Subject Interview of: (UNK) [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5

Date/Place: 06 Feb 03/GTMO, Cuba

On 2/6/2003, [REDACTED] Internment Serial Number (ISN) [REDACTED] was interviewed at Camp Delta, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, by Federal Bureau of Investigations Special Agent [REDACTED] and United States Army Criminal Investigation Command Special Agent [REDACTED]. The interview was conducted in the Arabic language and translated by Contract Linguist [REDACTED]. After being notified of the identity of the interviewing agents, [REDACTED] provided the following information: b(7)(C)-5 b(7)(C)-5 b(7)(C)-6

[REDACTED] was shown a photo of [REDACTED], as requested by CITF-B, and stated that he did not recognize [REDACTED]. - b(7)(C)-5 b(7)(C)-5

[REDACTED] advised that he has previously refused to speak because the guards do not respect his religion and they continue to humiliate the Koran. He requested his Koran be taken from him. [REDACTED] also advised that nothing was ever done to his Koran; however, if one Koran is humiliated, then all are humiliated. He had heard several stories of the Koran being humiliated. b(7)(C)-5 b(7)(C)-5

[REDACTED] advised he went to school in Morocco to study Islam, and he attended a mosque in his neighborhood called the [REDACTED]. He had been going there his entire life to pray. When asked if he ever heard anyone displaying anti-American sentiments or making terrorist threats, he refused to speak. [REDACTED] advised that he wanted to be honest with the interviewers, but he felt the questions being asked disrespected Islam. b(7)(C)-5 b(7)(C)-5

[REDACTED] advised he left Morocco for God's sake, and he was in no hurry to be released. He will be released at some point in time. He knows he is innocent and the only reason he is here is because he is Muslim. He is sure that the interviews will not last forever. [REDACTED] advised he never did anything wrong, and he never killed an American. b(7)(C)-5 b(7)(C)-5

[REDACTED] advised that if we have good intentions, then we would take his Koran from him. He stated that some of the information we get from interviews is against Islam. He went on to say that he has nothing to hide and he will not cooperate until the Koran issue is resolved.

[REDACTED] agreed to meet with interviewers in a couple of weeks so he could have some time to sort things out. [REDACTED] friend, [REDACTED], was recently moved from Gulf block to Charlie block, and [REDACTED] asked if he could be moved next to him. [REDACTED] was instructed that it would be looked into. b(7)(C)-5 b(2)-3 b(7)(C)-5

[REDACTED] was cooperative only for brief periods of time during the interview. b(7)(C)-5
