Subject Interview of: (UNK) [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5

Date/Place: 30 Aug 04/Camp Delta, Guantanamo Bay (GTMO), Cuba

[REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5, Interment Serial Number (ISN) [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5, was interviewed at Camp Delta, Naval Station Guantanamo Bay (GTMO), Cuba, by Special Agent [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 US Army Criminal Investigation Command, DoD Criminal Investigative Task Force (CITF).

[REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 was queried concerning his health and/or any other issues that he had. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 advised his health was good and he had no complaints. He was offered food and drink during the interview. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 was advised the nature of the interviewing agent.

The majority of the interview was spent talking about politics and the US government. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 stated he did not have any problems with Americans, just the American government. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 stated the world knows "what is going on", and believes he will be released soon. When asked to clarify his statement about what was going on, [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 repeatedly replied, "you know". It was apparent he was referring to the recent Abu Gharib scandal. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 was asked if he had personally experienced or witnessed any abuse while in custody, to which he initially said nothing, [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 then stated he hadn't. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 advised he knew that the detainees that were released in the past have "told everything". [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 was questioned about a statement he provided to interrogators in the past in which he initially advised he was abused, and then quickly recanted, stating he was only told of abuse. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 admitted that he had only heard about the abuse, and had not personally witnessed it.

[REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 was queried about previous information this office had received that he had previously been to AF, (see FM40; [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 of [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 advised he was not in AF prior to his apprehension, and had only traveled outside [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 on one occasion. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 advised the first time he traveled by plane was a on a field trip to France, which he took with his school. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 further stated he had told interrogators this in the past.

Agent's comment: [REDACTED] b(7)(S)-1

[REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 repeatedly denied traveling to AF prior to his apprehension, and could only state that it was a case of mistaken identity. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 insisted that his passport would prove that he had not previously traveled to AF.

Agent's comment: [REDACTED] b(7)(S)-1

[REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 insisted that he went there only to flee prosecution [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 and upon his arrival to AF, he wanted to return home, due to the harsh living and training conditions. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 was asked if he believed he was consistently honest with interviewers in the past, even while [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 when he was faced with prosecution, or punishment from his actions. Initially [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 advised he was honest; however, when it was made clear that SA [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 knew that he frequently lied in the past, specifically [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 for past misdemeanor offenses, and only told the truth when it benefited him, he hung his head and didn't answer. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 repeatedly told SA [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 "you hate me and think I'm a terrorist, and a terrible person". SA [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 reassured [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 that [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 didn't hate him, nor did [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 think that he was a terrible person; however, [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 believed he wasn't being completely honest with information he had previously provided, and further, had a lot of information which proved that he had previously been to AF. SA [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5 further

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b(7)(C)-5
stated it was apparent that [REDACTED] believes he will be released, and therefore is withholding information. [REDACTED] b(7)(C)-5
was asked to consider the fact that he could not be recommended for release, until all of the information that he and
others have provided has been corroborated.

The interview was terminated due to other scheduled interviews. Attempts to re-interview [REDACTED] met with
negative results, as the GTMO trip was cut short due to weather conditions. b(7)(C)-5

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
