On 17 May 04, the Military Police Desk Sergeant, Fort Drum, New York (FDNY), reported PV2 [REDACTED] had photographs depicting suspected maltreatment of enemy prisoner's of war (EPW), while PV2 [REDACTED] was deployed to Iraq. b7c-5, b6-5

On 17 May 04, Mrs. [REDACTED], [REDACTED] (FM/W: PV2 [REDACTED]), was arrested by the New York State Police following a domestic violence incident between her and her husband. In a subsequent interview with Military Police Investigations, FDNY, Mrs. [REDACTED] reported

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her husband had a photograph of himself pointing a gun at the head of an bound and hooded EPW in Iraq.

Investigation established probable cause to believe PV2 [REDACTED] committed the offense of Aggravated Assault, when he pointed a pistol at an EPW he was guarding while deployed to Iraq. b7c-5,66-5

At 2342, 17 May 04, the undersigned requested the Military Police Desk Sergeant (MPDS) FDNY, send a Military Police Patrol and collect the photograph and or photographs on a Evidence/Property Custody Document (DA Form 4137), and obtain the biographical information on PV2 [REDACTED]. The MPDS related PV2 [REDACTED] and Mrs. [REDACTED] are b7C-5, 66 currently in the process of obtaining and divorce and got into a verbal argument, which turned physical when Mrs. [REDACTED] pushed PV2 [REDACTED]. Subsequently, the New York State Police were notified and Mrs. [REDACTED] was arrested for assault. While being interviewed by the NYSP concerning the assault, Mrs. [REDACTED] contacted the MPDS FDNY to report PV2 [REDACTED] has photographs depicting EPW abuse. b7C-5, 66-5

Agent Comment: the undersigned briefly interviewed Mrs. [REDACTED] over the telephone and confirmed the above story. b7C-5, 66-5

About 0700, 18 May 04, the undersigned obtained a photograph and negative provided by PV2 [REDACTED] from INV [REDACTED] Military Police Investigations (MPI), FDNY, as annotated on the DA Form 4137. The photograph depicted PV2 [REDACTED] pointing a pistol at an unidentified EPW whose hands were tied, head was hooded, and who b7C-5, 66 appeared to be sleeping (See DA Form 4137). b7C-4, 66-4

At 1056, 18 May 04, the undersigned interviewed PV2 [REDACTED] who was advised of his legal rights, which he waived and rendered a sworn statement wherein he admitted to being photographed pointing a BB gun at a detained prisoner during a deployment in Iraq (See Waiver Certificate/Statement of PV2 [REDACTED], 18 May 04). b7C-4, 66-4 b7C-4, 66-4

At 1522, 18 May 04, the undersigned obtained a Consent to Search authorization from PV2 [REDACTED] and subsequently searched his belongings which were stored in the company classroom and room B250 of building 10114 with negative results (See Consent To Search Form of PV2 [REDACTED], 18 May 04). b7C-5, 66-5

At 1610, 7 Jun 04, the undersigned interviewed 1LT [REDACTED], HHC, 2-14 INF BN, FDNY, who [REDACTED] b7c-4, b7c-66-4 rendered a sworn statement detailing his role as PV2 [REDACTED] Platoon leader during operations in Iraq. 1LT [REDACTED] related he never witnessed or heard of PV2 [REDACTED] abusing any prisoners while deployed to Iraq. (See Sworn Statement of 1LT [REDACTED] for details). b7c-5, 66-5

At 1103, 15 Jun 04, SPC [REDACTED], C Co, 2-14 INF BN, FDNY, was interviewed and provided C-5, 66-5 a sworn statement wherein he related he had been deployed to Iraq with PV2 [REDACTED]. SPC [REDACTED] related he had C-5, 66-5 not witness or heard of PV2 [REDACTED] abusing any EPW's and could not provide any additional information concerning the firearm or location depicted in the photograph (See Sworn Statement of SPC [REDACTED]). b7c-4, 66-4

At 0953, 22 Jun 04, the undersigned received and reviewed the US Army Criminal Investigation Laboratory (USACIL) report of examination case number 2004-CID131-0981, 3 Jun 04, 4 Jun 04 and 15 Jun 04, which could not determine make and caliber of the firearm depicted in the 35 mm photograph negative provided. USACIL noted there are numerous BB/Air pistols that are manufactured to look like actual firearms that identification through a photograph of poor quality is almost impossible and an opine could not be rendered (See USACIL Reports dated 3 Jun 04, 4 Jun 04 and 15 Jun 04). b7c-4, 66-4

At 1550, 28 Jun 04, the undersigned interviewed SPC [REDACTED], C Co, 2-14 INF BN, FDNY, b7c-4, 66-3 who related he had been deployed to Iraq with PV2 [REDACTED]. SPC [REDACTED] related he had no knowledge of PV2 b7c-5, 66-5 [REDACTED] abusing any EPW's. SPC [REDACTED] stated he could not recall a BB gun pistol at any of the locations where b7c-5, 66-5 he had been deployed, but he had had a silver in color replica pistol lighter while at Al Ramadi. SPC [REDACTED] related the SF teams sometimes leant them pistols ranging from 45 cal to 9mm to guard EPW's. b7c-5, 66-5

Agent's Comment: SPC [REDACTED] was shown the photographs in question and identified PV2 [REDACTED] holding a pistol b7c-4, 66-2 at an apparently sleeping EPW. SPC [REDACTED] could not identify the location of where the photograph had been taken and said the pistol in the photograph was not the replica pistol he had owned. SPC [REDACTED] identified from left to right, b7c-5, 66-5 personnel in the group photograph as [REDACTED], "PV2 [REDACTED]", and [REDACTED]. SPC [REDACTED] T said [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were part of an SF scuba team identified as team 25 and related the photograph had been taken in Al Ramadi.

I, *67C-5,66-5* want to make the following statement under oath:

I'm assigned to Charlie C Co 2-14 INF BN. I am a RIFLE MAN. I deployed to Iraq from August of 2003 to March of 2004. I arrived back at Fort Drum on March 3rd of 2004. On the night of the 17th of May 2004 I arrived to my house to mow the lawn and supply my wife with money that she needed. I had this picture in the house hidden. When she found out that I obtained this picture I had from Iraq she began to get mad and cry because she wanted to use this picture to get me in trouble. My mission in Iraq was to pull security for ODA Groups. The prisoner in this picture is a member of Al-Qaeda from Egypt. My S.O.P. was to pull prisoner guarded on him with an M-4. My M-4 was to be on safe, no round in chamber and magazine in weld. I felt uncomfortable pointing my M-4 at high security prisoners, so I would often use a b.b. gun to pull guard, with my M-4 at a practicable distance.

This prisoner was very cooperative to me therefore I felt no threat. The b.b. gun was at the safehouse in Al Qaim when we arrived there. It was used to keep the stray dog's away from our location. The prisoner was never abuse in anyway to the best of my knowledge and I never had to use the B.B. gun on him. The prisoner was grateful that I gave him water and snack's from MRE's as opposed to other people pulling guard who did not give them this. My feelings toward the prisoner were that he was there for committing crimes of terrorism, but it was not my job to judge him or to pass sentence on him. My job was to guard him with high alertness and severity. When the picture was taken I was not posing for this picture. People were coming in and out of the area taking pictures and talking with other detainees. I'm a private in the Army and I don't ask many questions as to what going on or what's been done. I just do what I'm told. I was given my order by the S.F. group we were attached to in Al Qaim. I don't remember their names at this time.

My company mission was to provide safehouse security for CIA in central Iraq to facilitate CIA operations throughout the AO. My company supported 14 teams houses, with my other team we fire team to a platoon minus at a given time based on the threat. At the end of Jul 03 the company received some replacements P-22 b7c-5 b6-5

b7c-5 b6-5 was one of these soldiers. In early Aug 03, P-22 b7c-5 b6-5 moved to the safehouse in Ar Ramadi (OPR 531). 1 LT b7c-3 b6-3 and SSG b7c-3 b6-3 were the leaders (Company leaders) at that location. We had approximately 12-14 soldiers at that location. At some point in Sep 03, we moved a fire team from A Company to A1 Area. About two weeks later, PV2 ██████████ was removed from Al Asad for DPEEC violations. The ROR during the time in question was still fairly liberal. I, [REDACTED] WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH: I arrived at Fort Drum November 6th, 2002 and assigned to C Co 2-14th INF. I deployed to Iraq around March 30th 2003. I was in Al Ramadi around May 03 until October 03. In Al Ramadi we conducted High priority raids, Force protection and guarded EPW's until they were sent across the road to 3rd or 1st ID.

Q: SA [REDACTED] b7c-1, b6-1

A: SPC [REDACTED] b7c-4, b6-4

Q: What were your instructions regarding the treatment of EPW's?

A: For each prisoner it was different. We required to provide meals 2-3 times a day, water when needed or asked, use of the latrine when needed; that's all we were required to give them.

Q: What your ROE's regarding EPW's?

A: Prisoners must wear hoods and cuffs at all times, unless otherwise stated. Prisoners must remain in position they were left in by SF team members unless otherwise stated. If a prisoner did not comply or became disorderly we could necessary means to restrain the prisoner until help arrived.

Q: Did you witness any EPW abuse?

A: No I did not.

Q: What do you consider abuse?

A: Anything that is inhumane is abuse. Torture, cruel or unusual punishments or humiliating punishments as well. That's pretty much it.

Q: Do you know PV2 [REDACTED]

A: Not well but by name and rank. I do not like him because of his military or lack of military bearing.

Q: Was PV2 [REDACTED] deployed with you at Al Ramadi? b7c-5, b6-5

A: He was there for a short period of time in the middle of my time there. He was there from anywhere from one month to a month in a half.

Q: Do you know of any problems that PV2 [REDACTED] had when he was with you at AL Ramadi? b7c-5, b6-5

A: No, I was not in a leadership position. The only thing I have heard about [REDACTED] is that his wife is crazy. I heard that since I have been back along with this whole case thing.

Q: Did you ever witness PV2 [REDACTED] abuse EPW's? b7c-5, b6-5

A: No.

Q: Before today had you seen the photograph of PV2 [REDACTED] with the EPW? b7c-5, b6-5

A: No.

Q: Did you recognize the area and who was in the photograph?

A: No.

Q: Was PV2 [REDACTED] in the picture?

A: Knowing that this interview was regarding [REDACTED] I could tell a vague similarity to the person in the photograph as being [REDACTED] but if I had not known then I would not have recognized him. b7c-5, b6-5
