[REDACTED] b(7)(C)-6, [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5, Internment Serial Number (ISN) [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-1, was interviewed by SA [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-6, Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), and SA [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-1, Air Force Office of Special Investigations (AFOSI), at Camp Delta, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. The interview was conducted in the Urdu language and translated by contract linguist [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5. After being advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents and the nature of the interview, [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 provided the following information:

[REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 maintains that he only traveled to Afghanistan with the JEISH E MUHAMED (JEM) to see the sites. However, he did provide more information concerning the people he traveled with when he left Pakistan. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 advised there were eleven other people in the JEM office with him, but he only got to know one of them, an individual named [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 (LNU). [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 was from the village of Gujranwala in Pakistan and was also going to Afghanistan with the JEM to see the sites. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 admitted that he knew the JEM was recruiting people to travel to Afghanistan to fight in the jihad. He and [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 knew that the other ten men with them traveled to Afghanistan with the intention of fighting in the jihad. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 advised that JEM representatives told him that they would take him to Afghanistan to see what was going on there with the hope that he would want to stay fight. He claims that no one ever told him he had to fight and no one treated him any differently because he chose to work in the kitchen rather than fight.

[REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 was asked if he thought the JEM were supporting a worthy cause and if he supported the war against the Northern Alliance. He advised that he did not believe it was a worthy cause or a just war. He claimed that it was not his war to fight and he just wanted to visit the country. He maintained that he was forced to stay with the JEM and work in the kitchen. He claims that he was told that there were laws in place to keep him there and if he tried to leave he would be captured and detained by the Taliban. He was also told that the area around where he was living was not safe. Because of these reasons, he never tried to return to Pakistan. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 advised that [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 did leave on his own, but he does not know what happened to him. He claims that he did not go with [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 because he thought he was kidding about leaving and did not realize that he was serious until he had already gone.

[REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 advised that no one other than the seven other people that worked with him in the kitchen lived where he lived. They prepared the food in the kitchen and people came to pick it up in pick-up trucks. He did not know where

they took the food. He suspects that they took it to the house where he originally stayed. He claims that more than 100 men lived at that location. [REDACTED] advised that he never heard if there was any training was taking place at that location. He further stated that he never saw or participated in any type of training while in Afghanistan.

[REDACTED] was asked about a statement he made to a uniformed interrogator on 09/12/2002. In the interrogation, the attacks on the World Trade Center on 09/11/2001 were discussed. [REDACTED] allegedly stated, in English, that the United States was responsible for "killing those people" and the "United States is always about money, money, money," [REDACTED] even pointed to the interviewer and stated "it is your fault." [REDACTED] advised that he made that statement under stress and the interrogator was assaulting him physically. He claims that the interrogator made him angry but he never said that the United States was responsible for the attacks. He advised that the interrogator made that statement and he told the interrogator that he that he was just here to make money. He claims that the statement was incorrect and advised that it was taken under duress and completely out of context.

[REDACTED] advised that he does not harbor any ill will toward the United States as a result of his incarceration. He stated that he understands why the United States detained the people in Afghanistan. He cannot understand why he is still being detained and belabored the point that he has told the truth and has answered "thousands" of questions. He asked if he could have an Urdu/English or English dictionary. He also requested that he be moved to another cellblock. He claims that the guards on his cellblock unfairly punish the entire cellblock for the acts of a few disruptive detainees.
