SUBJECT: (U) Interview Techniques

1. (U) Purpose: Provide additional guidance to Criminal Investigation Task Force (CITF) agents regarding the use of various techniques and methods for conducting interviews of the Detained Persons (DPs) held in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, and in the CENTCOM AOR.

2. (C) Guidance: The President's 7 Feb 2002 POTUS memo states, "As a matter of policy, the United States Armed Forces shall continue to treat detainees humanely and, to the extent appropriate and consistent with military necessity, in a manner consistent with the principles of Geneva". Therefore, CITF will employ interview methods or techniques that are consistent with the Geneva protections and the President's memo. These methods are designed to ensure that all information from DPs is taken voluntarily.
