(U) On 27 May 04, this investigation was initiated based on notification from the
Prisoner Interview/Interrogation Team (PIT), Criminal Investigation Division (CID),
Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, Iraq (IZ), that Ms.

(b)(7)(C)-1, (b)(6)-1 [REDACTED] related she was abused while detained at an unknown location, believed to be
the Baghdad International Airport, Baghdad, IZ (BIAP).

(U) The conduct of this investigation could not determine if the offenses of Aggravated
Assault, and Cruelty and Maltreatment occurred. Interviews with interrogators at the
BCCF failed to produce any credible information which supported [REDACTED] claims of
abuse. Further, review of [REDACTED] medical records noted no injuries consistent with
her allegations. (b)(7)(C)-1, (b)(6)-1

(U) On 4 Mar 05, this office received information from the Operations Officer, 11TH
Military Police Battalion (CID)(FWD), Camp Victory, IZ, reporting receipt of Request
for Correction (RFC)(0132-05-CID001) from the United States Army Criminal
Investigation Command (USACIDC), which revealed the necessity for additional
administrative and investigative activities.

(U) On 8 Apr 05, this case file was forwarded to Headquarters, USACIDC, for review by
the Detainee Abuse Task Force (DATF). The case file was returned and the DATF noted
the closure of this investigation as insufficient evidence was appropriate and
recommended no further action.

INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

On 27 May 04, this investigation was initiated based on notification from the Prisoner Interview/Interrogation Team (PIT), Criminal Investigation Division (CID), Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, Iraq (IZ), that Ms. [REDACTED] related she was abused while detained at an unknown location, believed to be the Baghdad International Airport, Baghdad, IZ (BIAP).

Investigation established insufficient evidence to prove or disprove the offenses of Aggravated Assault and Cruelty and Maltreatment occurred as alleged by Ms. [REDACTED]. Ms. [REDACTED] was detained on 13 Jan 04, and transported to Kurkuk, IZ, where she stated no abuse occurred. She was later taken to an unknown detention facility on BIAP for an undetermined amount of time, where she alleged she was beaten, humiliated, and threatened continuously by an unknown black female. Ms. [REDACTED] related her nephew (NFI) was beaten by an unknown white male, while she was beaten by the female. Ms. [REDACTED] alleged she was also beaten with a plastic chair until it broke, leaving a shattered piece of the chair in her foot, which she was initially not allowed to remove. Ms. [REDACTED] related shortly after the incidents of abuse, she was moved to BCCF for detention.

Interviews of BCCF screening personnel, review of medical records, and interviews of BCCF interrogators indicated Ms. [REDACTED] was received with no signs of injury or abuse and upon her initial internment she made no mention of abuse prior to her arrival at BCCF. Through the review of BCCF records, the nephew of Ms. [REDACTED] was identified as Mr. [REDACTED], who was released on 14 Jun 04, thus not interviewed. Therefore, the information concerning the alleged abuse could not be verified and he was not identified as a victim. This Investigation did not diminish the integrity or credibility of Mr. [REDACTED]'s allegation.

About 0900, 27 May 04, this office received, via e-mail, the AIR of SA [REDACTED] (b)(6)-1, (b)(7)(C)-1 this office, which detailed the interview of Ms. [REDACTED] (b)(7)(C)-4, (b)(6)-4

Agent's Comment: SA [REDACTED] (b)(6)-1, (b)(7)(C)-1 was assigned to the 78th Military Police Detachment, Camp Victory, IZ, but was assisting the PIT with allegations of detainee abuse. The following entry by SA [REDACTED] (b)(7)(C)-1, (b)(6)-1 s was posted to this AIR.

About 1000, 25 May 04, SA [REDACTED] (b)(7)(C)-1, (b)(6)-1 and Interpreter [REDACTED] (b)(7)(C)-8, (b)(6)-8 Abu Ghraib CID, interviewed Ms. [REDACTED] (b)(7)(C)-4, (b)(6)-4 who was stated she was captured on 13 Jan 04. Her house was searched; however, nothing was found. She was taken to Kurkurk, where no abuse happened; however, she was later taken to a detention facility on BIAP, where a doctor checked her out. While at BIAP she was forced to stand against a wall for long periods of time, she subsequently fainted because she had not had any food for two or three days. She was later interrogated and she was accused of lying and was placed in a dark room with loud noises from a stereo being played (the noises sounded like people screaming and crying). An unknown, black female guard, believed to be a U.S. Soldier, entered the room and threw her around from one wall to the other until she fainted. The female stripped her down to her bra and underwear and brought her out so the men (NFI) would laugh at her. The male interrogator told her he was the devil and he and the black female made her crawl around on her hands and knees for hours. The female would hit her with a long stick when ever she would slow down while crawling. The male guards would all laugh at her and the female would pour cold water on her as she crawled. The guards brought in her nephew (NFI) and took off all of his clothes and made her and her nephew look at each other. The female guard exposed the detainee's breast and forced her nephew to look at her. The female continued to beat her while a male beat her nephew. They were again ordered to crawl on the floor and the female pulled her hair, to the point it took her breath away and slammed her head against a wall. If she tried to sleep the female would pour water in her ears to wake her up. The female beat her with a plastic chair until the chair broke. The detainee stated she had a plastic sliver in her foot, that she was not allowed to take out, which subsequently caused an infection in her foot. She was beaten against a wall until she passed out and again water was poured in her ear to wake her up and the female threw her leg numerous times against a wall. Later the interrogator brought in a meat grinder and told her they were going to grind her up in the meat grinder if she didn't talk. A machine (believed to be a vacuum cleaner) was brought into her room and she was told to clean up the room. The detainee stated she did not know how to use it and she was subsequently beaten with the vacuum cleaner

hose on her face and nose. She was placed back in a small room with no lights and was given her clothes back after the clothes were soaked in water. At night, when she tried to sleep, they would come in and wake her up and not allow her to fall asleep and she was forced to stand. She was not allowed to use the bathroom and if she asked the female would beat her. The detainee stated there was a nice guard who allowed her to see a doctor who looked at her foot and gave her slippers to wear. She stated she saw the doctor at 0400 in the morning and the doctor pulled out the sliver. The doctor checked up on her two days later and changed the dressings on her foot. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she was in the cell for five days until she was transferred to a better place. She was taken to Abu Ghraib prison where she received medical treatment for her injuries and given medication and she stated she had been treated very well at Abu Ghraib prison. Ms. [REDACTED] stated she believed she was going to be released soon and did not want this investigation to slow that process. Detainee provided a written statement. On Jan. 13 2004, at 1:30 AM, My house, located in Karkook, was raided by an American detachment, and the doors were broken down by force. I was in the house with my daughter [REDACTED] and her girl friend [REDACTED] and my nephew who was visiting from Baghdad, because my husband is dead and my son is in College. We were taken to the backyard, and the house furniture was destroyed. They came outside to the backyard and they demanded where were the amounts of money that I used to send to the resistance, but they did not find any money. We were all taken to the Military base in Kirkuk, and we stayed there until January 14th, and we were transferred in the afternoon to Baghdad airport by plane, and we arrived there at night. We were seen by a doctor, and a form was filled out for us. Me, my daughter and her girlfriend were put in a room, and my nephew was put in another. On the morning of Jan. 15th, I was taken to the interrogation room, and there were two individuals in the room, and they told me that they were going to start the interrogation, and I told them that I am tired because I did not eat anything since Tuesday. I felt dizziness, and I needed water, which I was giving and I sat down on the chair, and they told me that I transferred certain amount of money from [REDACTED] to [REDACTED] and I told them that [REDACTED] was transferred to Baghdad four or five years ago, and my Party rank when I was in Kirkuk was low and wouldn't allow me to contact him, and he replaced [REDACTED] when he came back from the war, as a head of Kirkuk party's office, and I did not have any relations with him and [REDACTED] when he was in Kirkuk, and we were in different branches in the party, and he was transferred too to Baghdad four years ago as an office member, and all the people in charge left the Province at the day of regime's fall, April 10th 2004, and no body was there, and I stayed home because I was afraid of the Kurdish, because they were killing every Baathy, and take his home. I had no husband to protect me, and He told me that I was lying, and he ordered the guards to take me to the torture room, which was dark with white dots, and there was Saddam's picture with his eyes pierced. In the morning shift, a black female guard took me into the torture room and took off my clothe except my slip, and they hooded me and bouncing my head from wall to wall, and the torture continued for hours until I was extremely exhausted from the severe beating. I was taken to the interrogation room where the interrogator said to me: you did not confess, I told him that I have nothing and I did not do anything against Coalition forces, and if my father did something wrong, I would report him because the torture was too severe. He told the female guard to take me back again to the torture room. The torture started with different way, creeping on the knees, pouring cold water on my body and hitting my back with black whip, and my hands were severely tied, then I fainted and water was poured in my ears. The torturing continued for hours, and I was taken to the interrogation room, and they said to me: you did not confess yet, and I said that I have nothing to say, and they said: take her to the room; you will see what you have never seen before. I found my nephew completely naked and they said to him look at your aunt's breasts, and said to me: look how your nephew is torturing in front of you, and they restarted the torture again and she severely dragged my hair and started hitting my head against the wall, and there was another black tall guy who was torturing [REDACTED] severely, and my head swelled as a result of hitting against the wall and I fainted again, and they poured the water in my ears. My head was hitting three times and I had three swellings in my head. An Iraqi translator came to the room and said to me: you have to confess, and I told him that I have nothing to confess. The female guard and the male guard hit us with two chairs until it were broken, and a small fragment from the chair pierced my foot, and I asked her to pick it out of my foot, but she refused. They set up (frightful music) and they turned on very high light in the room, and we could not open our eyes. They continued pouring cold water on our bodies, and they used four cartoons for that purpose. Then they brought a machine, which I did not identify, and the interrogator came and said (we shall chop up your flesh in that machine), and the torture with water started again, and I realized that the machine was a cleaning machine.

She said to me: clean the room, and I told her that I don't know how to use the machine, then she hit me severely and put my head in the machine, and I thought that she would cut my neck. [REDACTED] collected all the empty plates in a bag; and we cleaned the room, and we left the room. I said to the interrogator (I swore by the Koran and the bible that I did not do any thing, but he said: I am a devil and I don't believe in that). I was put in a small dark room and she gave me a dishdasha and she took my lighter, and I slept on the wood without a cover, and my clothes were wet but I did not feel because of the severe pain. At night the guard came and said to me: stand up against the wall and never sit down again, and I stood all the night, and when I needed to sleep, he gave me five minutes, then they waked me up again. I asked about that, they said to me that it is a punishment for me, and I stayed five days in the same condition. When I used to call for going to the bathroom, I stayed calling for an hour, and when she came she hooded me and dragged me like the animals. After five days I was taken to another room better than the former room, and there was a Yemenian woman who had 450 blood sugar, and a doctor came to treat her, so I asked him to help me because she hit me in my knee in the torture room and my knee was swelling. The doctor ordered a high bed to sleep on, and he gave me tablets for the pains I had, and my hands were blue as a result of the tough tie, I took two tablets at morning, noon, and night. Then we went to Kirkuk for a mission, and when we came back I found my knee swelling from the fragment of the broken chair. The guard, who I think was Mexican, was nice and he said that the doctor would come to see me. The doctor came and said that he might do a minor surgery to pick that fragment, and I think it was Monday morning when a translator, whose name is [REDACTED] came and took me to the doctor's room, and I asked about the time and it was 4:00 AM, and the doctor said to me: be patient a little bit and he injected me in my foot and the nylon fragment was picked off and placed on the table. After two days, the doctor came and bandaged my wound. Then I was transferred to Abu Ghrayb, where they do not take the prisoners to the bathrooms and they torture them, and at night they set frightful music for the prisoners and they slam the doors and they set a recording of a man who is severely torturing and noisy music which make the person get crazy.

When I came to Abu Ghrayb, I was checked by a doctor in front of the female guard, and I had a medical treatment, then I was put in the hard side, and the interrogation started, and I was too exhausted, and when I went the interrogator [REDACTED], I explained to her my medical condition, the left side of my head, my neck and my hands and leg were in very bad condition and my nose was hit. I was checked carefully by the tall senior doctor at the floor in front of the female guard, and he said thanks to god the hit did not reach the brain but you seem as a woman have been run over by a car. He gave me two tablets (two swallow at morning and evening and one at night), and the treatment still used so far, and thanked, she gave me pants and blouse, and I do not have clothes for the winter and I have a weak body, and I do not have socks because I don't posses any clothes for the cold winter.

In Jan or Feb I saw Ms. (b)(7)(C)-6, (b)(6)-6, Detainee # (b)(7)(C)-6, (b)(6)-6 and that would have been just after her arrival to Abu prison. I spoke with her and at no time did she ever tell me of any kind of physical abuse she encountered. I didn't see any physical marks on her. A doctor sees every detainee and I didn't hear anything about her being abused. I reviewed her statement and she stated she was hit on the head several times, she also mentioned that her leg was beaten and she had an infected foot from the sliver of the chair. At no time did I see any bruising or anything like what she stated. I am not saying this could not have occurred, I just didn't see anything on her nor did she ever tell me any (b)(7)(C)-6, (b)(6)-6 this. I see her every Friday after her arrival and she never told me.

I remember the incident because it was an important target and it was an older Iraqi female. It was about 0200, 14 Jan 04, and we responded to the target house with a platoon element which was really about 2 squads. One squad was external security and one was the assault squad. The Platoon Sergeant was SFC (b)(7)(C)-4, (b)(6)-4 and he had no specific job but to supervise and really did not get involved too much. I was in charge of the assault element and we went in and received no resistance what so ever. We entered the outer gate and entered easily and eventually kicked the door in and there was a lady who was the target and two daughters and her son. We then did not do anything aggressively as there was no resistance what so ever. We even grabbed a chair and placed it in the courtyard and let her sit down. The house was then searched and we retrieved a photos of the target with Saddam HUSSEIN and other high persons such as Chemical ALI. We also obtained an AK-47 and other assorted papers and pamphlets. We then sandbagged all four people and flexicuffed them and transported them to the Interrogation Center on Kirkuk Airfield, Iraq and arrived about 0400, 14 Jan 04. There was no aggressive actions taken by any of my soldiers in any way while in custody or enroute to Kirkuk. Especially due to the fact that there were no aggressive acts by the target. We then turned the four persons over to the Military Intelligence element at Kirkuk and the only people that we left behind were myself and my squad. Our only mission at that point was to provide the security for the MI detachment and to ensure that they did not escape. Our only mission there was to escort them from the interview rooms to their cells or to the bathroom and back. We also provided them with MRE's and water but that was it. At no time did me or my squad observe the MI personnel mistreat the prisoners in any way. The interview rooms were not sound proof and we would have been able to hear everything. The prisoners were only at this interrogation center for about one day and then JTF-7 then sent two Blackhawks to the flightline to pick up the targets. My squad also flew with them all to Baghdad International Airport, Iraq. The Blackhawks were from Tikrit North. We all then flew to the Airport and we turned the prisoners over to military looking individuals dressed in civilian clothes. We then had no further contact with the prisoners. During the entire time that I was present with the target I did not witness the prisoner being mistreated in any way. (b)(7)(C)-4, (b)(6)-4

Q: Do you remember seeing a black female at the interrogation center in Kirkuk?

A: I did not see a black female at the interrogation center.

Q: Was the Target injured at all during the detention specifically her foot?

I opened the outer gate and we eventually kicked the door in and detained the target and her two daughters and her son. We did not do anything aggressively as there was no resistance at all. I then utilized a digital camera to take pictures of the four detainees to document their appearance in case anything surfaced later. I did this to protect the unit and to show that the prisoners were not harmed by my Platoon in any way. I can provide these pictures to you. Our soldiers grabbed a chair and placed it in the courtyard and allowed the target to sit down as she was older. We then searched the house and we retrieved a photos of the target with important Iraqi's. We also obtained an AK-47 and other assorted papers and pamphlets. We then sandbagged all four people and flex cuffed them and transported them to the Interrogation Center on Kirkuk Airfield, Iraq in HUMVEES. We arrived at Kirkuk at about 0400, 14 Jan 04. My soldiers never behaved in a negative way and the prisoners were never mistreated while in custody or enroute to Kirkuk Airfield. Especially due to the fact that there were no aggressive acts by the target. We then turned the four persons over to the Military Intelligence element at Kirkuk Airfield and the only people that we left behind were SSG (b)(7)(C)-4 and his squad. Our only mission at that point was to provide the squad for security for the MI detachment and to ensure that they did not escape. I returned the following day to check on my soldiers at the Kirkuk Airfield but I did not observe anything that could be considered misconduct. I do know that the prisoners were then transported by Blackhawks to Baghdad. I had no further contact with the prisoners. During the entire time that I was present with the target I did not witness the prisoner being mistreated in any way. (b)(7)(C)-4, (b)(6)-4

Q: Can you describe any of the persons at the detention center in Kirkuk?

A: I only remember Chief (b)(7)(C)-4, (b)(6)-4 Military Intelligence, 10th Mountain who was short and older and that is it.

Q: Did the detainees cooperate the entire time? (b)(7)(C)-4, (b)(6)-4

A: Yes.

Q: What else was taken from the detainees

A: Only what was mentioned?

Q: Do you have anything else you wish to add to this statement?
