Investigation established insufficient evidence to prove or disprove the offenses of Assault and Cruelty and Maltreatment occurred as alleged by was bac-4, bb-4 interviewed and alleged during an interrogation someone pushed or bumped into him, causing him to fall to the floor of the interrogation room, while his hands were handcuffed to a hook fastened to the floor. The related he was blindfolded during the incident and was unsure if it was an accident or if the individual intentionally hit or pushed him to the floor. Interviews of BCCF personnel were conducted, which failed to identify an incident where the fell to the floor during an interrogation, but did confirm the had back to be allegation.

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

I reinterviewed the guy this morning. (No sworn statement as he can neither read or nor write.) It's clear from his description of his treatment that he was treated at the 801st CSH on Abu. (He descibed the x-ray procedure and the x-ray room to a tee.) I spoke with the hospital commander and he said they may or may not have an x-ray log documenting the prisoners that they take x-rays of. The Iraqi clinic does not have x-ray equipment. The treatment records are still MIA, but I've asked them to determine if they might have kept an x-ray log and to see if his number is in it. I'm interviewing the interperters this afternoon.







About 0930, 20 Jul 04, SA with the assistance of Interpreter

Corporation, Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), Baghdad, IZ, interviewed Detainee

at the Detainee In-Processing Center, BCCF, AG. When questioned concerning the allegation in claimed that he had never made a complaint against anyone and denied that he had ever been maltreated by anyone since his detention. When questioned specifically about the allegation that he was handcuffed and left alone for eight-hours in a detention cell, stated that he had never made that allegation. He did state he had spoken to a man in civilian clothing, who he believed was in the military, about being interrogated while his hands and feet where restrained by metal handcuffs and anchored to the floor of his interrogation room. During one of those interrogations, which believed occurred between two and three months ago, one of his interrogators struck him in the left shoulder. which interrogator struck him. At the time he was struck, one of his interrogators was asking him about attacks on US and Coalition Forces. The medical personnel he spoke with after the x-ray was taken told him that the nerves in his wrist were bruised, but that nothing was broken. he has not experienced any long-term complications from the incident.
