

<u>Task 5a.</u> Identify the parties with knowledge of the blunt force trauma and injuries sustained by the Iraqi Major General detainee.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

(U) ECC Tasking Summary #10, DTG 110800MAY04, Task 5c. Are any photographs in the public domain that are not on the disk?

(U) Answer #5c. There have been no photographs seen so far in the various media reports and on websites that are not included on the disk. It is believed that all images recorded by the various persons at Abu Ghraib have been recovered and are included on the disk. However, there always exists a possibility that an unknown photograph taken or retained by an unidentified person might become available for release to the public domain. There are photographs on the disk that are not yet in the public domain, or at least have not yet been publicized.



Take-Away/Discussion Points:

 It is not believed that there are any photographs in the public domain that are not included on the disk.
