

(U) This investigation was initiated upon receipt of Memorandum of Transmittal (MOT) (0093-04-CID789) from the 75th Military Police (MP) Detachment (DET), Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, IZ, APO AE 09342 (AGI), which related reported he was abused while detained in Mosul, IZ.

alleged he was abused on the scene of his first arrest on 25 Apr 04, by being punched in the back of the head two times and told to "shut up" while he was handcuffed behind his back and on his knees. He alleged he was then transported to the Mosul Airfield, Mosul, IZ, and kept at a place called "The Disco." During his interrogations at "The Disco" alleged he had his jumpsuit filled with ice and was made to lay down on a floor with bags of dirt placed on his legs so he could not move; held down and punched on his head; hit with "smooth rocks" all over his body, shoulders and head; and slapped, punched and kicked. The alleged he had two of his molars broken while being punched. Further, alleged he had water poured in his mouth and nose until he fainted, and was forced to stand in front of an air conditioner in wet clothes. Army and Navy personnel had separate interrogation facilities and both Army and Navy personnel interrogated The army interrogators were identified and interviewed and denied abusing or witnessing him being abused. Screening reports completed at the time of interrogations with Army personnel have been obtained and there were no signs of abuse noted. Obtained from Army personnel were 5 detainee questionnaires which ask detainees how they were treated while detained at the stated on all the questionnaires he was treated well at Army detention facility.

All medical documentation pertaining to , which was obtained from Army sources, has been reviewed and there was no medical evidence to support his allegations of abuse. Further, Army doctors and medical personnel who examined ave been interviewed and related there were no physical signs of abuse.

Documentation obtained from Navy personnel confirmed was captured both and was also interrogated by Navy and/or Marine times by members of personnel while at the Mosul Airfield. It is strongly believed that if the alleged offenses occurred they were perpetrated by members of the U.S. Navy or Marine Corps. All U.S. Army leads have been exhausted; therefore, this investigation is referred to the NCIS for action deemed appropriate.





The detained the hitially alleged he was abused three different times; during his initial arrest on 25 Apr 04, during subsequent interrogations to his first arrest; and again after his second arrest on 21 May 04.

During his first arrest on 25 Apr 04, and alleged he was forced to kneel in the floor, put a bag over his head, handcuffed his hands behind his back and was punched in the back of the head two times and told to "Shut Up."

alleged he was interrogated after his first arrest and during those interrogations he abused. Alleged he had his jumpsuit filled with ice and made to lay down on a floor and had bags of dirt placed on his legs so he could not move; held down while several people punched him on his head; had someone hit him with "smooth rocks" all over his body, shoulders and head; slapped, punched and kicked; had two of his molars broken while being punched; had water poured in his mouth and nose until he fainted; and was forced to stand in front of an air conditioner in wet clothes. Further, he alleged he had his face rubbed in urine on the floor where he was being interrogated; someone stomped on his groin; hit with smooth stones on the head about twenty times; and had someone hit him on the back of the neck with bags of ice.

was interviewed by CID, and related after his arrest he was taken to the Mosul Airport to a place called "The Disco". Claimed his abuse occurred at "The alleged at one point he passed out because of his abuse and woke up in a small wooden room with several IV's and medical devices attached to him. He is not sure how long he was there, but was taken back to the same area and interrogated again. he was at the "Disco" two days and then transferred to the detention facility in Mosul. There, I claimed he was medically screened and asked how he was treated. asked the screener if he was talking about the "Disco" or the detention facility and the screener replied he only wanted to know about the detention facility. imed he was taken back to the "Disco", interrogated again, and was abused. Plaimed he was released after a few days, but was captured again about 19 days later and returned to the "Disco" where he was abused during his interrogations again. described the interrogators who were involved his abuse as 1) tall white male, blue eyes, blond hair, blue jeans and green t-shirt, 2) short, white male, glasses, small brown mustache, blue eyes, about 19 years old, 3) black male (NFI). also stated he saw a tall white female, fat, blond hair in a ponytail, wearing glasses who talked to him while at the "Disco."

Four of the statements ask detainees to "Describe your experience in the custody of coalition forces" and one statement ask detainees "I was/was not physically harmed during the detainee process or during interrogation by U.S. or Coalition Forces." answers on the forms all indicate he was treated very well "in this location."

A review of second medical documents does not support his allegations of abuse. Further, was medically screened every time he was transferred between Navy and Army personnel and there were no noted injuries. The initial medical screening done when was in-processed to the Baghdad Central Confinement Center, Abu Ghraib Prison (BCCF), noted some bruising around his right eye and face and a broken right molar. A Dentist examined broken molar and was unable to determine whether or not the damage was a result of a punch to the right jaw as alleged by the did state there were some inconsistencies with the allegation in relation to the damage, but it was possible.

During his first capture, he was arrested at the home of his friend at 0130 hrs, unknown date, by five soldiers in US Army Desert Camouflage Uniforms (DCU) in black masks. He remembered seeing a patch on the sleeve of the uniforms, which looked like the head of an Indian, which he sketched on paper. There was one Iraqi Linguist present wearing the same type black mask. He could hear helicopters outside and heard at least two military vehicles. They kneeled him on the floor, put a plastic standard army green sandbag on his head, and tied his hands behind his back with plastic flexi cuffs. He was punched in the back of the head twice and told to "Shut Up". He was then loaded on the back of a military vehicle, similarly described like a M-998. While in the truck, he was punched in the back of the head twice. He was taken to the Mosul airport, to what is commonly called "The Disco" by local Iragi people, because music is heard coming from the location all day each day. When he arrived, he was taken into small wooden room, where his hood was removed and his hands freed. He was stripped of his clothing, place in a blue jumpsuit, and his picture was taken. He was then rehooded with the same hood and flexi cuffed behind the back. Cold water was then poured on him. He quest it was 0500 hrs the same morning. He was taken to a place with loud speakers. He stated he passed by a fire, because he could feel the heat. His jumpsuit was opened and filled with ice. He was then laid down and the remaining portion of his jumpsuit was filled with ice. A bag of ice was placed behind his head. Then four or five men speaking English started asking questions while kicking and stomping him. One American was speaking Arabic. He could tell by the dialect. He lay on the ground until the ice was almost melted. He was sat up and rocks placed in the back of the jumpsuit, and dragged by his feet for about 10 minutes. He remembers the Arabic speaking American and one other Iraqi Linguist talking to him. His hood was pulled up to his nose by a different interrogator and water was forced in his mouth and nose. The interrogator would lift him up and punch him in the back until the water came out. This happened twice. He then passed out and woke up in a small wooden room with several IVs and other medical devices attached to him. His head was not covered nor his hands tied. He saw what he thought was a doctor. He described the doctor as a white man, with a light brown beard and glasses. He stated that everyone was nice. He does not know how long he was there. Sometime after, a white male with no facial hair, in uniform pants and brown t-shirt, tied cloth around my eyes, but left his hands free. He was then driven in the back of a military truck to what he believes is the same place, because he heard the music. He was taken to a three-sided cement structure about four feet tall and no roof, where he was unhooded. It was located outside under camouflage netting. He was then taken into a small wooden interrogation room, unhooded, and hands flexi cuffed in front. He was sat in brown plastic chair. He saw and heard a man with the same voice as the one pouring water in his mouth. He described him as a tall white male, with blue eyes, blond hair, blue jeans and green t-shirt. The three men began to punch him in his head, on all sides, about 20 times. As they punched him, they would scream in his ear. He could see partially through his goggles, and saw a black male in uniform, piss on the floor of the milyan. He said the black male then took the goggle off and rubbed his face on the floor in the piss. If was somewhat dark in the milvan, so he could not describe the black male. He said the black male punched him as he was rubbing his head on the floor. He said this lasted for ten minutes. They the left him alone and the door to the milvan opened. He saw a white female in civilian cloths walk in. She had blond hair pulled back in a ponytail wearing glasses. He described her as being tall and fat. He said it was still dark outside. She told him that she knew he had been tortured, but she was his friend. She talked to him for a while. He was then taken back to the detention facility. He believes it was about 0400 hrs. He went back through the medical screening and was asked the same question. He was again instructed to only answer about the detention facility. While at the detention facility, he saw the same black male working there. At 1400 hrs the same day, he was taken back to the "Disco". He was taken into a room, while hooded with the same green plastic bag, where more ice was placed on him. He was beaten on the body more and once stomped in the grown. At some point he was hit with several smooth stones in the head about 20 times. He said they were not thrown, but rather held by someone's hands. He was leaned over while sitting on the floor and hit with a bag of ice on the back of the neck about eight times. After a few days, he was taken back to the detention facility and released.

He was again captured 19 days later and taken back to the "Disco". While at the "Disco". he incurred the same type of treatment, to include being beat with rocks, covered in ice, and kicked.
