> Our detainee strategy is based on an integration of interrogations and the > intelligence exploitation of detainees. We are relooking our efforts at > Abu Ghrayb to ensure we are getting tactical intelligence to your units > rapidly to help you in the close fight and supporting our operational > level focus. These interrogations will lead us to a decision on sending > the detainee to CCCI for trial, retain them in custody due to high threat, > transfer to Iraqi authority for to the jurisdiction of the Common Court > of Iraq for trial for civilian crimes, or release back to civil society. > We will work these areas in parallel so more rapid decisions are made. I > have given Geoff the release authority for all non-Black and Grey list > detainees, referral authority to the CCCI, and transfer authority to Iraqi > legal system for detainees that are classified as committing civil > criminal offenses. We will move out rapidly in these areas and keep you > informed.

> We are in the process of moving out with our detainee review and release > program. Since February we have reviewed approximately 2300 detainee cases > and made release decisions on the first 1200. Four hundred will remain in > detention and about 800 will be transferred for release. Our first > releases are scheduled for 4 and 14 May and you have received > notification of those detainees who will be returned to you for release on > both periods. The system we will use is to inform you of the releases and > give you an opportunity to provide any additional information that would > cause us to reconsider the release decision. Work with Geoff on any of > these issues. For these first releases I have suspended the Review Board > unit 4 May to address any issues that Commanders bring to us about the > release of detainees. This follows the philosophy of doing something once > and doing it right. We will take a 1 or 2 day break each time we schedule > a release so as to address any release issues from units or agencies. The > Board will reconvene on 5 May and will move forward to meet the goal of > completing the about 1800 remaining detainee files in the next 3 weeks.

> I believe this detainee focus is a force multiplier for us and we will > continue to make it work better for our Commanders.

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
