INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

This investigation was initiated upon the receipt of a Request for Investigation (RFI) # 0211-04-CID001, received from the HQUSACIDC, Inspector General, Identifying Allegations of Iraqi Prisoner Abuses.

Investigation established probable cause to believe [REDACTED] committed the offense(s) of Cruelty and Maltreatment of Detainees and Failure to Obey an Order or Regulation, when they violated the Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) established by their Command regarding the treatment of Iraqi Detainees.

Investigation also established probable cause to believe unknown soldiers committed the offense (s) of Aggravated Assault; Cruelty and Maltreatment and Failure to Obey an Order or Regulation, when they violated the SOP established by the Command regarding the treatment of detainees.

The detainee victims were not able to be identified in this report of investigation.

There are indications that [REDACTED] former Commander, 800th Military Police Brigade, [REDACTED] former Commander, 115th MP Battalion and [REDACTED] former Commander, 443rd MP Company, may have committed the offense of Dereliction of Duty. The offense of Dereliction of Duty is not an offense normally investigated by CID and is being referred back to the Commander for action deemed appropriate.

DETAILS

**BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION:** About 0930, 15 Jun 04, this office received Request For Investigation #0211-04-CID001 from the HQUSACIDC, Inspector General, identifying allegations of Iraqi Prisoner abuses. Preliminary investigation disclosed several soldiers assigned to the 443rd Military Police (MP) Company (Co), 12100 Green spring Avenue, Owings Mills, MD 21117-1610, reported alleged abuses of Iraqi detainees by US service members assigned as guards in Iraq. The allegations entailed incidents of shackled detainees being made to hold concrete blocks for hours in the sun without water, and/or being secured to a metal object while being physically abused for hours by multiple guards. Further, preliminary investigation determined that some of the abuse incidents were allegedly reported to the 443rd MP Co chain of command but may have not been appropriately investigated.

At 1714, 23 Jun 04, Special Agent (SA) [REDACTED] this office, interviewed [REDACTED] 443rd MP Co, Gettysburg, PA 17325. [REDACTED] provided a sworn statement in which she related she observed Iraqi detainees being abused by several of the members from her unit. [REDACTED] stated she reported the incidents to her supervisor, who related he would 'take care of it' (see sworn statement of [REDACTED] for details).

At 1735, 25 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] interviewed [REDACTED] 443rd MP Co, Gettysburg, PA 17325. [REDACTED] provided a sworn statement in which he related he did not observe any Iraqi detainee abuse during his shifts, and no abuses were reported to him (see sworn statement of [REDACTED] for details).///LAST ENTRY///

I, Marjorie Maye BAXTER want to make the following statement under oath:  
 I arrived at Camp Cropper, Iraq, in June of 2003, which was the Corps Holding Area #2 for Iraqi detainees. My job was to guard the prisoners. At first I did external and Quick Reaction Force. We then took over the prison from the 115<sup>th</sup> MP Battalion because they had too many riots. The 115<sup>th</sup> personnel cease to perform any guard mission in the main prison and went to the High Value Detainees. When we took over the CHA, our main job was to guard the prisoners and to control their movements inside the prison. We would rotate where we would work as far as if we sat at a cell or at the holding area or the sally port. We worked 12 hr shifts from 0400 to 1600. The night shift worked 1600 to 0400. Most of the prisoners that came into our prison were brought in throughout the day. On any given day we could have received up to 300 prisoners. The prison was built to hold 250 prisoners. We were a holding area and were to hold them 72 hours only. All the prisons were getting full and none of the other prisons would take ours. We would hold them until either another prison would take them or they were to be released. At one point we had over 1200 prisoner jammed into our prison. It got very crowded. When working the sally port you got the first experience with the prisoners. When the prisoners were brought to us, they were brought in by the truckloads. They would be shackled and usually brought in with bags on their heads. The first thing that happened was they went to the garage to be interrogated. The MI unit would ask them their questions and when they were done with them, they would bring them to the sally port for us to search them and put them in the holding area. Sometimes MI would tell us not to put them in the holding area because they were not done with them. If they were to sit in the sally port, they were to remain shackled. Sometimes they were to keep the bag on their heads. One day when working the sally port, a group of 3 prisoners came to the prison. Their hands and feet were shackled together. After the MI had asked them questions, 2 of the guys was allowed to go to the holding area. The other guy was to remain in the sally port till he would talk to MI. The first time MI brought him out he had to stand in the sun holding a concrete cinder block. He held it for about an hour then MI took him again. ██████████ on the block and told him not move. The MI told us at the sally port that if the inmate moved or took his head off the block we were to rub his head across the block. A few times the prisoner moved and I would put his head on head back on the block. The MI wanted us to punish the prisoner. I told my NCOIC what was going on and he said he would take care of it. A few times the QRF would come down to the sally port and would help control the prisoner. One of the QRF soldiers would twist the handcuffs up on the prisoner's wrist to make him put is head on the block. After a few hours the MI came out and got the prisoner. The prisoner sat in the sun for a long time with no water to drink. When MI had brought him back out they had replaced the bag on his head and had tightened the bottom of it a little. We were instructed not to take the bag off his head. The inmate started to throw up and MI would not allow us to remove the bag. We took bottles of water and dumped it on the inmate's head trying to rinse out the bag. When I had gotten off shift the inmate was still sitting in the sun in the sally port.

Q: What eventually happened to prisoner that had his head on the cinder block?

A: He was processed and placed into A Block.

Q: Did he sustain any permanent injury from that incident?

A: None that was visible to me.

Q: Do you recall the MI individual that instructed you to place the inmate head on the cinder block and rub it if he moved?

A: I do not know his name. We did not know any of their names they did not have their names displays.

Q: Who was it that rubbed the detainee face across the cinder block until it was bloody?

A: ██████████ 443<sup>rd</sup> MP Co. He was part of the 400<sup>th</sup> MP Bn and I do not know if he went back their.

Q: The detainee that had the bag over his head and was made to sit in the sun was he being disruptive?

A: No, we were told by MI that he had bludgeoned an 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Soldier to death.

Q: Did MI explain this was a tactic to get the detainee to cooperate?

A: Yes.

Q: Were any of these abuse incidents reported to your chain of command (i.e.) Commander and First Sergeant?

A: That particular incident I do not know, I reported it to the NCOIC of the compound that day.

A: I do not recall, because it switched everyday.

A: The incident involving ██████████ took an inmate out of his cell at night took him to the garage and beat him. I, [REDACTED], WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

I arrived in Iraq in June of 2003, and my unit was assigned to provide EPW control in Camp Cropper. During my stay in Baghdad, at Camp Cropper I noticed no incidents where prisoner abuse took place. There were instances where soldiers got tempered with detainees, but nothing that was abusive. For instance, I observed a soldier with his foot on the back of the neck of a detainee who was rolling around in the sally port. I quickly pulled the soldier to the side and asked him what was he doing? He replied "I'm keeping him still". I then explained to him that it looked like he was standing on the prisoner's neck. The soldier replied that the prisoner keeps rolling around. I replied, let him roll around because he is subdued and he can't harm anyone. That was the extent of the altercation. Later on that day the soldiers were given a use of force block of instruction, to prevent any further miscommunications. I thought that was great on the leadership's part.



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

I traveled from Kuwait to Baghdad, Iraq via convoy in June 2003. Upon arrival to Camp Cropper, I was assigned to become the NCOIC of the Quick Reactionary Force (QRF) for the compound. The QRF was divided up into two teams and performed duty on a 24-hour on/24-hour off basis. The mission of the QRF was to respond to incidents that took place inside the compound such as: prisoner riots, physical altercations, provide extra security, guard detainees on work details, etc. For the most part, we were never in direct control of the detainees. We were definitely not in control of detainee punishment for infractions that occurred inside the wire. Those duties were the responsibility of the compound NCOIC/OIC. On several occasions, the QRF was called to perform security for the arrival of incoming detainees to the compound. This included posting armed guards at the vehicle that was bringing the detainees in and inside the warehouse, where detainees were held until they processed into the compound. In addition, the QRF did assign team members to assist with conducting searches of incoming detainees from time to time. There was never a time where I physically abused a prisoner. If anyone ever saw me do anything to a detainee that could be construed as abuse, then that was a result of a detainee resisting me while I was attempting to place them into a prone position for the requisite search to bring them into the compound. I have been a military police officer for over 11 years now and a Federal police officer for over five years. At no time have I ever abused a subject for any reason. I may have forced someone to the ground because they were resisting, but I did not scrape a detainee's head across a brick. A few weeks prior to our (443rd MP Co) departure from Baghdad, I was relieved from my duties as the QRF NCOIC so I could assume duties as the assistant movement NCO to pack up and move the unit home.

[REDACTED] brought one of the detainees into the sally port and instructed him to stand with his arms parallel to the ground and not to move. After a sometime, the detainee's arms began to drop, and [REDACTED] grabbed him by the hair and told him not to drop his arms again. A few minutes later, the detainees arms dropped again, and [REDACTED] grabbed the detainee in what appeared to be the crotch and chest area, and forced him to the ground. While on the ground, it looked like he grabbed the detainee by the hair and punched him in the face, and told him not to do it again. About that time, another MP Company had pulled up, and were watching what was going on. A male soldier then asked if he could come in and get some of that. [REDACTED] responded to the soldier that if he wanted to come into the sally port, he could not bring a weapon. At this time in realized this was wrong and left the sally port. I gave a statement to my commander, and the matter was later investigated by the unit. I do not know what had happened to the individuals who were involved.

In the month of June, 2004, our unit arrived in Baghdad, Iraq. Our mission there was to operate the inside of a prison camp. We were stationed at Camp Cropper, near the Baghdad International Airport. Our unit was there unit the month of November, 2004. I was in 3rd Platoon and our platoon work the night shift. Sometime in the month of July, 2004, I was working at the sally port of prison. Around 3am a SEAL team had brought in 3 prisoners. The 3 prisoners were being brought to us because they were shooting at Americans, possibly killing Americans. After the SEAL team left it was myself, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were left watching over the prisoners. I stated to [REDACTED] I have to go to the bathroom, and urinate. [REDACTED] replied saying "Why don't you piss on the prisoners. I then began urinating, but I urinated beside the prisoners. Since it was dark out [REDACTED] asked me then if I did it and I said yes. The next morning [REDACTED] and I were talking about it and I told him that I didn't do it. He asked me why I said yes the night before, I told him I don't know. I didn't feel comfortable telling him that I said yes just to receive the glory. The reason why I did it for the glory was to be look at as a badass. Ever since our unit deployment at Ft Sam Houston, Texas from October 2002 to October 2003, I've been made fun of for basically not hanging out with my fellow soldiers.

A: Everyday that I walked into the prison, the detainees cheered at me because they like me. I always had a good relationship with the detainees. I am well assured, if you were to question the detainees today, and they could remember me, they would say that I was a good person, and a soldier that treated them with respect.

About 1400, 17 Aug 04, this office received a Category 1 Request For Assistance (RFA) from the Carlisle Barracks Resident Agency, Washington District (CID), Carlisle, PA to conduct a witness interview of [REDACTED] assigned to the 229th Military Police (MP) Company, Virginia Beach, VA. The RFA indicated [REDACTED] may have been a witness to detainee abuse while deployed with [REDACTED] 443rd MP Company, who allegedly urinated on an Iraqi detainee while in his custody.

Between 1730 - 1930, <sup>18</sup>19 Aug 04, SA [REDACTED], this office, interviewed [REDACTED] at her place of business, located at [REDACTED]. The following is a synopsis of that interview:

[REDACTED] stated that, while assigned with a Military Police Company at Camp Cropper, Iraq, she witnessed [REDACTED] intentionally urinate on a detainee. [REDACTED] stated there was an internal investigation into the matter by a [REDACTED] wherein it appeared to her that other witnesses to the act may have provided false information when questioned by [REDACTED] as to the intent of [REDACTED] to urinate "on" or "beside" the prisoner. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] returned to duty shortly after the completion of the inquiry. [REDACTED] stated the incident occurred during the early morning hours when she was on duty along with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] recalled [REDACTED] initially making a comment that he should "piss on" the detainee and that [REDACTED] encouraged the act by prompting him with comments or approval to do so. [REDACTED] stated it was obvious to everyone present that [REDACTED] intended to urinate on the prisoner. I, [REDACTED] want to provide the following statement, under oath: I was mobilized Feb 10<sup>th</sup> with the 229<sup>th</sup> MP CO. I was then involuntarily transferred to the 229<sup>th</sup> Chemical Company out of Roanoke, VA. The unit went to Fort Lee, VA to go through the mobilization train-up in Feb 03. Sometime in May persons were asked to go to Iraq with the 443<sup>rd</sup> MP Company, a reserve unit out of Owings Mills, MD. I volunteered and later flew to Kuwait. I did not know any of the soldiers within the unit. We were in Kuwait for about three weeks and then moved into Iraq by convoy in Jun. Once we arrived, the unit quickly assumed the duties at Camp Cropper which was a general population prison. I was there as the NBC NCO, as I am a 74D, which is a Chemical Specialist. Since there was no real mission for me, I was asked to be the NCO of the night or evening mission to in-process incoming prisoners and I agreed. I don't recall the date this actually occurred, I think it was in July. I was on shift with at least four other individuals, in addition to [REDACTED]. Unfortunately he caught a lot of flack for not being real masculine. Some of the guys gave him a hard time for this. I knew this was something he would not normally do. I can't remember if the Navy Seals brought these guys in or what. There were two Iraqi detainee's. They were picked up in a scheduled raid and were brought in with Flexi-cuffs on their arms and ankles. They were wearing only their underwear and hoods on their heads. One of the MP's cut the flexi-cuffs from their ankles. [REDACTED] pushed one of the detainees against the other. I imagine from fear, the prisoner urinated on himself and on the boots of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] became angry. [REDACTED] then, for some reason, came over and urinated on one of the detainees. [REDACTED] was just standing there. It was completely out of character for [REDACTED] to do this. Afterward, I don't remember which person brought a flashlight over but it was shown on the detainee and it was clear that he was wet with [REDACTED] urine. At that point we all just, it was one of those things you just...you know. [REDACTED] came to me a few days later, crying. [REDACTED] was an investigating officer and did speak with me about the matter. I told him exactly what happened. Anyway, [REDACTED] did not want me to say anything about it. I was a little upset about this. [REDACTED] didn't want to leave and go back to the states. As I found out, everyone else lied about what occurred except for me. [REDACTED] was pulled out of the compound for a little while but later returned.

Q: The evening shift was from when to when?

A: From 1600 to 0400.

Q: Did you work with [REDACTED]? How is he involved with this?

A: [REDACTED] was one of the other NCO's in the unit. He was on duty that evening and present that night. [REDACTED] actually made the comment first to pee on the detainee and [REDACTED] sort of encouraged it by making comments. I don't recall what was actually said.

Q: Provide some different scenarios as to why a detainee would need to be restrained or "Hog Tied"?

A: That would be difficult to provide three scenarios. Basically they had to be really screwing up. Most of the guards would keep close monitorship of what you could and could not do to a detainee. I know that prisoners had three opportunities to follow instructions but I don't know that they would be hog tied or anything like that.

Q: Did you ever see or hear of a prisoner being hog tied?

A: I saw a prisoner being hog tied. It wasn't for very long, maybe 5 -10 minutes. I don't know what he did to deserve that. I couldn't tell you who did the tying either.

Q: Describe the process of being brought into the "Sally Port"?

A: It was like a staging area. When prisoners initially come into the compound, they are searched there and depending on how busy we are they could be there a while. This is a separate area that was cordoned off until they could be moved inside a tent area. They are given water as there was no shade in this area. It wasn't established for persons to be there for extended periods.

Q: Did you ever witness [REDACTED] handcuff a female detainee and place her in the sun for hours?

A: I would not know. I did not work with him as he worked the day shift.

Q: Well did you hear anyone comment about [REDACTED] his actions with a female prisoner or anything else with him while there?

A: Honestly, I cant recall.

Q: Do you feel [REDACTED] encouraged [REDACTED] to urinate on the detainee?

A: Yes.

Q: Were you instructed by Military Intelligence soldiers to make things harder for the detainees? What MI Unit was present?

A: They didn't tell us to make things hard, but there were specific individuals that came in that, depending on who they were or what they came in for. For instance two brothers came in for attacking coalition forces. Those two were made to stand in the Sally Port for extended periods. This was requested by [REDACTED] he headed the MI Unit there. I dealt with him most of the time. I think the MI Unit was the 325<sup>th</sup> but I do not recall. I do know they were mixed reserve and active together. Our Commander, [REDACTED] did step in and say that the MP guards would no longer participate with handling requests from the MI.

Q: Were you briefed on the Standard Operating Procedures and Policies concerning the treatment of detainees?

A: The unit I was with actually wrote the SOP. All of had the opportunity to read it and yes, I did read it.

Q: Was your chain of command approachable about reporting abuse?

A: This is just my opinion, but I felt [REDACTED] wanted a good OER. If he could keep things in the unit and from getting out, he would have taken necessary steps to do so. I felt that [REDACTED] gave more credit and weight to what his MP's told him than what I did.

Q: Do you feel you could have gone to [REDACTED] on other issues outside of matters referring to prisoner abuse?

A: No.

Q: Do you have any idea what the detainee to guard ratio was during your time there?

A: Probably twenty guards per shift and the number of detainees ranged from 300 to 1,200.

Q: Do you feel there were guards there with character traits not conducive to this type of a career field?

A: There were those who probably had no business being MP's. A recall a [REDACTED] who I felt had some control issues. No specific incidents but just my overall observations about him. He made some poor judgment calls. He did attempt to send a lower receiver of a Turkish weapon through the mail. It was found and a few of his soldiers were arrested.

Q: In your statement, you mentioned you knew "this was something [REDACTED] would normally not do" what did you mean by that?

A: I meant pee on a person.

Q: You mention a flashlight being needed to see whether there was pee on the detainee. Is it possible [REDACTED] meant to pee next to the detainee and not on him?

A: No, he knew what he was doing. It was three o'clock in the morning. There was light from a warehouse and there was visibility but not real clear.

Q: Do you have any idea why [REDACTED] pushed one of the detainees in the first place?

A: Because [REDACTED] made it clear he did not want to be there or that he cared for the Iraqi prisoners.

Q: After providing your statement, I read portions of the RFA and [REDACTED] statement to you. You appeared to have some concerns with some of the statements or its credibility. Can you explain?

A: I will agree that [REDACTED] did it for the glory and that he would be looked at as such a feminine guy. It was clear to everyone that [REDACTED] urinated ON the detainee and not next to him as stated in the RFA. It was [REDACTED] intent to urinate on the guy before he approached him. His initial comment was "I should piss on him" or words to that effect. Everyone in the unit was clear on the treatment of detainees who did not comply with orders, including [REDACTED] There were TAZER's at Camp Cropper and [REDACTED] had direct knowledge of this. They were used from time to time.

Q: In your statement after telling me that [REDACTED] urinated on a detainee, you made partial comments. Appeared to me you had trouble articulating what everyone was thinking or your reactions to what just happened. Did others make comments about what [REDACTED] did. Either supportive or not?

A: I remember [REDACTED] being there. The two of us looked at each other in amazement but no one really said anything.

Q: Do you feel other MP's that were present provided false information about what occurred?

A: Yes.

Q: Anything else you feel I need to know?

A: No. He did treat the prisoners very well...of course other than this incident.

The RFA also requested this office obtain, if available, a unit roster and the location where the MI unit re-deployed back to, when they departed Iraq.

About 1600, 19 Aug 04, SA [redacted] coordinated with SA [redacted] CIC, 22<sup>nd</sup> Military Police BN (CID), Camp Victory, Baghdad, Iraq APO AE 09342. SA [redacted] provided documentation detailing three MI units that were at Camp Cropper, between May 03 and Dec 03. The units identified as being at Camp Cropper between the aforementioned dates were the 323d MI BN, 221<sup>st</sup> MI BN, and the 325<sup>th</sup> MI BN. (See MI Unit Documentation for details)

About 1617, 19 Aug 04, SA [redacted] conducted internet searches for the aforementioned MI units utilizing AKO and Google, in an attempt to identify where each unit's home station was located. The searches revealed the 323d MI BN was stationed at Fort Meade, MD; the 221<sup>st</sup> MI BN was stationed in Atlanta, GA; and the 325<sup>th</sup> was stationed somewhere in New York State (was unable to identify the exact location of the 325<sup>th</sup>)

About 1830, 19 Aug 04, SA [redacted] coordinated with [redacted] Deputy Director of Joint Interrogations and Debriefing Center, A Co, 202<sup>nd</sup> MI BN, Baghdad Central Confinement Facility, Baghdad, Iraq, who related during the time frame in question the 205<sup>th</sup> MI BDE was the main MI unit in Iraq. [redacted] related he did not know exactly where the 205<sup>th</sup> MI BDE home station was.

About 1200, 21 Aug 04, SA [redacted] conducted an internet search utilizing AKO and Google in an attempt to locate the home station of the 205<sup>th</sup> MI BDE. Q. What is your current unit?

A. I am assigned to 301<sup>st</sup> MP Co, 65<sup>th</sup> Reserve Support Command (RSC), Fort Buchanan, PR 00934.

Q. How long have you been assigned at that unit?

A. I have been assigned to that unit since November 2001.

Q. What is your current position at that unit?

A. I was promoted while the unit was deployed so I am currently a regular team member.

Q. Were you deployed to Iraq?

A. Yes I was. I was deployed with the 443<sup>rd</sup> MP Company from May 2003 through December 2003. We were there for six months only.

Q. Were you involved with detainee operations in Iraq?

A. Yes, I was involved in detainee operations while deployed to Iraq.

Q. Were you assigned to the Baghdad Correctional Confinement Detention Facility?

A. Yes, I was assigned to the High Profile Area for the first two weeks of June 2003, then I was assigned to the Corps Holding Area from July 2003 through October 2003, when they closed the facility. The facility was located at the Baghdad International Airport.

Q. Do you know [REDACTED]

A. Yes, I know him. I first met [REDACTED] on February 2003, but there no interaction with him during that time and while the unit was deployed. While we were deployed we would see each other because the jail was not big, but there was really no interaction with him. He was assigned to a different squad over there. I really got to met [REDACTED] on February 2004 when we arrived from the deployment and he was working with us in a daily basis.

Q. Do you remember requesting assistance to [REDACTED] to remove a female prisoner from her cell, during the deployment?

A. I really never worked with females while I was there. There was a female tent over there and I was assigned only one time to that tent while I was there. On the day I was assigned to that tent I got sick and I had to leave because the doctor sent me to quarters. My sinuses were really bad. The only time I worked with females at the detention facility was during searches when they first came into the facility or when they were leaving the facility. Also, on one occasion I transported females to a nearby female and juvenile detention facility. I do not remember asking [REDACTED] for any assistance removing females from their cells. Further, the female population on that detention facility was very low. The most females we had at a time were ten. This was due to them being transported to the nearby female and juvenile detention facility.

Q. During your deployment to Iraq, did you witness any acts of abuse towards any detainees?

A. I never witnessed any acts of abuse towards detainees by anyone while I was deployed to Iraq. I did not witness any acts of abuse committed by [REDACTED] while we were deployed.

Q. Do you remember a female being placed on the ground "hog tied" and left in the sun for hours as punishment? [REDACTED]

A. No, I do not. I honestly doubt something like even happened. Again, leadership was always present there so somebody would have notice that.

Q. Did you witness any members of your unit taking photographs of detainees in humiliating positions?

A. I do not remember or witnessed anything like that. Again everybody knew from the beginning that it was against the Geneva Convention so I don't think anyone engaged in that type of conduct.

Q. Do you remember if [REDACTED] was alone with any females while working at the jail?

A. No. The controls were very strict over there. Males were not allowed to be alone with females. Besides you would have to be crazy to go to a tent by yourself without being armed. Detainees were very abusive at times over there. Juveniles were the most abusive detainees of all. Detainee also liked to fight with each other, so we kept control of the situation at all times. There were also riots when we arrived at that facility.

Q. Do you remember if [REDACTED] was suspected of detainee abuse at any time while you were assigned to 443<sup>rd</sup> MP Company?

A. No, I do not.

Q. Do you remember any incidents that would be misunderstood as abuse or assault towards a detainee by anyone?

A. No, I do not. We didn't mistreat anybody, the rules were very strict. The leadership was constantly checking the operations. It was mandatory to provide them with cigarettes, water, food, showers, shoes, jump suits for the prisoners that did not have any clothes, blankets, medical treatment, females and juveniles had cots and never sleep on the floor while there, etc. If somebody was sick with any condition, even a headache, they had a right to medical treatment. If someone was sick, two MPs would go get their food and provide it to them. Details by detainee were on a voluntary basis. Each cell had their latrine, which was emptied out every day. I honestly can not remember any acts that could be misunderstood. We took pride in what we did and I feel proud of our unit. Leadership; I think that was the most important factor, our leaders were there constantly supervising the operations. I think also that the fact that there were rumors about the company that was prior to us there mistreating detainees. Our leaders ensured that nothing wrong happened over there and further I think took all necessary measures to prevent this type of incident.

Q. What type of training did you receive to handle detainees?

A. We were at Fort Lee for about two and half months before we deployed and received constant training over there. We took courses on Geneva Convention over there, searches, etc. We even had a "mock up" prison facility there to train us in the daily operations of the jail. We were briefed on all the rules concerning the treatment of detainee, having common sense when dealing with detainees, safety, etc. We even simulated every aspect of our training with other MP companies. I feel very confident that the training was very good and sufficient to perform our duties with detainees.

A. I am a [REDACTED] at Fort Buchanan, PR.

While guarding detainees it was common practice to put them in the sun for a period of 15 to 20 minutes for disobeying an order from a guard, or creating a disturbance within the compound with other detainees. The detainees were never physically harmed during this practice.

assigned to the 443rd Military Police Company, I have been in 21 years as a Military Policeman. I was deployed to Operation Iraqi Freedom, my arrival into Baghdad was 5 June 2003 until about 17 November 2003. I was assigned to Camp Cropper, Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), Iraq. My duty was 3rd Platoon Sergeant, basically I worked as a duty officer in the CHA, Corp Holding Area. The duty officer oversaw the CHA, and acted as the "gopher" for all squad leaders working in the CHA. I did not work in the Interment facility directly, but we would over see the head counts, processing and updated the prisoner roster.

A: [REDACTED]
Q: Was there any written SOP or just standard practice when you arrived?
A: There were Memorandums in place, but no SOP's in place. There were rules of engagements, but as we set up, we began to write SOP's. The SOP's were written by the chain of command. We had input from squad leaders as they were the one's doing the day to day dealing with prisoners.
Q: What was the rule of placing detainees in the sun passed down from your supervisors?
A: The only reason they were placed in the sun, was to segregate them from other prisoners. You could not avoid the sun. Anytime they were out of the compound was in the sun. The main compound was built for 250 - 300 Prisoners, but it routinely went over 800. The highest we had at one time was 1,200 prisoners. We had people there, the longest was about 6 months.
Q: How long would you say this practice went on, while you were there?
A: Camp Cropper would transfer prisoners to Talil Aribase or Camp Bucca. When our prison would get over crowded we would transfer them out.
Q: How did the practice from a Supervisory standpoint place detainees in the sun start?
A: It was in place when we arrived. At that time the 115th Military Police Battalion was in charge of the facility.
Q: What made it stop?
A: There actually were several things happening to make it stop. My squad leaders would tell us that they were told to do place detainees in the sun and do other things by Military Intelligence and we ran those instructions up the chain, because we did not feel they were right. Our job was prisoner control and we did not train on some of the things that were being asked by MI.
Q: Did you discontinue the practice after that?
A: Yes, I did. Almost immediately MI started telling us the detainees were ours do with them what we wanted and this was because they knew we would not do some of the things they were asking.
Q: Was there always water available to detainees that were placed in the sun?
A: Yes, but some of the detainees would say that there was never enough water when they wanted it.
Q: With that form of punishment no longer used, what did you start using to maintain control of the detainees?
A: We would still use segregation and sit them down at our holding area.
Q: Can you explain the Taser gun use on detainees?
A: Every time the Taser gun was fired there was a report that had to be completed. The Gun had information that was downloaded to a computer showing how many times it was fired. To my knowledge the Taser gun was only used 3 times when I was on shift. The Gun would only be used by squad leaders who were trained and certified in their use and only to break up fights.
Q: Was any detainee ever harmed from being placed in the sun by anyone to your knowledge?
A: No.
Q: Can you tell me about the practice of "Hog Tying" a detainee in the sun?
A: The only time they would that is when the detainee was unruly and would not cooperate.

I was deployed to Iraq from about May 2003 until about December 2003. I worked at Camp Cropper, Baghdad International Airport, Baghdad, IZ. This was a detainee holding area, a place as a central holding area for the Baghdad Area. Any criminal was brought to us and held for about 72 hours, however the way things were backed up there, some stayed for a while. I cannot recall the Military Intelligence unit that was emplaced at Camp Cropper. I was assigned to 3rd Platoon, 2nd squad, B team. We had rotating shifts. In the beginning I worked QRF due to man power shortage. I also worked in the "Sally port", this is the entrance to the holding area. When prisoners came in, they were first taken into the warehouse area, then screened by MI. This process took as long, determined on how many prisoners they had at this time. Sometimes 5 or 20 Prsioners would come in. The prisoners were brought in by various MP, Infantry and Special Forces.

Q. SA [REDACTED]

A. [REDACTED]

Q. Did you witness [REDACTED] abuse any detainees, specifically when he attempted to cuff a female detainee and place her in the sun?

A. I do not recall that. But, I would not think an attempt would be abuse.

Q. Did you witness any other detainee abuse?

A. I did not think I saw anything that was unlawful. Meaning, if a detainee got out of line or had to be punished. Sometimes they would be placed out in the sun. We were required to always to give them water. Only 15 minutes was about the time frame they would be placed in the sun. I did not care for the set up of the camp as it was unclear. I do not recall witnessing anything that did not seem right. I am not aware this was in the SOP.

Q. Were there SOP's in place?

A. Yes there were. We were briefed on them and probably did read them, but I cannot recall the details of the SOP's at this time. At this point it all runs together.

Q. If a soldier acted improperly or abusive to a detainee what procedures were followed to report the incident?

A. I never came across any issues that pertain to that. If I did then would notify the chain of command.

Q. What type of scenario would a detainee be punished for?

A. Fighting. Not fighting guards, but each other. I recall an incident when the prisoners were throwing trash and had to be separated. I feel we had a good company. For the most part what I saw, it was drilled down our throats on War crimes.

Q. Do you know who [REDACTED]

A. I do not know a [REDACTED]. But there was a [REDACTED], white male, 5'6", that would be the closest name I can think of. I did not work with him, [REDACTED] was in 2nd Platoon.

Q. Do you know [REDACTED]?

A. Not [REDACTED], but [REDACTED], black male, 5'6". I think [REDACTED] was in 1st Platoon.

Q. Why would [REDACTED] alleged you witnessed [REDACTED] abuse a detainee?

A. I honestly do not believe [REDACTED] would make that up, but I do not recall anything like that occurring. I worked mainly days, I cannot recall ever working nights. I think it was 2nd Platoon that worked nights.

Q. Can you explain "hog tying"?

A. To me, "hog tying" would be arms behind the back and feet. I never did this, I never felt the need to. This would be done for the purpose of a detainee fighting as a controlling purpose, or if they were going to lash out at somebody. Maybe for throwing rocks, in order to cease them from hurting someone.

Q. Was placing a detainee in the sun a normal practice?

A. Yes. It was a temporary punishment. On the average, when my unit first arrived there were over 1,000 prisoners. There were about 22 to 25 soldiers during the day shift watching these prisoners. That is not including the tower guards, they were a different unit. When we first arrived the 115th MP Battalion was the unit we were taking over for and they did a train-up for us. The first couple of weeks I was doing the QRF duty.

A more thorough search. They would sit in holding. They would have to go to medical to get checked. Then forwarded to their cell.

Q. Was you Chain of Command approachable about reporting abuse?

A. Yes.

Q. Do you know [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]?

A. Yes. [REDACTED], white male, 5' 8" or 5' 10", brown hair. He was in 2nd Platoon. [REDACTED], white female, blonde hair, 5' 4 to 5' 6", she was in Headquarters Platoon. She was our unit NBC NCOIC.

A. I had a good platoon and I do not see people trying to get anyone in trouble or hide what occurred. I never witnessed anything I would consider human rights violation. I never witnessed a detainee being hurt by anybody.

 I was deployed to Iraq from about 6 May 03 until I was medivac on 6<sup>th</sup> August. So only four months. I worked at Camp Cropper, Baghdad International Airport, IZ. I worked compound security and military Police in general. I mainly worked the night shift from 1800 until 0600 or 2200 until 0600, it depended on manpower. I never witnessed any detainee abuse. I was inv. Investigated by my unit for Prisoner Mistreatment.

Q. Please explain?

A. I was charge assaulting a prisoner by hitting him in the testicles, keeping him wake all night. I do not know who reported the incident and I deny it ever happened. I never abused anyone. I hogtied one prisoner who attempted to bite or fight a fellow soldier. The prisoner I believe was on some illicit drug. I assisted tying him up, and he kept dragging himself even when he was all tied up.

Q. Name 3 reasons why a prisoner was tied up?

A. For our safety, some tried running through the barbwire, for their safety. I only hog-tied one detainee while in the holding area. All prisoners were treated well. They got food, water, 6 cigarettes a day and carpets in their tents.

Q. What specifically happened regarding the incident when [redacted] and yourself were investigated for detainee abuse?

A. They were all separate incidents. [redacted] urinated on a detainee. Myself was investigated for detainee abuse involving a prisoner we suspected of bringing drugs into the compound. I was working a night shift and we had a snitch in the cage and that person told us who had drugs. I do not remember the detainee. We did find pills in the urinal area of the compound cage.

Q. During the time the detainees was out of his cell, was he taken down or hog tied?

A. I do not remember if he was. But if he did get up we probably flexi cuffed him.

 A: I was not there when that incident occurred. I heard about the incident, but I cannot recall being there.  
 Q: Can you tell me about an incident where you were talking with [REDACTED] about hitting a detainee?  
 A: I do not know anything about that. I never talked to [REDACTED] about anything like that. I only knew him from the Dining Facility. He was assigned to the 115<sup>th</sup> MP BN, and we never discussed those type of issues with them.  
 Q: Did you ever have to hit a detainee for any reason?  
 A: No, I was not that kind of person or MP with them. The only thing I ever had to do was put a detainee on the ground, who refused to comply to our instructions.

I, [REDACTED] want to make the following statement under oath:

I arrived at Camp Cropper, Baghdad, Iraq, mid May 2003. I was assigned as the Military Police Shift Supervisor. I worked the night shift primarily. I left Camp Cropper early Nov 2003.

Q: There is an allegation that you allowed an 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne soldier into an area of the Sally Port on the Night shift to abuse a detainee, is that true?

A: No, it was not an 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne soldier, it was another MP, who's unit was dropping prisoners. I let this soldier in that was pulling security on his detainees that they were dropping off. While they were dropping of the detainees I had to go up front with another soldier, as the NCOIC I had to make sure the paperwork was correct and completed. While I was verifying the paperwork the other soldiers down in the compound told that they were going to check on drugs in the compound and I told them go ahead. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] brought up a detainee and they began to search him up front. [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] had to go back down to the compound, so the soldier that was guarding the detainees asked if he could help. I asked him if he was an MP and he said yes. I told him that you know the rules arm bars and pressure points are the only thing to be used. He said "Roger that Sergeant". The soldier went over and assisted [REDACTED] I continued verifying the paperwork with the other soldier. I would not have allowed a soldier to abuse a detainee and we were also under the watch of the tower guards, who would report anything that they thought was abuse. I believe the unit that ran the towers was the 186<sup>th</sup> Military Police Company.

Q: When [REDACTED] was searching the detainee was he abusing the detainee by conducting an improper search or hitting the detainee in the testicles?

A: [REDACTED] was conducting a proper search, but he may have been conducting the search with a little too much pressure, but I was not there holding the detainee up either. The detainee was falling all over [REDACTED] while he was conducting the search.

Q: What time of day was it when the search was being conducted by [REDACTED]

A: It was late night early morning.

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Q: Where was the soldier that volunteered to assist [REDACTED] and what was he doing during the search of the detainee?

A: He stood behind he detainee holding his arms up and he was also holding the detainee behind the neck or holding his hair.

Q: What was the soldiers name or unit?

A: I do not recall his name, but he was with a unit out of California. They were Military Police and had armbands. I do not know if they all had armbands.

Q: To your knowledge was there any abuse that took place during that incident?

A: I would not say any abuse took place.

Q: Did an 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne soldier come to you in the prison and asked to get at a detainee, who had recently killed a 82<sup>nd</sup> airborne soldier?

A: There was an incident where 82<sup>nd</sup> airborne soldiers dropped off some detainees that had just killed some of their guys and they were pretty fired up, but it had nothing to do with the guy I let into the compound. I never let an 82<sup>nd</sup> airborne soldier in to beat up or abuse a detainee. 82<sup>nd</sup> airborne soldier do go into the compound, but I believe they were logistics or intelligence.

Q: Did you witness [REDACTED] urinate on a detainee?

A: No, I did not, I was off that evening. I heard that [REDACTED] had put [REDACTED] up to urinate on a detainee. I do not know if it happens or not. I over heard [REDACTED] say she saw it happen.

Q: Do you have any knowledge of [REDACTED] placing a detainee in the sun for hours as a disciplinary measure?

A: I do not know anything about that. He was in another platoon. It was common practice to separate detainees and that was either in the tent or out in the sun.

Q: Do you know which military intelligence unit was working Camp Cropper when you were there?

A: No, I do not know, they did not wear any nametags.

Q: Were your chain of command aware of the practices and some of the abuses that was on going?

A: Yes, because sometime they would dictate certain procedures on prisoner treatment. I do not believe they provided enough command oversight and really did not come down to the area, as they should. There was no AAR or NCOOP to review and determine what was working and what needed improving.

Q: Did you ever report any detainee abuse to your chain of command that was not addressed by them appropriately?

A: I said to my chain of command that we need to have SOP's and access rosters. The SOP was eventually put together and we never got an access roster. I never saw anything that was out of control that required reporting to the chain of command.

Q: Did you observe at anytime [REDACTED] hitting, kicking or grabbing the testicles of the detainee he was searching for drugs?

A: I recall seeing his hands going up into the detainee groin area, but he was not grabbing the detainee's testicles. The soldier that was assisting [REDACTED] had the detainee collar area, which could from a distance look like he was holding the detainee's hair. [REDACTED] was yelling and cursing at the detainee, but at no time did I observe

I, [REDACTED] want to make the following statement under oath:  
I arrived at Camp Cropper, Baghdad, Iraq in early May 2003 and left early Nov 2003. I was initially a driver and then became a military police detainee guard in the Sally Port and prison area. I worked primarily the day shift.

Q: Was there ever any reason you had to "Hog Tie" a detainee?  
A: No never "Hog Tying", but once a detainee was causing problems in the detainee area I was in, he was trying to start a riot. We removed him from his cell, got him outside of the cell area he took a swing at me and I had to place him on the ground and restrain him with flex cuffs. I placed cuffs on his wrist and once we got him to the holding area he continued to be disruptive, so we had to place cuffs on his legs.

Q: Was there ever a time you had to restrain a female detainee?  
A: Yes, I was assisting [REDACTED], who requested my assistance in securing a female detainee that was inciting other female detainees. They did not want to have anything to do with her. [REDACTED] went into the detainee area and I followed her in to get the female out. Once we began bringing her out, we took her to the holding area and [REDACTED] placed handcuffs on her. We did not place her on the ground or so-called "Hog Tied" her.

Q: What is the meaning of "Hog Tied" to you?  
A: To me it is when you have the feet of a person restrained to their wrist, similar to western movies.

Q: Did you ever place a female detainee in the sun for hours as a disciplinary measure?  
A: No, I never placed a female in the sun for hours. There was a time when we first arrived we placed a male detainee in the sun for about an hour. We gave water during the time. Later, it was determined that placing them in the sun was unacceptable, so we discontinued the practice.

Q: Did you ever witness any detainee being abused by either [REDACTED] or any other member of the 443<sup>rd</sup> MP Co?  
A: I witnessed detainees being restrained but never abused, liked being punched or kicked.

No restrains were applied to the detainee when I saw this. I was running detainees to their cells when this was going on, so he could have hog-tied the detainee without my knowledge. I was processing detainees, which took about 10-15 minutes per detainee.

A: Yes, I placed my hands on her grabbing her to pull her back. I placed my hands on her right arm above the elbow.

Q: Did [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] witness you handcuff a female and place a female in the sun for hours?

A: The only time I can recall is when [REDACTED] and I removed the female detainee from the cell area and placed in the holding area. We may have had her in the sun for about 15 minutes.

Q: What was the normal procedure when placing a detainee in the sun as a disciplinary measure?

A: When we first got there you would place them in the sun either sitting or kneeling for about 10-15 minutes. We would also make sure they had water during this time. If they asked for water we would make sure we got it for them.

Q: How many detainees would you say was at Camp Cropper that you were guarding?

A: About 800-900 individuals on average. At times it would get up higher when we were not able to transfer detainees out.

Q: What instructions were you given by your chain of command on how to treat detainees?

A: We were told to treat detainees like we would want to be treated and to ensure that they had the basic needs, water, food and shelter. We were to respect their religious beliefs. Were also told about the use of force, where physically force was the last resort.

Q: Do you know what MI unit was working the area?

A: I really do not know.

Q: If you had to segregate a detainee where would you take him or her?

A: We would remove them from main detainee and them up to the holding area.

I was deployed to Camp Cropper, Baghdad, Iraq, from about March 03 until about November 04. I worked the night shift at Camp Cropper Prisoner Corp holding area. My job was military police team leader, I rotated in the sallyport, holding area, compound guard and medical escort. But I mainly worked the night shift.

Q. Did you encourage [REDACTED] to urinate on a detainee?  
A. I did not think so, I was joking with him. He would never do that, it is not in his character.

Q. There is an allegation that you encouraged [REDACTED] to urinate on a detainee? Is this true?  
A. No. I lived with [REDACTED] outside the military for more than a year as a roommate. I believe anything I say to him, he would not take out of context to do. Yes, the prisoners came in and [REDACTED] stated he had to goto the bathroom. I remember this incident. It was late at night, maybe early hours of the morning. I think it was the [REDACTED] who had brought prisoners in that night. I think it was two male prisoners, in their underwear with sandbags over their heads. I was talking with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] came upto us and said he had to urinate. I said jokingly, "Why don't you go piss on those guys". I said it one time, no more than that. I did not witness him urinate on the detainees, but I heard the sound of urine hitting concrete. He was in the vicinity of the prisoners, he was about 2 feet from the prisoners, but he was about 25 feet away from me.

Briefing every night before shift. No soldier should be able to say there was no SOP at Camp Cropper. When we first arrived there was Chaos. But after about a month or two the SOP came out and was followed. During that time we trained and shadowed the 115<sup>th</sup> MP Battalion. After [REDACTED] urinated he came back to where I was talking with [REDACTED], I said to him something to the effect, "What were you doing over there"? I do not recall him replying. However the next day, I think our room or chow, we shared the same room. [REDACTED] brought it up and said he did not really urinate on the detainees, I do not think I said anything, because I do not think he would do it. I do not see him doing that. [REDACTED], to write a statement concerning [REDACTED] urinating, approached me, he was the investigating officer. He asked me questions and I wrote a statement. I do not know where the statement is now. I think [REDACTED] was demoted to SPC and extra duty. He had to clean latrines for a couple weeks and extra duty jobs. He also lost pay.

Q. Did [REDACTED] assault a detainee with an unidentified soldier, which [REDACTED] allowed to enter the Sally port? Do you recall this incident?

A. I recall seeing the interaction from the holding area. I did not see anything that would demonstrate abuse or mistreatment of a prisoner. It just looked like a soldier helping [REDACTED] processing a prisoner, because he had a couple of prisoners, because you cannot have that many prisoners versus three soldiers. I remember the guy giving up his weapon to go inside. I think it was a pistol. He did not charge in there and grab the detainee.

Q. When you said to [REDACTED] to urinate on the prisoners, what was your intentions?

A. It was a joke. My frame of mind, it was a quiet night bullshitting and talking in a group. [REDACTED] was not acting any different than he normally did. That is what we did to get by, we joked around a lot. I do not know if he did it to be cool.

A. I cannot recall, but roughly 1800 until 0500 or 0600, it was basically from dusk till dawn.

  - c. (For personnel subject to the UCMJ) "You have the right to talk privately to a lawyer before, during, and after questioning and to have a lawyer present with you during questioning. This lawyer

can be a civilian you arrange for at no expense to the Government or a military lawyer detailed for you at no expense to you, or both."

(For civilians not subject to the UCMJ) You have the right to talk privately to a lawyer before, during, and after questioning and to have a lawyer present with you during questioning. This lawyer can be one you arrange for at your own expense, or if you cannot afford a lawyer and want one, a lawyer will be appointed for you before any questioning begins."

- d. "If you are now willing to discuss the offense(s) under investigation, with or without a lawyer present, you have a right to stop answering questions at any time, or speak privately with a lawyer before answering further, even if you sign a waiver certificate."

Make certain the suspect/accused fully understands his/her rights.

THE WAIVER

"Do you understand your rights?"

(If the suspect/accused says "no," determine what is not understood, and if necessary repeat the appropriate rights advisement. If the suspect/accused says "yes," ask the following question.)

"Have you ever requested a lawyer after being read your rights?"

(If the suspect/accused says "yes," find out when and where. If the request was recent (i.e., fewer than 30 days ago), obtain legal advice whether to continue the interrogation. If the suspect/accused says "no," or if the prior request was not recent, ask him/her the following question.)

"Do you want a lawyer at this time?"

(If the suspect/accused says "yes," stop the questioning until he/she has a lawyer. If the suspect/accused says "no," ask him/her the following question.)

"At this time, are you willing to discuss the offense(s) under investigation and make a statement without talking to a lawyer and without having a lawyer present with you?" (If the suspect/accused says "no," stop the interview and have him/her read and sign the non-waiver section of the waiver certificate on the other side of this form. If the suspect/accused says "yes," have him/her read and sign the waiver section of the waiver certificate on the other side of this form.)

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

WHEN SUSPECT/ACCUSED REFUSES TO SIGN WAIVER CERTIFICATE: If the suspect/accused orally waives his/her rights but refuses to sign the waiver certificate, you may proceed with the questioning. Make notations on the waiver certificate to the effect that he/she has stated that he/she understands his/her rights, does not want a lawyer, wants to discuss the offense(s) under investigation, and refuses to sign the waiver certificate.

2. If the suspect/accused was questioned as such either without being advised of his/her rights or some question exists as to the propriety of the first statement, the accused must be so advised. The office of the serving Staff Judge Advocate should be contacted for assistance in drafting the proper rights advisal.

NOTE: If 1 or 2 applies, the fact that the suspect/accused was advised accordingly should be noted in the comment section on the waiver certificate and initialed by the suspect/accused.

WHEN SUSPECT/ACCUSED DISPLAYS INDECISION ON EXERCISING HIS OR HER RIGHTS DURING THE INTERROGATION PROCESS: If during the interrogation, the suspect displays indecision about requesting counsel (for example, "Maybe I should get a lawyer."), further questioning must cease immediately. At that point, you may question the suspect/accused only concerning whether he or she desires to waive counsel. The questioning may not be utilized to discourage a suspect/accused from exercising his/her rights. (For example, do not make such comments as "If you didn't do anything wrong, you shouldn't need an attorney.")

Q. When were you first briefed on your mission for Camp Cropper?  
A. I was first briefed on my mission on or about 7 Jun 03.  
Q. What guidelines did you provide to your soldiers and senior NCO's regarding the treatment of Enemy Prisoners of War?  
A. During regular drill period, at Fort Lee, during mobilization and once in Kuwait we either received or conducted rules of engagement, Geneva Convention and treatment of EPW training, plus the SOP given at Camp Cropper. Myself, [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] (they were my platoon leaders), developed an SOP based on the mission we had at hand. We then gave it out to the platoon leaders and they conducted training within their platoons.  
Q. Did you instruct your NCO's or Platoon Leaders to conduct training on the Geneva Convention?  
A. Yes  
Q. Was any training conducted?  
A. Yes, I witnessed the training  
Q. When did you first become aware of the detainee abuses, and what were your actions?  
A. The first time I received any word of detainee abuse at Camp Cropper was on or around the second week of Jul 03. It involved [REDACTED], it was reported to me that [REDACTED] had urinated on or near a detainee that was under his control. I immediately appointed [REDACTED] to take statements and conduct an investigation. Immediately after I got him started on that I went to my Battalion Commander [REDACTED], 115th MP Battalion, I notified him of the incident and the actions I had started. I removed [REDACTED] from his duties involving direct contact with detainees.  
Q. What date did you create an SOP and how long was it after your unit assumed the mission?  
A. Not long after we started the mission and realized the existing SOP's were non sufficient. It took us several weeks to fine tune it. It was within the first month of my unit's arrival which was Jun 03.  
Q. Whom did you inform in your chain of command about the detainee abuse incidents and was there a report generated?  
A. I notified [REDACTED], my Battalion Commander, a report was generated by [REDACTED] after statements were taken from witnesses. The incident was founded and a field grade Article 15 was the outcome. I originally recommended that it go to Court Martial. It went through the 115th to the 800th MP BN, [REDACTED], who forwarded it to CFFLC, and multiple weeks later, the recommendation came back that we do a Field Grade Article 15.  
Q. How many times during an average week would you visit Camp Cropper and what were your actions?  
A. I lived at Camp Cropper, I visited the holding area multiple times daily. I would walk the perimeter and speak to the soldier, I would inspect the conditions of the cells and prisoners and attempt to solve whatever problems I could. Most nights I would go to the prison at night to do a perimeter walk to ensure nothing inappropriate or dangerous was going on. I did not witness any incidents of detainee abuse during my visits.  
Q. Did you conduct daily meetings with your senior NCO's and did these briefs include abuse of the detainees?  
A. For the first couple of months I conducted daily briefings with my platoon sergeants, platoon leaders and unit staff. Around Sep 03, we started to conduct them every other day. The [REDACTED] incidents were the only ones discussed during these meetings.  
Q. Of the soldiers that were determined to have committed assaults upon Iraqi detainees, what action did you take?  
A. [REDACTED], was given a field grade Article 15, [REDACTED], Article 15 paperwork was prepared. He developed a medical condition which required him to be shipped to Germany. He never returned to us in Iraq, and was transferred back to Fort Lee. He was sent to Germany roughly two weeks after the incident, I did not get a chance to take any action against him due to his leaving theatre. He was transferred from my command to a Fort Lee Garrison Company once he got to Fort Lee. I was told by the Adjutant General at Fort Lee to take him off my roles. I held onto the Article 15, in case he came back to Iraq. He was put back on my roles the day we left Fort Lee after the deployment. When I turned command over to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] the paperwork for [REDACTED] was transferred to him also and was only on active duty with the 443rd for one day. In any case of suspected abuse I would appoint one of my platoon leaders to do an investigation. I also notified [REDACTED] of the incidents. I also removed them from their positions of working with detainees until the matter was adjudicated.

Q. Why did you not forward the appropriate paperwork to have [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] reduced as indicated by internal documents?

A. I do not know who [REDACTED] is, he was not one of my soldiers. We did forward the proper paperwork for [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. It was forwarded 3 times, first to 1st Armored Division, the second time was when we got back to Kuwait after the deployment, it was a Puerto Rican finance company, the 3rd was when we got back to Fort Lee, we checked the system the actions had still not taken place so we submitted it again. [REDACTED] submitted the paperwork.

Q. Did you look the other way when advised of detainee abuse?

A. No

Q. How many soldiers, and who reported detainee abuse incidents to you?

A. I was notified of 3 soldiers involved in detainee abuse incidents, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. I don't recall who the first person was that reported it to me. I received information from [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED], I don't remember who came to me first or when they came to me. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] are both with the 443rd still and [REDACTED] is part of the 3/312th Training Support Battalion. I was notified within 24 hours of the alleged incidents.

Q. What were your documented actions to address these incidents?

A. The Article 15's on [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], the investigations I appointed my platoon leaders to initiate, my notifications to [REDACTED] and the removal of the soldiers from duties involving the detainees, and the initiation of the Article 15 on [REDACTED].

Q. Were you aware of any fraternization or other misconduct that contributed to the abuse incidents in your unit?

A. I was not aware of any

Q. How long were you knowledgeable of MI personnel instructing your soldiers to "soften up" or "rough up" certain detainees for interrogation?

A. I was not aware of any instruction by MI personnel to rough up or soften up detainees for interrogation. I was made aware of MI personnel's request that we assist with sleep deprivation. I refused to allow my soldiers to assist with that process. The issue of soldiers assisting with sleep deprivation was taken to [REDACTED] and he concurred with my decision.

Q. Who in your upper chain of command did you report matters of detainee abuse to and what were you instructed?

A. I reported all incidents of abuse to [REDACTED] and was instructed to proceed with my chosen actions to initiate the investigations and later initiate the Article 15's.

Q. Were you asked to do anything that was inappropriate?

A. Other than the sleep deprivation, I was not asked to do anything that I felt was inappropriate.

Q. What was your official position in Iraq at Camp Cropper?

A. Company Commander, 443rd Military Police Company

Q. When did you arrive and when did you leave the country?

A. We arrived in Kuwait 15 May 03, arrived in Baghdad 5 Jun 03, we arrived back to Kuwait in late Nov 03, and departed Kuwait for Fort Lee in early Dec 03

Q. Name your upper chain of command up to [REDACTED]

A. [REDACTED]

Q. Was there written guidance in place when your unit took over the mission at Camp Cropper?

A. We received a copy of the 115th MP BN's SOP which was insufficient so my platoon leaders and I developed a new SOP which was later adopted by the 115th MP BN into their own SOP

Q. Where are the written guidelines, SOP, provided by the Battalion and Brigade regarding treatment of detainees?

A. I do not have a copy of any Battalion or Brigade SOP currently.

Q. Who instituted the guidance?

A. I don't know who instituted the 115th's SOP, it was given to me by [REDACTED], the Battalion S-3. After we developed our own SOP I disseminated it to my platoon leaders who either trained the soldiers or had the squad leaders train the soldiers on the SOP.

Q. When did you first become aware of the first detainee abuse incident?

A. All the incidents were around the same time frame, I do not remember the exact dates but they roughly occurred in Jul 03, I believe, since I cannot remember the exact dates I cannot say with certainty.

A. I was not given a specific guidance to report the incidents but I felt ethically required to and reported all incidents to [REDACTED]



The following statement is in response to questions regarding an incident of detainee abuse that occurred at Camp Cropper, Iraq.

To the best of my recollection [REDACTED] Commander, 443rd MP Company reported an alleged case of detainee abuse to me regarding a [REDACTED], 443rd MP Company. I cannot recall the date. [REDACTED] was accused of urinating on a detainee who was awaiting inprocessing. I do not recall whether I initiated a commander's inquiry or investigation. I do not remember if I reported the incident to [REDACTED] or if it was reported to the Brigade JAG Officer [REDACTED] through the JAG Officer supporting the 115th MP Bn. The incident was obviously reported to [REDACTED] because she assigned [REDACTED] as the Investigating Officer. He recommended that [REDACTED] receive a Field Grade Article 15 because the investigation revealed that [REDACTED] urinated near, but not on, the detainee. I punished [REDACTED] as recommended. I do not recall the punishment.

The following statement is in response to the question regarding my knowledge of prisoners being placed in the sun for hours, and whether I condoned that act:

I did not condone the act of placing prisoners in the sun for extended periods of time, nor am I aware of any occasion where this was done for an unreasonable period of time, and certainly not for hours at a time. Such an act would be contrary to common sense, as the other detainees would understandably become upset if someone were treated in such a manner in full view, possibly leading to further unrest. Additionally, there was insufficient MP manpower available to dedicate an MP to guard one individual any longer than absolutely necessary. These facts notwithstanding, upon becoming aware that detainees had alleged to the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) that this act had occurred, I ensured that shelter was erected in the sally port area of the Corps Holding Area where detainees would be held in the shade pending reassignment to another compound. On numerous occasions I personally witnessed compound guards giving water to restrained detainees in this situation until those detainees were reassigned to a different compound.

The following statement is in response to the question of whether I directed any specific training after becoming aware of incidents of abuse:

The International Committee of the Red Cross [REDACTED] Report is attached.

I assessed the few cases of abuse that occurred at Camp Cropper as breaches of individual discipline as opposed to lack of training, and administered punishment accordingly. I directed throughout the deployment that the JAG officer supporting the battalion train the guard force frequently (usually weekly at shift changes) on the rules of engagement and use of force standards in effect, which they did. Independent observations by the ICRC confirms my effectiveness on this issue.

Q: What were the circumstances surrounding the use of the tazer in this incident?  
A: The detainee that [redacted] used the tazer on was fully combative and had a history disturbances. Earlier this same detainee assaulted a Military Police Officer. The tazer was used for officer safety only. [redacted] hit the detainee with a dry stun. After being hit the detainee continued to be combative. At that time the detainee was placed in handcuffs.

Q: Why would [redacted] have considered the use inappropriate?  
A: [redacted] was a very bitter person who felt like he was being over looked for promotion intentionally. He felt he was not being treated with the proper amount of respect due to his age. Although I will say he was a good soldier.

Q: What knowledge do you have pertaining to detainee abuse at Camp Cropper, to include "sun punishment"?  
A: I never saw any abuse. As a matter a fact they need to use this unit as an example as to what went right over there. As far as "sun punishment" my perception, it wasn't punishment because all of us where in the sun. There were times where a detainee was taken out of compound due to the detainee causing disturbances and they needed to be removed from general population for their safety and/or for the safety of the other detainee's as well as for the safety of the entire compound.

Q: So you never saw any detainee being overly exposed to the sun?  
A: We had a time limit that the detainee's where allowed to be out in the sun. I think it was an hour. There was a policy that we had to follow regarding detainees in the sun. It was never used as a punishment. It was used to defuse a situation. Detainee's where removed from the compound and placed where there was a guard or the holding area till the situation could be resolved.

Q: Did you ever have any type of formal training on the use of the tazer?  
A: Yes, we where certified by an instructor from the Military Police School. In order to carry the tazer we first had to attend the class and be hit with the tazer in order to know how it worked and felt.

Q: Did you know the Camp Cropper SOP on the use of the tazer?  
A: Yes. I really can't recall the tazer being used very often, and the times I do remember the tazer being used it was always used as a last resort.

Q: Do you have anything else you'd like to add to this statement?  
A: I know my Platoon usually maintained pretty high standards for our soldiers conduct. That if any issues did arise our chain of command was more then supportive.

What was your unit in Iraq? The 800<sup>th</sup> Military Police Brigade.

What was your duty position in Iraq? Staff Judge Advocate.

Where were you stationed in Iraq? Camp Victory near Baghdad.

Did you receive a recommendation for court-martial for any of the 15-6 investigation subjects from [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]? I do not recall the names, but I do remember discussing a 15-6 involving two separate allegations of detainee abuse with both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. One involved a soldier allegedly urinating on or near a detainee and the other involved soldiers (one unidentified) using excessive force on a detainee. There was at least one soldier (one of the soldiers identified as using excessive force) they each initially wished to recommend be sent to a BCD Special Court-Martial. I advised [REDACTED] that before preferring any charges I wanted to feel out the 377<sup>th</sup> TSC and CFLCC SJA offices on how they felt because the CFLCC had reserved Special and General Court-Martial authority. [REDACTED] (the SJA for the 377<sup>th</sup> TSC) and I believe [REDACTED] (the Acting SJA for CFLCC) each indicated they would recommend any of those cases be returned to the 800<sup>th</sup> MP BDE for handling at our level (meaning nonjudicial punishment). I informed [REDACTED] of this fact, and indicated it was unlikely CFLCC would go against his SJA, but he could still forward the cases with a court-martial recommendation. He opted to handle the cases with field grade Article 15s. I do not recall any recommendation for court-martial ever being forwarded from [REDACTED] or [REDACTED].

What documentation did you receive from [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] pertaining to the detainee abuse? I had the 15-6 investigation and a CID report on unrelated allegations for one of the soldiers. Do you still have the documentation? No, but my Deputy [REDACTED] may have copies of some of the e-mail traffic between our section and higher level SJAs on these cases.

What was your legal opinion of the subjects of the 15-6? I had the opinion the AR 15-6 was legally sufficient, but recommended asking CID to open a case to see if they could ID a subject the IO could not identify. CID declined to open a case.

Did you agree or disagree with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] recommendations? I agreed with the recommendations for UCMJ action, and also agreed that at least one of the soldiers should have gone to Court-Martial. When that soldier was titled under a separate CID investigation with wrongfully appropriating and trying to mail home an M-4 receiver group (taken from a [REDACTED] soldier in Coalition custody) I spent the better part of a day with [REDACTED] at Camp

Cropper to personally draft charges. However, when I sent the draft to the 377<sup>th</sup> TSC and CFLCC SJA offices they again opined that they saw NJP as more appropriate.

Why did you agree (or disagree) with the recommendations? I thought the misconduct was sufficiently serious to warrant UCMJ action and that at least the soldier who committed additional misconduct merited a court-martial. I also agreed with [REDACTED] decision to ultimately go with NJP due to the likelihood of the cases being delayed and returned for action after [REDACTED] Company (which was pending redeployment) had already left Theater as this could have resulted in problems with proving the case even at an Article 15. I kept [REDACTED] informed and she did not directly speak to [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] on the cases to avoid any appearance of unlawful command influence. She told me she would have recommended court-martial if [REDACTED] had forwarded the case to her with that recommendation, but agreed with his decision for Article 15s for the same reasons outlined above.

Were the 15-6 recommendations forwarded higher up the chain of command? Yes. Who were the results forwarded to? I sent them to the 377<sup>th</sup> TSC and CFLCC SJA offices when I made the pitch for court-martial.

Were any recommendations for court-martial made on any of the subjects? See statements above. If so, were any recommendations for court-martial downgraded to an Article 15? See statements above. If so, who made the decision to downgrade and why? See statements above.

How many 15-6 investigations from Camp Cropper did you review? I do not recall the exact #. I would estimate 10 to 12 with the majority arising out of events occurring when the 18<sup>th</sup> MP BDE controlled Cropper.

Did you ever discuss the 15-6 investigation with [REDACTED] (the investigating officer)? I do not recall that name. The investigating officer I remember doing the case (who I did coordination with) was [REDACTED]. It is possible that there was an investigation done under the 18<sup>th</sup> MP BDE and we did not know about it or found it insufficient. What did you discuss? When I spoke to [REDACTED] we discussed the scope of his investigation, and when he needed to inform soldiers of their Article 31 rights. We also discussed his attempts to identify the other soldier allegedly involved in the instance of excessive force on a detainee. It did not appear that soldier belonged to the 800<sup>th</sup> MP BDE or any subordinate unit, and [REDACTED] was at a dead end, but we were unable to get CID interested in opening a case.

What commanders did you coordinate with on the 15-6 investigation? [REDACTED] and I kept [REDACTED] informed. I think the 800<sup>th</sup> MP BDE provided [REDACTED] as the IO at [REDACTED] request.

A: To the best of my recollection... Commander, 443rd MP Company reported an alleged case of detainee abuse to me regarding a... 443rd MP Company. I cannot recall the date. ... was accused of urinating on a detainee who was awaiting inprocessing. I initiated an AR 15-6 investigation. During the course of the investigation I reported the incident to the 800th MP Brigade Commander, ... She decided at that point that a member of her staff would conduct the investigation, and she assigned ... as the Investigating Officer. The officer I had appointed from within my battalion turned over witness statements he had gathered to that point to ... who completed the investigation, and concluded that ... had urinated near, not on, the detainee. He recommended that ... be court martialed for the offense. Some time later, ..., the 800th MP Brigade JAG, informed me that the 377th TSC JAG advised that ... be given a Field Grade Article 15 instead of a court martial, which I did. I do not recall the punishment imposed.
Q. What were your normal procedures for reporting detainee abuse?
A. There was no formal procedure. When any situation requiring investigation was reported to me, I initiated a commander's inquiry or AR 15-6 investigation and appointed an officer outside of the affected company level chain of command as the investigating officer. In the few incidents involving alleged detainee abuse or serious incidents I verbally reported the incidents to the brigade commander (...).
Q. Were detainee abuse incidents required to be reported to the Combined Land Forces Component Command (CLFCC)?
A. I do not know.
Q. What JAG officer did you direct to train the guards?
A. Initially, ... was detailed by the 18th MP Brigade to directly support the 115th MP Bn. He developed and conducted the briefings. He was replaced by ..., who continued the briefings. Upon ... reassignment, several other JAG officers whose names I cannot recall were detailed to support the battalion.
Q. Was the practice of placing detainees in the sun as punishment utilized by the unit you replaced at Camp Cropper?
A. My unit established Camp Cropper - there were no units before us. We accepted detainees transferred from the 3rd MP Bn three days after arriving at Baghdad International Airport. I am unaware of any of the 3rd MP Bn's practices.
Q. Did your unit temporarily adopt the practice of sun-punishment after assuming control of Camp Cropper?
A. No. Any use of "sun-punishment" (exposing detainees to sunlight for the purpose of punishment) was not authorized by me.
Q. Did your unit discontinue the practice after utilizing it for a period of time? If so, why was it discontinued?
A. See answer to Previous question.
Q. Why do you think several soldiers have reported that short period sun-punishments (15-20 minutes) were a common practice at Camp Cropper?
A. I did not condone the act of placing prisoners in the sun for extended periods of time, nor am I aware of any occasion where this was done for an unreasonable period of time, and certainly not for hours at a time. Such an act would be contrary to common sense, as the other detainees would understandably become upset if someone were treated in such a manner in full view, possibly leading to further unrest. Additionally, there was insufficient MP manpower available to dedicate an MP to guard one individual any longer than absolutely necessary. These facts notwithstanding, ... ensured that shelter was erected in the sally port area of the Corps Holding Area where detainees would be held in the shade pending reassignment to another compound. Removing unruly detainees from the compound, restraining them, and having them sit or lie down on the ground was a measure used to maintain positive control of the detainee. I can see where the lower ranking MPs might have misconstrued this as punishment because they would perceive a cause and effect relationship. For example, "a prisoner attacked another detainee and therefore had to sit in the sun." There was insufficient space or manning to establish a separate holding area for unruly detainees; therefore placing them in the open area between the compounds was the most expedient option available until the detainee could be safely returned to his compound or reassigned to another one. I did my best to establish a command climate Camp Cropper that did not tolerate abuse. I believe I succeeded. Outside observers agreed.

Q: You are being shown a list of incidents provided by the requesting office, 00666-04-CID342-64142 Reported Incidents. The list is to be used for the next few questions.

Which of these incidents were reported to you?

I want to make the following statement under oath: I understand that on 17 Jun 05, I was advised of my rights by Special Agent Fort Belvoir, VA and I waived my rights on that day. I subsequently attempted to provide a sworn statement on 17 Jun 05; however, the computer SA was working on malfunctioned and the sworn statement was lost. I was re-advised of my rights again today and I again have waived my rights. I am providing the following information to SA but it was also discussed with SA on 17 Jun 05.

Q. What were your normal procedures for reporting detainee abuse incidents?

A. My normal procedures were to:

- 1. Remove the individual allegedly involved in the incident from duties that required direct involvement with detainees.
2. Initiate an investigation by appointing one of my Platoon Leaders or Platoon Sergeants as the investigating officer.
3. Notify my chain of command (either the Battalion Commander or his representative) of the alleged incident and the subsequent results of the investigation. I also conferred with my Battalion Commander regarding the appropriate UCMJ action for the soldier(s) involved.

Q. Were detainee abuse incidents required to be reported to the Combined Land Forces Component Command (CLFCC)?

A. I am not aware of the reporting requirements of my Battalion Commander and above my Battalion Commander.

Q. What is your knowledge regarding placing detainees in the sun as punishment?

A. I am not aware of nor was I notified of any incidents of using the sun or exposure to the elements as punishment. Our facility was built as a temporary Corps Holding Area. It consisted of nothing more than concertina wire compounds and tents. The facility was built to hold approximately 250 to 500 detainees at the most. At times, the numbers of detainees expanded to 1200 - 1500. Each of the compounds had tents to provide shade for the detainees, as did the Holding Area, In-processing Area, and Medical Area. When the population was high, there was not always an adequate amount of shade available. Units continually brought truckloads of detainees in to Camp Cropper throughout the day and night. Also, if there were significant disturbances within the individual compounds, some detainees would have to be segregated, at times, from the general detainee population. For example, significant disturbances included, but were not limited to, these following circumstances: 1)

if a detainee was unruly; 2) if a detainee was involved in a fight; 3) if a detainee refused commands from the guards; or 4) if a detainee was believed to be a danger to himself or others. In these cases, that detainee would be removed from the compound and segregated from the rest of the detainees. If detainees continued to resist once being removed from their compound or if they represented a flight risk or continued danger to themselves or others, they would be restrained, in accordance with the unit's Standard Operating Procedure (SOP), physically either with flexi-cuffs or hand irons. This was done to protect the MPs as well as the detainees. The only secure and appropriate place that we had to take detainees in these situations was the Holding Area. As mentioned before, the Holding Area had a single GP Medium tent that was used to provide shade to the detainees waiting to be in-processed. If there were a large number of detainees waiting for in-processing, then there was no room under the tent. At certain times of day, the tent didn't provide much shade either. At these times, the detainee being segregated for the above-referenced discipline problems may have sat in the sun without shade. I think it is important to point out that my MPs and I were in the sun, without any shade, at these times as well. I would also like to point out that the landscape of Camp Cropper, Iraq does not offer much shade from the sun. The intent of this practice was solely to segregate the unruly detainees from the general detainee population so that we could maintain order within the facility.

Q. Were their incidents of abuse involving this practice? If so, what were your actions?

A. I was not notified nor am I aware of any incidents involving this alleged practice.

Q. Was the practice of placing detainees in the sun as punishment utilized by the unit you replaced at Camp Cropper?

A. I do not know what practices the units working the CHA (Corps Holding Area) utilized before the 443<sup>rd</sup> MP Company arrived.

Q. Did your unit temporarily adopt the practice of sun-punishment after assuming control of Camp Cropper?

A. No.

Q. Did your unit discontinue the practice after utilizing it for a period of time? If so, why was it discontinued? How long was the practice in effect?

A. I am not aware of any practice of placing detainees in the sun as punishment taking place. It was not authorized or condoned by the unit's SOP or me.

Q. Why do you think several soldiers have reported that short period sun-punishments (15-20 minutes) were a common practice at Camp Cropper?

A. I can't speculate on statements that I have not had the opportunity to read. As previously indicated, I was not aware of nor was I notified of any incidents of the use of "sun-punishment" by my soldiers.

Q. In 2003, [REDACTED] handcuffed a detainee and placed him in the sun, was this reported to you?

A. This alleged incident was not reported to me and I am not aware of this alleged incident.

A. I am not aware of my Battalion Commander's reporting requirements or the reporting requirements above my Battalion. I do not know if this alleged incident was reported to CLFCC.

Q. In 2003, [REDACTED] tazed detainees for fighting each other, was this reported to you?

A. Yes. As I recall, this incident involved two detainees fighting each other. As it was reported to me by the Duty Officer, two detainees were fighting and one of the detainees began to repeatedly strike the other. In accordance with the unit's SOP, the MP compound guards ordered the detainees to stop fighting and warned them that additional force would be used if they did not comply. When both detainees failed to comply with the verbal order and one of the detainees was in danger of getting seriously injured, [REDACTED] utilized the M26 Tazer to subdue the attacking detainee. The Tazer was an approved Non-Lethal Weapon, otherwise known as an Intermediate Control Technique, which [REDACTED] and all of the CHA NCOICs and most of the Company Leadership had been qualified on while in theatre. The unit's SOP authorized the use of the M26 Tazer. Once the detainee had been subdued and serious bodily injury had been prevented, both detainees were taken to the Medical Tent to be treated for minor injuries. Based upon the facts as reported to me by the Duty Officer, I determined that [REDACTED] had acted appropriately and utilized the proper escalation of the levels of force available to him and concluded that no detainee abuse had occurred.

Q. On 5 Jul 03, [REDACTED] struck a detainee and grabbed his testicles, [REDACTED] failed to intervene in the incident, was it reported to you?

A. Yes, this incident was reported to me. Please refer to my previous statement given on 21 Jan 05. My recollection of the incident was that [REDACTED] witnessed the incident and did attempt to stop [REDACTED]. The incident was then reported to me and [REDACTED] was removed from his duties involving direct contact with detainees and an investigation was initiated. My Battalion leadership was notified and once the results of the investigation were complete; Article 15 paperwork was prepared on [REDACTED]. However, as previously explained, he developed a medical condition, which required him to be shipped to Germany before the Article 15 procedure could be completed. He never returned to my unit in Iraq, and he was subsequently transferred back to Fort Lee. He was sent to Germany roughly two weeks after the incident. I did not get a chance to take any action against him due to his leaving theatre. He was transferred from my command to a Fort Lee Garrison Company once he got back to Fort Lee. I held onto the Article 15, in case he came back to Iraq. He was put back on my roles the day we left Fort Lee after the deployment. When I turned command over to [REDACTED] the paperwork for [REDACTED] was transferred to him but [REDACTED] was only on active duty with the 443rd for one day after his transfer.

[REDACTED] apparently allowed the detainee to come out of the compound and proceeded to have an arm wrestling contest with him. The detainee bested [REDACTED] in the arm wrestling contest which then resulted in a great deal of unrest (mostly shouting and celebrating) from the detainees within the facility. When the NCOIC realized what was going on, he removed [REDACTED] and reported the incident to the Duty Officer. At that point, I met with [REDACTED] Platoon Leader [REDACTED] and the Duty Officer. Based upon the facts as presented to me by the Duty Officer and [REDACTED], I concluded that the incident was a severe lapse in discipline, judgment and supervision but that it did not constitute detainee abuse. [REDACTED] was assigned additional duties and required to write an essay on why he should not arm wrestle detainees. I have included a copy of [REDACTED] essay with this statement.

There are many opportunities that a detainee can take advantage of to hurt or even kill MP's, Coalition Forces, or other detainees. Arm wrestling and playing games offers a detainee the distraction to perpetrate these incidents. There are three incidents that can occur. First, a detainee can take you hostage. Second, the detainee could attack you or someone else while you are interacting with them. Lastly, other detainees may take advantage of the distraction in order to escape. This in turn can also lead to the death of the escaping detainees.

Detainees could be hurt as a direct result of arm wrestling or other games that are played with guard force members. Some things that you could do arm wrestling a detainee is cause an injury to their arm, wrist, or shoulder in which case you will be held personally responsible for. Not only will that reflect negatively on you, it could also serve as a reflection of the entire guard force. Your actions could launch an investigation that would do more harm than good. This could result in long-term mistrust towards coalition forces in Iraq. On the other hand, the detainee could in turn cause injury to your arm. In this case, you will be held responsible for this action, not the detainee. This consequence would lower the unit's ability to accomplish the mission.

Arm-wrestling and playing games with detainees can lead to riots within the Holding Area. In that case, you will be held responsible for the actions leading to a

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riot, which will put the entire guard force's safety in danger. It can also lead to the physical harm of other detainees.

There are many ways that you could be punished. One is an article 92. Article 92 is described as dereliction of duty. You can be issued this article during peacetime and wartime. The maximum punishment under peacetime is dishonorable discharge, forfeiture of all pay and allowances, and confinement for 2 years. The minimum punishment is forfeiture of two-thirds pay per 3 months and confinement for 3 months. The maximum punishment during wartime is death or such other punishment as a court martial. The minimum punishment is dishonorable discharge, forfeiture of all pay and allowances, and confinement for 1 year. This in turn can also lead to an article 15 proceeding. During this proceeding you will be ordered in front of your commander with your leadership present and they will make a decision on your punishment based on the facts. You then can request the opportunity to consult with a counsel, and demand to have a trial by court martial. The hearing may be open or closed, and you may also have persons there to speak on your behalf, or as a witness to the accusations. These persons may be presented in person or in writing. If written, it is produced on a DA Form 2823 (sworn statement). After the proceedings are completed you may request an appeal. Once the proceedings are filed without an appeal you will have no choice but to accept the punishment. If you request an appeal then you will wait until that date, then go through the proceedings again. After that, the decision will be final. You will realize that you were wrong and people who are wrong must admit when they are

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wrong. You must stand up like a man and take responsibility for your actions without the bickering and attitude.

In closing, you should not arm wrestle or play games with detainees because it is not right and can cause problems that you just don't need. If you are thinking about doing anything of the sort, consider all the consequences of your actions and think about the possibilities of what could happen. This is not the kind of position that you would want to put yourself, fellow soldiers, or your chain of command in.


