[REDACTED] has been spoken to on one occasion since his polygraph examination and the interview that followed it. That interview was conducted by a military interrogator described as [REDACTED]

This individual told [REDACTED] "Not to worry about the civilian people. We can give you another polygraph, a military one." [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-2
[REDACTED] advised that another interrogator described as [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 b(7)(C)-2 b(7)(C)-5 b(7)(C)-5
[REDACTED] came to his cell several days ago to tell him he would be going home soon.

[REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5
[REDACTED] reiterated that he has never been to Afghanistan. He knows people have said that he was there, but claims he was told by members of the Pakistani police or military to say that he was in Afghanistan and had gone to Khost. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5
[REDACTED] also admitted to being a member of [REDACTED] while in Kandahar but states he said this after being yelled at by Egyptian forces and beaten by American forces. [REDACTED] insists now that he was never in Afghanistan and was never a member of AL-QAEDA. The time in Kandahar was the only time he admitted to being AL-QAEDA. b(7)(C)-5 b(7)(C)-3

While in the KOHAT PRISON (phonetic) [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-3 b(7)(C)-3 b(7)(C)-5 b(7)(C)-5 b(7)(C)-5 b(7)(C)-5
[REDACTED] and other prisoners were approached by a police or military officer. [REDACTED] (phonetic). [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-3
[REDACTED] asked each prisoner for their home phone numbers which he then distributed to each of the other prisoners. The purpose for this was to have any detainee that escaped, contact the families of the others to inform them of the status of their loved ones. The majority of the prisoners were from Saudi Arabia. [REDACTED] estimates between 10 and 15 prisoners provided phone numbers. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5
[REDACTED] provided his parents home phone number in Saudi Arabia. [REDACTED] believes [REDACTED] was attempting to assist several prisoners escape and thinks that one or two actually made it out of the prison. [REDACTED] also took b(7)(C)-3
photographs of the prisoners, but [REDACTED] is not sure what the purpose of this was. [REDACTED] heard that [REDACTED] was going to put these pictures on the Internet. [REDACTED] left his copy of phone numbers in the prison bathroom. [REDACTED] is described as [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 b(7)(C)-3 b(7)(C)-5 b(7)(C)-5

[REDACTED] was concerned about his not receiving any letters, and he was advised that the interrogators would look into that issue for him.
