After I got Abu Ghruveb on 17 Dec 2003, then they moved me to the hard site on 18 Dec 2003. After that date in a day or two, they appointed an interrogator for me. After a few days, they started beating me. He ordered the soldiers in the hard site to tie my hands and my legs. That was done by five people. They started beating me. Then they threw me on the staircase. I started feeling heavy pain in my ribs and nose. I was bleeding from my nose. After that they threw me in the shower room and took my cloths off. They put me under cold water naked. A little bit more than a half of an hour, I put on an orange jumpsuit without underwear or t-shirt. Again they put water on me while was putting on the uniform. They sent me back to my room without a blanket and I stayed until morning and the weather was very cold. And my cloths were wet. They repeated the same situation more than ten times and throughout the interrogation they tied my hands to the hock on the floor to the back and they put the hood on my head. After the interrogation, they would not guide me out, but they instead would tell me to move by sound. They would not guide me. As I was walking, I hit the fence and went threw some water holes. I was bleeding from my face. I could not see because of the bag on my face. One of the times, they put a cigarette on his right leg and it burned all the way into the meat. I was receiving bad words everyday. For example they said they would send some people to fuck you or they would send some people to fuck my kids, even though nothing like that happened. He kept repeating this all the time. He would also tell me he would send me to Guantanimo and alot men there would marry me. That didn't happen. The interrogator sent three times a black dog into my room, in the shower room, and in the hallway at night. I swear to God with my dignity, everything that I wrote above is truthful with a translator witnessing.

He cuffed my hand to the back and they walked me about 15 meters and there were the integrator and the translator and 5 soldiers. 3 of them were black and 2 white and there they uncuffed me then the soldier catch me with my hand backward and it felt like my hand is getting broken and I felt pain then I pulled my hand back that when they got mad so pushed me against the stairway hard and my noise was bleeding and then they took me to bathroom in hard side.

A: The reason is I pulled my hand from them and they got mad, but I don't think they did it on purpose.

Q: Describe to me exactly what happened with the dogs.

A: Approximately about 7 or 8 times they came with dogs inside the cell and about 3 or 4 times in the shower room but the dog did not bite me and it was sometime during integration in the bathroom.

Q: [Describe how did they walked you by the sound.]

A: In the conex my hand were cuffed behind my back and the bag over my head and they told me walk by the sound and I was trying to do that but I was hitting the conex or the fence or I use to fall in a water hole in the ground.

A: That happened by the second group when they captured me in there base in Baghdad Q: On May 19 when the doctor was examining you did you tell him that the American forces beat you?

I witnessed getting a haircut one day in which his head and moustache were both shaved, but not the eyebrows. One day, his eyebrows were shaved though, because I noticed it during the interrogation. I did see one other prisoner with his eyebrows shaved as well, so I just dismissed it from my mind as a procedural aspect of the job. The second procedure of the prison wing was showers. From what I was told, prisoners were given a shower regularly meaning at least once a week. THIS IS AN "OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM" INVESTIGATION.

THIS INVESTIGATION WAS INITIATED UPON NOTIFICATION FROM CPT 504TH MILITARY INTELLIGENCE BRIGADE, STAFF JUDGE ADVOCATE, BCCF, THAT A DETAINEE ALLEGED HE WAS ASSAULTED BY US FORCES WHILE BEING INTERROGATED AT BCCF.

PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION REVEALED DETAINEE ALLEGED HE WAS ASSAULTED BY IRAQI INTELLIGENCE PERSONNEL, WHO WORKED FOR UPON HIS CAPTURE FROM HIS HOME ON 14 DEC 03, AND BY US SOLDIERS AFTER HIS ARRIVAL AT BCCF ON 18 DEC 03. DURING THE INTERVIEW. HE RELATED THE TWO IRAQI INTELLIGENCE PERSONS HIT HIS HEAD AGAINST THE WALL REPEATEDLY. HE WAS THEN RELEASED TO US CUSTODY AND TRANSPORTED TO BCCF ON 18 DEC 04. HE WAS HOUSED IN THE HARD SITE, TIER 1, WHERE HE WAS INTERROGATED BY A TALL, THIN, WHITE MALE, WITH BLACK HAIR AND WEARING CIVILIAN CLOTHES. HE RELATED THE TALL MAN ORDERED FIVE US SOLDIERS, THREE BLACK MALES AND TWO WHITE MALES, TO BEAT HIM AND THROW HIM TO THE GROUND WHILE HANDCUFFED. HE STATED HIS HEAD WAS SHAVED AND HE WAS GIVEN SEVERAL COLD SHOWERS AT THE TALL MAN'S INSTRUCTION, AND THEN LEFT IN HIS CELL WITH NO DRY CLOTHES OR BLANKETS.
