INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

This investigation was initiated upon receipt of Serious Incident Report CD-08AUG04-19C-0580-[REDACTED], dated 9 Aug 04, from Headquarters, 3rd Brigade, 1st Cavalry Division, Baghdad, IZ, APO AE 09348, detailing [REDACTED] had been assaulted by [REDACTED] while he was detained at FOB Head Hunter, Baghdad, IZ.

Investigation established probable cause to believe [REDACTED] committed the offenses of Aggravated Assault, and Cruelty and Maltreatment when [REDACTED] slammed [REDACTED] head, which was covered with a sandbag at the time, into the side of a detainee cell while escorting him to the detainee cells after he was captured.

Basis for Investigation: On 10 Aug 04, this office received Serious Incident Report (CD-08Aug 04-19C-058-██████████) from Headquarters, 3rd Brigade, 1st CAV DIV, Baghdad, Iraq, APO AE 09348, detailing ██████████ (Capture number: ██████████) was assaulted while he was detained at FOB Head Hunter, Baghdad, Iraq (IZ) by U.S. Forces. (See SIR and attachments for details)

About 2000, 11 Aug 04, SA ██████████ coordinated with CPT ██████████ Staff Judge Advocate, Forward Operating Base (FOB) Grey Wolf, Baghdad, IZ (FOBGW) who provided a color copy of the photographs taken of ██████████ injuries. He also provided copies of a Detainee Health Assessment form and SF 600 (Chronological Record of Medical Care), both pertaining to ██████████ medical screening on 9 Aug 04, when he arrived at FOBGW. The documentation detailed the injuries ██████████ had when the medically screened, which was conducted by ██████████, 3 BDE, 1st CAV, Surgeon, FOBGW. ██████████ also provide a copy of a correspondence, dated 9 Aug 04, ██████████ Officer in Charge of Interrogations, Delta Company, 312 Military Intelligence Battalion, FOBGW wrote in reference to ██████████ allegations of abuse and the injuries she noted on ██████████ when she interrogated him. (See Photo's, Detainee Health Assessment, SF 600 for details)

About 0910, 12 Aug 04, SA ██████████ interviewed ██████████, who related about 1100, 9 Aug 04, she interrogated ██████████ stated she had observed two black eyes and stitches on ██████████ ██████████ related ██████████ was transferred from FOB Headhunter. ██████████ stated 1/9th Calvary controlled FOB Headhunter, Baghdad, IZ. ██████████ stated ██████████ had not been interrogated at her facility. ██████████ stated her questioning of ██████████ in reference to his injuries was a part of protocol to document previous injuries he may have had before capture. She related ██████████ was not restrained while in his detention cell at FOBGW, and was not restrained during the interview she conducted.

AGENT'S COMMENT: During this investigation ██████████ continuously presented herself as being unprofessional and uncooperative.

About 0920, 12 Aug 04, SA ██████████ interviewed ██████████ Category 2, Titan Linguist, FOBGW, who related he translated for ██████████ for the interrogation. ██████████ provided a sworn statement wherein he detailed the allegations made by ██████████ and the injuries he noticed on ██████████ body. (See Sworn Statement for details.)

Agent's note: [redacted] is the Internment Serial Number for [redacted] [redacted] would not allow SA [redacted] to interview [redacted] without her present or in the immediate vicinity.

About 0950, 12-Aug-04, SA [redacted] with the assistance of [redacted] interviewed [redacted] [redacted] stated he was arrested about 1500, 8 Aug 04. He stated after he was captured he was struck in both eyes, in the back, on the right shoulder, struck twice in the stomach, once in the chest, and once on the left shoulder with fists, and had a bag placed over his head. [redacted] related he was struck with fists and kicked. [redacted] stated he was also struck on his left eyebrow with the muzzle of a rifle, but the soldier apologized to him in English because it was an accident. [redacted] related he received stitches from a doctor at FOB Headhunter for his injury to his eye. [redacted] stated he was only pushed when he was put into his cell and never struck.

Agent's Note: [redacted] would not allow SA [redacted] to interview [redacted] without her present. [redacted] related this was not the story [redacted] provided to him during the interrogation. Muthania Airport is FOB Headhunter.

About 1045, 12 Aug 04, SA [redacted] interviewed [redacted], who rendered a sworn statement detailing his medical screening examination of [redacted] when he arrived at FOB Grey Wolf on 9 Aug 04. He related he asked [redacted] through a interpreter how he sustained the injuries he had and [redacted] replied that unknown American soldiers beat him after he was captured. (See Sworn Statement for details)

About 1618, 24 Aug 04, SA [redacted] interviewed [redacted], D Company, 215 Forward Support Battalion, FOB Headhunter, IZ, who provided a sworn statement wherein he detailed how he observed [redacted] strike a Iraqi detainee. (See Sworn Statement for details)

About 1700, 24 Aug 04, SA [redacted] interviewed [redacted], A Co, 215th FSB, 1 CAV BDE, FOB Headhunter, IZ, who provided a sworn statement detailing he witnessed [redacted] abuse the detainee he [redacted] was placing in the detainee cells at FOB Headhunter. (See Sworn Statement for details)

About 1700, 24 Aug 04, SA [redacted] coordinated with Dr. (CPT), [redacted], Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 1/9th CAV, FOB Headhunter, IZ, who related he had stitched a prisoner's head around the right eye about 1400, 8 Aug 04. Dr. [redacted] stated the prisoner was number [redacted]. Dr. [redacted] related he did not ask how the prisoner received the injury. Dr. [redacted] could not relate who the interpreter was that assisted

Agent's Note: SA [REDACTED] coordinated with Dr. [REDACTED] for [REDACTED] medical treatment records. Dr. [REDACTED] related [REDACTED], HHC, 1/9th CAV, FOB Headhunter, IZ, took the records for the 15-6 investigation into the alleged abuse.

About 1730, 24 Aug 04, SA [REDACTED] interviewed [REDACTED], HHC, 1/9 CAV REGT, FOB Headhunter, IZ, who related the detainees arrived at the FOB HEADHUNTER in the morning and left in the evening. [REDACTED] stated he knew a prisoner by the name of [REDACTED] had arrived on the morning of 8 Aug 04 and left that evening. [REDACTED] related when [REDACTED] was being loaded into the vehicle in the evening, he had lost his footing and fell into a the body portion of the M-4 a soldier was carrying slung around his neck and soldier. [REDACTED] did not see which specific part of the weapon [REDACTED] face had hit, but did see an injury to the upper area of the left eye socket of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated he had seen the stitches to the right eyebrow of [REDACTED] but did not see any other injuries. [REDACTED] related he had not seen any prisoners with facial bruising or other injuries before [REDACTED] A at FOB HEADHUNTER.

About 1858, 24 Aug 04, SA [REDACTED] interviewed [REDACTED], HHC, 1/9th CAV, FOB Headhunter, IZ. [REDACTED] provided a sworn statement detailing he did not directly witness [REDACTED] abuse the detainee he was escorting into the detention cells as he had his back to [REDACTED] and the detainee at the time. He related after he heard a loud noise and turned around and saw the detainee [REDACTED] had was on the ground he thought [REDACTED] had done something to the detainee, but he did not witness anything. (See Sworn Statement for details)

Sir,

According to detainee he received the cut over his right eye by accident when the soldiers went to put him into the vehicle. He hit his head on the muzzle of one of their weapons, the soldier apologized and detainee believed it was an accident.

He received the bruise on his left shoulder and his back after he was restrained but before he was moved from the site where he was caught. He said the soldiers tied his hands behind his back and kicked him in the shoulder and back then moved him to the vehicle. He said two people hit him at this time an officer and a soldier who he could not identify. He believed one was an officer because he had a pistol in holster on his leg.

Detainee said his head was covered with a bag once he was in the vehicle and when the soldiers took him out of the vehicle he was nearly beat to death by multiple soldiers. He could not identify them because his head was covered.

When I interrogated the detainee he had two black eyes and visible bruises on his shoulders and abdomen.

Since there was no interpreter in the facility at the time, I initially planned on doing a brief screening and vitals on the detainees and do a detailed history the following day with one of the regular interpreters. However, as soon as I saw Detainee [redacted], I asked the guards at the Interrogation facility to call in an interpreter. An active duty US military interpreter who I know only as [redacted] arrived about 20 to 30 minutes later. Through the interpreter I asked how he sustained his cuts and bruises and he responded that he was beaten. He then I asked him who did this to him, and he said American soldiers. I asked him where it happened, and he said at Mathana Airport (currently used as a FOB for 1-9 Cav as well as the 302nd Iraqi National Guard Battalion). I do not know the name of the unit or the soldiers who detained him but I believe that they were from 1-9 Cav. The det [redacted] stated that after he was restrained and lying on the ground, he was punched and kicked several times to the shoulders, head and abdomen. He also stated that he was struck next to his left eye with the muzzle of a rifle by one of the American soldiers while he was getting into a vehicle. The soldier claimed it was an accident, he said, but apologized, but he wondered if he did it on purpose. [redacted] said that after he sustained his injuries, he was brought to a [redacted]

I asked him if he was in any pain, and he said yes and pointed his left lower chest. I asked him about his past medical history, and he said he has frequent abdominal pain and takes Librox as needed. I told him that I believe Librox is a sedative and that I would not give him that for abdominal pain. He also reported a history of frequent itchy skin for which he takes Allermin^{al} an over the counter antihistamine. He reported no previous surgeries, no allergies to medications, no drug use, no tobacco use, no alcohol use. I assumed that he did not know his immunization history. I then went through a review of systems in which ~~that~~ he reported mild hearing problems, mild hypertension, a history of asthma for which he is currently on no medication, a history of kidney stones - he passed one about every 6 months and a small scar on his left forearm that was old. I then proceeded to his physical exam which was significant for: 1) mild tenderness to the left side of his chest just below the nipple, no crepitus, no bruising, 2) laceration to lateral edge of right eyebrow, with blue suture material closing the wound, 3) bruising of right eyelid, 4) laceration of lateral corner of left eyelid with an adjacent abrasion, 5) large reddish-purple bruising to right shoulder, 6) large bruising to right shoulder - reddish-purple in color, 7) large bruising to right upper quadrant of abdomen, 8) small bruise lateral left of belly button, 9) abrasion to right knee, 10) small bruise to buttocks. [redacted] reported that the bruise to his left shoulder was from being kicked, the bruise on his right shoulder, abdomen and buttocks are from being pinched. Laceration around bruising over right eye was from being punched and laceration in corner above left eye from being struck with a rifle's muzzle. I completed the exam and reassured him no harm would come to him at this facility. I offered him Tylenol or Motrin for his pain. I reassured him his ribs were not broken. He asked me if he needed a picture taken of his head and brain (a CT scan) and I told him that it wasn't indicated. I told him that I would give him medications for rashes if they develop. I did follow up evaluations on [redacted] on the 10th and 11th and the patient's pain was under control. I don't recall what time

[redacted] HHC [redacted] escorted them to the cell block with the cover guard of [redacted] and some other scouts. When they got to the cell block 1 detainee was taken to the first cell. Then the next 2 were escorted to the middle cell. One of the two were injured. Then the last one that was escorted by [redacted] was told to be held on the side of the cell block until they were done with the first 3. [redacted] told him this. There is a correct to a previous statement I made, I previously stated that the detainee [redacted] escort was the 3rd but he was the last detainee. The 3rd detainee was the injured one. Well [redacted] took him to the side of the cell but instead of holding him there he took him by his neck and back and pretty much slammed him into the side of the cell. Then the detainee just fell to his knees. [redacted] came over to him quickly and told him to stop. The first 3 detainees were escorted into there cells by some scouts & accompaned by [redacted]. Scouts left and [redacted] accompanied [redacted] on the other side of the consoling wire. [redacted] was still in the cell block telling the detainees to be quiet & not talk. [redacted] then also put his detainee in the 3rd cell. [redacted] was still in the cell block too with [redacted]. While [redacted] and [redacted] were observing and yelling to the detainees from the other side of the wire. Also standing there was [redacted] and [redacted] who left soon. [redacted] put the detainee in the corner of the cell facing the corner (Blood from the detainee was visible through the sand bag on his head). The detainee was on his knees. Then [redacted] put his boot in the back of the detainee's neck & smashed his head into the wall once again. I don't think [redacted] saw it this time. But [redacted] and [redacted] saw it and did nothing to stop it. The detainee in the middle cell that was injured was escorted by one of the scouts to the medics. [redacted] told him to do this. [redacted] said the detainees need to have the sand bags on their heads removed. [redacted] said he would do it. Starting with the 3rd cell he removed the sand bags and [redacted] moved the one previous detainee that we already had from the middle cell to the outside of the cell to separate him from the new detainees. He handcuffed him to the cell. [redacted] removed the sand bags, but while doing so he checked them and hit them in the face. After all the sand bags were removed off the 3 detainees [redacted] (The personnel still remaining besides me and [redacted] left the area. A few minutes after [redacted] came over to the cells to get the detainees impressed. He also brought back the injured detainee [redacted] then released the detainees from their cuffs. Then he got their statements and filled out their paperwork. This was around the time of 1630. Then [redacted] unhandcuffed the old detainee that was outside the cell and escorted him to the main gate to release him. My recommendation is either to Release the detainee or to send him to bde for further Questioning.

ON or about 6-7 Aug-04 4 detainees were captured AT A mortar NAI by HHC 1-9CAU. I was called on the Motorola by one of my S-2 personal saying that there were 4 detainees being brought in and the CSM wanted me AT the gate. When I arrived AT the gate the [redacted] was telling the guards to put sandbags ON the detainees heads. The detainees were still in the back of a silver [redacted]

OPel STATION WAGON. Once the detainees had their heads covered they were driven to the Detainee cage. Upon arrival to the Detainee cage they were pulled out of the back of the Opel station wagon. The first man pulled out was wearing a Dirschdasha. His legs were pinned under the legs of the other detainees so he hit the ground, when he was on the ground [REDACTED] kept hollering that we caught you, your going to Abu Graibe cocksmaker. [REDACTED] was really getting excited and hollering so I told the soldiers around me to get them into the cages. [REDACTED] took the first man in the Dirschdasha and I grabbed another individual and started moving to the cage. enroute to the cage the individual I was walking got his pant leg caught in the wire. As I was untagling the pant leg I heard a loud CRASH and looked up to see the individual lying on the ground alongside of the cage and [REDACTED] standing over him. I screamed what the fuck are you doing just put the detainees in the cage. Once the detainees were in the cage I noticed [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] "HHC 1SG" walking the detainee who was shot in both arms towards the Aid station. AS I was leaving the detainee area to follow the wounded detainee to the Aid station [REDACTED] asked me if he could see the detainees faces that maybe he would recognize them from his patrol area. I told him that he could. I then ran and caught up with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] in order to get the screening information from the detainee in case he had to be moved to the Hospital in the international zone. I screened the wounded individual as he was being treated by the medics. Upon completion of his screening I left the Aid station and wrote his report and built his detainee packet so the medics could take the paper work with them to the hospital. When I completed this I then went to eat some chow in order for the Detainee unit to get debriefed and write their sworn statements. After chow I started my tactical questioning of the detained individuals.

I asked him what happened AND he said THAT he noticed some blood on A detainees face AND he asked the soldiers what had happened. 

THE PLATOON ARRIVED WITH THE CONFISCATED VEHICLE THE INSURGENTS HAD USED DURING THE ATTEMPTED MORTAR ATTACK. I STOPPED THE VEHICLE TO GET A REPORT ON THE CONDITION OF THE WOUNDED DETAINEE. THE PATROL INFORMED ME THAT HE HAD WOUNDS TO BOTH WRISTS AND THAT HE HAD BEEN GIVEN FIRST AID. THE PLATOON MOVED THE DETAINEES IN THE CONFISCATED VEHICLE THROUGH THE FOB TO THE DETAINEE CELL. I MOVED BY FOOT. WHEN I ARRIVED AT THE GATE TO THE DETAINEE CELL THE PLATOON WAS IN THE PROCESS OF UNLOADING THE DETAINEES AND MOVING THEM TO THE FACILITY. I ASSISTED ANOTHER SOLDIER WITH THE WOUNDED DETAINEE. AT THIS TIME I SAW THAT HE HAD BEEN IRRADIATED WITH FULL DRESSINGS AND WAS NOT BLEEDING. WE MOVED HIM TO THE CELLS THROUGH THE WIRE. AS I WALKED OUT OF THE INTERPRETOR SHACK I CALLED TO THE MOIC OF THE MANICATE TO BRING ME 4 SANDBAGS. IT IS NOT PART OF OUR NORMAL PROCEDURES TO BLINDFOLD DETAINEES BUT CIRCUMSTANCES SURROUNDING THIS SITUATION REQUIRED THAT THE ENEMY NOT SEE THE LAYOUT OF OUR FOB. DETAILS

BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: On 25 Aug 04, this office was notified by the 391st Military Police (MP) Battalion (BN) Detainee Aid Station (DAS), Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, Iraq (AGI), that Detainee [REDACTED] Internment Serial Number (ISN) [REDACTED] alleged he was abused while detained by Coalition Forces, prior to arriving at BCCF.

About 2300, 25 Aug 04, SA [REDACTED] interviewed 1LT (DR) [REDACTED] 391st MP BN, Detainee Aid Station (DAS), BCCF, AGI, who stated he performed a physical examination of [REDACTED], which revealed several bruises on his arms, legs and torso. He said [REDACTED] told him he was beaten after being captured by American soldiers. 1LT [REDACTED] provided copies of the medical records pertaining to [REDACTED] treatment at medical facilities prior to his arrival at AGI. (See Medical Records)

About 2310, 25 Aug 04, SA [REDACTED] with the assistance of [REDACTED], interviewed Detainee [REDACTED] who stated he was captured by American soldiers on 8 Aug 04 in Baghdad. [REDACTED] said he was captured with three other Iraqis that he did not know. He was bound with plastic restraints and placed in the back of a Toyota station wagon along with the other men. They were driven to the old airport in Baghdad. He was taken out of the vehicle and blindfolded and walked into the airport. As he was walking, he heard a man speaking English approaching him. He said the man sounded angry and told him that "his sister was a bitch" and other insults in Arabic. The unknown man hit him several times and he fell to the ground. On the ground, he was kicked many times in his stomach and back by at least three individuals. After about five minutes he became unconscious. He was unconscious for an unknown amount of time and awoke in a conex and remained by himself for about 10 minutes. A man opened the door and he was taken out of the conex and given medical aide for the cut above his right eye that required stitches. He was taken to a HMMWV and transported to the Palace in Baghdad. He was familiar with this location and was not blindfolded. He remained there for four days and was questioned four times. He was then transported to Baghdad International Airport (BIAP) and remained there until he was transported to AGI on 25 Aug 04. He was questioned six times and hospitalized on BIAP for five days prior to being transported to AGI. [REDACTED] stated he was only kicked and punched at the old airport and had no other incidents while detained. He could not provide any details or descriptions of the individuals who kicked and punched him and where it occurred. SA [REDACTED] exposed photographs of the bruises on the arms, abdomen and legs of [REDACTED]. (See Photographs)



Pt. 2351 is a 42 yo Iraqi detainee who was transferred from medical facilities at (b)(2)-2 for further evaluation of renal insufficiency. Pt has known h/o uncertain renal disease diagnosed in 2000 and confirmed by renal biopsy at Iraqi facility. The patient has been treated as an outpatient with chronic steroids and ACEI—captopril 10mg po qd. Both of these medications were stopped by another Iraqi physician in Fallujah approximately 1 month ago, again for unknown reasons to the patient.

The patient was captured in Fallujah on 8 August 2004.

He was transferred to the CSH on the 19th of August for evaluation of renal insufficiency after lab eval showed BUN of 75 and Cr > 20 (higher than the upper limit of detection on the labs).

Repeat evaluation of these labs at the time of admission confirmed BUN 65 and Cr > 20, but were relatively unremarkable otherwise. He had an ultrasound of both kidneys which showed normal size bilaterally, no hydronephrosis, no stone, or other significant findings. The pt denied oliguria or anuria, swelling, but did have chronic persistent anorexia and nausea, anemia with HCT of 28, and elevated serum phosphate at 10.3. His serum potassium was not elevated at 3.4.

The patient was admitted to ICW1 and given challenge of IVF 1L NS IVB followed by 200cc/hr for 5 hrs then 100cc/hr for 3.5 more days. Further lab evaluation was done showing Urine Na 70's and Urine Cr 70's c/w FENa of 16. This was consistent with an intrarenal process. Urine microscopy revealed minimal RBC's and blood, few wbc's without bacteria, 3+ protein other than albumin, and only occasional granular casts. No evidence of ATN or either RBC or WBC casts were seen. Urine culture was negative. Estimated creatinine clearance using the Cockcroft-Gault equation was 4cc/min despite oliguria. HIV nephropathy was considered but rapid HIV negative.

The patient's bun and creatinine did not show any significant improvement during the course of his hospitalization with a minimum level bun of 70's and cr of 18. He was started on phoslo for elevated phosphate but this supply ran out and he was switched to calcium carbonate 1gm po tid. He was started on sodium citrate 500meq/5ml liquid po bid for chronic metabolic acidosis. He was also given phenergan and decadron 4mg po

qAM for nausea and appetite stimulation, respectively. His ACBI was stopped b/c of possible exacerbation of renal function and it's role at the level of renal failure is unclear.

There is no evidence for a reversible or acute etiology of renal failure and his elevated bun and creatinine, anemia, elevated phosphate, persistent nausea and anorexia are all consistent with chronic renal failure. Without knowledge of his previous biopsy or repeating another kidney biopsy no further recommendations regarding his treatment can be made at this time. Despite his persistent UOP, his extremely low creatinine clearance, elevated phosphate, and anorexia/nausea are indications for referral and initiation of chronic hemodialysis.

We are currently unable to do hemodialysis at the (b)(2)-2 and it's use here has been limited to acute indications only. As pt 2351 is He is a security interest detainee and must remain in custody, I recommend that he return to (b)(2)-2 and be sent directly from there to an Iraqi nephrologist.

The patient also alleged that he was beaten during his capture on the 8th of August by American soldiers. He states that he was punched and kicked repeatedly. Physical examination did show significant ecchymosis on his R. lower rib margin and mid-abdomen. He also complained of Left rib pain and shoulder pain, but no fracture or disability was found. Orthopedics was consulted and agreed. CID and Detainee Abuse were contacted by DNVF and by email and will be pursuing further evaluation.

1. End-stage chronic renal failure.
2. Alleged abuse—musculoskeletal injuries, recovering

1. phenergan 25mg po q4-6hr prn nausea
2. decadron 4mg po qAM
3. calcium carbonate 1gram po tid
4. sodium citrate 500meq/5mL po bid
5. percocet 1-2 tab po q4-6hr prn pain

1. Pt will need follow-up evaluation by Iraqi Nephrologist for hemodialysis
2. Titrate Calcium carbonate to decrease serum phosphate to below 5-6
3. Titrate sodium citrate, as tolerated, to increase serum bicarbonate above 20
4. Pt will need serial electrolyte monitoring until hemodialysis and then with Hemodialysis
5. Push nutrition with low protein, low potassium diet
6. Abuse investigation per CID/ Detainee Abuse team

Once I and [redacted] and [redacted] walked to the mortar firing point we told them to get on the ground again. This time they complied. I noticed one of the individuals bleeding from his arm. I instructed [redacted] and [redacted] to pull security. The Scout platoon then pulled up. They went chasing an individual they saw running from the scene. I linked up with [redacted] and told him to gather everyone in, make sure no one from us was hurt, flex cuff the two uninjured individuals and treat then flexcuff the injured individual. I then said to secure the individuals with the mortar system and rounds so we could take photos for evidence. About this time [redacted] came to me and said they had found a man hiding in nearby bushes with a cell phone. I told [redacted] to detain the individual. I then left the firing point and walked to the Scout Gun truck to have them inform battalion of the situation and our actions. I walked back to the firing point and the Scouts when in the process of flexcuff two individuals, and the man with the cell phone was being brought over. The man with the cell phone resisted, we had to physically put him to the ground with 3 individuals. He resisted putting his hands behind his back. He was now on his knees so we bent his upper body forward putting his face in the dirt and forcibly put his hand behind his back. We then placed him near the others. By this time all but the injured detainee was flexcuffed. I had the medic treat the injured man and determined it would not increase his injuries to flex cuff him. All the detainees, except for the injured man, continuously lifted their heads up and were told not to. I had the interpreter tell them not to move, they complied. During the search of the man

They did not want to spread their legs or help in the process. We had to physically move their legs. We then stood them up. I had the medic check for injuries quickly on the others. There were none. We placed all four next to the marker system for ~~the~~ photographic evidence. The man in the white man dress and man with the cell phone resisted, we had to forceably put them on their knees, it took two individuals to do. We took the photo and moved them to their gray vehical. We placed them in the trunk portion of the gray station wagon. [REDACTED] with security drove the car back to the FOB, we left a small element behind to see if the individual who called on the cell phone, who the man in the white man dress said was his boss, would show up. We drove back to the FOB, I drove the last vehical in the convoy. We were stopped at the front gate by [REDACTED] who opened the trunk area of the captured car and placed hands on the detainees heads. He later apologized for this and corrected it. He shoved them back in the trunk with his arms. The detainees where taken to S-2. I did not see them again.

On 8 August, 2004 [redacted] and I were dropped off to observe a suspected mortar site. We had been in place approximately 1 hour when we heard voices and the clanging of metal. After we identified that we saw a mortar tube, the 3 of us rushed the individuals. As I was rounding the weeds I heard gunfire and proceeded to charge the individuals. In front of me was a man in a white man-dress. I pointed my rifle at him and told him to get on the ground. He seemed to hesitate a few moments, I walked closer to him and pointing my weapon at him I yelled again "Get down!" and pointed to the ground, he then got down on his knees. I wanted him to get to where he was lying down, so I continued to approach him pointing at the ground with my weapon pointed at him yelling "Get down, lie down!" I had to tell him a few times while gesturing before he finally lie flat on the ground. After he lie on the ground I placed my foot on his back to reassure him to stay there. I then took a few steps back to assess the situation and I saw we had 3 individuals on the ground, a emplaced mortar system and several mortar rounds. I did notice that the mortar system was aimed toward the JLENS balloon at FOB Heehunter. Then the rest of the scout patrol arrived on the scene. Someone yelled that there was a 4th individual running away from the scene. [redacted] and I gave chase through tall weeds and mud. We then ran up near the road and didnt notice anyone suspicious.

Two HummV's came around to our position to give support. One of them had gotten stuck in a ditch next to the site walk. So [REDACTED] and I were giving assistance to recover the stuck HummV by blocking traffic and aiding the drivers. After approximately 20 minutes [REDACTED] went back to the area where the mortar team was captured. After an additional 20 minutes or so we got the HummV unstuck and returned to the site. I noticed that they had the interpreter with the cell phone to the detainees. There was a plan to lure the mortar teams boss to the site. At this time I noticed no injuries on any of the detainees, except for the one with gunshot wounds. The detainees were looked up as was the mortars and mortar system. We left a small team near the site in case the boss showed up. We then proceeded to drive back to FOB Headhunter. The HummV I was in was very slow and was falling behind the rest of the team. After we got to the FOB we cleared our weapons at the clearing barrel and drove up to the TOC and unloaded the mortars and set them on the ground for pictures. Someone said that they needed the cell phone from the detainees so I walked over to the detainee cell to get it. Once there I saw a few guards and [REDACTED] in the cell with the cell phone and the detainees. After a few moments [REDACTED] gave me the cell phone and I then proceeded to give it to the individual who was asking for it, back at the TOC. Later on we were then asked to fill out sworn statements on what happened.

That on 08 Aug 04 at 1319 the scout platoon was sent out to set up an OP to watch for suspected mortar men. We dropped off our OP at 1330 and left the sector to go out and run through our other mortar NAI's & Enclaved Areas of Interest. We scanned our sectors for an hour and returned to check on our OP. As we arrived at 1430 we heard shots fired. As we started to dismount the trucks the scouts initially ran over to the area as I started to get my aid bag out of the truck. When I arrived to the actual site the detainees were laying on their stomachs with their heads down. As I got there I asked if anyone was shot and was told one of the detainees was. The detainees were laying next to each other side by side so I went down the line to check on them. The first guy I started to evaluate didn't want treatment or evaluation and told me to go to his friend. I then moved to the next one who also did the same thing. The third guy was open to evaluation but turned his head as I would try to look at him but he immediately said to help his friend which leads up to the one that was wounded by a gun shot. The wounded one had a gun shot wound to his left wrist and on his right forearm. I didn't find any exit wound on the shot to the wrist so I used a field dressing and bandaged him up. I then moved on to the right forearm. He had 3 penetrating wounds that were bleeding. These wounds were not gun shot wound but possibly shrapnel from the mortar tube, being that the tube itself was shot also. I used another field dressing and bandaged that arm up as well. While I was treating the detainee the others

were being "flexi-cuffed". When I finished up the bandaging the last detainee was flexi-cuffed. Of the four detainees one of them was hiding in the bushes near by. As I was heading toward our site was when he was found. When we had them all together I was told the one hiding had a phone and to go get the phone. The man hiding had claimed he didn't know. The other 3 guys and that he was hiding because he was scared. As we stood there, the phone was ringing when I found it, so the man answered his phone and the caller asked for someone and that's when one of the initial 3 men confessed it was him and the one hiding tried to get away and resisted. It took 2 soldiers to restrain him and get him back. He was placed, along with the other 3, in front of their supplies and a picture was taken of them. We then were told by one of the detainees that the man who called was his "boss" and he was on his way so we gathered up the supplies and put it into the gun trucks. After that we loaded the detainees into their Personal Vehicle & grey Opel station wagon and got ready to leave. We left 3 more soldiers as another DP increase. The other guy showed up. As we started to mount up in the trucks I was told to get into the back seat of the station wagon and full security on the 3-4 men as we rushed to the F.O.B. to drop off the detainees and their supplies. As we pulled into the F.O.B. we were stopped at the front gate and was to that the detainees were to be blindfolded so they could not see our F.O.B. inside the walls. [REDACTED] was walking toward the gate to the shop in the front when he noticed what was going on. He called for something to blindfold them and someone brought empty brand new sand bags. They were then blindfolded and we drove into the F.O.B. and towards the detainee cell. We were followed by one gun truck so we could drop off the detainees and rush back out to our DP. still putting security on the detainees as they were being taken out. When the back hatch of the station wagon was opened a detainee was leaning against the door and happened to roll out the vehicle. He was wearing a flannel shirt and slacks. I believe I couldn't see who was getting the detainees. I just saw them being taken out. After all 4 were taken I immediately jumped out the car and into the gun truck. We went to link up with our other truck to go back out when I was told to run into the Aid Station and have someone go do a further evaluation on the detainee that was shot. As I went to do so I was told to take him to the Aid Station so I ran to the cell to get him and escort him when I was told to go back out with my guys and someone else grabbed the detainee from me and took him. I then jumped back into the truck and we left the FOB to go pick up our other OP. When I went to get the detainee from his cell the other detainees were already separated into their own cells and were being guarded by the cell guards.

The scouts are running up now and some one yells "theres a 4th guy running." [REDACTED] and the scouts have the Iraqi's covered so myself and [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] persue the 4th Iraqi civilian. We run thru bushes & mud and can hear the hmv's come around. By time we get thru and clear our area the 4th civilian is caught. Myself and [REDACTED] stay momentarily to help get the Hmuv unstuck out the mud. We all then return to the mortar team site. There already zip stripped and in the back of a grey station wagon. We assist in breaking down the mortar tube which was placed in the exact spot as the imprint. [REDACTED] directly pointed to our F.O.B [REDACTED] clearly visible in the distance. After loading the tube and mortar rounds in the Hmuv we break down in teams jump back in the Hmuv's and move out back to the F.O.B. The detainee's follow in the station wagon with other soldiers. Back at the F.O.B my hmv goes straight to the T.O.C. I run across to the detainee cell to assist putting the detainees in the cell. Theres detainee cell guards in the distance the hatch is open and Im getting ready to pull the 1st detainee out when the some soldiers come and say "We got em." Characteristics of the Crime Scene: The Detainee Detention Facility (DDF) was located at Al Muthania Airport, APO AE 09348. The DDF was a 30 meter by 10 meter, white in color, wood and metal constructed building separated into three, 10 meter by 10 meter, holding cells with a mesh front door and screen. The door, of Holding Cell number three, was located on the north wall and was made out of metal-type bars. The west, south, and east walls were made out of wood-type material and painted white in color. The floor was made of wood-type material and so was the ceiling. The walls and ceiling were white in color. Cell one had a aluminum-type folding cot which ran along the west wall and was adjacent to the northwest corner of the cell. The metal doors to the cells were secured with a key lock. The entire detainee center was a 40 meter by 100 meter area. There was triple concertina around the outside of the Detention Center with a controlled entrance on the west side and a entrance on the east.

Condition of the Scene: Holding cell was quite tidy. The furniture was upright.

Environmental Conditions: The outdoor temperature was approximately 92 degrees Fahrenheit. The sky was clear and there was no moisture present on the ground.

Factors Pertinent to Entry/Exit: Entry to the Detention Cell 1 could be achieved through the north door. Entry to the Detainee Cell could be achieved from the west or east side of the Detention Facility.

Scene Documentation: SA [redacted] prepared crime scene sketches and exposed crime scene photographs utilizing a Samsung, Digimax Digital Camera. The photographs were subsequently incorporated into a photographic packet. (See Crime Scene Sketches and Photographic Packet for details)

Search for Latent Impressions: Due to the delay in reporting, a search for latent impressions was not conducted.

Collection of Crime Scene Evidence: No evidence was collected.



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

[REDACTED] forcefully slammed [REDACTED] face into the side of the detention cell prior to placing him into the detention cell. Additionally, after [REDACTED] placed [REDACTED] on his knees inside of the detention cell, [REDACTED] kicked [REDACTED] in the back of the neck with his left foot causing [REDACTED]'s head to be smashed into the corner of the detention cell.

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qAM for nausea and appetite stimulation, respectively. His ACEI was stopped b/c of possible exacerbation of renal function and it's role at the level of renal failure is unclear.

There is no evidence for a reversible or acute etiology of renal failure and his elevated bun and creatinine, anemia, elevated phosphate, persistent nausea and anorexia are all consistent with chronic renal failure. Without knowledge of his previous biopsy or repeating another kidney biopsy no further recommendations regarding his treatment can be made at this time. Despite his persistent UOP, his extremely low creatinine clearance, elevated phosphate, and anorexia/nausea are indications for referral and initiation of chronic hemodialysis.

We are currently unable to do hemodialysis at the (b)(2)-2 and it's use here has been limited to acute indications only. As pt 2351 is He is a security interest detainee and must remain in custody, I recommend that he return to (b)(2)-2 and be sent directly from there to an Iraqi nephrologist.

The patient also alleged that he was beaten during his capture on the 8th of August by American soldiers. He states that he was punched and kicked repeatedly. Physical examination did show significant ecchymosis on his R lower rib margin and mid-abdomen. He also complained of Left rib pain and shoulder pain, but no fracture or disability was found. Orthopedics was consulted and agreed. CID and Detainee Abuse were contacted by DNVF and by email and will be pursuing further evaluation.
