(1) Date of Occurrence: 28 Aug 02. Reported by MI SSG, 519<sup>th</sup> MI Bn on 25 Sep 02.

Unit: ODA 343, 2/3d SF Grp

Synopsis: Investigation revealed soldiers detained an Afghanistan citizen (██████████) and then shot him when he allegedly lunged toward a weapon near **Lwara, Afghanistan**. The five soldiers were listed as subjects for the offenses of Conspiracy, Murder, Dereliction of Duty and Obstruction of Justice.

Status: **Case is closed.** One of the subjects received a General Officer Letter of Reprimand and no action was taken on the remaining subjects. (0114-02-CID369)(Crosswalk #5, AF chart)

(2) Date of Occurrence: 28 Feb 04. Reported by 4<sup>th</sup> ID on 28 Feb 04.

Unit: HHC, 1/27th Inf Bn, 25th ID

Synopsis: A SGT attempted to detain an Iraqi near **Taal Al Jal, Kirkuk**, and the Iraqi resisted when the SGT attempted to place flexi-cuffs on him. A PFC raised his weapon to protect the SGT. The SGT was able to complete the cuffing process and was leading the detainee away when the PFC claimed the Iraqi was lunging at the SGT. The PFC fired one round from his weapon which struck the detainee (██████████) in the head and killed him. Further investigation revealed the PFC admitted to lying about the detainee lunging towards the SGT prior to the shooting. The PFC has been titled Murder and False Official Statement.

Further, the Soldiers are alleged to have conspired to cover up the incident. Investigation identified ten soldiers as involved in the conspiracy and death. Five of the nine soldiers received non-judicial punishment and four remaining soldiers are pending court-martial at Ft Carson, CO. The soldiers were listed as subjects of Involuntary Manslaughter, Aggravated Assault, Obstruction of Justice, and False Official Statement.

**JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDE (1):**

(1) Date of Occurrence: 17 May 04. Reported by media and provided to CID on 18 Jun 04.

Unit: 5<sup>th</sup> SF Gp

Synopsis: A newspaper article reported an Iraqi citizen was shot and killed by American forces at a **residence in Baghdad, IZ**. Investigation revealed after an Iraqi citizen was detained, and he subsequently engaged in a struggle with a soldier, attempting to gain control of the soldier's rifle. During the struggle, the soldier, using his pistol, shot and killed the Iraqi. A subsequent unit 15-6 investigation determined the shooting was justifiable and within the rules of engagement. As CID was never notified initially of the incident, an autopsy was not conducted.

(1) Date of Occurrence: 21 May 04. Reported by 1st AD on 25 May 04 and CID case initiated on 4 Jun 04.

Unit: A Co, 2/37th Armor Bn, 1st AD

Synopsis: After Soldiers of a 1st AD unit lawfully and successfully engaged a civilian sedan in An-Najaf, two wounded Iraqis were captured. One of the detainee's injuries were determined to be terminal by the military medic. When the medic departed to treat the other wounded detainee, a CPT lowered his weapon and fired what appeared to be two shots into the back of the detainee's head, killing him. The detainee's body was not collected by US Forces.

Status: **Investigation continues.** Video examination results from lab. Images could not be magnified with enough clarity for positive identification purposes. Efforts on-going to locate and identify second person (Iraqi) in vehicle. (0144-04-CID259)

(2) Date of Occurrence: 1-24 Dec 03. Reported by medical doctor to CID on 29 Jun 04.

Unit: Unknown.

Synopsis: An Army medical doctor, while deployed with the 21<sup>st</sup> CSH, Balad, IZ, reported an unknown, unidentified white male American, believed to be a US Forces soldier, brought in an injured (bruise on forehead), unconscious, unknown/unidentified detainee for evaluation. According the person who delivered the detainee to the hospital, the detainee had fallen unconscious during an interrogation session. A subsequent CT scan revealed a dated blunt force trauma injury to the detainee's head as well as a subdural hemorrhage. The detainee subsequently died of his injuries at the 21st CSH.

Status: **Investigation continues** to identify the detainee, recover any available records, identify the person who delivered the detainee,

identify the unit responsible for the detainee's capture, and identify the unit conducting the interrogation (if different). (0537-04-CID034)

(3) Date of Occurrence: Unknown. Reported by a Soldier and CID case initiated on 12 Aug 04.

Unit: 5025th Garrison Support Unit

Synopsis: A Soldier reported he overheard a conversation between two other Soldiers during which one of the Soldiers talked about being involved in an ambush between his convoy and Iraqis while at an **unknown location in Iraq**. According to the conversation, the Soldier stated an Iraqi surrendered after the attack, but he shot and killed him because of his anger at the ambush. A subsequent interview of the Soldier who was told of the incident disclosed the subject who shot the Iraqi stated the Iraqi was coming towards him with a weapon pointed at him, and he had no other option but to shoot the Iraqi.

Status: **Investigation continues** to determine the validity of the allegation and interview Soldiers assigned to convoy during the ambush. (0326-04-CID056)

Synopsis: Five soldiers assigned with 1/36<sup>th</sup> Inf Rgmt, robbed, physically assaulted, and unlawfully discharged a firearm against several detainees in their custody.

(3) Date of Occurrence: 20 Jun 03. Reported by CJTF-7 on 24 Jun 03.

Unit: A Co, 1/13th Armor Bn, 82 Abn Div

Synopsis: A 1LT detained several individuals suspected of looting and placed them in the back of a truck. He later took one detainee, a young boy, from the truck, pointed his pistol at the boy's head, and fired a round away from the boy in an effort to scare him.

He then removed the muzzle, charged the weapon, and fired the weapon into the ground near that detainee.

Status: **Investigation closed** and report of disciplinary action pending (0006-04-CID259).

(6) Date of Occurrence: 7 May 04. Reported by 1<sup>st</sup> Cav Div on 9 May 04.

Unit: A Co, 2/5th Cav, 1st CD

Synopsis: **Between Camp Eagle and Cuervo, IZ,** a SGT with A Co., 2/5<sup>th</sup> Cav, acting as a detainee guard, apparently assaulted two detainees by pulling their hair and hitting them his fists and knees, resulting in one detainee suffering from a broken collar bone and the other with various bruises and contusions. Unit: Unknown, 1st Cav Div

Synopsis: On 18 May 04 it was reported a detainee alleged he was physically assaulted and burned with a cigarette while at the **Al-Azimiyyah Palace**, Baghdad, IZ. Further investigation disclosed no burn marks on the detainee or other physical trauma to support his allegation. Interviews of interpreters also failed to corroborate the detainee's allegation. Subsequent interviews identified 8 additional detainees who allege they were physically and indecently assaulted and sodomized by coalition forces while they were detained. Further investigation and interviews revealed the alleged detainees provided false information regarding their alleged abuse. All offenses of detainee abuse were unfounded.

Status: **Investigation closed.** (0106-04-CID259)

(8) Date of Occurrence: 29 Dec – 2 Jan 04. Reported by 504<sup>th</sup> MI Bde on 9 May 04.

Unit: Polish Forces & Unknown US SF.

Synopsis: On 16 May 04, it was reported that two detainees alleged they were physically assaulted by American-speaking Coalition Forces (now suspected to be OGA and/or SF) who detained them over a three day period, prior to their arrival at **Baghdad Confinement and Correctional Facility**. CJTF-7 records reflected they were initially captured by Polish forces, and it is now believed the detainees were released to American forces.

Status: Investigation continues to locate and obtain interrogation records and interview of any interrogators assigned to the BCCF during the time frame of the alleged incidents. (0029-04-CID789)

Synopsis: A soldier related she received an email from another unidentified soldier who implied several Iraqi detainees were physically assaulted by unit members. An interview of the soldier who sent the email and members of her unit were conducted. At the time of the report, there was not sufficient credible information available to believe anyone committed an offense or that an offense actually occurred. The detainee was interviewed and alleged he was captured, placed in a vehicle and was punched in the head and stomach by unknown white males. The detainee alleged he was captured at his father's residence near **Tal Afar, Iraq**.

Status: **Investigation continues**. (0068-04-CID389)

(10) Date of Occurrence: 14 – 18 May 04. Reported by CJTF-76 on 28 May 04.

Unit: ODA 311, Army SF

Synopsis: Preliminary investigation revealed members of the US Special Forces (ODA 311) physically assaulted several Afghanistan citizens who were allegedly affiliated with the Taliban, while in the villages of **Gurjay and Surkhagen, AF**. A member of the 320<sup>th</sup> PSYOPS was interviewed and confirmed the assaults occurred.

Status: **Investigation continues** to identify the possible victims and suspects/subjects involved. (0064-04-CID369)

(11) Date of Occurrence: 1 – 30 Apr 03. Reported by Soldier on 2 Jun 04.

Unit: B Co, 2/325th PIR, 82d Abn Div

Synopsis: After soldiers detained five Iraqi guards, one of the guards became angry and spit on one of the American soldiers. The

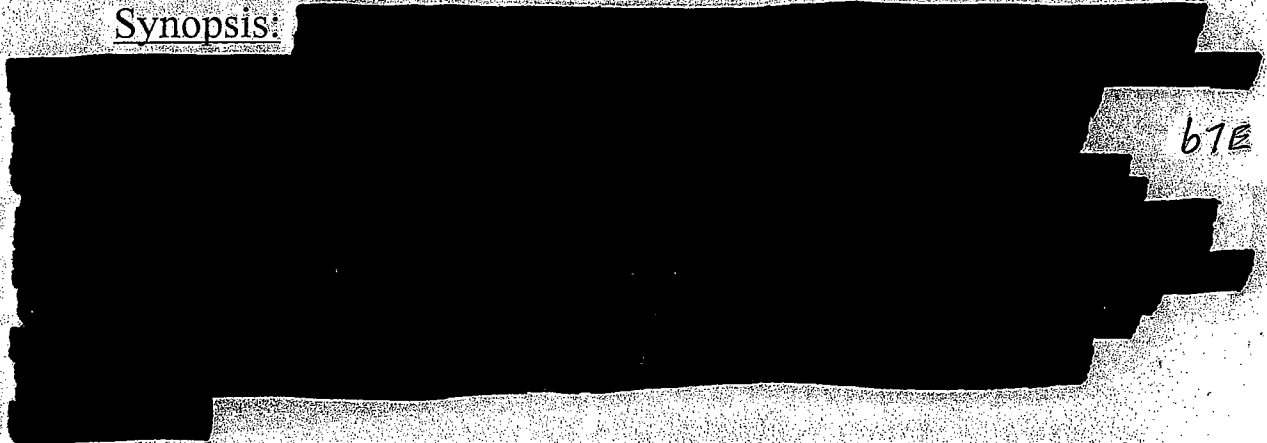

Synopsis: Two detainees alleged they were physically abused by **unknown Coalition Forces at an unknown location**. Two subsequent medical examinations (one which was conducted in the presence of CID) did not reveal any current or previous signs of trauma or abuse. Further investigation did not substantiate the allegations, and the offenses were unfounded with local SJA concurrence.

Status: **Investigation closed.** (0152-04-CID899)

(15) Date of Occurrence: 8-22 Mar 04. Reported by the detainee on 22 Jun 04.

Unit: Unknown

Synopsis: A detainee alleged he was captured by American Forces in civilian clothes and transported to **an unknown location at the Mosul airport**, where he was physically assaulted. Investigation revealed the detainee had pre-existing injuries prior to his capture and would inflict injuries upon himself while detained. Medical personnel present during detainee's interrogations did not observe any abuse by Coalition Forces.

Status: **Investigation closed.** (0180-04-CID259)

(16) Date of Occurrence: 12 Jun 04. Reported by the detainee during his initial medical screening at BCCF

Unit: Unknown

Synopsis: During a medical screening prior to in-processing at the BCCF, a detainee alleged he was physically assaulted aboard a **helicopter near Baghdad, IZ** by unknown forces. Upon CID receipt of the allegation, the detainee was interviewed and refused to cooperate or provide any information regarding the alleged assault.

Status: **Investigation closed** as insufficient evidence due to the victim's failure to cooperate. (0181-04-CID259)

(17) Date of Occurrence: 3 Jun 04. Reported by detainee and CID case initiated on 22 Jun 04.

Unit: Unknown

Synopsis: A detainee alleged he was physically assaulted by **unknown US Forces in Altlafia, IZ** after he was captured. A subsequent medical examination of the detainee did not reveal any signs of current or previous trauma consistent with his allegations.

Status: **Investigation continues** to verify the allegation and identify the US Forces responsible for the detainee's capture. (0182-04-CID259)

(18) Date of Occurrence: 11 – 19 Jan 04. Reported by SJA, Bagram, and CID case initiated on 24 Jun 04.

Synopsis: During an office cleanup, a recordable compact disc was discovered containing images of possible detainee abuse. The images depicted detainees bound and masked while US Forces brandished their weapons, pictures of blood stains, and a picture of an apparent dead local national killed by a gunshot wound. It is **unknown at what location the images were exposed at**, but they were dated in Jan 04. Investigation so far has identified the blood as having come from wounded Soldiers who were attacked by local nationals, one of whom was shot and killed during the ensuing firefight. Further investigation revealed the majority of possible suspects are within the AOR of Ft Drum, NY. Subsequently, this investigation was referred for further investigation.

Status: Investigation closed (0078-04-CID369). Follow-on work will be conducted under a new case number by Ft Drum CID. Ft. Drum initiated follow-on case on 13 Jul 04. Nine subjects have been identified with five soldiers admitting to posing for photographs with their assigned weapons pointed at detainee heads. **Investigation continues** for additional interviews of subjects. (0133-04-CID452)

(19) Date of Occurrence: Unknown date. Reported by OSI and CID case initiated on 24 Jun 04

Unit: Unknown location within BCCF, Abu Ghraib.

Synopsis: Air Force medics, while conducting medical examination during their work at **Abu Ghraib** prison, noted what they thought might be detainee abuse. They did not report the alleged abuse until they had returned to their home station in CONUS. They reported the abuse through OSI channels to CID HQ. The allegations involve unknown detainees with lacerations around wrists and ankles and a bruise to a forearm possibly caused by a rifle barrel.

Status: Investigation identified two possible victims.

**Investigation continues** to conduct additional interviews and to locate and review detainee files. (0184-04-CID259)

(20) Date of Occurrence: 24-25 Apr 03. Reported in an article of *Dagbladet*, an Oslo, Norway newspaper and CID case initiated on 14 Jul 04.

Synopsis: According to two employees of the above newspaper, they observed four American soldiers pushing detainees, forcing them to unclothe, writing "sinful thief" on their chests, and then forcing them to walk naked down a public street. The detainees were reportedly captured for looting and pillaging.

Status: **Investigation continues** to locate and identify the detainees and the soldiers involved in the incident. (0173-04-CID259)

Synopsis: A *Playboy* magazine article alleged various types of physical and sexual abuse by soldiers of 1/15<sup>th</sup> Inf, at **unknown locations**, during their deployment to Iraq. Investigation revealed the author of the article failed to verify or validate his information. The

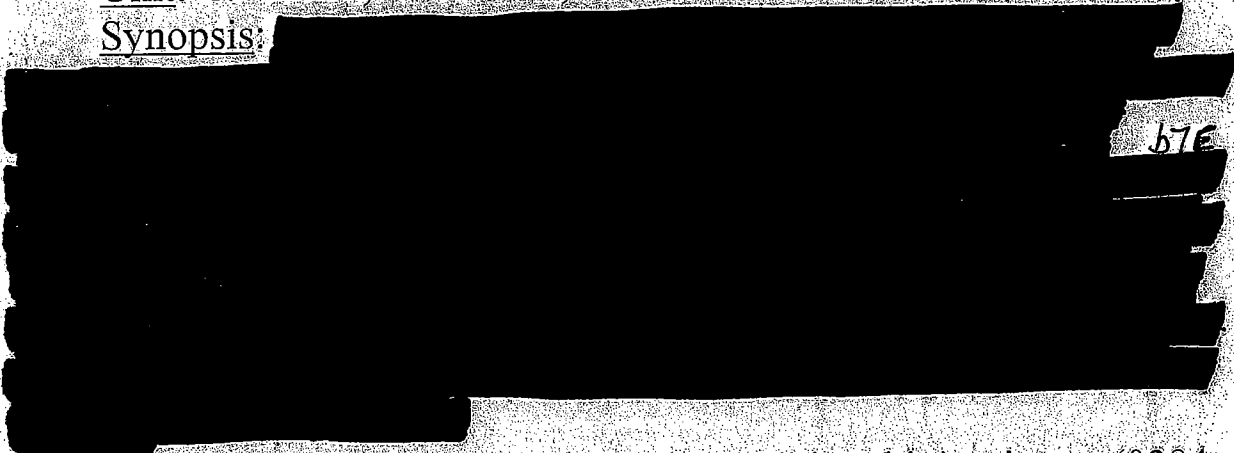
individuals quoted in the article were interviewed, and they said they did not make the statements in the article or their statements were taken out of context and misrepresented. Other members of 1/15<sup>th</sup> Inf were interviewed and stated the article was grossly untrue. Investigation developed insufficient evidence to believe any offenses occurred as alleged. The investigation was terminated.

soldier kicking a detainee. The soldier has been listed as a subject in the investigation.

Status: **Investigation continues** to obtain any additional tapes or copies as evidence, interview and identify unit personnel. (0374-04-CID093)

(24) Date of Occurrence: 2 – 8 Jul 04. Extracted from ICRC reports and initiated by CID on 26 Jul 04.

Unit: Unknown.

Synopsis: According to ICRC report, a detainee alleged he was captured and taken to **an unknown location** by unknown Coalition Forces. During transport, the detainee alleged his hands were restrained and he was forced to lay face down on a hot surface, believed to be the engine of a vehicle. As a result, the detainee suffered extensive burns over his frontal body area (stomach, chest and upper and lower extremities), which required three months of hospitalization at the Iba-Sina Hospital, Baghdad, Iraq.

Status: **Investigation continues** to identify the unit responsible for the detainee's capture. (0176-04-CID259).

(25) Date of Occurrence: Unknown. Extracted from ICRC report and initiated by CID on 27 Jul 04.

Unit: Unknown.

Synopsis: According to the ICRC, a detainee alleged he was captured at **an unknown location** by unknown Coalition Forces. The detainee alleged he was tied, hooded and forced to sit on a hot surface, which he believed was the engine of a vehicle, causing burns to his buttocks. Efforts to identify the detainee have proven unsuccessful as the ICRC declined to provide any identifying data for fear of future reprisal against the detainee.

Status: **Investigation continues** to verify the allegation and interview the alleged victim. (0175-04-CID259)

Synopsis: A detainee alleged he was physically assaulted by unknown US Forces **at an unknown location**. The detainee alleged he had a plastic sandbag cover placed over his head, was put inside a Coalition Forces vehicle and choked.

### SEXUAL ASSAULT (1)

Synopsis: On 16 May 04, it was reported an Iraqi citizen alleged she was apprehended on 11 Aug 03 and detained for 10 days before being released. The female alleged she was sodomized, physically and indecently assaulted, and deprived of food and water, all at a **remote unknown location**. The female alleges her captors were American Coalition Forces, but she was unable to provide any descriptions. Further investigation did not develop sufficient evidence to prove or disprove the incident occurred as alleged. The delay in reporting, lack of witnesses and the medical screenings, which did not disclose any physical injuries, negated any potential value to substantiate the incident.

Status: **Investigation closed as insufficient evidence to either prove or disprove the offenses.** (0094-04-CID259)

Synopsis: At Camp Ganci, Abu Ghraib Prison, coalition guard force personnel shot and killed four Iraqi detainees (**J. Salman, R. Shaalan, M. Sayar, & D. Thawin**) who were aggressively contributing to a prison riot. The detainees did not comply with ordered commands and were threatening to affect a breach of the containment perimeter.

Status: Investigation determined the shootings were justified and **investigation was closed.** (0264-03-CID259) (Crosswalk #26).

(2) Date of Occurrence: 18 Apr 03. Reported by CJTF-7 on 18 Apr 03.

Unit: 314th MP Co (NG), 800th MP Bde

Synopsis: At Camp Bucca, IZ detention facility, a detainee incited a crowd of Iraqi detainees to riot and attempted to kill or hurt the surrounding soldiers by swinging a four-foot tent stake at them. Due to the detainee's actions, the soldiers responded with fire, resulting in the detainee's death (**A. Yasiree**).

Status: Investigation determined the shooting was justified and the **investigation was closed.** (0035-03-CID259)(Crosswalk #28)

During the course of the riot, multiple attempts were made to stop the riot, using less than lethal means. However, during the IRF entry, a SGT, using buckshot, shot a detainee who was endangering one of the IRF members, causing the detainee's death (N. Amir).

**Synopsis:** While manning an observation point, soldiers were fired upon by three Iraqi citizens with small arms fire and RPGs. Two of the Iraqi's were captured (one who sustained significant gunshot wounds) and transported to the **Abu Medical Treatment Facility, Baghdad Confinement Correctional Facility** at Abu Ghraib. On 28 Apr 04, the Iraqi (██████████) who sustained gunshot wounds was pronounced dead at the detention facility, due to complications from his injuries. An autopsy was conducted by OAFME, which determined the detainee's cause of death was gunshot wounds and manner of death as homicide. Investigation determined the shooting was justifiable since it occurred during defensive combat operations. Investigation substantiated the death of the detainee was justified.

Synopsis: An Iraqi detainee (b(6)(4)) died at **Abu Ghraib Prison**. While in the prison, the detainee approached medical personnel and complained of chest pains. The detainee lost consciousness and following CPR, was pronounced dead. **An autopsy\* was conducted** and an examination of the body revealed no signs of trauma. The autopsy listed the manner of death as natural.

Status: On 1 Sep 03, the **investigation was closed** (0139-03-CID259)(Crosswalk #2).

Synopsis: At the Abu Ghraib detention facility, three active duty male enlisted Soldiers assigned to Co A, 519th MI Bn entered the female wing of the prison and took a female detainee to a vacant cell. While one allegedly stood as "look-out" and one held the detainee's hands, the third Soldier allegedly kissed the detainee. The detainee was allegedly threatened to be left with a naked male detainee. Investigation failed to either prove or disprove the indecent assault allegations.

Status: **Investigation closed.** Three soldiers were listed as subjects for the offenses of Indecent Assault, Conspiracy, Maltreatment of a Prisoner and Communicating a Threat. All three Soldiers received Field Grade Article 15s and were returned to Ft Bragg, NC. Two were reduced to PFC and fined \$750 and \$500 respectively, while the third was reduced to SPC and fined \$500. (0216-03-CID259).
