**4. REMARKS**

Subject Interview of: (UNK) [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5  
Date/Place: 03 May 04/Camp Delta, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba  
On 03 May 04, ISN [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5, was interviewed at Camp Delta, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba by Special Agent [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5, Naval Criminal Investigative Service and [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-1, Air Force Office of Special Investigations. The interview was conducted in Pashtu as translated by [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5, Contract Linguist, Titan Corporation.

[REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 stated that if released, he would like to return to Kabul, AF. [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 further stated that since he had only graduated from high school, he would also like to enroll at the Kabul University. [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 said he would attempt to earn a degree in either Computer Science or Business Management, as there is much money to be made in either field. [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5

[REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 also commented that although he supports an American presence within Afghanistan, he believes the Americans have done him an injustice by sending him to Cuba.

[REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 explained that while employed with DynaCorp as a translator, he was accused of providing classified information to anti coalition members. According to [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5, his subsequent confession regarding the accusation is not only false, but also coerced. [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-2

[REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 related that prior to his capture, he was assigned to provide linguistic support for Agent [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 (NFI) regarding three Arabs who wanted to share information with American Forces. [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 explained that after translating for [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-2

[REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-2 some unknown drivers also employed by DynaCorp, inquired as to why the three aforementioned Arabs wanted to visit with Americans. [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-2 stated that he told the drivers that the three men were working with the Americans, but stressed that he never told the drivers anything about their conversation with [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-2

[REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 further explained that shortly after the conversation with the drivers, [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-2 approached him and inquired why he was sharing classified information with other people. [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 said he denied [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-2 accusation and immediately left work. [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 stated that because he was worried that he would be in trouble, he decided to travel to Jalalabad, AF and ask his father for advice.

[REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 said after spending two days in Jalalabad, his father convinced him to return to work and resolve the situation with Chris. [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 explained however, that when he returned to work, he was immediately placed under arrest and interrogated.

[REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 claimed that during the interrogation, he was first beaten and subsequently coerced into providing a written statement indicating his culpability. [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 stated his interrogator, [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-2 (NFI), told him that unless he admits to sharing classified information with enemy forces, he would be sent to Cuba. [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 also stated that [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-2

[REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-2 suggested he claim that the classified information was provided to a well-known enemy because he would later be able to claim political asylum. [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5

[REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-5 stated that because he didn't want to be sent to Cuba, he decided to admit that he was working for [REDACTED] - b(7)(C)-2

## 4. REMARKS (Continued)

b(1)(c)-5  
(NFI), a known Hezbi Islami Gulbadin (HIG) member. Additionally, in order to make his admissions more believable, [REDACTED] stated he needed to provide as much detailed information as possible; consequently, [REDACTED] said. b(1)(c)-5  
he admitted to providing weapon serial numbers, as well as names and ranks of coalition members working within the facility. b(1)(c)-5  
[REDACTED] acknowledged he underwent a polygraph examination in Bagram, AF, but claims interrogators told him that he had passed. However, when the interrogator stated that he would not have been sent to Cuba if he had passed the examination, [REDACTED] opined that the interrogators must have lied to him. b(1)(c)-5  
Despite acknowledging that his story was not believable for several reasons, [REDACTED] remained steadfast in his claim. b(1)(c)-5  
that his original statement, in which he admitted guilt, was false.
