(U) General 30 To provide guidance concerning the handling, 31 a. (U) Purpose. evacuation, transfer, and processing of Enemy Prisoners of War 33 (EPWs), Civilian Internees (CIs), and other Detained Persons (DETs) coming under the control of 1st Force Service Support 34 35 Group (1st FSSG). 36 37 b. (U) Scope. The collection, processing, evacuation, and 38 transfer of EPWs, CIs, and DETs will be per the references, this 39 Appendix, and Annex B (Intelligence). 40 41 c. (U) Policy. 1st FSSG policy towards EPWs/CIs/DETs will be 42 in accordance with the applicable Geneva and Hague Conventions for the Protection of War Victims as set forth in references (a) 43 44 through (d) and amplified in references (e) through (h). In 45 general, this policy and the legal references require that EPWs 46 receive humane treatment to include adequate food, water, 47 medical care, and sufficient shelter, along with proper 48 identification and reporting of their condition. Treatment of 49 detained personnel is also governed by both customary and

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conventional international law. Detained personnel must be treated humanely and protected from acts of violence, intimidation, insults, and public curiosity. All personnel must be treated alike; under the provisions of the Geneva Conventions they will not face adverse distinction or privileged treatment because of health, age, grade, sex, professional qualifications, race, nationality, religious belief, political opinion or other similar criteria.

#### d. (U) Assumptions

(1) (U) That 1st FSSG forces will be required to accept temporary custody of EPW/CI/DET captured or interned by I MEF forces.

(2) (U) That 1st FSSG will turn over EPW/CI/DET to CFLCC and the theater confinement facility.

#### 2. (U) Situation

a. (U) Enemy. See Annex B. Intelligence.

b. (U) Friendly. 1st FSSG will transfer EPWs to the theater confinement facility. 1st FSSG will assist in the evacuation of EPWs to collection points, provide transportation from division collection points and transfer EPWs to the theater confinement facility. Personnel augmentation will be requested from subordinate commands when necessary to assist in transporting EPWs.

### 3. (U) Execution

#### a. (U-S) Concept of Operations

(1) (U) 1st FSSG must administer EPW/CI/DET in conformity with international law and the Geneva Conventions.

(2) (U) EPW operations will be conducted to avoid disruption or degradation of other 1st FSSG operations and will generate the least possible burden on manpower and logistic resources.

(3) (U) 1st FSSG commanders are responsible for EPW/CI/DET coming under their control until they are turned over to another unit or delivered to a site determined by the G-3, 1st FSSG. Commanders will make maximum use of transportation, including logistics back haul, to transport EPWs, CIs, and DETs to theater confinement facility as directed. The Commanding General, 1st FSSG, has the overall responsibility for EPW/CI/DET

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coming under 1st FSSG control until transfer to designated CFLCC forces or delivery to the theater confinement facility.

(4) (U) The FSSG G-3 will arrange for the transfer of EPW/CI/DET to the theater confinement.

 $\,$  (5) (U) Procedures and facilities for the capture, initial care and evacuation will be established for EPW/CI/DET at designated 1st FSSG commands.

## b. (U) Assignment of Tasks

(1) (U) All 1st FSSG Commanders are responsible for:

(a) (U) Establishing hasty collection points within their respective areas of responsibility (AOR). Provide these locations to the FSSG G-3 and G-2.

(b) (U) Developing procedures for early and continuous accountability of all persons captured, detained, or transported by COMUSMARCENT forces, including accounting for their personal property, for the remains of those who die in captivity, and for wounded EPW/CI/DP evacuated through the medical regulating system. This process includes the use of capture cards and maintaining accurate accountability of all EPWs. Specifically, each EPW/CI/DET will be clearly tagged to show the date, time, circumstances, capturing unit, national power, and will be accounted for, by receipt, at each change of custody.

(c) (U) Assisting in the administrative processing of EPW by capturing units and the safe and expeditious evacuation of EPW to designated collection points.

(d) (U) Ensuring training is conducted on the proper handling of EPW in strict compliance with the Geneva Conventions and that treatment of all detainees is in accordance with the law of war (LOW).

(e) (U) Developing appropriate guidance and procedures for the reporting and investigation of violations of the LOW per Appendix 4 to Annex E (Legal).

(f) (U) Providing personnel augmentation to 1st FSSG for staffing EPW transportation requirements.

(2) (U) The 1st FSSG G-2 will develop gross, time-phased estimates of the number of EPW/CI/DET and provide these numbers and updates to the G-3 and Medical Planners.

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1 2	(3) (U) The 1st FSSG G-3, in concert with higher

4 5 6	(a) (U) Develop overall EPW/CI/DET policy and coordinate matters pertaining to specific EPW/CI/DET policies.
7 8 9 10	(b) (U) Plan and coordinate the custody, handling, evacuation and processing of EPW/CI/DET who come under the control of 1st FSSG.

12 13 14	(c) (U) Ascertain EPW information policies and procedures with higher headquarters; to include liaison with the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC).
15 16 17 18	(d) (U) Arrange for and coordinate the transfer of ${\sf EPW/CI/DET}$ to the theater confinement facility at the earliest opportunity.
19 20 21 22	(e) (U) Report the status of EPW/CI/DET to higher headquarters as required.
23 24 25 26 27 28	(4) (U) The SJA in conjunction with the Legal Service Support Section, 1st FSSG, will publish instructions to all personnel, and train them, regarding the treatment of EPW/CI/DET in accordance with service regulations, international law, and the LOW.
29 30	c. (U) Coordinating Instructions.
31 32 33 34 35 36	(1) (U) COMUSMARCENT G-1 and G-4 will coordinate with the ARCENT G-1 and G-4 on the processing and transfer of EPW/CI/DP to COMUSARCENT for internment as expeditiously as possible. 1st FSSG may coordinate with ARCENT G-1/G-4 for movement and transfer of EPW/CI/DP as directed by MARCENT.
37 38 39	(2) (U) COMUSMARCENT may request the use of transportation provided by USARCENT for evacuation of EPW/CI/DP from the COMUSMARCENT holding facility to USARCENT theater camps.
40 41 42 43 44 45 46 47 48	(3) (U) Welfare Organizations. The ICRC is recognized by the US as having a special role in ensuring respect for all the Geneva Conventions by belligerents. Subject to measures essential to ensure security, representatives of the ICRC and other relief societies assisting EPW/CI/DET will be provided the necessary facilities for visiting and inspecting temporary holding facilities. Before allowing a visit or inspection, the 1st FSSG SJA will be contacted for concurrence.
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## 4. (U) Special Guidance

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a. (U) The administrative processing of EPWs in the forward areas will be kept to a minimum. Field processing will be limited to those tasks essential for security, safety, control, or those needed to take advantage of available intelligence or for the immediate welfare of the EPW. Medical attention will be provided. EPW will retain identification cards and protective gear. Field processing actions include SEARCH (for weapons, military documents), SILENCE (prohibit talking among EPW), SEGREGATE (by rank, sex, and nationality), SAFEGUARD (to prevent harm or escape), SPEED (evacuate EPW from the combat zone), and TAG (prisoners, documents, property).

b. (U) Units evacuating EPW/CI/DP will take maximum advantage of all types of transportation. Logistical backhaul transportation will be the primary means of evacuation. However, COMUSMARCENT tactical movements have priority over the movement of EPW/CI/DP.

c. (U) EPWs will be expeditiously interrogated. Interrogation will not take priority over the evacuation of EPWs to a place of safety. EPWs retained for interrogation at any level of command must be provided safe custody and proper treatment in compliance with the Geneva Conventions.

d. (U) In questionable cases, the 1st FSSG Staff Judge Advocate (SJA) will make an initial determination on the legal status of all EPW/CI/DET.

e. (U) Reporting, investigation, and adjudication of alleged violations of the LOW as applicable to DETs will be reported to the FSSG G-2 and SJA for investigation.

#### f. (U) Civilians

(1) (U) <u>Detention</u>. No civilians will be detained for longer than two weeks without approval of the CG, 1st FSSG. Citizens of the host nation detained for any reason other than for their safety incidental to combat operations will be processed through military police channels for transfer to host nation control and custody, or will be released, depending upon the tactical situation.

(2) (U) <u>Internment</u>. The 1st FSSG SJA and Civil Affairs Officer will coordinate all required procedures in regards to the internment of civilians. The 1st FSSG G-2 will determine when internment of a civilian is necessary for imperative reasons of security. Upon proper approval, the 1st FSSG G-2

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will publish an internment order. Subsequently, the FSSG G-2 will process all appeals of the internment order and will periodically review the cases of all interred civilian personnel.

g. (U) EPW/CI/DET who are in a medical in-patient status, under care, will not be transferred until they are no longer in an in-patient status and have been released by medical authorities.

### 6. (U) Administration and Logistics.

a. (U) Accountability. Maintaining accurate accountability from capture to turnover to the theater EPW facility is a challenging process. Special care must be made to track EPWs that diverted via medical channels or die during the evacuation process. All reports will be made to the 1st FSSG G-3 and G-1.

(1) (U) <u>Accountability for EPW/CI/DP</u>. Commanders will be responsible for collecting personnel strengths of EPW/CI/DP and providing it to 1st FSSG G-3 and G-1. Reporting EPW strengths will be in accordance with Appendix 13 of Annex E (JPERSTAT).

(2) (U) Accountability for Deceased EPW/CI/DP. Report the death of EPW/CI/DP to 1st FSSG G-3 and G-1 and in addition, see Appendix 2 (Mortuary Services) to Annex D, Logistics.

(3) (U) Accountability for Wounded EPW/CI/DP. Report transfer or evacuation of EPW/CI/DP via medical channels to 1st FSSG G-3 and G-1 and in addition, see Annex Q, Medical Services.

b. (U) Medical Care, Treatment and Hygiene. The capturing force must provide medical care to EPW/CI/DET under its control on the same basis and priority as that provided to U.S. sick and wounded. See Annex Q, Medical Services. The commander may refuse to accept custody of EPW/CI/DET who are recovering, or suffering, from serious wounds or who have contracted a communicable disease, when the level of care required exceeds the capabilities of the resident medical facility. In such cases, the EPW/CI/DP will be evacuated through the medical regulating chain to the appropriate medical facility.

c. (U) Movement of EPW/CI/DET. To the maximum extent possible, utilize logistical backhaul to evacuate these personnel. While awaiting movement, these personnel must not be unnecessarily exposed to danger. Evacuation from the battle area must be carried out as swiftly, safely and humanely as possible. Whenever these personnel are transferred from one point to another, permit them to take their personal effects and

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provide food, potable water, clothing if required, and adequate medical attention during the transfer period.

d. (U) Administration of EPW Personal Property. Except for prohibited items (e.g., weapons, documents with intelligence value), EPWs are allowed to retain personal property in their possession while being evacuated to the theater confinement facility. Such property includes monies, valuables, protective equipment (e.g., helmets, gas masks), identification cards, personal items of sentimental value and badges of rank or grade. If security requires the confiscation of personal property, an itemized receipt for the personal property must be given to the EPW and the property and record receipt should accompany the EPW to the theater camp.

e. (U) The designated EPW/CI/DET temporary holding facility commander will:

(1) (U) Ensure that capture cards are prepared.

(2) (U) Furnish emergency dental, surgical and medical treatment.

(3) (U) Report EPW/CI/DET strengths to the 1st FSSG G-3 and G-1 daily.

(4) (U) Inventory and safeguard personal effects.

f. (U) EPW/CI/DET will not perform labor except as needed for construction, administration, management and maintenance of the temporary holding facility.

g. (U) The camp commander will consider and attempt to settle complaints. When unable to satisfy the complaining EPW/CI/DET the camp commander will endorse the written complaint to the 1st FSSG SJA with a full explanation of the circumstances.

h. (U) EPWs will not be photographed or videotaped except in conjunction with processing. Interviews by news media will not be permitted. Photographs or videotapes of EPWs will not be released to the news media.

i. (U) Reference (h) gives detailed instructions on the foregoing as well as use of internee representatives; social privileges, public access, correspondence and communication, and discipline and security.
