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This statement is a written transcript of a taped discussion between Brigadier General Formica (USA) and [REDACTED]. The statement only reflects answers given by [REDACTED] B6

I [REDACTED] want to make the following statement under oath: B6

I am [REDACTED]. I am an 1130, Naval Special Warfare Officer - SEAL. I have been in the Navy for 6 years, all as a SEAL. I have been here, in Iraq, since March, I believe I arrived on the 25th or 26th. I was part of the ADVON, so I arrived two weeks before the main body. My duty is as an assault team leader and my collateral duty is to run the tactical interrogation center. I manage the personnel who work in the interrogation facility. I assigned an individual to ensure that we had adequate watch rotations in the TIC. I also ensured that we adhered to medical procedures.

We have a total of 4 corpsmen who work at the TIC. They are 18D corpsmen, which means they have been through SF medical training. One of these corpsmen has gone through the "long course" and he is an Independent Duty Corpsman (IDC). The "long course" refers to the most in-depth course that the SF has for its personnel and it includes the ability to prescribe medications. The course is approximately one year. The FOB Surgeon always helped us as needed. The FOB surgeon would review every medical screening form for detainees completed when they in-processed. There is not a location on the form for the FOB surgeon to sign indicating that he reviewed the form. The only signatures on the form are the senior medic and an MP.

We had 35 detainees while I have been here. The most we ever had at one time was 12 detainees, and this was right when we arrived. We did not have all 12 for 72 hours. We had them for roughly 48 hours but I cannot remember exactly. The gist of it is that we narrowed down to the individuals who were the principal targets as quickly as possible and turned the rest over to the MNB detention facility. We got down to 2 detainees and performed multiple operations with one of the individuals. He did not stay here for more than 14 days, as prescribed by the JAG and we coordinated his stay with the JAG. No one stayed more than 14 days. The cooperating detainee was turned in to the MNB facility and then we check him out and take him into town with us to identify other houses. We could continue doing this after the 14 days. He would come with us for the identification and then go back to the detention facility. He could stay for 14 days in our facility and longer in the MNB facility. No one ever stayed in our facility for more
