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Basis of Investigation: On 17 Aug 04, the 504th Military Intelligence (MI) Brigade (BDE), Joint Interrogation and Debriefing Center (JIDC), Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, Iraq (AGI), reported that Detainee ISN and Detainee ISN C alleged they were detained and abused by Coalition Forces bey, 1704 ISN CO

(CF), prior to their arrival at BCCF, AGI.

6631,6163 About 1020, 20 Aug 04, SA , with the assistance of Linguist interviewed Detainée who stated he was captured by Coalition Forces on 23 Jun 04 on Ibrahim al Ali road in Baghdad, Iraq. He and four other detainees were stopped in a line of vehicles waiting at a checkpoint. There were three AK-47 rifles in the vehicle and the occupants feared being detained because of the weapons. They attempted to turn the vehicle around in the street. There was a shot fired and they stopped the vehicle. The occupants were removed from the vehicle, bound with plastic restraints and laid on the side of the road. An Iragi and two Iragi women arrived and the Iraqi man began punching the restrained men telling them "You killed her." When the Iraqi man finished hitting the restrained men, an American soldier dressed in the DCU uniform. took each man separately to a farm building located approximately 10 meters from the road. When was taken to the farm, he was taken into a room where four American soldiers and one translator of unknown nationality were waiting. After he was placed in the room, the five men began hitting him and telling him, "You are the killer." did not know who woman was that they were talking about and they did not tell him. He was beaten for about 30 did not know who the minutes and was returned to the roadside. He could not provide any additional details pertaining to the descriptions of the room and the occupants. About 10 minutes later, he was blindfolded and placed into the back of a HMMWV and was transported to an unknown location. He could not provide any details as to the direction or distance to this unknown location. He was given food, water and was allowed to sleep. He and four other detainees were stopped in a line of vehicles waiting at a checkpoint. There were three AK-47 rifles in the vehicle and the occupants feared being detained because of the weapons. They attempted to turn the vehicle around in the street. There was a shot fired and they stopped the vehicle. The occupants were removed from the vehicle, bound with plastic restraints and laid on the side of the road. A vehicle drove up and an Iragi man and two Iragi women got out, there was a boy (about 13-14 years old) in the car. The man beat each of the five restrained men in succession and asked, "Where did you take the woman?" One of the women said to him, "They are not the men, they are five and there was only four. And their car has plates the other car did not have plates." The man told her, "This is not your business, go back to the car." This man and an American soldier in uniform took the first man to a farm located about 15 meters away from the road. He could hear each man screaming from the farm, and when he was returned. the next man was taken to the farm. He heard the screaming and he too was returned. The same happened to the third man, but when he returned, all five men were blindfolded and placed in HMMWV's and taken to an unknown location. He could not provide any details as to the direction or distance to this unknown location. They were given orange/red jumpsuits and placed in separate cells. The following day they were all gathered into a single cell, blindfolded and transported to a second unknown location. He could not provide any details as to the direction or distance to this unknown location. Upon arrival, he was interrogated by an American soldier in DCU's with the American flag. He described the man as tall thin, white male, clean-shaven, with light colored hair and did not wear glasses. The man told him a woman had been kidnapped and asked where she was. He told the man he did not know anything about the situation. The man became angry and he was sent to a room and he could hear the other detainees were also in the room. He said he was beaten by a group of people of unknown size and nationality and he could hear the others being beaten as well. He said he returned to the room with the interrogator and was asked again about the missing woman. He told the man he did not know anything and he was returned to the other room and beaten again until sunset. He could not provide any additional details pertaining to the descriptions of either room. He was then bound and blindfolded and taken to a third unknown location and was placed in a single cell. He could not provide any details as to the direction or distance to this unknown location. He stayed there for seven to nine days and was interrogated three separate times on three separate days but was not beaten. He was then transported to AGI. After he finished hitting the men, two American soldiers took one of the men to a nearby farm building. The two soldiers returned with the man and took another away. When it was his turn, he was taken into a room where there were two American soldiers and a translator waiting for him. He was beaten by the three men for about 10-15 minutes and questioned about the location and disposition of an unknown woman. He described Americans as a tall black male with a large build and a tall white male who was smaller in build than the first. Each soldier was wearing the DCU uniform. The translator was an Iraqi man wearing civilian clothes and had a "pure" Iraqi accent. He could not provide any details pertaining to the description of the room. When he was returned to the road, he remained there for approximately 10 minutes. He was given water by an American soldier and was then blindfolded and placed in the back of a HMMWV. He was transported to an unknown location. He was given an orange/red jumpsuit. He could not provide any details as to the direction or distance to this unknown location. He was given food and water and allowed to sleep. The following day he was blindfolded and transported to a second unknown location. He could not provide any details as to the direction or distance to this unknown location. He was taken into a room where he could hear the other detainees, and then into another separate room. He was questioned and beaten by a man he could not describe. The man asked him about the location of the missing woman. At one point the interpreter told him. "Raise your head, you are an Iraqi." He replied to him with "I do not have the honor to be an Iraqi now." He could not describe the men because he was blindfolded during the interrogation and there was nothing distinct about their voices. He could not provide any details pertaining to the descriptions of either room. He was returned to the room with the other detainees and transported to a third unknown location. He could not provide any details as to the direction or distance to this unknown location. He remained there for nine or ten days and was interrogated twice during that time. He was then transported to AGI. He was seen by a doctor and received medication for ear pain, but did not receive any injuries as a result of the beatings.

This soldier start hitting me with his AK on my head and my side just like a baseball. And the other Iragi start kicking me. Later, the American soldiers took us to an interrogation room that was in a house near by. And I was hearing guys screaming from beating them so hard, and when it was my turn the time was up for the checking point. Then they put me in the hummer just like throwing anything else. They took us to one of the American military locations. One of the soldiers picked me up and dropped me on the ground so I fall over my head. He covered my eyes so I won't see anything then started walking me and hitting my head in the hummer or a wall. He took me to a tent in a backyard and the handcuffs were so tied to a point I couldn't move my hand cuz there was no blood in them. There was American soldiers talking and I asked them if I can get some water and they asked me to shut up. And there was other soldier that gave me water and he helped me drink it because my hand were cuffed, after that they took us to see a doctor for a checkup. Later they took me to an area with bathrooms by myself where I took a shower and had some sleep and that was after they took some information's from me like my name and my last name and living condition

During the month of came out to the power plant on a regular patrol, once he arrived he received orders to take custody of some detainees at "29 Palms" and transport them to FOB Falcon. We went to "29 Palms" and took custody of the detainees, on the way back to FOB Falcon we stopped at the power plant so that my platoon could do the chow run and so that we could change out personnel. While at the power plant CPT conducted interviews of the detainees. We brought the detainees in to the power plant building and utilized to empty rooms to conduct the interviews. In one of the rooms we had the detainees sitting in a circle facing the walls and separated so that they couldn't talk. One by one we would lead them into the other room to be questioned. While they were in the holding room they were blindfolded and then when we brought them into the room for questioning we removed the blind fold. Once we had finished questioning them they were returned to the holding room. The questioning of all of them took a little more than an We then loaded them back up and transported them to FOB Falcon where we turned custody of them over to the Baghdad Central Confinement Facility.

Q: Were any pictures taken of the detainees while at the Aldura Power plant?

A: No.

Q: In your previous statement to CID you stated photographs were taken using your digital camera, why are you now stating no photographs were taken?

A: I think it was because we did turn over pictures of the detainees at FOB Falcon, but in thinking about it we turned over pictures that were already printed and I have no way of printing the pictures from my camera, so I think the photographs I was talking about were the ones we received when we picked the detainees up, taken by the capturing unit and then turned over 028459 at FOB Falcon.

It is very clear that the soldiers and translators were emotionally involved in this situation due to the fact that the detainees were suspected of kidnapping and possibly murdering a female translator from 1-8 CAV. The potential for abuse escalated when members of B CO, 1-8 CAV became involved in transporting and interrogating the detainees. This is aggravated even more because the victim's cousin also worked as an interpreter for B CO, 1-8 CAV, although he was not present during the interrogations because he was out searching for his missing cousin.





The B Company Commander and First Sergeant were in charge of the detail that picked up the detainees at the 2BCT BIF or "29 Palms". They were already at Camp Victory to participate in a Court Martial for one of their soldiers, and were escorting the BDE JAG as well. Our TOC gave them the VOCO FRAGO to pick up the detainees from the 2BCT BIF and escort them to the 5BCT BIF. The patrol took custody of the detainees, and transported them to the Dora Power Plant. The Dora Power Plant has a permanent security requirement of 1 Platoon. The Platoon had not received their LOGPACK, and the only transport available for the mission was this same convoy. The detainees were escorted to a room in the facility, given water and food, and were under NCO supervision the entire time. The LOGPACK took no more than 1 hour, and since the detainees were suspects in the murder of one of their interpreters, they used the line of questioning to collect the basic information that was also included in sworn statements for processing into the 5BCT BIF. There was constant, uninterrupted NCO supervision of the tactical questioning, and although the detainees were handled firmly as they were segregated for questioning, there was never a breach of unnecessary force. At no time did any member of B/1-8 use inappropriate force on the individuals. When the LOGPACK returned, the B Company Commander expedited their movement and processing into the 5BCT BIF.
