedar.

Q. Why did you take the pictures?

A. I made a habit of taking pictures of all Iraqi's that we came in contact with to keep a database just in case we needed to ID them at a later time.

WHEN WE ARRIVE ON LOCATION WE ALSO CAME TO FIND OUR EXO, 1<sup>ST</sup> LT [REDACTED] AND HIS DRIVER, SPC [REDACTED] ON LOCATION TOO. ALSO AT THE SOUTH CHECK POINT WORKING THERE THAT DAY WERE CPL. AGUILAR, SPC [REDACTED] AND I'M NOT SURE, SPC [REDACTED]. WHEN WE ARRIVED I SAW SPC [REDACTED] AND SPC [REDACTED] TALKING TO MAN WITH 1<sup>ST</sup> LT [REDACTED] SUPERVISING. I WATCHED LONG ENOUGH TO UNDERSTAND THE SITUATION FROM A DISTANCE OF 5 TO 10 METERS. FROM THE LOCATION OF WHICH I STOOD, I ALSO SAW THE MANS MONEY GIVEN BACK TO HIM. SPC [REDACTED] TOOK THE MONEY FROM A POCKET ON HIS UNIFORM AND HANDED THE MONEY BACK TO THE MAN AND JUST BEFORE THE MAN WENT TO THE POCKET MONEY SPC [REDACTED] ASKED THE MAN TO CHECK HIS MONEY AND TO MAKE SURE IT WAS ALL STILL THERE. When I pulled up to the guard shack, CPL Aguilar and SPC [REDACTED] were searching a white sedan at the point where the civilian bypass meets the MSR (southbound). SPC [REDACTED] and CPL Aguilar brought one local national back to the guard shack. CPL [REDACTED] told me that he was suspicious of the local national because he was carrying an unusual amount of cash (I believe it was over \$1000 in US currency, although I cannot recall the exact amount), and that the LN didn't have a "straight story". The LN had supposedly told SPC [REDACTED] and CPL Aguilar conflicting stories on where he was going and what his business was. During this time, SGT [REDACTED], the squad leader, called in a situation report to the BDOC. I checked the LN's identification, which consisted of a passport and Iraqi Business Bureau ID. The LN conveyed to me that he was on a business trip, and I attributed any perceived conflicts in his story to our soldiers as being caused by a language barrier. Nothing about the LN's story or ID's seemed suspicious to me, so I told SPC [REDACTED] to return the man's money. I asked the LN to count the money to ensure it was the correct amount. The LN counted the currency and told me that it was the correct amount. The LN then returned to his vehicle and headed south. [REDACTED] (b)(6)2;(7)(C)-2

## DETAILS

About 1605, 28 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] received a telephone call from Ms. [REDACTED] mother of SPC [REDACTED] who stated she would be available for an interview on 1 Jul 04, between about 0930 and 1000. Ms. [REDACTED] related she was the director of a daycare center about five minutes away from her residence, and could come home for the interview anytime on 1 Jul 04.

About 1040, 30 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] received a second telephone call from Ms. [REDACTED] who stated that she had been contacted by a lieutenant in Iraq who told her that she did not need to be talking to CID, and that her son had been through enough already. Ms. [REDACTED] related that she knew her son had been interviewed for four hours and was sad about what was happening, but didn't know much beyond that before this lieutenant called her. She stated the lieutenant, whose last name she later provided as "[REDACTED]", told her that her son was being questioned because someone claimed that money had been stolen from him, but that the unit treats each other like family and they're looking out for him. Ms. [REDACTED] stated it wasn't very fair that these young people were fighting honorably for their country and now the Army is treating them like this. When asked, Ms. [REDACTED] stated she had never heard from [REDACTED] before, but it sounded as though he was in her son's unit rather than an attorney, because of the way he said they were taking care of each other, fighting side by side, and words to that effect. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she felt responsible about what was happening because she had been the one to encourage her son to join the National Guard. She stated he had joined the Guard to get money for college, which he planned on attending. Ms. [REDACTED] stated her son had never been in trouble, was always a good kid, played on the varsity golf team in high school, and wanted to be a police officer like his brother. Ms. [REDACTED] stated her son was never hurting for money, and he held a job at In 'N Out Burger, so would have no reason to take any money. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she knew nothing about the money, and didn't know why she needed to be interviewed when she didn't know anything. When asked if she was refusing to be interviewed by CID, Ms. [REDACTED] stated that she didn't feel comfortable talking to us after [REDACTED] had advised her not to, and she had told him that she would do anything to help her son, at which point he told her that she could help him better by not providing any statements. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she would be willing to be interviewed by CID if her son, his attorney, or [REDACTED] was to tell her it was all right for her to do so.

A: Yes, the first soldier laid it on the barrier, then the second would walk to it, he had the belongings of all three of us together mixed in his hands.

A: Yes, 6,000 Iraqi Dinar.

Q: Was there any U.S. Currency in the vehicle?

They said an investigator was going to ask us questions and would give it back to us, the investigator came asked us questions and took pictures of us and the money we had left, but we never got the night stick back.

Q: What was in the trunk?

A: One gallon container of gas.

A: Between 20 - 30 minutes.

Q: Do you know if any other soldiers were aware of the search being conducted?

A: It was just those two soldiers by themselves; their vehicle was close by the tent where they were staying. We never saw any other soldiers.

The CPT said he would pass the information on to Tallil Air Base but would not provide his name to us. A. Yes, and they took a police stick that was in the car. The police stick belonged to my brother. The soldier stated that they would return the stick once we left but the stick was never returned.

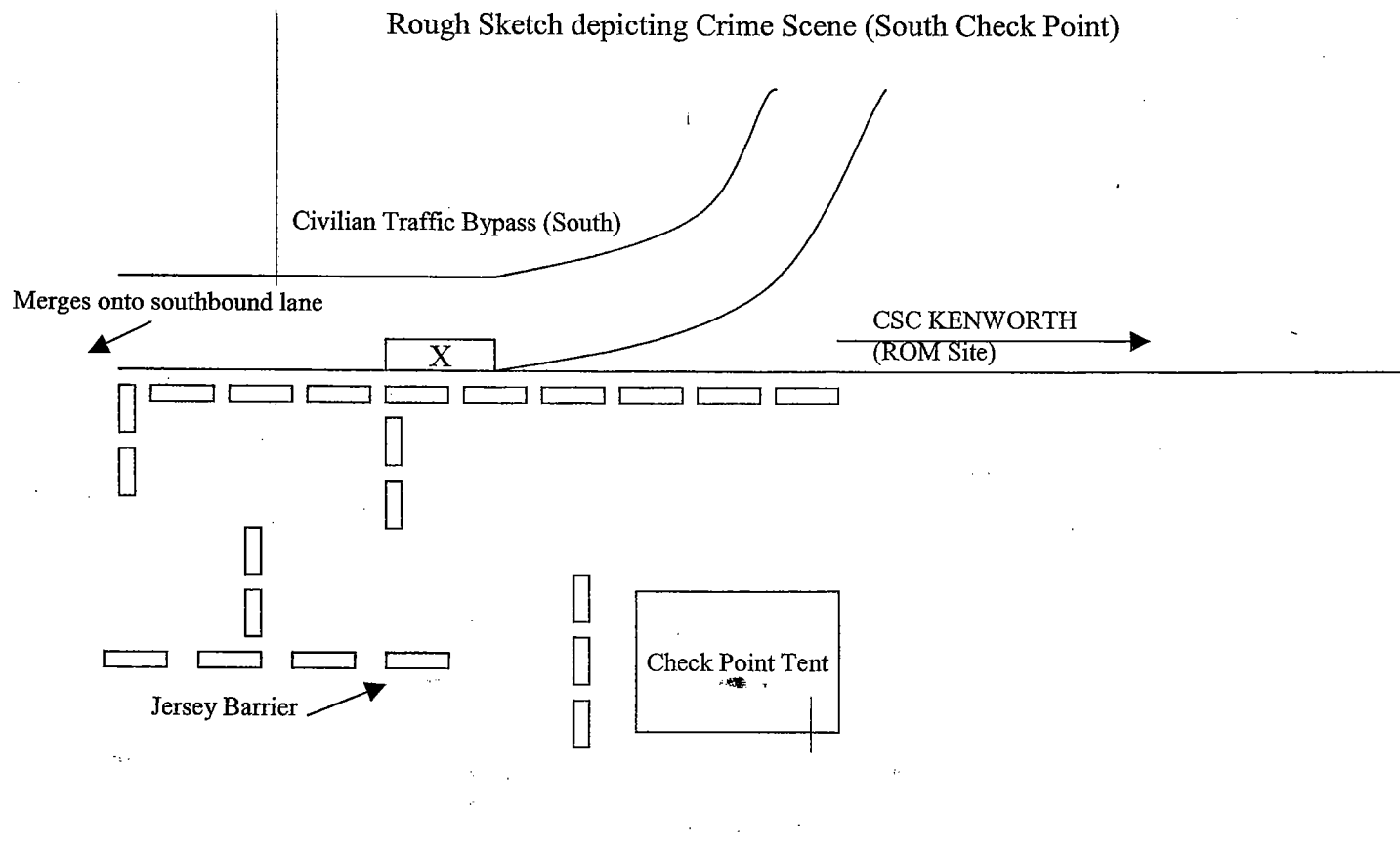

The Iraqi's wanted to know how many days to return. I myself told them to check back every two weeks. They asked for Point of Contact for the officer who took pictures of the vehicle. I called Hellfighter base again to ask permission to release the officer's name, they replied with negative, do not release the officer's name. The three individuals asked me who they were suppose to contact if I could not release a name. I then showed them a tattoo on my right wrist and told them I would help them as much as I can to retrieve the money. Never did I confiscate any item from them.

About 1230 and 1300 we were leaving Camp Cedar after eating lunch, we heard over the net that Big Dog South had a vehicle with two Iraqi Nationals who had \$3000.00 US currency. We were traveling south on Cedar Road and the Squad leader asked over the radio if the Romeo unit which was us, needed to be on the scene. Hell-fire base told us that we did not need to go out there and to continue our roving mission. Later on that day, that evening CPL AGUILAR came to my tent and asked me if I would hold some Iraqi Dinar for him. He said that he felt that some people were trying to steal his money. He had the money in a wad and he unfolded it. It was a large amount of Iraqi Dinar he fanned it out I could see two one hundred dollar bills <sup>mixed in</sup>. I asked him why he wanted me to hold it and that was when he said he thought that people were trying to take it from him. I turned away and grabbed my black folder from my shelf and he handed the money to me and I placed it in an envelope and put it in the folder. The same day was when 1SG [REDACTED] and LT [REDACTED] came through my tent doing a tent inspection we did not know what they were looking for. They said they are looking for anything that we were not supposed to have any contraband and large amounts of money. So asked them what was considered a large amount of money. I told them that I had a lot of Dinar, and they said they were not worried about it. Then [REDACTED] searched my area real quick looking at the obvious spots, and moved through the tent and left. A couple of days after the inspection, I was getting ready for shift I was outside smoking a cigarette and CPL AGUILAR came up and said hi. I asked him what was going on because I heard rumors that there was money stolen out at the ROM. He said "he did not have anything to do with what was going on". He said "between me and you I think that SPC [REDACTED] had something to do with it". I told him that he needed to come pick up his stuff. He told me he would come by and get it. I did not want to spread anymore rumors so I did not talk to anyone about what he said. About a week later, after the rumors got worse, my squad leader came in front of the squad while we were on shift one night. He said that if anyone has anything that they know or knows what is going on to get it out in the open and let him know. So I told him about the Dinar that I had, and he said Ok if you get asked or interviewed about this to tell them everything you know and tell the truth. Sometime before I spoke with my squad leader but after AGUILAR gave me the money, CPL AGUILAR came to my tent and asked me for some of the Dinar because he knew I was not comfortable holding on to it. He took all of the big bills of Dinar and left about 75,000 dinar in the 5,000 bills. The night I spoke with my squad leader I got off of shift the next morning at

0700 and I looked through the Dinar that I had and I noticed that the 2 \$100 bills were mixed in with the dinar I wasn't sure at the time that he had handed me the 2 \$100 bills with the dinar. I also noticed that one of the \$100 bills had a small black stamp on the front side of the bill near the upper right hand corner. I confronted him about it and told him he needed to come get the rest of it and if he was mixed up in this in some way that he needed to go talk to someone. He reassured me that he did not have anything to do with what was going on. He seemed to blow me off and said something like he would come and get it later. Later that day I took the money out of the envelope and on my way to lunch I went to the amnesty box and threw it in. Either that evening or the following evening he came to me and asked where his money was and I told him I got rid of it. I said I do not know what you are mixed up with and I do not know if you are trying to get me mixed up with it. I told him how I felt about him bringing me the money and all of the stuff that is going on. Then he walked out of the tent and about 5 minutes later he came in and asked me what I did with it and where it was at. I told him that I put it in the amnesty box and he asked me why I did it. I told him it was hard for me not to get angry with him because he put me in that position. He left and came back a few minutes later and said he talked to the 1sg [REDACTED] about getting it back and he needed to know exactly what amnesty box it was. I told him it was the one at the front of the camp and he left again. Later that evening, my squad leader asked me what was wrong between me and AGUILAR and I told him that I am tired of putting 100% into a friendship and only getting 50% back. From that time until a couple of days ago, maybe the morning of the 6<sup>th</sup> of July, I didn't talk to anyone and never ran into AGUILAR, I saw him around but we never talked. On the morning of the 6<sup>th</sup> he came up to me while I was at a computer in the internet Café, he walked by and said hey I need to talk to you if you have a minute. I said ok lets talk, I went outside and he said I apologize for giving you that stuff, I do not have anything to do with it, that stuff didn't have anything to do with it, and I see how bad it looks now. He said he wanted to apologize and swallow his pride and try to save our friendship. I said I feel like you lied to me and put me into a horrible position and I am not going to be able to forgive you or forget it. He then told me about how him and his wife are on bad terms because of this whole situation and how he didn't tell her anything that was going on and then someone from the military called her and was asking her questions about it. He said CID questioned him and said that [REDACTED] said that he had something to do with it. CPL AGUILAR then said that they think [REDACTED] did it. I said I don't know but I do not want to talk about it anymore. Then we just talked about general things family and stuff. Then I walked in and used the phone.

**AGENT'S COMMENT:** The RFA detailed SPC [REDACTED] (b)(6)5 ; (7)(C)-5 and CPL AGUILAR were suspected of robbing Iraqi civilians of \$1,250.00, in U.S. currency and 159,000, in Iraqi Dinar. The U.S. currency was described to have a small black stamp on the face of the bill resembling a campfire.

Also, at my position was CPL AGUILAR and SPC [REDACTED]. CPL AGUILAR and SPC [REDACTED] were on foot at and around the South Bunker. After the first couple of hours they moved forward of the bunker and began making random car stops. They would get to about 200 meters away from the bunker, I saw them make at least two stops on North bound vehicles. They would also cross the MSR and make stops on southbound vehicles coming from the civilian bypass. Due to the position of the 113 and the bunker, I was not able to watch them make any of the stops with the southbound traffic. Even though they were out of my sight, I was not worried, as they would continuously walk back and forth across the MSR. I am not sure how many stops they made on south bound traffic, as I could not see from my angle.

While they were forward of the position LT [REDACTED] arrived on scene and asked where AGUILAR and [REDACTED] were. I told LT [REDACTED] they were forward of the position on the south side of the MSR. LT [REDACTED] went forward of the bunker and I lost site of him as well, until a few moments later, all of them came back to the bunker including an Iraqi male. They stayed at the bunker for a moment and were involved in a discussion. CPL AGUILAR came to my position at the 113 and asked for the radio handset. CPL AGUILAR then called into Hellfigther base notifying them that he had made a car stop. He also mentioned that the driver had a large amount of money. CPL AGUILAR also mentioned that this individual was either a lawyer or professor. CPL AGUILAR requested further directions as to this situation as it was unusual. I believe the reply was delayed, so CPL AGUILAR left the 113 and went back to the group at the bunker. CPL AGUILAR, SPC [REDACTED] and LT [REDACTED] were talking amongst each other as well as the Iraqi male. I did not hear any of the conversation as they were too far away. The Iraqi male was then released and shortly after LT [REDACTED] left also. This one car stop was the only one I knew that they made southbound, as I am sure they made others. Other than the original radio broadcast talking about the money, I never saw any and don't recall any further conversations about it. After that we just went on about the day as usual, I believe there were a few other stops that were made. I remained in the 113 for that entire shift.

Q: Did you have a visual on CPL AGUILAR and SPC [REDACTED] (b)(6)5;(7)(C)5 at all times?

A: No, I could see them fine when they were on the northbound lanes and had zero visibility when they were in the southbound lanes. (b)(6)5-7(C)5

Q: Could you see any of the vehicles stopped by CPL AGUILAR and SPC [REDACTED] on traffic headed south?

A: No, my vision was obscured by the bunker. (b)(6)5, 7(C)5

A: Somewhere around the middle of shift, it would have been around 1100.

Q: Can you describe the Iraqi man?


