INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

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This investigation was initiated upon receipt of Memorandum of Transmittal (MOT) 0078-04-CID789 from Prision Interrogation Team (PIT), Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, Iraq (AGI), that Mr. reported he was abused while detained at the Radwaniya palace, BIAP, Iraq.

The conduct of this investigation determined that Mr. was not assaulted as he originally reported. Investigation established probable cause to believe that Mr. committed the offense of False Official Statement when he provided a written statement that did not reflect the same details as he originally reported and statements taken of the personnel who attended Mr. interrogation denied any abuse took place.

On 15 Jul 04, CPT Office of the Staff Judge Advocate, 16th Military Police Brigade, Camp Victory, Iraq opined probable cause existed that Mr. Committed the offense of False Official Statement.





- Q: Describe to us how your eyes were covered?
- A: There was a painted goggle and it was covered by tape.
- Q: Why were they removing the goggle out of your eyes?
- A: They were removing it for interrogation and when I go to the bathroom.
- Q: When they removed the goggle, what did you see?

A: I saw the interrogator, and he was medium, bald, and has a red brown mustache, and blue eyes, and I saw the translator who was between 40-45 years old, and Arabic, and has a little almost white beard, and the third person was a white tall young man, and about the interrogation room, it was between 4x4 and 5x5M, and it contained an additional small room which contained yellow and orange detainees uniforms. There was a desk and a bed and solit air conditioner "Plazma/LG", that was about the interrogation room.

- Q: Describe the translator.
- A: He was an old man as I said, short, and has an almost white beard, thin, and wearing civilian clothes, and he had Lebanese or Syrian dialect
- Q: Describe to us the interrogator.

A: The interrogator was medium white bald man, he has blue eyes, and I saw him 4 times, and he was wearing the full military uniform once, and at the rest of the interrogation, he was wearing a brown T-shirt with military pants, and when he was wearing the full military uniform, I watched that his name was --- and on the other side there was US Army, and about the color of the uniform, it was the same you are wearing. (This Agent was wearing standard Army DCUs)

- Q: Can you describe the desk, which was in the room?
- A: It was a big metal desk, and I do not remember its-color.
- Q: Can you describe the bed, which was in the room?
- A: It was a metal low bed, and there was a mattress covered with cloth on it.
- Q: Describe to us how they hit you?
- A: They punched me on my stomach several times and kicked both my legs.
- Q: Were you blinded when they were hitting you?
- A: Yes, I was blinded.
- Q: Did the Americans kick you?
- A: The Americans punched me and the Kurds kicked me.
- Q: Were you standing or sitting while you were punched by the Americans?
- A: I was standing.
- Q: How and where your hands were cuffed?

JO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH was detained on 15 JUN 04 by USSF who were looking for his father who had been identified as a leader and financier of Anti-Iraqi Forces (AIF). The father, was not at the residence, but two of his sons were. Additionally, approximately 25 million Iraqi Dinar (approximate value 16,000 US Dollars) and 4400 US Dollars were found at the house. All the money was confiscated and brought with the detainees to the Combined Joint Special Operations Task Force - Arabian Peninsula (CJSOTF-AP) Parrived at approximately 0500 on 15 JUN 04 already Temporary Holding Facility (THF). blindfolded and with his hands bound behind his back. Inprocessing to the THF consisted of a pat-down search before he entered the facility, and then being placed into a cell. At 0537D on 15 JUN 04, was brought into an interrogation room for screening. I cannot remember if there was a guard present with me during the screening. blindfold and binds were removed, and he was ordered to undress down to his underwear. He complained of pain in his shoulder resulting from having his hands bound behind his back. He managed to remove his dishdasha, but complained frequently about the pain. Two full-length photographs were taken of and back) as well as a closer facial picture. As soon as I had taken the three pictures, I told to get dressed, but he refused to do so, stating he could not raise his arms above his head. I continued the rest of the screening with standing in his underwear. I questioned his biographic data and the location of his father. I believed some of his answers were deceptive, particularly concerning the location of his father and mifitary background. Before I returned to his cell, I again told him to get dressed, and he again refused, stating he could not move his arms. I flex-cuffed his hands in front of him, replaced the goggles, and escorted him back to his cell. I told him that when he felt sufficiently recovered to get dressed, he was to inform the guards and they would remove the flex cuffs long enough to allow him to dress. I later found out he did that within five minutes of being returned to his cell. The first interrogation took place later that same day at 1930D. cars and the rest of the money seized from his home. I felt that he was trying to avoid sensitive topics, but in the case of the \$4500 U.S. he claimed had been taken, he was correct. That money showed up later the same day. also stated that there had been more than 26 million Iraqi Dinar stored at his house although slightly less than 25 million was delivered with him. The capturing unit, who later delivered the \$4400 (44 x \$100 bills), said there had been no other money taken from the home. When I asked about his father's location in Syria, he said he did not know, but he speculated the father may have been in Aleppo. During interrogations with R.I learned that did not know where the father was living in Syria, but state that , being the oldest brother, would know stated that father regularly on the phone. confirmed that he did speak with his father by telephone, but he stated that the father initiated the phone calls. maintained he did not know an address or phone number that could be used to contact his father. I repeatedly told that he was lying. Following the interrogation, I put goggles back on him and escorted him to his cell. The second interrogation took place on 17 JUN 04 at 1610D. Only during this interrogation. I concentrated on the discrepancies between statements and changed his story about being a witness to the exchange of those of his brother, I also asked pabout the identity of the person whose money between and 's documents had been found in house, but he said he did not know to whom the documents belonged. In a later interrogation with **I** was told the individual was a friend of the father. That person had given the documents to to have a new passport made. I then confronted with three AIF propaganda documents found in the house, but he denied all knowledge of them, claiming there were many things in the house of which he was unaware. I accused I transporting weapons to Falluja (as the HUMINT source reported), but he denied the accusations. I concluded the interrogation by replacing goggles and escorting him back to his cell. I intended to interrogate him one more time before transferring him to Abu Ghurayb. I did not have that opportunity, however. was transferred to Abu Ghurayb on 18 JUN 04 at 1430D. He was kept blindfolded and flex-cuffed during his transportation to Abu Ghurayb. All money. documents, and other property was evacuated with him. During screening and both interrogations, I removed blindfold to be able to watch his eye movements. He was kept flex-cuffed, but his hands were in front of him except while transported by the detaining unit. 




