I, _____, WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

My name is _____ and I am currently the Brigade Surgeon for 1st Brigade 1st Armored Division. I am a doctor. I was a Field Surgeon with 301st PSB. I remember _____ came in on 25 December. _____ came in on Christmas night. In a wheelchair, unresponsive, not responding verbally, and I could not feel a pulse on him. We transferred _____ to our treatment room and administered CPR. _____ was severely hypothermic, and we were not able to warm him up throughout the resuscitation. The condition we saw _____ in was likely due to the hypothermia. I contacted the 28th CSB and they suggested that we transfer _____ there. _____ was pronounced dead at the 28th CSB after they did a number of tests. In the process of trying to revive _____, we did see some healing bruises on his extremities and some irritation around his wrists. The head CAT scan that I got back from the CSB was normal. When we took a rectal temperature of _____ there was nothing in that area that raised concerns of trauma in that area. We did not see any signs of internal bleeding on _____ I only saw patients that were brought to the aid station and did not do routine medical screenings on detainees. I don't recall _____ or seeing a detainee for being sodomized. Occasionally we'd see patients with injuries, however, solely we treated detainees for medical reasons such as diabetes or chest pains. The bruises I saw on _____ appeared a couple of days older and could have been caused prior to his detention. A detainee being treated for sodomy would be something that I'd be aware of. If the soldiers that worked at the detention facility had any concerns with the detainees' condition, or felt uncomfortable in any way with how a detainee looked, they would bring them in to be evaluated. The soldier that brought _____ in was SPC _____ Some of _____ bruising could be consistent with being caused by him falling down, and his bruising on his left upper chest could be consistent with him falling on something. From my medical judgement, saying _____ was beat to death, would be an incorrect statement. I believe his death was caused by severe hypothermia. I don't know if _____ was returned to his family or if CID was notified.
