INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

(S) On 16 Jun 03, this office was notified by the 10th MP Det (CID), BIAP, IRAQ, of a request by CENTCOM to conduct an independent investigation into the death of a prisoner being held at Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), Baghdad, Iraq.

(S) Investigation established probable cause to believe Mr DABABA died of a closed head injury which he sustained at some point during the 48 hours preceding his death. The investigation disclosed there was insufficient evidence to prove or disprove that unknown persons(s) committed the offense of Involuntary Manslaughter. Further, it did not produce conclusive evidence that the actions of the guards caused Mr DABABA's death as they used sufficient and necessary force to subdue him during numerous escape attempts.

(S) Investigation established probable cause to believe [REDACTED] committed the offense of Dereliction of Duty and Cruelty and Maltreatment when, between 0400-0430, 13 Jun 03, he constructed an "MRE Stink Bomb" utilizing Tabasco Sauce, a Meal Ready to Eat (MRE) heater, and water, and placed it into Mr DABABA's cell, which caused Mr DABABA pain and respiratory irritation.

(S) Further investigation established probable cause to believe [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] committed the offense of Dereliction of Duty when [REDACTED] provided

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the ingredients to [REDACTED] in order for him to construct the "MRE Stink Bomb" and they failed to stop [REDACTED] from placing it in Mr DABABA's cell.

(S) Additional investigation established probable cause to believe [REDACTED] did not commit the offense of Simple Assault, when he struck Mr. DABABA in the head with his fist during an escape attempt. The force used by [REDACTED] was necessary to quell the escape attempt by Mr DABABA.

(S) Lastly, the investigation established probable cause to believe, at about 0600, 13 Jun 06, Mr DABABA committed the offenses of Simple Assault and Attempted Escape when he left his cell and tried to rush passed the guards in an attempt to escape from the facility, during which he assaulted and was subdued by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

DETAILS

On 16 Jun 2003, this office was notified by [REDACTED], Operations Officer, 10th MP Bn, that a High Value Detainee (HVD) had died on 13 Jun 2003, while in custody of US Forces at a compound run by AA. Initial information provided by [REDACTED] indicated the HVD arrived at the compound about 2142Z, 12 Jun 03 and made a first attempt at escape at 0725Z, 13 Jun 03. About 1830Z, 13 Jun 03, the medics were summoned due to the HVD being down and in serious condition. Initial cause of death was believed to be heart attack.

About 0900Z, 17 Jun 2003 SA [REDACTED] and SA [REDACTED], this office coordinated with [REDACTED] Counter Intelligence (CI) Agent, AA, who provided a briefing regarding the facts of the case and detailed the security requirements regarding the operations of the units involved. [REDACTED] stated the detainee involved was an Iraqi named Mr. DABABA, Dilar (AKA HASSIM) who was found dead in his cell about 1830, 13 Jun 2003. A 15-6 investigation had been ordered and recommended a CID investigation be initiated when it was learned that a guard had manufactured an improvised irritant gas by mixing Tabasco sauce, water and a Meal Ready to Eat (MRE) heater packet and then placed the device in the detainee's cell. It was further learned that a Coroner from the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP) was scheduled to perform an autopsy about 1900, 17 Jun 2003.

CRIME SCENE

It was further determined that the cell in which Mr. DABABA was housed had been cleaned since the time of the detainee's death and reoccupied by other HVD's, which would negate any chance of the collection of physical evidence. Additionally, the detainee currently residing in that cell could not be moved for security reasons.

On 17 Jun 03, Dr. [REDACTED], Armed Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP), Rockville, MD performed an autopsy on Mr. DABABA at 38th Quartermaster, Mortuary Affairs, BIAP, Baghdad, Iraq. Dr. [REDACTED] initial findings showed cause of death as a closed head injury and manner of death as homicide. (see SF 503 for details)

About 1920Z, 18 Jun 2003, SA [REDACTED] interviewed [REDACTED] Co A, BB, assigned to AA who rendered a sworn statement in which he detailed his instructions and involvement with the detainee. (see Sworn Statement for details)

About 0930Z, 19 Jun 2003, SA [REDACTED] interviewed [REDACTED] BB, who rendered a sworn statement in which he detailed the events which took place on his shift. (see Sworn Statement for details)

He was given water during breaks while standing. Twice on my shift it seemed as though he made attempts to solicit help to escape once with me and the other with [REDACTED]. He did so by nodding his head toward the door while the other wasn't watching. Then later

The detainee had made two more attempts to escape on the 1000-1500Z shift so he cuffed his hands to water pipes one foot to the chair that he was seated on and his waist also to the chair. After being on shift for about 15 minutes after getting on shift his waist was cut free. The only times I went into his room was to tape his wrist because he continued to hang and pull on his cuffs, as if he thought he could break free. We taped them because his tugging would leave marks. Then about 30 minutes before he died we attempted to put him back in the chair but he fought it so we decided to leave him alone. Every time I saw him while passing by his room he was either tugging pulling or slouched hanging on the cuffs. [redacted] attempted to give him water and he'd spit it out continuously. The (investigating officer) (board), having carefully considered the evidence, finds:

a. What was the cause of Hassin's death?

It is difficult to say at this time what was the exact cause of death for Hassin (actually known as Dilar Dababa). I am not a medical expert and do not yet have a copy of the autopsy report. None of the TF20 medical personnel nor the 2 doctors who examined the body at the emergency medical facility, indicated to me that there were any physical findings suggesting injury or foul play discovered during their initial examination or at any time while Dababa was in custody. As a result of my investigation, I was unable to determine his cause of death. I am currently awaiting the results of the ordered autopsy.

NOTE: It is also important to mention that I believe this individual to be Dilar Dababa rather than the name originally mentioned in the instructions of this 15-6 investigation. Dababa apparently attempted to intentionally deceive the interrogators of his identity. He was subsequently identified by another detainee, who we believed would know him. This detainee provided the Dababa name without being prompted.

b. Did any guard, detainee or other person cause or contribute to the cause of Hassin's death?

Without the final medical autopsy report, this question cannot be answered conclusively. I conducted a complete review of the procedures used during the transfer of detainees, interrogation of detainees, and treatment of detainees, to include interviewing all of the guards and interrogators who had any dealings with Dababa during his 36 hours in custody. I developed a chronological account of all events involving Dababa from the time of his capture to the time of his death. During my investigation I discovered a possibility that one or some of the guards may have acted inappropriately. However, it is unclear whether or not the suspected actions would have had any impact on Dababa's death. During an interview given by Guard (b)(3), (b)(6) he stated that one of the other guards (b)(3), (b)(6) had possibly used a "tobasco bomb" in the room with the detainee (see TAB D). This would have occurred prior to (b)(3), (b)(6) coming on shift (probably about 0615z). I also noted that during the interview with Dr. (b)(3), (b)(6), he stated that at 0700, there was a strong smell of some type of gas. The guard told him they used CS on the detainee, to quell him. This presents an immediate inconsistency in the stories, as (b)(3), (b)(6) stated he smelled the "gas" upon entering the building and prior to the alleged attack. Once I discovered this information, I stopped my investigation and therefore, did not confirm the truth of this allegation, nor which individuals may have participated (other than possibly) (b)(3), (b)(6). I recommend a further investigation be conducted to determine the truth of this allegation and its relevance to answering the above question.

c. What SOPs, regulations, etc., are implicated by the detention and processing of Hassin prior to his death?

(S/ORCON/REL CAN/UK/AUS) The regulations/SOPs that are implicated would be AR 190-8 (Enemy Prisoners of War, Retained Personnel, Civilian Internees and Other Detainees), guidance found in the 10 May 2003 EPW/Detainee OPS Law Brief: Treatment and Interrogation, and the JTF20 internal SOP regarding processing of detainees.

SECTION V - RECOMMENDATIONS (para 3-11, AR 15-6)

In view of the above findings, the (investigating officer) (board) recommends:

1. A formal CID investigation be completed to more closely examine the circumstances surrounding Dababa's death.
2. Develop a detainee processing checklist/folder for the purpose of tracking information regarding time of arrival, DD Form 2745 accurately filled out; medical evaluation conducted; photo taken; document last time of sleep, water, and food; initial guard instructions, etc. This would help provide continuity of detention as well as a historical record.
3. Establish a more formal program of oversight that would require systematic and periodic checks on compliance with approved policies and guidelines. Identify specific individuals and responsibilities to provide this oversight. Require all individuals dealing with detainees to read and be familiar with all policies and guidelines applicable to the detention and handling of detainees.
4. Request formal publication of the guidelines found in the EPW/Detainee OPS Law Brief: Treatment and Interrogation. This would expand the guidelines from a power point presentation to a written form of a reviewed and authorized (signed) policy. Additionally, this policy states that a stress period may not last longer than four hours. It does not indicate how long of a break is required before introducing an individual to the same circumstances. It does not state if the four hour period is within 12 hours, 24 hours, etc. Needs clarification.
5. Expand the current JTF20 internal SOP regarding processing of detainees to include guidance on the handling and interrogation methods suitable for our current operations. Currently the policy contains guidance on Mission Planning; Notification; Processing; Screening; Debriefing (PIR); Reporting; Detainee Disposition; Transferring; and Repatriation. There are no specific guidelines on interrogation techniques or limits, guard responsibilities, status of detainees, DOs and DON'Ts, etc.

Summary from Mosul detention of Handset 05XX this morning.

At approximately 0300Z a faded blue, early 80s model, Toyota drove up to the gate from the north and parked. A short, Arab looking individual in a plaid shirt got out and walked to the gate, pushed at the gate, and knocked 3-4 times before getting back in the car and leaving at approximately 0305Z. At that time base relayed Handset # 05XX was believed to be in Erbil. The individual at target gate was deemed a low probability match.

At approximately 0345Z, an individual approached the gate on foot from the north and knocked. This individual was identified as the same individual from the previous attempt to enter the gate. Base was contacted and base reported Handset # 05XX was believed to still be in Erbil at this time. At 0349Z. This individual left on foot to the north.

At approximately 0405Z, team was notified by base that Handset #05XX was noted as active at 0330Z and was located in Mosul less than 1 kilometer from the target house. This leading the team to believe that the individual who had visited the target house twice was, in fact, Handset #05XX.

At approximately 0550, the same blue Toyota was observed approaching from the North. This information was sent to base and all teams were able to position themselves at the gate

He was moved to a larger room and a full cardiac code was begun. I assisted the team by doing / administering CPR. The code was continued for up to about an hour and a half until the detainee was moved to an established medical facility. The code was continued en-route and did not stop until a consensus of death was determined by the physicians. Every life saving measure was used that was available to the team.

I reapplied the choke must sure he was out then restrained him and put him back in his cell at no time was this man miss treated the guards are professional and we used the least amount of force to defuse a potentially dangerous situation. in conclusion I feel my men performed well under the circumstances and the only reason the prisoner was injured was because he tried to escape and then resisted.

The medic also said the hand flexcuts were cutting into his wrists. At 1600z Spc. Brown and I removed the detainee's flexcuts taped his wrists and reflex cuffed him. At 1800z one of the detainees wanted to talk to an interrogator. At 1830z (b)(3), (b)(6) arrives and talk to the 2nd detainee. The 1st detainee was out of his chair, (b)(3), (b)(6) and I attempted to put him back in his chair but he resisted so we left him on the ground. Around 1830z (b)(3), (b)(6) came out of the back room. I, SPC (b)(3), (b)(6), WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

For the past month and a half I've been a part of the detainee guard watch. On a daily basis I work their for 6 hours a day on average and I've dealt with at least 50 detainees. On the night of 13 June 2003 one of them died on my shift.

We have 2 facilities of guard the BIT (the main building), and the ANEX (the overflow building). I replaced SPC (b)(3), (b)(6) as SOG and his instructions were to stress him out. I have 5 guys under me so I put 3 in the BIT and 2 in the ANEX, Chattavesouk and Vaca. I roamed between the two but mostly I stayed in the ANEX for supervision of this detainee. He was to do PT, be standing, ~~be~~ be on his knees and when he was hesitant or plain not following instructions we used pressure points. While standing we gave him water. Once I was in the room with (b)(3), (b)(6) giving him a water break and he nodded his head to the door and smiled as he spoke in his native tongue, suggesting that I let him free. I told him no. Then I was behind him cutting his flex ties so he could use the restroom and ~~PT~~ and he did the same to (b)(3), (b)(6). Now that I think about it I believe that he thought one of us would let him go. Then towards the end of the shift we had left him alone for a while and (b)(3), (b)(6) showed up to ~~be~~ relieve us at about 0610 (20 minutes ^{early}). Then I left to check on the BIT, when I walked back into the ANEX I saw they being restrained by (b)(3), (b)(6) with blood on his forehead. (b)(3), (b)(6) told me what happened. The detainee ~~escape his~~ managed to get out of his cuffs and into the hall I saw him and grabbed him, when the detainee reached for his weapon he stuck him. Abd Alah Hassin Mohammed Shipzamy (here after referred to as the detainee) arrived on 12 June 2003 at approximately 2130Z. I and the Ranger guards received him. About 2200-2215Z the detainee's picture was taken by (b)(3), (b)(6). Shortly after that an interpreter (terp) (b)(6) arrived. The terp and I began to screen (for basic information and identification) the detainee. The screening lasted approx 30 minutes; and revealed so little information, that a TIR was not written. The terp and I then went and spoke to another detainee. I then spent about an hour doing background research on AI. I went to bed about 0130Z. At approx 0600Z, I was awakened by (b)(3), (b)(6) telling me that the detainee had tried to escape. Approx 30 minutes later, (b)(3), (b)(6) came and advised me that the detainee was injured from that escape attempt. I then went to check on the detainee. I spoke with the detainee for about 10 minutes, after the JMAU doctors were done looking at him. I used the terp (b)(6) that the JMAU doctors used. At about 1200Z I went down and checked up on the detainee. I also checked up on him around 1500Z, after I learned he tried to escape 2 more times. During this visit the JMAU doctors were checking up on the detainee. The doctors gave no indication that the detainee had a life threatening injury.

At about 1800Z, I, a terp, (b)(6) and (b)(3), (b)(6) went to question another detainee; (co-located with the detainee in question). On my way out, I stopped to check on the detainee in question. A Ranger guard was present. The guard mentioned that the detainee had just been combative with him about five minutes prior. I walked out of the room and went to another room, when the guard then tapped me on the shoulder and said he thought the detainee was dead. I quickly went back into the room holding the detainee. The guard used a flashlight in an attempt to illicit a reaction from the detainees eyes. I told them I was going to run to the main holding facility and call for JMAU. I ran over to the main holding facility and picked up the phone that dials directly to the JOC. The phone rang and rang with no answer. I ran and notified the JMAU that a detainee was not responsive. They grabbed their equipment and we got into their vehicle and drove down to the holding facility. JMAU immediately started working on the detainee. JMAU initiated CPR and a number of other medical procedures. I assisted JMAU by holding bags of IV fluid for the doctors. Eventually JMAU decided to move the detainee to a medical facility.

I was told he had made an escape attempt, during which he was punched in the face, and subdued with a choke hold. On my arrival he was laying on the floor of the facility in the back room with flex-cuffs in place. Due to lingering tear gas, I moved him to the front room. He walked there on his own. An interrogator arrived. The patient was vocal, defiant, and aggressive. He refused to answer questions until he received water, and the interrogators gave him a drink. I took a brief medical history, then examined him. Significant exam findings were a laceration on his left forehead, and abrasions on both wrists from the flex cuffs. I then anesthetized his wound with 1% lidocaine, irrigated it with saline and closed it with interrupted 5-0 nylon sutures. I applied bacitracin to his wrists. Throughout the procedure, he had to have two people hold his head still and he was shouting at me.

At approx 14:30 Z I was called back to the facility because he had made another escape attempt and had blood at his old wound. On my arrival he was flex-cuffed to a pipe on the wall, with his feet flexcuffed to a chair, and a large

Tip toe around his waste. His wound was not bleeding and required no further attention. The patient appeared lucid, but followed command. I advised the guards to remove the cigarette from his abdomen. On my departure he was sitting upright in the chair. He refused to talk to the interpreter throughout.

At approx 1430 an interrogator entered our clinic to inform us that the patient was unresponsive. The entire JMAU team drove to the facility. On arrival patient was laying supine in bathroom. He had no pulse, and pupils were fixed and dilated. He was moved into the back room after being endotracheal intubated by our CRNA. CPR begun. LTC (b)(3), (b)(6) ran the code. I placed a 16g angiocath into his right femoral vein and began fluid resuscitation. I placed an 18g angiocath in the left femoral vein. After approx 4-5 liters of fluid, both of these lines dislodged and I placed a 19g in his right external jugular vein. The patient underwent a full ACLS resuscitation attempt, at one point displaying pulseless electrical activity. After approx 30 minutes the decision was made by Dr. (b)(3), (b)(6) to transfer him to the E-MED hospital. He was loaded on litter into truck and transported with CPR in progress. Once at E-Meds the code continued for brief period after which he was pronounced dead.

On the morning of 13 June 03 at approximately 0800Z I was notified by a team member that one of the detainees has suffered a head laceration as the result of an escape attempt. It was relayed to me that the detainee had rushed the guards and was struck by a fist. Reportedly he fell to the ground but did not lose consciousness as he remained combative requiring a submission hold and application of noxious gas. After the crisis was resolved and the detainee appropriately restrained our doc evaluated the patient and determined no significant medical issues except the laceration. Notably there was no known loss of consciousness and no abnormal neurologic signs. The laceration was cleaned and sutured closed.

2000
At approximately 1500 hours I was again notified that a team member reassessed the patient after a second escape attempt. After being subdued the guards noticed bleeding from the head and summoned our doctor. The doctor assessed the detainee and determined that no significant injuries had occurred, the previous laceration was still closed and there were no new lacerations requiring closure. Our doctor conveyed to me that he noted the detainee was restrained around the waist by a system that could potentially cause injury. He recommended this system not be used and the guards complied. Our doctor also noted that the detainee was being offered water frequently. The detainee was characterized as being very unwilling to cooperate. This was manifested by refusing to answer questions, persistently straining against his flex cuffs and trying to remove them and sometimes refusing water.

At approximately 1830Z an interpreter ran into the clinic building stating "the detainee is on the floor and won't respond". The team gathered our resuscitation gear and immediately departed to the detainee area. Upon arrival I found the detainee lying on the floor, face up, no recent signs of trauma, without pulse or respirations. The detainee was promptly intubated, CPR begun and intravenous access established. He was then moved to an adjacent room where there was better lighting and more space. We applied a cardiac monitor and performed CPR and ACLS procedures for about the next 40 minutes. On several occasions signs of electrical activity returned to the heart for brief periods but without a spontaneous pulse. As we began to run out of drugs but the potential for cardiac activity still existed we elected to move to the EMEDS hospital to continue attempts at revival. At the EMEDS we performed ultrasound to look for fluid around the heart or in the abdomen but this was normal. After 10 more minutes there was no longer any electrical activity in the heart and the detainee's pupils were dilated and unresponsive. He was declared dead.

He then instructed PFC (b)(3), (b)(6) and I to keep him awake and uncomfortable. He told us not to strike him in anyway, to include punching, kicking, or banging his head. If needed we could apply pressure to points behind his jaw or under the bridge of his nose. We then went into the room with the prisoner, stripped him and flex cuffed his hands behind his back. We would have him stand and kneel repeatedly. At times he became uncooperative and would not rise to his feet. We would apply pressure to the points I stated above and tell him to stand up. We had given him only small drinks of water.

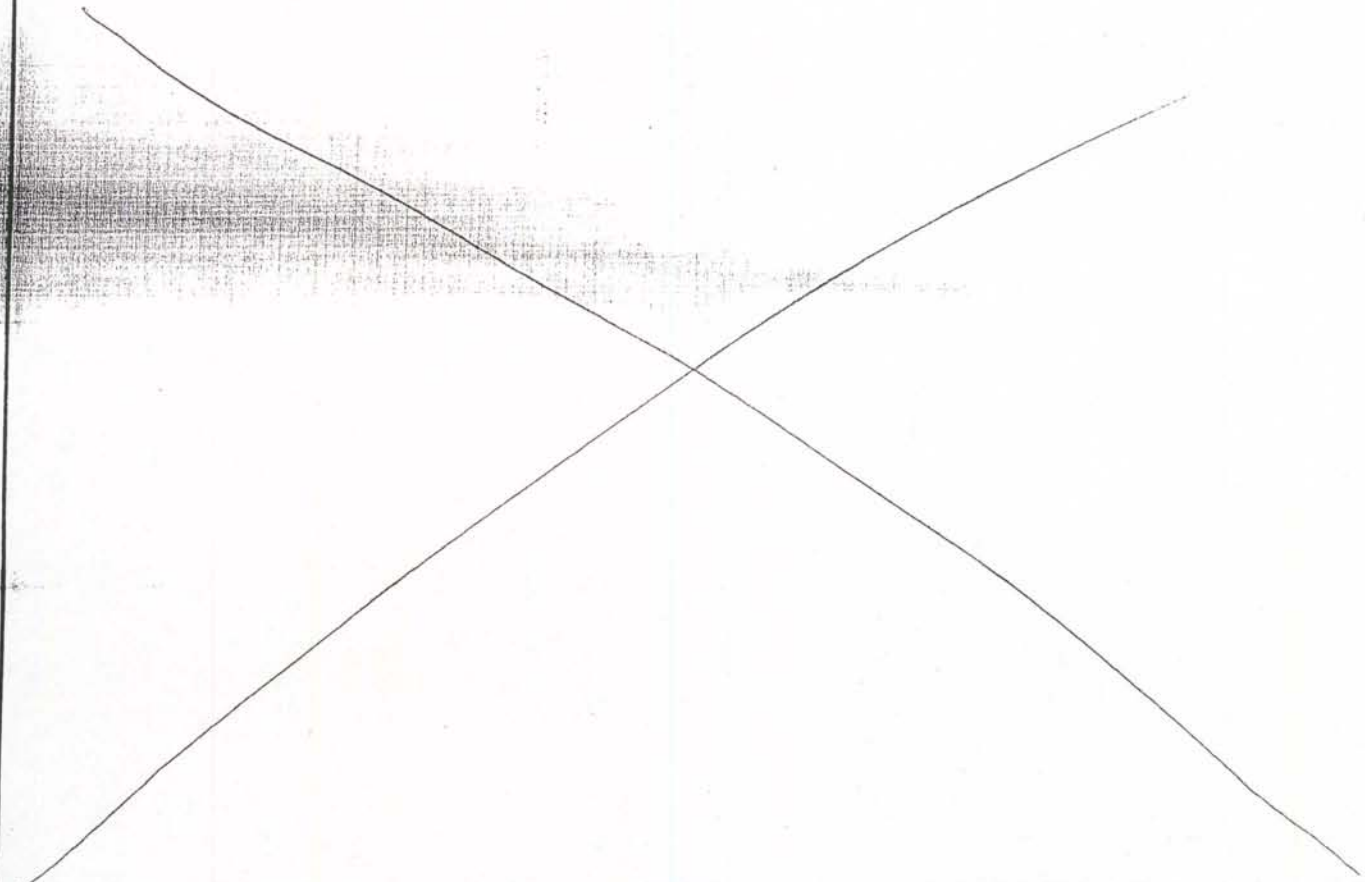

Upon receiving notification that one of the enemy combatants was "not breathing and unresponsive" I and the other members of the [REDACTED] followed the interrogator to the holding facility. The subject was found to be unresponsive to verbal + pain stimulation. He was not breathing and no pulse was found. (cardinal) upon palpation. A bag valve mask was applied and ventilation + chest compressions were started. After about one minute, the patient was moved to the next room because the place of arrest was too small for all members of the team to work. The move took < 10 seconds. After arrival at the new room, the patient was immediately intubated using an 8.0 ETT and 3 Miller laryngoscopes. Placement was confirmed via auscultation. CPR was continued. Monitors were applied. No noted electrical activity was seen (no heart rate) and standard ACLS protocol was followed to attempt resuscitation for a 40-45 min. The decision was made to take patient to the EMTS DS located ~ 2 miles away. The patient was placed on a stretcher, wrapped in a truck and brought to the EMTS DS. CPR / ACLS continued in route. Report of pt condition was given to EMTS staff and care was transferred.

The only indications of trauma were circumferential wounds of all 4 extremities at wrists and ankles. These were 1/2" to 1" thick and scabbed over. The (R) ankle also had a circumferential 1/2" ~~thick~~ ring of tissue compress as if a tight band had been in place.

Pt remained in Asystole despite all resuscitative measures, which were halted at 2333 local time when pt was pronounced dead.

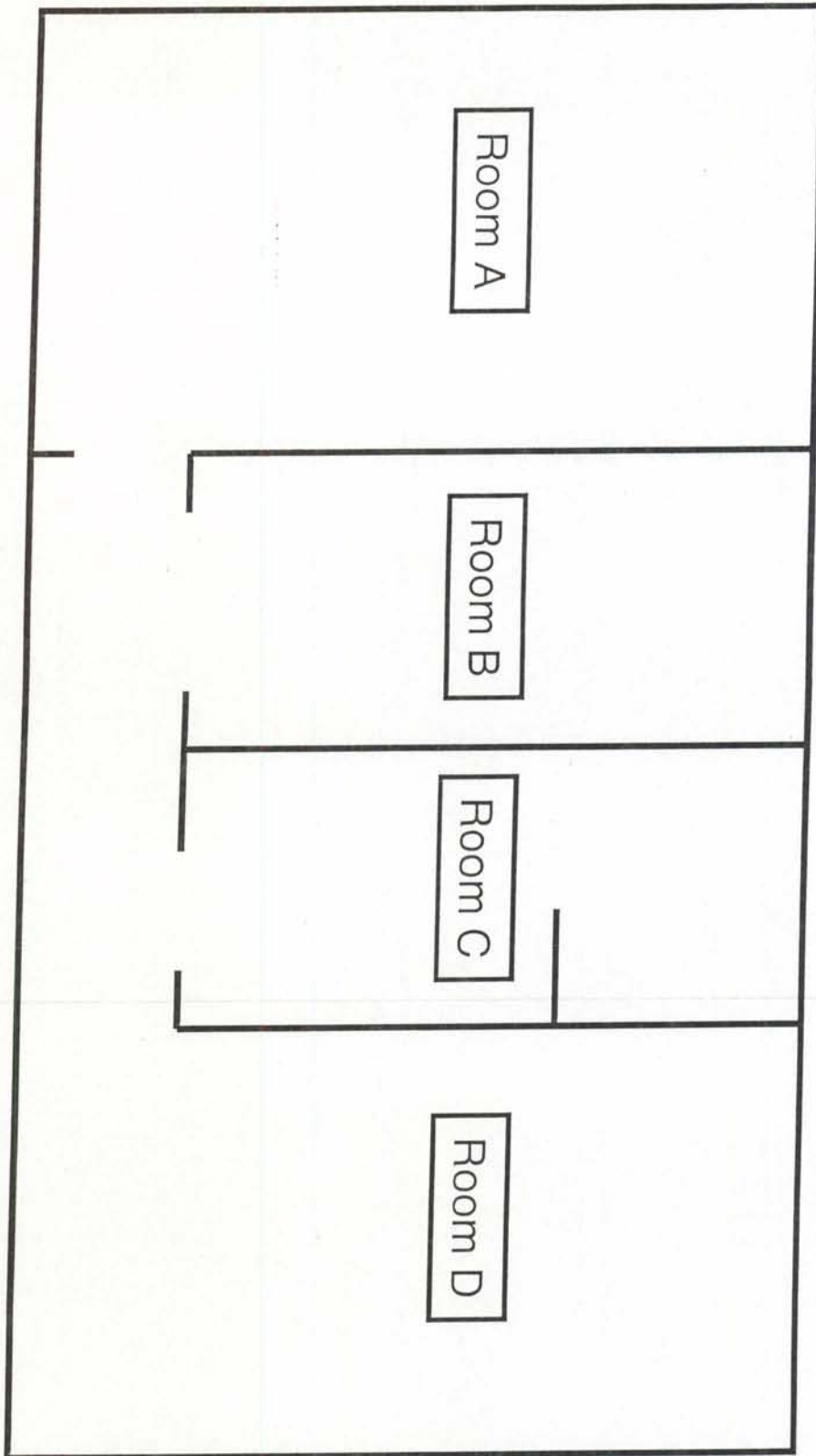

I was acting as a guard on 13 Jun 03, while I was deployed to Iraq with my unit. I worked at the holding facility guarding detainees. I began shift sometime in the late evening hours on 13 Jun 03. When I arrived at the facility the outgoing guard informed me that one of the detainees had attempted to escape. He also told me the last time he gave him water to drink. That was all he said. There was an interpreter and interrogator, from TF 20 also there when I arrived with the detainee. They were talking to the detainee. The detainee was sitting down on a chair in his cell. The interrogator was giving the detainee water to drink. The detainee drank only a sip and spit out the rest of it. The interrogator told [REDACTED] another guard with me from my unit and I to keep the detainee awake by making him stand up for 15 minutes to 30 minutes at a time. No other instructions were given, so we went back to the front of the facility. Then I started conducting my checks of all the cells, about fifteen minutes later, and the detainee was by himself. He was sitting down, [REDACTED] told him to stand up. [REDACTED] helped him up on his feet, by holding his arm pits and lifted him up. He also told him to stand up. Then we both left together. We checked him again about 15 minutes later and told him to sit down. He sat down, I went to the front. About 15 minutes to 30 minutes later, I checked the detainee again, and I found him on the ground off his chair on his back, with his handcuffs still secured to the wall. His head was leaning back, eyes were opened and his arms were above him. I went inside and tried to check for a pulse but I did not feel a pulse. I went to get the interrogator, who came into the cell and tried to get a pulse, too. But he could not feel one either, so he radioed for the medics. The medics arrived within five minutes. I took him restraints off his hands, and layed him on the ground.

I was deployed to Iraq with my unit, where I worked as a guard at the EPW holding facility, at Baghdad International Airport, Iraq., in June 2003. There was a EPW found dead while I was deployed in Iraq. I began my guard shift sometime around after lunch, and ended around right before dark. When I arrived there with another soldier [REDACTED] we were briefed by the outgoing guard to watch the EPW closely because he had grabbed another soldier's weapon earlier in the day. That was about it for this EPW. Then a member of the TF 20 came inside the facility and we went with him to the EPW's cell and he took off the EPW's flexicuffs. The EPW was sitting on the chair in the cell. He was awake, and looked at us when we came into his cell. The member of the TF 20 told us to let the EPW sleep for awhile, and we gave him some water to drink, and then left him alone. A little while later, about a couple of hours later, the EPW appeared in the hallway walking towards us, so we got up and grabbed him and took him back to his cell. We put the flexicuffs back on him. We grabbed him by the arms, and led him back to his cell. We restrained him to the chair using a flexicuff. We went back into the front room. Then our shift leader told us to clean up a little so we did some cleaning. Then again this EPW appeared in the hallway walking towards to us with the chair attached to him which he was dragging with him. We grabbed him again and led him back to his cell. Then we secured the chair to a pipe which was attached to the room. I gave him another bottle of water. We went back out of the cell and cleaned some more. Then shortly before my shift ended I went back into his room to give him some water and food. I stood by him until he finished so I could take the MRE trash out of his cell. I then left and shortly afterwards my shift ended. It was about 15 minutes or so before my shift ended.

A: He had stitches around the front scalp side of his head, I cant remember which side.

Q: When you went into the EPW's cell each time how was he acting?

A: He was sleeping in his chair, one time, then we released his cuffs so he could lay down. Then he was caught walking down the hall twice, and right before the shift change he looked at me when I gave him the water and the MRE. I handed the water to him and he looked at me and understood I was giving him the water, so he reached for it and drank the whole bottle of water.

I was in Baghdad, Iraq during Mid April thru the of the June 2003. I worked as a guard at the Field Interrogation Facility, Baghdad International Airport, Baghdad, Iraq. As I relieved the previous guards, one of them told me that one of the detainees had tried to escape. The guard also told me that the detainee had tried to reach for his weapon, and to be careful with him. That's all that I remember of that. Then awhile passed and I remember seeing the detainee walk down the hallway attempting to escape. So [redacted] and I went and handcuffed to the chair that was in his cell. We handcuffed him using flexicuffs. A little later we saw him again walking down the hallway with the chair still cuffed to his hands. So again [redacted] and I took him back to his cell and we secured him and the chair to the pipe which was attached to the wall. I think I gave him food and water, to the best of my recollection. We had to conduct checks of the detainees so I know I went by his cell again before my shift ended. He never said anything to the best of my knowledge. He looked like he was upset, but it could have been his facial features.

About 1200, 28 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] contacted [REDACTED] who related the read on procedures were not yet approved. He referred me to [REDACTED], Executive Officer, 2/75th Ranger Regiment, FLWA, who was overseeing this offices' request.

About 1100, 29 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] coordinated with [REDACTED] who explained his unit received 24 hour notification to deploy to the CENTCOM AOR, and were departing on 30 Jun 04. Agent's Comment: [REDACTED] related he would contact this agent this afternoon to advise when she could come to S-2 and get read on to interview the former [REDACTED] who was not associated with the deployment.

The detainee was brought in towards the end of my shift on guard duty. He was examined by the medical personnel and one of the interrogators, but I don't remember which one. Apparently during his examination he was not answering their questions or not answering they way they wanted so they sent him to the outside holding area where I was working. I was working with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and we were given instructions not to hit the detainee but to keep him awake using exercises. We took his clothes off because it would make him more uncomfortable. We then started to have him do exercises like squatting down and standing up repetitively, lying down on the floor and getting back up, and lifting an MRE box above his head while standing. When he did not follow instructions we used pressure points to have him comply with our instructions. [REDACTED] and myself all took turns having the detainee do exercises. We continued this through the end of our guardshift and were relieved by the following shift but I don't remember who at this time. We passed on our instruction to the following shift and went back to our area and went to sleep. I went back on duty later and worked in the main area away from the outside holding area and did not work with the detainee at that time. I did go out to the holding area to talk with the guards but I don't remember who else was working. I did see the detainee at that time and he appeared tired but otherwise he seemed to be OK. The interrogator was there and gave the detainee water but spit it back out. I left shortly afterwards and did not see the detainee again. I heard later on that the detainee had died.

A: Mostly he did what he was told. We had to use pressure points on occasion to get him to do what he was told but he wasn't much of a problem.

 I started my guard shift in the hangar area and after about a half hour I switched with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were all there and we went to the outside holding area. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were taking turns "smoking" the detainee making him do exercises because our instructions were to keep the detainee awake and give him water every hour. I don't remember who was working him before me but when I started he was already tired and sweating, so I didn't work him really hard and let him catch his breath. I had him hold the MRE box over his head but he couldn't do it any more so I told him to hold his hands over his head in the air. He did that for a couple minutes and when he couldn't do that I had him stand. When he sat down I made him stand back up. I guarded him about a half hour or so until I was relieved by [REDACTED]. I think [REDACTED] continued to "smoke" the detainee and I went to the front of the building and sat down and read a magazine. After a little while I started to eat an MRE when [REDACTED] came out and said to give the detainee a break. That's when [REDACTED] said he felt like making an MRE bomb [REDACTED] made the MRE bomb and put it in the room with the detainee. After about maybe 10 minutes or so I told [REDACTED] that it was stinking up the area so [REDACTED] went and took the MRE bomb out of the room. We were in the building with [REDACTED] sitting by the hallway with [REDACTED] and I was on the other side of the room near [REDACTED] when I heard [REDACTED] shout at the detainee. The detainee had gotten up and out of the room and was coming down the hall towards us. [REDACTED] faced the detainee and blocked his exit and ordered the detainee back into the room. [REDACTED] was standing behind and to the left of [REDACTED] blocking the rest of the hallway [REDACTED] and I were behind [REDACTED] watching. The detainee tried to grab [REDACTED] and wrestle with him and that's when he tried to grab [REDACTED]'s rifle. 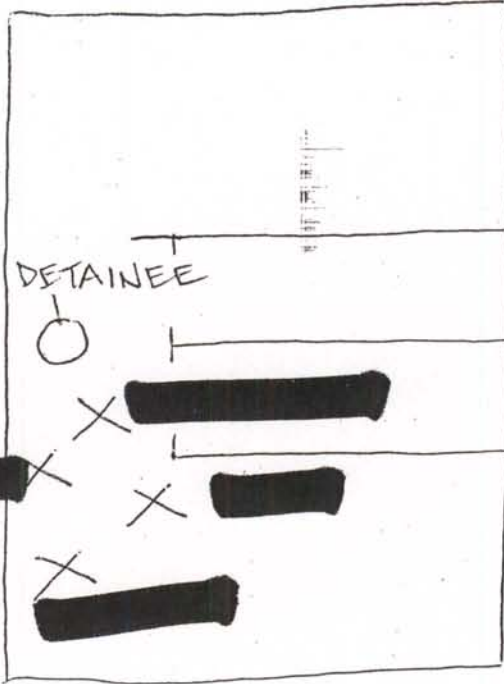

 During Jun 03 I was stationed at Baghdad International Airport and treated a detainee who later died. At that time all detainees were given an initial medical screening. The medical staff would work as a group to screen the detainees and I don't specifically remember doing his screening. After the initial screening the detainee was taken to the outside holding area and after some time I was contacted and told that the detainee required medical attention. When I arrived I found the detainee to be in aggravated and combative state. I treated him for a laceration to the scalp and sutured the laceration closed. Due to the detainees continued resistance during treatment it was necessary to restrain him in order to suture the wound. Some time later I was called again to look at the detainee because he "did not look good". When I observed him the second time he appeared somnolent, fatigued and appeared to be dehydrated. I don't remember if he was flexcuffed to the wall or the chair now. I instructed the guards to take the flexcuffs off the detainees' waist and to give him water and allow him to sleep. At that time he did not appear any different than any of the other detainees who were undergoing stress. We would regularly take detainees to the medical clinic and hold them for intravenous fluids, rest and evaluation but this detainee did not appear to be that bad. After I left for the second time it was again some time later when I was notified by the interrogator, a fireman from (b)(6) that the detainee was unresponsive. The medical team then took our aid bags to where the detainee was and began to attempt resuscitation. We worked on the detainee for at least 45 minutes but don't know except it was a long time. We gave full advanced cardiac life support measures including CPR and later transferred him to the air force medical treatment center where efforts to revive the detainee continued for some time until he was pronounced dead.

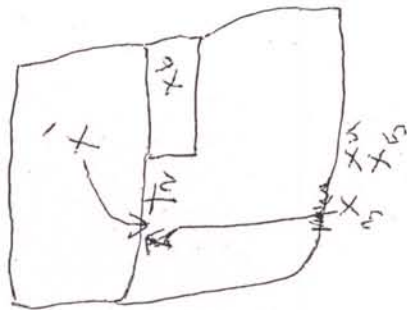

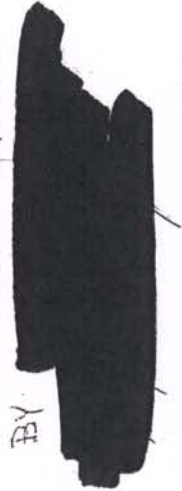

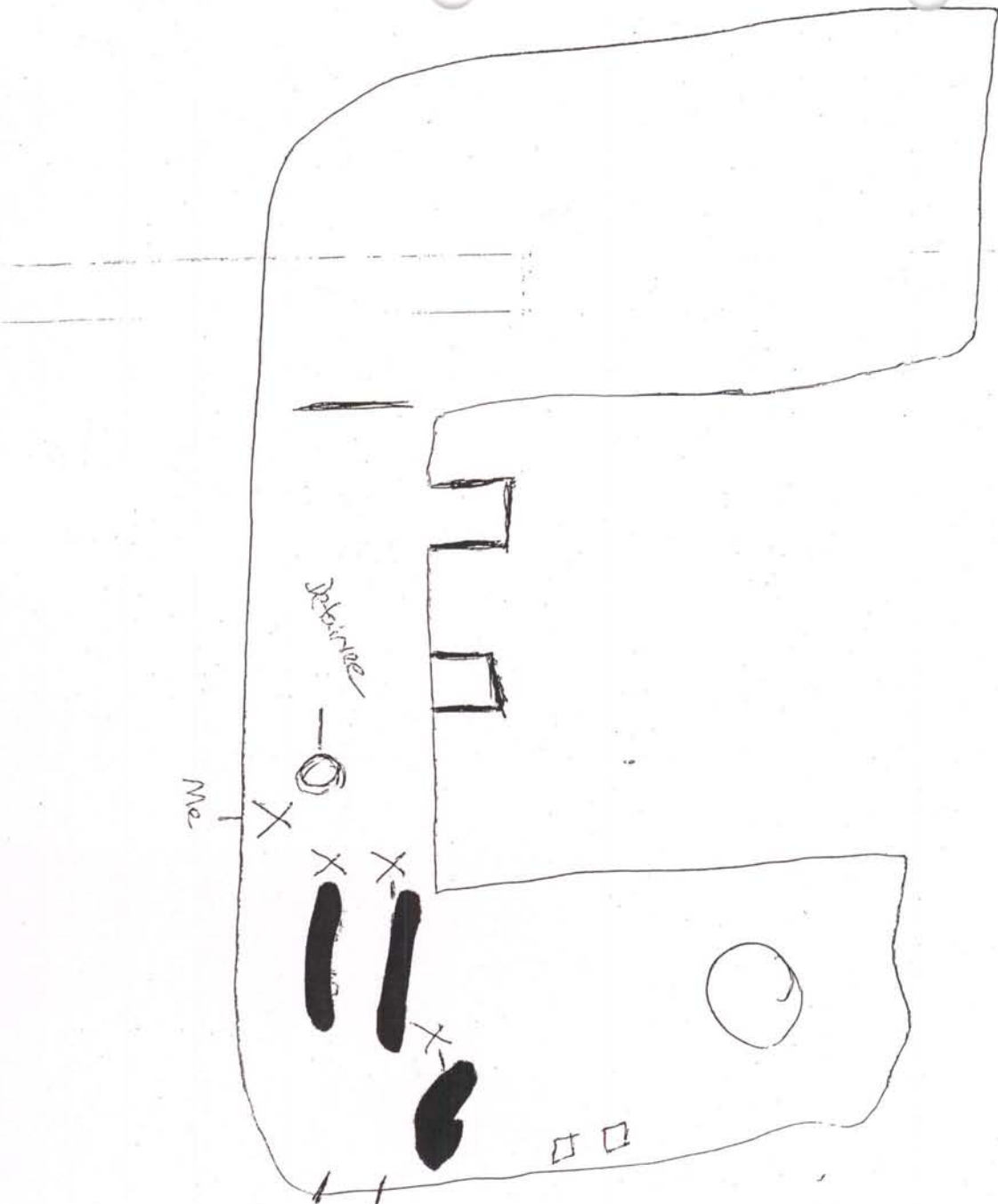

On 20 Sep 05, SA [REDACTED] received this case file from Special Agent in Charge for review. The file was prepared by the previous CID detachment on 3 Feb 05 to give to the 11th MP Bn. The file was received by CID Command on 25 Apr 05 for review by the detainee Assessment Task Force (DATF) and forwarded back to Iraq on 14 Jun 05.

On 24 Sep 05, SA [REDACTED] reviewed the case file and DATF findings.

On 17 Oct 05, SA [REDACTED] received the case file from SAC [REDACTED]. SA [REDACTED] reviewed the case file. The following information is from SA [REDACTED]'s responses and SA [REDACTED] review of the case file.

DATF review:

a(1). Two FSO reviews and a previous DATF review were documented in this file. The investigative leads were never conducted based upon those reviews and this fourth review has determined the leads should be conducted.

Response: A thorough review of the case file, including AAS and email traffic could not locate a previous DATF review of this case file. Significant previous reviews include (1) FSO review, 5 Jan 04 [REDACTED]; (2) SAC review, 15 May 04 [REDACTED]; (3) FSO review, 28 Aug 04 [REDACTED]. There is some email traffic from FSO [REDACTED] cc'd to SA [REDACTED] and CW3 [REDACTED] on 28 Aug 04 pertaining to his review of the case file.

The following investigative leads, minus comments not requiring investigation, were identified from the three reviews:

- a. Crime scene exam should always be done; at least, a verification; luminal or presumptive test for blood.
- b. Were guards examined for injuries (hit with left hand)?
- c. Suggest a timeline be done for 24-48 hours prior to death of detainee.
- d. Other prisoners were present. Were they interviewed?
- e. No crime scene done.
- f. [REDACTED] never titled for dereliction of duty for MRE/Tabasco bomb.
- g. Surrounding detainee(s) not ID'd / interviewed.
- h. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] (interpreters) not interviewed.
- i. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were identified but not interviewed.
- j. Who was guarding detainee between 0630 - 1000z, 13 Jun? Where was the detainee at this time?
- k. May need to go back and reinterview to see if anyone saw symptoms of head injury.

a. On 17 Jun 03, the CA states in the AAS the house was reoccupied by other High Value Detainees, the cell was cleaned and there was a detainee currently in room who could not be moved. FSO [redacted] stated no scene was conducted but he also commented this was addressed early in the AAS and based on the only apparent external injury was the laceration to the head, he was not sure a scene exam would have an impact on this case. Further, since this death occurred two years ago, this lead would not be practical to pursue.

b. The CA did not respond to the FSO review point by point so it is difficult to determine whether or not any injuries were noted or looked for on the hands of any of the guards. There will be no more identifiable injuries after two years. There is no mention of injuries, not even from [redacted] who is the one who admits he punched the detainee.

c. The time line was not completed by the CA after two reviews. There is no explanation in the case file why not. A time line would not solve anything but would make the case file easier to review and identify discrepancies between statements.

d. Even if other detainees were fully identified, it would be virtually impossible to locate them two years later. Detainees were kept in separate rooms and not together. They may have heard something but wouldn't have seen anything.

e. Crime Scene already addressed.

f. [redacted] is titled in the draft final report prepared by Bn.

g. Surrounding detainees already addressed.

h-i. These interpreters were listed in the 15-6 investigation statement by [redacted]

[redacted]. It would be equally difficult to locate them. The interpreters appeared to be used during short periods of time during inprocessing and during medical treatment. The three civilians named and the interpreters were not present during "PT" sessions or during the struggles.

j. A roster in the 15-6 identifies personnel on duty. A timeline would also identify who/what/when/where.

k. FSO [redacted] stated all major players involved in this case were interviewed, some more than once. This lead was completed during an RFA to Fort Lewis.

SA [redacted] prepared timeline. There are some inconsistencies but they appear more in line with different people's accounts of one incident, not deceit or a cover up. The punch by [redacted] reportedly happened about 0445 and 0630. After reviewing the case file, it is most likely the incident happened closer to 0630.

Did that one punch result in the closed head injury which resulted in Mr. DABABA's death? A photograph of Mr. DABABA upon arrival to the facility shows him with a bandage around his neck, a red nose, some dark areas around the neck and most noticeably, his right eyelid appears to be sloughed closed. Mr. DABABA was "PT'd" from 2200 until about 0600. There are statements alluding to Mr. DABABA smacking his face on the ground and dropping an MRE box (presumably a case full of MREs) on his head while being "PT'd." The

wound from the "punch" is described by the attending doctor as a 2.5cm laceration on the scalp with minimal active bleeding, which was irrigated and closed with facial nerves and motor nerves ok and pupils reactive. The autopsy did not identify any skull fractures. The small laceration was above the left eye, at the scalp line. The punch, which resulted in a small laceration and no fracture, doesn't seem consistent with a fatal coup/ countercoup internal head injury.

a(2) It is unlikely other detainees could ever be identified. Even if they were identified, it is unlikely they would ever be found two years later. There is no tracking system to locate Iraqi citizens or persons from other countries. Even if someone is in custody, they can still be very difficult to identify and locate.

a(3) Mr. DABABA was observed by other Soldiers (besides the guards) as being combative. The responding physician, [REDACTED] observed Mr. DABABA's combative behavior during the initial evaluation when he was suturing the cut on his forehead. If he was as combative as most of the interviews indicated, it would not be unusual for him to bear multiple abrasions on his body. Additionally, he was held in US custody from about 2130, 12 Jun until his death **less than 24 hours later**. It is possible he sustained a significant injury prior to his arrival to the BIF. Since he was held in custody for only 24 hours, it is not a significant time period for guards to assess his "normal" behavior.

In a response by DR [REDACTED] through SA [REDACTED], injuries could have happened up to 48 hours prior to death but in her opinion, they happened within 12 hours or less. DR [REDACTED] also stated someone would have seen him acting strange, showing symptoms of a head injury; vomiting, disorientation, and being lethargic. He would have been experiencing pain from his broken rib as well. Some of the "combative" behavior of Mr. DABABA could be from his suffering the injury.

a(4) [REDACTED] sworn statements were in the case file to CID and the 15-6 Officer. All statements are included as exhibits.

a(5) [REDACTED] was identified as [REDACTED], USMC (Reserve). [REDACTED] was interviewed twice by CID and once by the 15-6 Officer, who provided sworn statements, which are included as exhibits. [REDACTED] stated he periodically checked on the detainee.

a(6) Agree the guards could be polygraphed; however, TJAG stated all actions would be coordinated thru SF LNO, Fort Bragg.

After a review of this case file, although possible, it is unlikely that [REDACTED] single punch caused Mr. DABABA's death. Based on autopsy results and the timeline, it is likely that Mr. DABABA received another serious strike to the head prior to confinement or between 0030 and 0630, before or during the incident when [REDACTED] punched Mr. DABABA. Neither SA [REDACTED] nor SA [REDACTED] concur with a

decision of Justifiable Homicide. If the detainee attempted to escape or grab a weapon, the Ranger Guards were trained in ways to neutralize the detainee (choking out, pressure points, etc) without giving lethal blows. Personnel were instructed to stress or PT the detainee and told not to strike, kick, or hit in the head. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were charged in the 2d Status for dereliction of duty for the stink bomb. [REDACTED] Article 15 was "dismissed without prejudice." [REDACTED] should be charged with a minimum of simple assault, for the single punch to the detainee's head. [REDACTED] is no longer on active duty.

Leads to consider:

Polygraph [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] This was suggested by the FSO in 2004. [REDACTED] admits he punched the detainee and is no longer in the military. [REDACTED] is now assigned to a Fort Stewart unit, possibly back in Theater. [REDACTED] is still a Ranger assigned to Fort Lewis. If these leads are to be considered, also recommend reinterview and polygraph of [REDACTED] who is assigned to HHC, I Corps, Fort Lewis, since he was the shift supervisor and was involved with "PT'ing" the detainee.

The previous CA was considering reinterview of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. These leads are not significant. [REDACTED] worked in the BIF main, not the BIF annex where the incident occurred. [REDACTED] provided a sworn statement to CID on 20 Jun 03. [REDACTED] only saw the detainee for a "second," when he went to the BIF annex to see who tried to escape. [REDACTED] was never interviewed. [REDACTED] worked in the BIF main (not the annex) and worked the shift when the detainee came into the BIF, not the following morning shift when the incident occurred. [REDACTED] is not mentioned in any other statements, which indicate he had any knowledge of the incident. [REDACTED] full ID is unknown and it is not known if he is still in the military. AAS entries in Jan 05 indicate the CA was trying to coordinate with SA [REDACTED] 57th MP Det (CID), Mosul, Iraq and at the time, both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were located near Mosul. SA [REDACTED] does not recall the coordination or opening an RFA. Days later, the case file went to BN and these two interviews were not pursued.

About 1630, 23 Oct 05, SA [REDACTED] discussed the leads remaining for this case with the Special Agent in Charge. [REDACTED] should be titled for simple assault, since it is unlikely his one punch resulted in the detainees death but he still should not have punched the detainee. Recommend changing the subject from None to Unknown and changing Justifiable Homicide to Manslaughter, since it is clear someone struck the detainee before or during U.S. control and it is unlikely anyone intended to kill the detainee. [REDACTED] was already titled, along with two others for Dereliction of Duty.

About 0925, 3 Nov 05, SA [REDACTED] advise [REDACTED] Company, 703rd Forward Support Battalion, Union III, Iraq of his rights, which he waived and provided a sworn statement

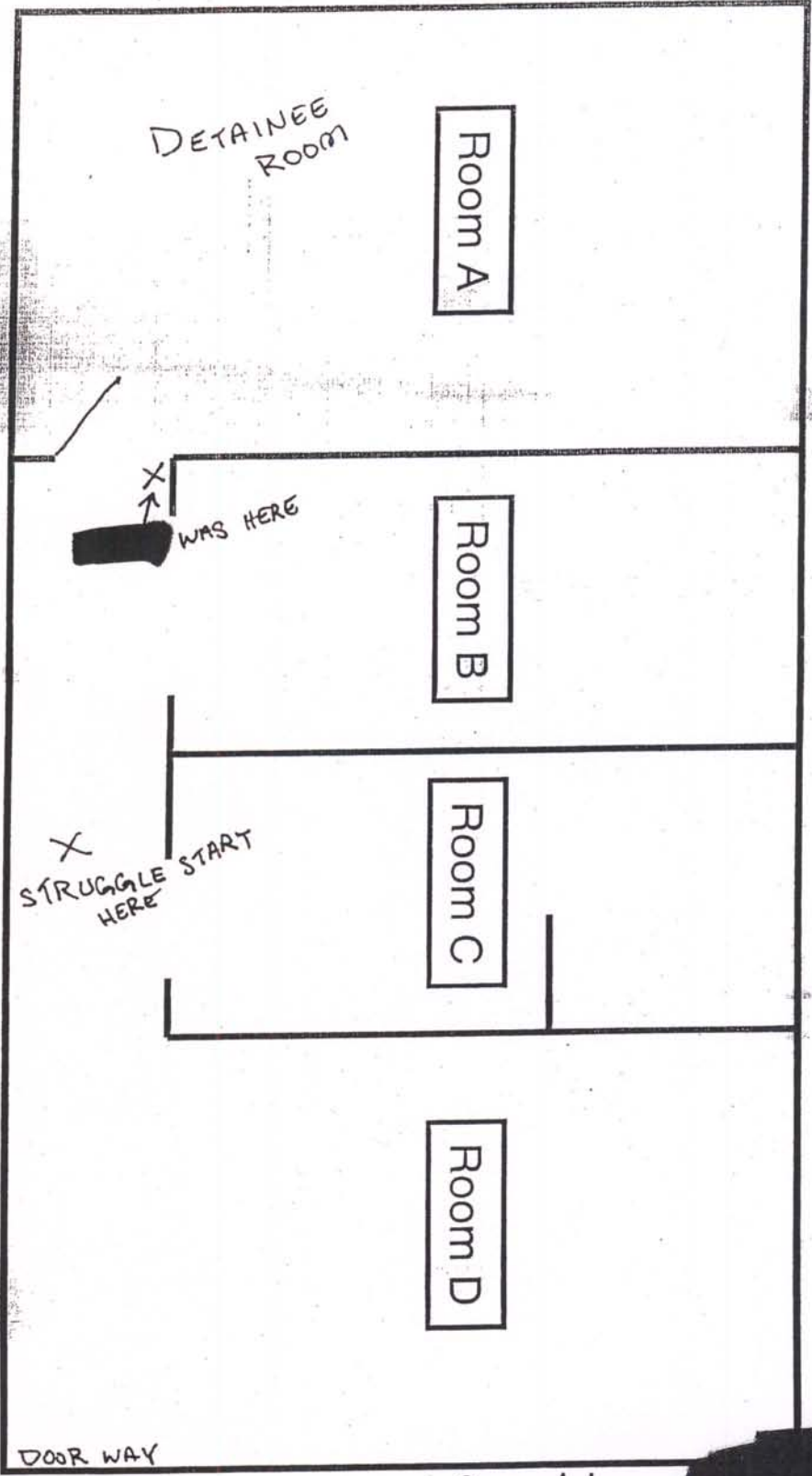

I heard the detainee cough a little bit and my eyes began to water a little bit. I suggested that we take it out and [REDACTED] threw it out. In the last fifteen or twenty minutes or so the detainee came running down the hall out of his cuffs. [REDACTED] got in his way and held him back. As [REDACTED] began to sling his weapon behind him the detainee reached for the weapon. [REDACTED] punched him once and split open his forehead. [REDACTED] related his son was at work but he did not know where he worked and he did not know his cell phone. Agents provided several contact numbers and request he provide the numbers to his son.

Between 1600-1710, 27 Apr 06, SA [REDACTED] and SA [REDACTED], traveled to [REDACTED] residence. Upon arriving, agents knocked on his door but received no answer. BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: About 1645, 25 Oct 06, this office received a Request for Assistance (RFA) from the Camp Liberty CID Office, Iraq, to interview [REDACTED] [REDACTED] 92nd Military Police Company (formerly assigned to 75th Ranger Regiment), regarding his assignment to the Battlefield Interrogation Facility (BIF) Annex near Baghdad, Iraq. Specifically, the RFA detailed that Mr Dilar DABABA was in custody at the BIF at the time of his death and a [REDACTED] was on guard duty in the vicinity of Mr DABABA from 0600-1000, 13 Jun 03, and might have information pertaining to his death.

About 1830, 25 Oct 06, SA [REDACTED] interviewed [REDACTED] regarding his assignment to the 75th Ranger Regiment and duty at the BIF in 2003. [REDACTED] stated he did not recall the name Dilar DABABA, but did recall an incident with one of his fellow Soldiers, who punched a detainee that tried to grab his weapon. [REDACTED] stated the name of his fellow Soldier was [REDACTED] however, the only thing he knew about [REDACTED] was that he was no longer on Active Duty and that he currently lived in [REDACTED]. About 1953, [REDACTED] completed a sworn statement detailing his actions and observations while assigned to the BIF. [REDACTED] also provided a rough sketch of the BIF layout, as he recalled from assignment there. (See Sworn Statement and Rough Sketch)

About 1045, 26 Oct 06, SA [REDACTED] coordinated with SA [REDACTED] Camp Liberty CID Office, Iraq, and briefed him on the results of the interview of [REDACTED]. I, [REDACTED], want to provide the following statement, under oath: I was assign to BCo 2/75th Ranger BN. Our company deployed to Iraq on February 2003 to June 2003. My job in Iraq was to either conduct missions with my company or to stay back with my supplies just in case anybody needed any equipment or supplies. In addition we were living in the Hangers in Baghdad Iraq. We had two Facilities building were we kept detainees in there to be interrogating. The 1st building we had 1st and the 2nd we had in about a month later. The 1st building had two rooms on the left a bath-room in the middle and two rooms on the right. The 1st room on the left were all the new Iraqis that came fresh from a mission. The other rooms 2, 3 & 4 had Iraqis there but the Interrogator personnel was the one who would make a discision if the Iraqi was going to be in the rooms 2, 3, or 4. That depended if the Iraqi would give him information that he needed. The second building only had two rooms. And this building if you were new Iraqi and you had sam with they (Interrogators) would separate you. I believe we pull from 2 to 3 hours duty. They were one time that my Ranger comrade told me when he got off duty that he had his M-4 rested on the well and this Iraqi try to reach for the weapon and my Ranger comrade with his name was [REDACTED] push this Iraqi to the well and punch him. And that was it. I never bothered to ask where he punch the guy or whatever happen to this Iraqi guy.

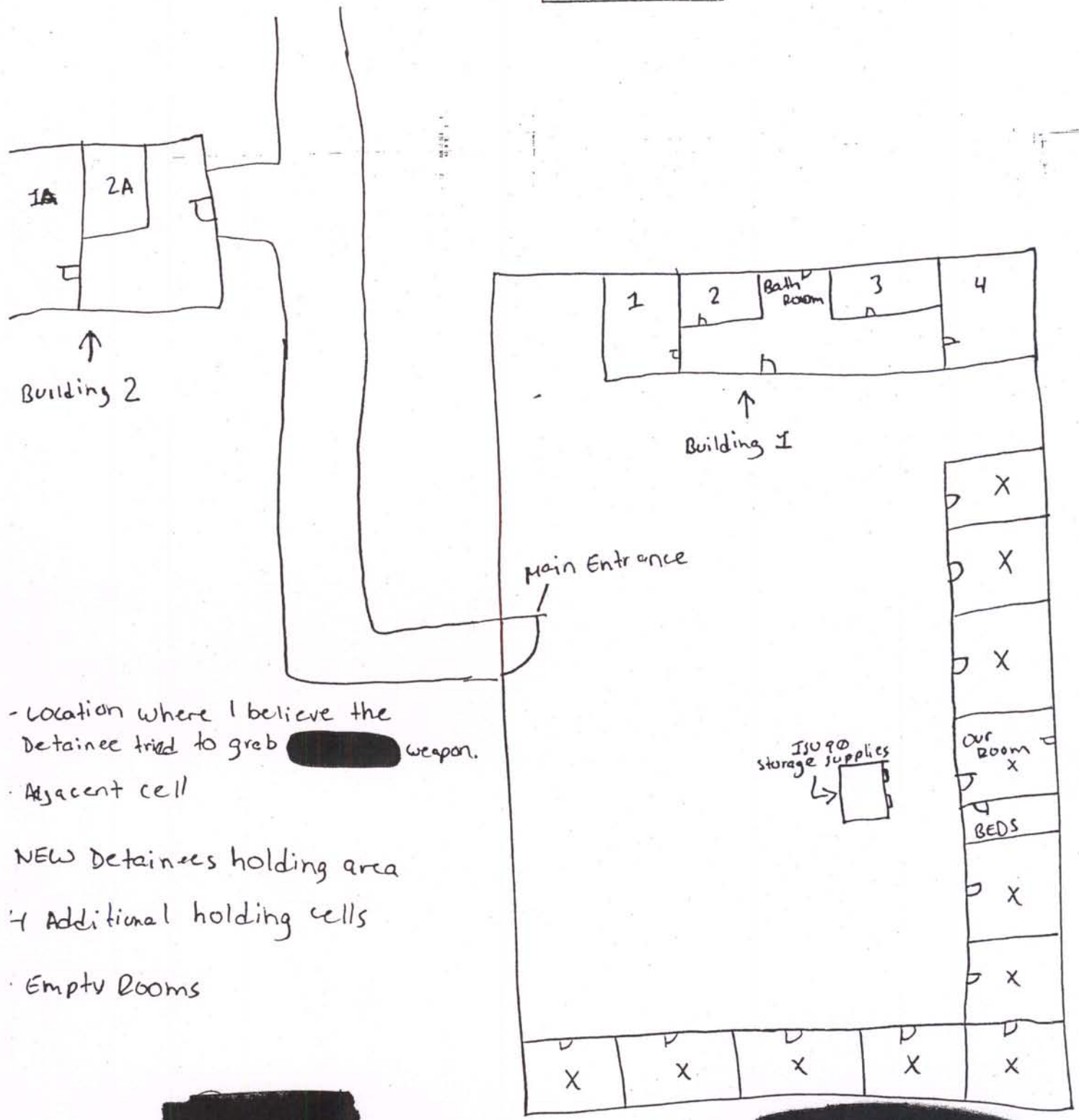

INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

On 16 Jun 03, this office was notified by the 10th MP Det (CID), BIAP, IRAQ, of a request by CENTCOM to conduct an independent investigation into the death of a prisoner being held at TF-20, Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), Baghdad, Iraq.

Preliminary investigation has established that DABABA was in custody of US Forces at BIAP for less than 36 hours, during this time he was placed in an interrogation center and made to undergo both physical and psychological stress, described as sleep deprivation and various forms of physical exercise. During this time he also made a number of attempts to escape, struggling with guards and at one point attempting to grab a hold of a guard's weapon, the guard responded by slinging his weapon over his back, and utilizing less than deadly force by pushing DABABA up against a wall, when DABABA rushed him again the guard punched DABABA once in the face with his left hand causing a cut on DABABA'S forehead.

An autopsy completed on 17 Jun 03, provided a preliminary cause of death as a closed head injury. This office is awaiting the final autopsy results.

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This is an interim report. Additional investigative activity will be conducted and documented in subsequent report(s). The information in this report is based upon an allegation or preliminary investigation and may change prior to the completion of the investigation. Commanders are reminded of the provisions of AR 600-8-2 pertaining to suspension of favorable personnel actions and AR 380-67 for the suspension of security clearances of persons under investigation

8. Statement of [REDACTED] 20 Jun 03, in which he related that on the day DABABA died [REDACTED] was assigned to the main interrogation facility DABABA was in the annex. [REDACTED] related that during his shift one of the interrogators came in to use the phone to call for a doctor, later on that same shift [REDACTED] learned that a detainee had died.

9. Statement of [REDACTED] 21 Jun 03, in which he related that he was an interrogator at the facility. [REDACTED] stated that when he came on shift he checked on DABABA and found him sitting on the floor flex cuffed to the wall. [REDACTED] gave DABABA some water, which he took and spit it some out on the floor. [REDACTED] left and a few minutes later a guard told him he had checked on DABABA and believed he was dead. They immediately went to DABABA'S aid and called for medics.

10. AIR of SA [REDACTED] 4 Sep 03, detailing the receipt of the RFA; Coordination with the S-2, NCOIC, 2/75TH Ranger Regiment; and the interviews of [REDACTED] AND [REDACTED]

11. Statement of [REDACTED] 26 Aug 03, in which he related when he came on shift he had checked on the detainee and he appeared coherent then about 15 to 30 minutes later [REDACTED] discovered him laying on the floor unconscious and unresponsive.

12. Statement of [REDACTED] 26 Aug 03, in which he related that he guarded DABABA the shift prior to DABABA'S death and was instructed to apply authorized psychological and physical stress. During that time DABABA made no attempts to escape while in [REDACTED] custody.

13. Statement of [REDACTED] 26 Jun 03, in which he related that DABABA had left his cell twice during his shift and had to be escorted back to his cell. Before [REDACTED] ended his shift he provided food and water to DABABA and noted DABABA to be tired and dozing off in his chair.

14. Statement of [REDACTED] 4 Sep 03, in which he related that DABABA had attempted to escape twice during his shift by walking out of his cell down the hall. [REDACTED] stated that when his shift ended DABABA looked upset but was quiet.

THIS STATUS REPORT WAS SUBMITTED TO LIST THE OFFENSE OF INVOLUNTARY MANSLAUGHTER AS INSUFFICIENT EVIDENCE TO PROVE OR DISPROVE IT OCCURRED; MODIFY THE MANNER OF DEATH AS UNDETERMINED; ADD MR DABABA AS A SUBJECT FOR THE OFFENSES OF SIMPLE ASSAULT AND ATTEMPTED ESCAPE; ADD [REDACTED] AS THE SUBJECT OF CRUELY AND MALTREATMENT; AND ADD [REDACTED]

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[REDACTED] AND THE US GOVERNMENT AS VICTIMS OF SIMPLE ASSAULT AND ATTEMPTED ESCAPE RESPECTIVELY.

THE TOTALITY OF THE EVIDENCE COLLECTED, BOTH TESTIMONIAL AND FORENSIC, DETERMINED THERE WAS INSUFFICIENT EVIDENCE TO PROVE OR DISPROVE [REDACTED], OR [REDACTED] COMMITTED ANY CRIMINAL OFFENSE ASSOCIATED WITH THE DEATH OF MR DABABA. AT THE TIME THE DECISION WAS MADE TO ADD THE OFFENSE OF INVOLUNTARY MANSLAUGHTER TO THIS INVESTIGATION, THERE WAS NO CREDIBLE INFORMATION TO INDEX [REDACTED] OR [REDACTED] AS SUBJECTS OF THE OFFENSE.

AFTER A COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW OF ALL INVESTIGATIVE ACTIVITIES TO DATE BY THIS OFFICE, THE 10TH MP BATTALION OPERATIONS OFFICER AND FORENSIC SCIENCE OFFICER, IT WAS DETERMINED THAT MR DABABA SHOULD HAVE BEEN INDEXED AS A SUBJECT FOR THE OFFENSES OF ATTEMPTED ESCAPE AND SIMPLE ASSAULT. ON 13 JUN 03, MR. DABABA GRABBED [REDACTED] WEAPON AND ASSAULTED HIM AND [REDACTED] IN THE PROCESS OF AN ESCAPE ATTEMPT.

AT ABOUT 2100, 12 JUN 03, MR DABABA WAS DETAINED BY UNIDENTIFIED COALITION FORCES PERSONNEL AND TRANSPORTED TO THE BIF. HE WAS IN-PROCESSED INTO THE BIF WITH MINOR CONTUSIONS AND ABRASIONS AND CLEARED BY MEDICAL PERSONNEL FOR INTERVIEWS BY BIF ANNEX INTERROGATORS.

BETWEEN 0400 AND 0430, 13 JUN 03, [REDACTED] CONCOCTED AN MEAL READY TO EAT (MRE) STINK BOMB FROM THE HEATING DEVICE, WATER, AND TABASCO SAUCE, AND PLACED IT INTO MR DABABA'S CELL. THE FUMES WERE AGGRAVATING AND CAUSED RESPIRATORY AGITATION, PRESUMABLY LEADING TO MR DABABA'S EXIT FROM HIS CELL.

AT ABOUT 0600, 13 JUN 06, MR DABABA EXITED HIS DETENTION CELL AND CHARGED TOWARDS [REDACTED] IN AN ATTEMPT TO ESCAPE. [REDACTED] CHOSE LESS THAN LETHAL FORCE AND ACTED WITHIN THE LIMITS OF HIS OPERATIONAL DUTIES AS A GUARD, WHEN HE PHYSICALLY GRABBED MR DABABA AND FORCED HIM INTO A WALL AND ONTO THE FLOOR TO PROPERLY RESTRAIN HIM. MR DABABA THEN GRABBED AT [REDACTED] WEAPON AND IN AN EFFORT TO FURTHER SUBDUE MR DABABA, [REDACTED] PUNCHED HIM ABOVE HIS LEFT EYE. AS A RESULT, MR. DABABA SUSTAINED A LACERATION WHICH REQUIRED SUTURES.

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BETWEEN 2130, 12 JUN 03 AND 1940, 13 JUN 03, MR DABABA WAS SUPERVISED AND MONITORED BY GUARDS AND MEDICAL PERSONNEL UNTIL HIS DEATH. INTERVIEWS WITH ALL GUARD AND MEDICAL PERSONNEL DID NOT DISCLOSE ANY OTHER INCIDENT WITHIN THE BIF ANNEX WHICH COULD HAVE CAUSED THE INJURIES THAT LED TO HIS DEATH. ALTHOUGH MR DABABA SUSTAINED A HEAD INJURY DURING HIS ESCAPE ATTEMPT, THERE WAS NO DEFINITIVE EVIDENCE TO LINK THE INJURY SUSTAINED WITH THE COUP/CONTRECOURP INJURY IDENTIFIED AT HIS AUTOPSY. FURTHER, THE AUTOPSY REPORT REVEALED THE CLOSED HEAD INJURY SUSTAINED BY MR DABABA COULD HAVE OCCURRED UP TO 48 HOURS PRIOR TO HIS DEATH. AS A RESULT, THE INVESTIGATION COULD NOT RULE OUT THAT MR DABABA SUSTAINED THE FATAL INJURY PRIOR TO DETENTION BY COALITION FORCES.

FINALIZATION OF THIS INVESTIGATION IS PENDING ADMINISTRATIVE CLOSURE.

THE OFFENSE OF JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDE WAS CHANGED TO INVOLUNTARY MANSLAUGHTER AS MR DABABA RECEIVED A BLOW TO THE HEAD WITH ENOUGH FORCE TO CAUSE A FATAL INTERNAL HEAD INJURY. IT IS UNLIKELY ANYONE INTENDED TO CAUSE THE DEATH OF MR DABABA. THERE IS INSUFFICIENT EVIDENCE TO INDICATE THE SINGLE PUNCH BY [REDACTED] CAUSED THE INTERNAL HEAD INJURY RESULTING IN MR DABABA'S DEATH. IT IS UNKNOWN IF MR DABABA RECEIVED THE INJURY BEFORE OR DURING THE 24 HOURS HE WAS IN U.S. FORCES CUSTODY.

ON 13 JUN 03, 19 JUN 03, AND 14 DEC 04, [REDACTED] PROVIDED STATEMENTS ADMITTING HE PUNCHED MR DABABA IN THE HEAD WHEN MR DABABA ATTEMPTED TO GRAB HIS WEAPON. THE PUNCH RESULTED IN A 2.5 CM LACERATION TO MR DABABA'S FOREHEAD WHICH REQUIRED STITCHES. GUARDS WERE INSTRUCTED NOT TO STRIKE MR DABABA AND WERE TRAINED IN OTHER MEANS OF FORCE TO SUBDUE DETAINEES.

DURING THAT TIMEFRAME, HE WAS PLACED IN AN INTERROGATION CENTER AND MADE TO UNDERGO BOTH PHYSICAL AND PSYCHOLOGICAL STRESS, DESCRIBED AS SLEEP DEPRIVATION AND VARIOUS FORMS OF PHYSICAL EXERCISE. DURING THIS TIMEFRAME, [REDACTED] CONSTRUCTED AN "MRE STINK BOMB" UTILIZING TOBACCO SAUCE BOTTLES FROM HIS AND [REDACTED] MRE AND PLACED THE "MRE STINK BOMB" INTO MR DABABA'S CELL. [REDACTED] WHO WAS THE THIRD GUARD ON DUTY DURING THE SHIFT WAS DERELICT IN HIS DUTIES AS HE FAILED TO STOP [REDACTED] IN THE COMMISSION OF THE ACT.

WHILE MR DABABA WAS IN CUSTODY, HE MADE NUMEROUS ESCAPE ATTEMPTS. DURING ONE OF THE ESCAPE ATTEMPTS, MR DABABA ATTEMPTED TO GRAB [REDACTED] HHC, 2/75TH RANGER REGIMENT, FORT LEWIS, WA WEAPON. My brief assessment does not cover all aspects of this incident, as there are many aspects to this incident that does not completely explain how the Detainee received the injuries which resulted in his death. It appears that the statements given by the subjects are similar in some aspects, but do not appear to reasonably explain injuries sustained by the Detainee. More than likely, someone has omitted details surrounding the confinement and treatment of the Detainee, which resulted in his death. At this point, only the re-interview of suspects to clarify statements of fact and to ask additional questions could possibly disclose new information. Further, to at least confirm the statements provided, all suspects should be afforded the opportunity to undergo a polygraph examination to verify the truthfulness of their statement(s).

If your office has a specific request concerning information pertaining to this incident let me know. Based on your last email, I am not sure if you are looking for capture information or additional information you feel our organization might be able to provide. If there is something specific you are looking for let me know and I'll check on it.

On 16 Jun 03, this office was notified by the 10th MP Det (CID), Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), Iraq, that Mr Dilar DABABA (aka: HASSIN), an Iraqi civilian, (NFI) died while in the custody of US Forces at BIAP. The notification was subsequent to a request by US Central Command (CENTCOM) to conduct an independent investigation into the death of Mr DABABA, who was held in a facility operated by TF-20, BIAP, Baghdad, Iraq.

2. Preliminary investigation revealed Mr DABABA was placed in an interrogation center (Annex) and made to undergo both physical and psychological stress, described as sleep deprivation and various forms of physical exercise. During this time Mr. DABABA also made a number of attempts to escape, struggled with guards and at one point attempted to grab a guard's weapon. The guard responded and slung his weapon over his back, and pushed Mr DABABA against a wall. Mr DABABA again rushed the guard and was punched by the guard with his left fist, which caused a cut on Mr DABABA's upper left forehead at the hair line. Approximately 12 hours after the escape attempt, Mr DABABA was checked on by an interrogator who gave him water. Approximately five minutes afterwards, a guard saw Mr DABABA laying on his back in his cell. The guard checked Mr DABABA for signs of life, which were negative. The guard immediately notified the interrogator who notified medical personnel.

On 17 Jun 03, an autopsy was performed on Mr DABABA by the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP). The results of the autopsy determined the cause of death to be a closed head injury and the manner of death as homicide. The autopsy report indicated coup/contrecoup injuries to the front right and rear left of Mr DABABA's skull. Further, a comparison of the initial capture photograph and the autopsy photographs reveal multiple abrasions to Mr DABABA's right forehead, eyebrow, right cheek bone, and right ear. The initial capture photograph does not show these injuries.

On 5 Jan 06, [REDACTED], B Troop, 1st Squadron, 2nd Cavalry Regiment, Fort Lewis, WA, who was identified as a guard during the time frame Mr DABABA made his first attempt to escape, witnessed [REDACTED] strike Mr DABABA in the head during the escape attempt. conducted a sit down review of the case file and the draft final report. The basic problem with this case is that the investigation was initiated over 40 months ago. Those items which were not accomplished or those which were not thorough can not be accomplished as a later time to standard.

1. The autopsy report of 11 May 04, nearly 11 months following the death identified a number of bruises to the body of Dababa in addition to the coup and contrecoup to the head. During the interviews of the guards, several incidents were mentioned which provided reasonable explanations as to how these bruises could have been caused (PT, pressure points, Dababa's three escape attempts).
2. The autopsy report determined the cause of death was attributed to a closed head injury of the right occipital region and a corresponding contrecoup hemorrhage. There was a notable subdural hemorrhage in the left frontal region as well. According to the interviews of [REDACTED] he admitted hitting Dababa in the left eye region during his first attempt to escape about 0400-0430, 13 Jun '03. [REDACTED] explained Dababa attacked him and attempted to grab his weapon that he shoved Dababa against the wall and that Dababa fell to the floor. It was after Dababa fell and while [REDACTED] was checking on his condition that Dababa reached for his weapon a second time (witnessed by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. At that time [REDACTED] struck him in the left eye area with his fist. This fall may have resulted in the injuries to the forehead and may explain the injury to the right occipital region. Multiple interviews of these eye witnesses and other guards, over a three year period did NOT identify any other specific incidents which might explain the injuries.
3. Considering the amount of force employed by [REDACTED] to prevent Dababa's escape and to prevent him from seizing [REDACTED] weapon, that force was reasonable and necessary. This does not constitute an assault.
4. The amount of force employed by [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to gain control of Dababa, prevent his escape was reasonable and necessary. This does not constitute an assault.
5. There were rumors, which were denied and not supported by the investigation, that two other guards "butt stroked" Dababa later on 13 Jun '03.
6. Regarding the Action of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] with respect to the "stink bomb" the unit Commander dismissed the Art 15 action without prejudice. No action was recorded as having been taken against the other two. NOTE: It is more likely than not that the stink bomb was the motivating event which prompted Dababa to attack [REDACTED].
7. Based on the totality of the investigation, there is no physical or testimonial evidence to prove [REDACTED] committed any offense associated with the death of Dababa. That the amount of force employed to subdue Dababa was reasonable and appropriate.
8. The offense of involuntary manslaughter is unfounded; the offense of undetermined death will be added to subject number 1 - Unknown.
9. Dababa will be listed for the offenses of attempted escape and assault, with [REDACTED] and the US Govt listed as victims of those offenses.
10. This investigation needs to be discussed, in depth, during a meeting with SJA. Pending concurrence a 5th Status Report is to be prepared. Forward the draft to me for review.
11. A carefully worded and reviewed Final C Report will follow.

1. [REDACTED] according to the polygraph report, admitted that he lied in his prior sworn statements. He seems a likely subject (if applicable) for any criminal offense regarding the death of DABABA.

2. I NON-concur on listing the death as a justifiable homicide. We have not proven that the purported use of force was either proportionate to the alleged assault by the detainee on the guard; or consistent w/ a contre-coup injury. The detainee allegedly, after continuous "smoking" still had enough energy to assault a guard, who was carrying a weapon in close proximity with a prisoner, (which violates corrections doctrine), and was then punched and choked by at least 2 Rangers. Considering polygraph results (or lack thereof) on top of this fact pattern does not comport w/ an act of self defense (and consider [REDACTED] alleged butt stroke admission).

3. Still no timeline, noted in several prior reviews.

4. The AFIP report does not specifically address the specific acts which allegedly occurred to the detainee prior to death. Although possible, a contre-coup is NOT

LIKELY from a simple fall (insufficient force generated).

2. According to statements in case file, [REDACTED] punched Mr DABABAN with a "closed right fist strike at a downward angle" at his head. Most of the individuals interviewed corroborate Mr DABABA started to bleed from his head immediately after his struggle with [REDACTED]. None of the individuals interviewed related seeing anyone, including [REDACTED] strike Mr DABABA with the butt of his weapon. The Autopsy report stated Mr DABABA died as a result of the strike to his head; further, all interviews indicate strongly [REDACTED] was responsible for the injury.
3. The question of whether or not [REDACTED] used excessive force to restrain Mr DABABA. Bottom Line: Mr DABABA died as a result of a head injury. A controlled strike to the head would not have resulted in death, without any indication of skull irregularities—which the Autopsy Report did not substantiate.
4. Need to re-evaluate case as there is credible information to believe [REDACTED] caused Mr DABABA's death as a result of use of excessive force. (i.e. Negligent Homicide or Involuntary Manslaughter).
5. According to IP, next investigative leads were re-interview/polygraph of [REDACTED] and interview of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. However, TJAG stated all actions would be coordinate thru SF LNO, SA [REDACTED] at Fort BRAGG.
6. Do not see what can be done by this office beyond reviewing case file and responding to DATF.

RESPONSE TO DATF FINDINGS:

1. Timeline: There is conflicting times of occurrences, based on information from the Statements. Will attempt to put together a "rough" timeline.
2. Interview of Other Detainee: Noted in AAS entry by SA [REDACTED] on 15 May 05 indicated "There was a detainee in the next room during the attempted escapes but the person was never identified and interviewed. Probably to late now." Without further information, it would be virtually impossible to locate the potential witness without any additional information as it is unlikely the BIF kept records of how was in the cell next door given it was a temporary holding facility.
3. Mr DABABA is observed by other Soldiers (excluding the guards) as being combative. The responding physician, [REDACTED] observed Mr DABABA's combative behavior during the initial evaluation when he was suturing the cut on his forehead. If he is as combative as most of the interviews indicated, it would not be unusual for him to bear multiple abrasions on his body. Additionally, he was held in U.S. Custody for less than 36 hours prior to his death. It is also possible he sustained many of the injuries prior or during his capture. Additionally, given the fact he was held in custody for less than 36 hours, that is not a significant period time to assess his "normal" behavior with guards (i.e. cooperative or combative). It

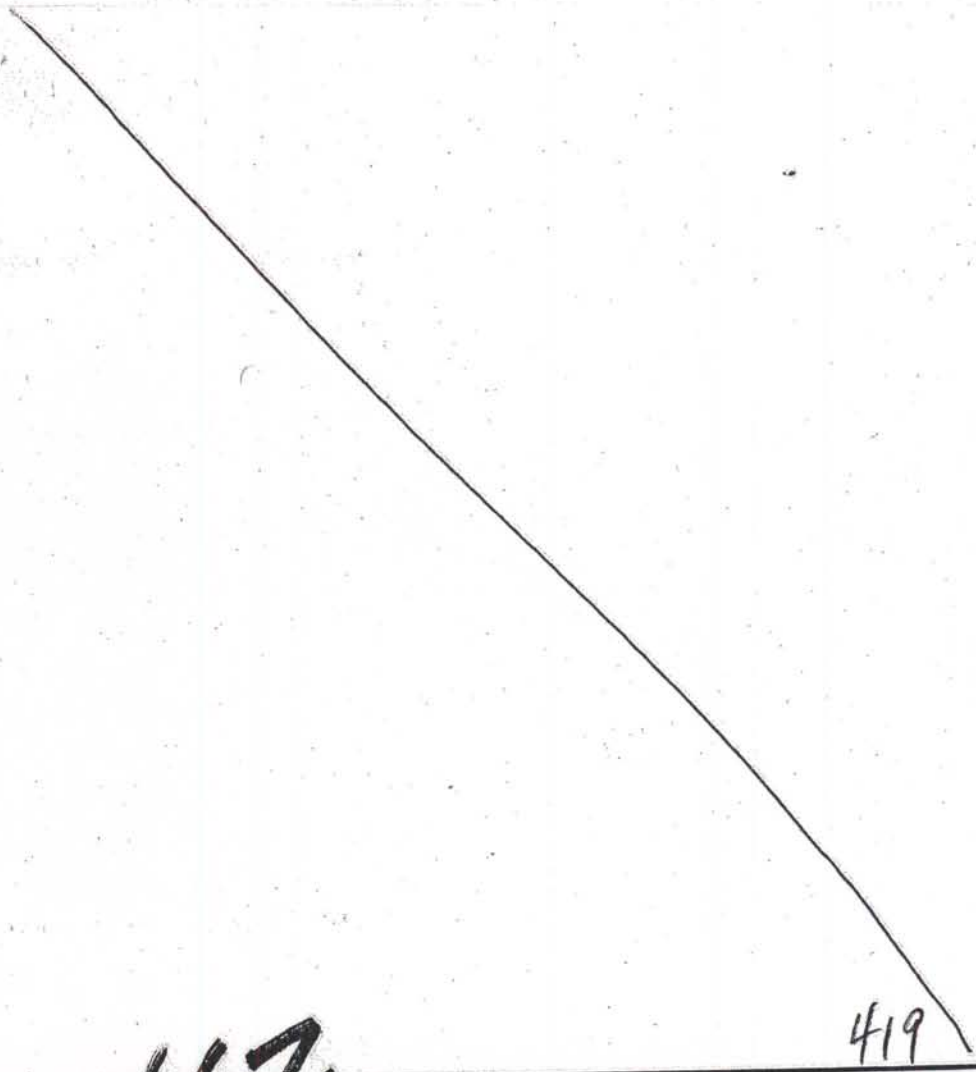

Conducted a review of this file.

All of the major players involved in the case were interviewed, some more than once. Some of the statements were a little thin, but most were at least adequate.

No scene exam was conducted, but this was addressed early in the AAS. Based on the only apparent external injury was the laceration to the head, not sure a scene exam would have had much of an impact on this case.

There was an FSO review back on 5 Jan 04, and he gave guidance to do a timeline. Don't see where we ever did that. Its still a good idea. We need to do the timeline and figure out where the players were at the critical times. First when the unit claims the injury to the head took place, about 0600, 13 Jun 03, and then again about 1800, 13 Jun 04. The head injury, if severe enough, may have caused symptoms. Again, depending on the severity of the injury, the symptoms would have been evident pretty quickly after the injury. We may need to go back and do add'l interviews/re-interviews on this to find out whether we can get anyone to admit they saw symptoms.

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] describe Dababa as very combative and aggressive, going so far as to claim he made repeated escape attempts. The other folks who were guarding the victim don't describe him the same way, but more compliant. [REDACTED] denies the victim made any attempts to escape on his shift. Seems odd that only one or two guards are describing escape attempts. This maybe an attempt on the part of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to justify their attempts to subdue him. Additionally, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] provide pretty consistent detail for the period before the death, but when it comes time to describe what happens at the time of death, details are lacking. Additionally, when the victim is non-compliant, they more or less ignore it and let it go, whereas nearly every other time he was noncompliant they used limited force to enforce compliance. Why the change?

[REDACTED] describes the detainee as being combative with a Ranger guard shortly before his death, but neither [REDACTED] makes mention of anything like this. They assert nearly the opposite, in fact, claiming they didn't enforce compliance as mentioned earlier in this review.

[REDACTED] is the one who does the MRE bomb and he's also there when the detainee is found dead. An interesting coincidence.

I believe its possible the victim was injured at 1800, 13 Jun 03 vs 0600. If that's true, you got several unit members who gave false statements regarding how and when this detainee was injured. In order to clarify this question, I've sent an email to AFIP seeking information regarding whether the injury was consistent with a blow from a fist, whether the injury would have cause symptoms to be apparent, and when those symptoms would have been visible. Once we get a reply back from AFIP, we may have to go back and do some more interviews. I don't think a punch to the head like the one described by [REDACTED] would result in the head laceration or the coup counter coup injury described in the autopsy report. Perhaps a rifle butt stroke or something similar.

Bottom line: There are inconsistencies in the statements, inconsistencies with what we think we know about the injuries, and those involved have a motive to lie about what happened. Once we hear back from AFIP, re-interview or polygraphs ought to be considered. The only way we solve this now is with a confession.

SUBJECT: Request for Assistance (0031-03-CID899-63493) (CATEGORY I)

1. This office is investigating the death of Mr Dilar DABABA, an Iraqi Local National Detainee. Investigation determined Mr DABABA was in the custody of U.S. Forces in a Battlefield Interrogation Facility (BIF) Annex near Baghdad, Iraq for about 24 hours. During that time, he was placed in a cell and made to undergo both physical and psychological stress, described as sleep deprivation and various forms of physical exercise. Mr DABABA allegedly made several attempts to escape and convince guards to let him go. On one occasion, about 0630, 13 Jun 03, Mr DABABA attempted to grab a guard's weapon and the guard punched Mr DABABA one time in the face, another choked Mr DABABA out and they returned Mr DABABA to his cell. About 12 hours later, at 1830, 13 Jun 03, one of the guards noticed that Mr DABABA appeared to be dead. Lifesaving measures met with negative results and about 1940, Mr DABABA was pronounced dead.

2. Autopsy results determined Mr DABABA died of a closed head injury with a cortical brain contusion and a subdural hemotoma. [REDACTED] opined Mr DABABA could have received the fatal blow up to 48 hours to his death, however, he most likely received it 12 hours prior to death, and he would have presented with signs of a head injury. AFIP stated the lesion on the skull combined with a right occipital (back of head) cortical lesion was consistent with a coup/countercoup injury. There was no skull fracture. The one punch to the head resulted in a 2.5 cm laceration requiring stitches and does appear to be significant enough to cause such a fatal head injury. It is possible Mr DABABA received another blow to the head at an unknown time prior to, during or after his capture.

3. About 1 Jan 05, this case was forwarded to HQ, USACIDC for reassignment to the LNO for SOCOM. On 20 Sep 05, the file was returned to Iraq with a Detainee Assessment Task Force review. The Special Agent in Charge and the Battalion Operations Officer determined re-interviews of key personnel were necessary, as well as offering polygraph examinations to determine the truthfulness of their statements.

[REDACTED] was the Sergeant of the Guard during the hours of 0030 - 0630 and spent most of his time in the Annex where Mr DABABA was. [REDACTED] also relocated personnel to Mr DABABA's area during the shift to give them experience. [REDACTED] "stressed" Mr DABABA from 0300-0400. [REDACTED] made an "MRE Tabasco sauce stink bomb" and placed it in Mr DABABA's cell. [REDACTED] may have been at the Annex prior to his shift and remained there after the incident to make a statement. [REDACTED] was titled in a Status for Dereliction of Duty for the stink bomb. [REDACTED] was not present when the guard punched Mr DABABA but was there shortly after. There is insufficient evidence to prove the single punch by [REDACTED] caused the death of Mr DABABA. [REDACTED]

This seems to have been a continual in-fight between CID Iraq, CID SOCOM and this headquarters, and all that we (HQ) want to do is to review the cases to determine who should investigate them.

CID Iraq has been wrong in the past, and may apparently be still wrong today in trying to do Final/Referred ROIs. There is NO provision in CIDR 195-1 to Final(C)/Refer an ROI from one CID unit to another CID unit. CIDR 195-1 says that you may only refer an ROI outside of CID (like to NCIS or FBI or IRS)

CIDR 195-1 says that if a CID unit wants to transfer an ROI from its control to another CID unit, they have to do a Control Transfer ROI (which is what Iraq CID did not do when it sent case 0055 to Carlisle to become Carlisle's case 0065). CIDR 195-1 says that to control transfer a case from one CID unit to another, both the sending and receiving CID units have to agree to the transfer. That is not the situation here. Iraq CID wants to send and SOCOM CID says it is not theirs, and they do not want to receive. CIDR 195-1 says that when the two field elements can not agree on a control transfer, then it is raised up the chain of command to either the Bn or Gp or Cmd level. Since SOCOM CID has no Bn or Gp over it, the disagreement must be our own regulation be resolved by HQ CID (specifically, the DCSOPS).

It is impossible for us here at HQ to make a decision as to which office, if any, should get the control transferred ROIs, or if the cases should stay in theater for completion, UNLESS we see the cases and what documents/files are in them to make a good, informed judgement as to who is going to end up with these cases. Seemingly, we have continually asked for these cases, documents, exhibits, etc (or copies thereof) be sent to us so that we can review them and make an intelligent decision.

It is our understanding at HQ, that Iraq CID has had these 20-some odd cases sitting around in limbo since about January 2005, with apparently no investigative work being done on any of them, apparently not even draft Final reports on some of them by latest rumor. We have asked that they (or copies) be sent to us expeditiously for review. HQ even arranged to have them shipped back via an SF flight from Baghdad to Ft Bragg at one point, but Iraq CID had concerns and did not ship them. CID personnel have returned from Iraq to CONUS since then, but neither the cases nor copies have accompanied them.

We do not need draft finals in the cases to review them, as long as we have all relevant info, papers, documents, initials, statuses, etc in a case file. We do not need the originals, copies of all will do. Unless and until these cases are blessed off on as being authorized to transfer to another CID element, they remain the full responsibility of Iraq CID and 3d MP Gp.

Request you direct the 11th MP Bn (CID), to send either originals or copies of all case files, notes, papers, documents, initials, statuses, photos, etc to this HQ by the most expeditious means possible so that they might be reviewed and a determination made as to which CID element will be responsible for completing the investigations.

Sir - If this needs to be put in a FRAGO, please advise and I'll get MAJ [redacted] to get one out.

1. On 16 Jun 03, this office was notified by the 10th MP Det (CID), BIAP, IRAQ, of a request by CENTCOM to conduct an independent investigation into the death of a prisoner being held at TF-20, Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), Baghdad, Iraq.
2. On 16 Jun 03 this office was notified that Mr. Dilar DABABA (aka Hassin), Iraqi, civilian, (NFI) died while in the custody of US Forces at BIAP.

Preliminary investigation revealed Mr. DABABA was placed in an interrogation center and made to undergo both physical and psychological stress, described as sleep deprivation and various forms of physical exercise. During this time Mr. DABABA also made a number of attempts to escape, struggling with guards and at one point attempting to grab a hold of a guards' weapon. The guard responded by slinging his weapon over his back, and utilizing less than deadly force by pushing Mr. DABABA up against a wall. Mr. DABABA again rushed the guard and was subsequently punched from behind by a guard utilizing his closed left hand causing a cut on Mr. DABABA's forehead. Approximately 12 hours after the escape attempt Mr. DABABA collapsed from an apparent heart attack. About 1830Z, 13 Jun 03, medics were summoned due to Mr. DABABA's unresponsiveness. Subsequent attempts to revive Mr. DABABA were unsuccessful. Preliminary autopsy results have determined the cause of death to be a closed head injury. All of the guards on duty at the time of the detainees' death were not interviewed nor were they retained in Baghdad until interviewed by CID.

During administrative review of witness statements additional possible witnesses were identified.

Due to the sensitive nature of this incident contact must first be made with S-2 Section, 2nd Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment, Ft Lewis, WA, and the assigned agent read on for this investigation and information prior to any contact with, or statements being obtained from the individuals to be interviewed.

3. Request your office locate, fully identify and conduct a witness / victim interview of [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] concerning their knowledge of the detainees actions and state of mind prior to his death. Specifically determine the detainees' state of agitation, lethargy, and aggressiveness or lack thereof. It is also important to determine if the detainee complained of any physical ailments such as nausea, dizziness or headache. Any or all of these symptoms may be evidence of a possible brain injury. Further determine if the detainee had to be further restrained by any of the guards during their particular shift or if they have knowledge of any maltreatment

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above and beyond the authorized psychological and physical stress which was applied prior to continued interviews and interrogation. If any of the identified individuals are no longer in your area attempt to determine his current location and advise this office accordingly.

4. Request you provide this office with the appropriate man-hours expended, along with any .0015 funds expended and any Privacy Act Disclosures made with your Final Information Report.

1. This office in conducting an investigation into the death of an Iraqi Detainee by the name of Dilar DABABA (NFI) on 13 Jun 2003. The victim was in the custody of US Forces at the time of his death. While in custody he attempted to escape on a number of occasions and had to be subdued, in one incident, after attempting to grab a guards weapon he was stuck in the head once with a closed fist. During a 15-6 investigation it was further determined one of the guards had concocted a noxious gas by mixing the hot sauce from an MRE into the heater packet, creating an "MRE Bomb" this device was then thrown into the cell of DABABA for harassment. Approximately 12 hours after the escape attempt in which DABABA was punched by the guard, DABABA collapsed from an apparent heart attack. His death prompted the 15-6 investigation which focused on the MRE Bomb incident as a possible aggravating factor in the detainee death. A subsequent autopsy has determined the cause of death to be a subdural hematoma situated to the right rear medial side of the brain. Unfortunately due to the focus of the 15-6 investigation all of the guards on duty at the time of the detainees death were not interviewed nor were they retained in Baghdad until interviewed by CID. The following service members redeployed due to their units assumption the MRE Bomb incident would be the focus of the CID investigation.

2. Due to the sensitive nature of this incident contact must first be made with S-2 Section, 2nd Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment, Ft Lewis, WA, prior to any contact with or statements being obtained from the subjects of these interviews.

3. Please locate, fully identify, interview and obtain written statements from the following individuals concerning their knowledge of the detainees actions and state of mind prior to his death, specifically, was he agitated, lethargic, calm, or aggressive. It is also important to determine if the detainee complained of any physical ailments such a nausea. Any or all of these symptoms may be evidence of a brain injury. Further determine if the detainee had to be further restrained by any of the guards during their particular shift or if they have knowledge of any maltreatment above and beyond the authorized psychological and physical stress which was applied prior to continued interviews and interrogation. Any admissions to striking the victim would require the individual be advised of his rights.

Ok, I spoke to her regarding your questions. Since she won't respond to the email for whatever reason, I took notes.

1. She said a neurosurgeon or ER doc, could better answer this. Neuropathology at AFIP said the injuries happened within 48 hours prior. It would do for us to second guess them, but in her opinion, the injuries happened within 12 hours or less. He wouldn't have been acting normal, then just up and died. Someone would have noticed him acting strange, provided they were checking on him.. He would have shown some symptoms of a head injury - vomiting, disorientation, lethargic.

2. One broken rib hurts bad. Several hurts real bad. I don't recall how many he had. Ask anyone that's played football (certainly not me), but one busted rib is noticeable. You'll hold you side and wince. When your lungs expand, it forces the chest wall out, which causes the busted drib to flex, which hurts like hell.

She mentioned if the lawyers are looking for her to say something specific about the injuries, have them get in touch with her, and she'll discuss it. I would recommend having them email her due to response time.

Some questions on this one done by Dr. [redacted]

1- This guy had coup/counter-coup injuries. Based on the histo exam of the brain, injuries occurred no more than 48 hours before death. Can we say/make an educated guess as to how quickly after the insult to the brain would this guy have begun to demonstrate symptoms of his head injury?

2- Broken Rib- How likely is it that this injury would've caused symptoms like difficulty breathing to the extent that it would have been noticeable to anyone around the victim?

3- One of the guards admits to punching the victim in the area of the head lac about 0600 the morning the victim died. The victim dies about 1800, twelve hours later. Is this time of death consistent with the reported blow to the head. Is the severity of the injury consistent with a blow to the head by a fist? Rifle buttstroke? By the way, we have a doctor's statement and treatment record to support the time the injury was inflicted. Unless the doc is lying. I mention this because it wouldn't be the first time a unit/chain of command conspired to hinder an investigation.

My focus is this. I seem to remember in the child abuse class we had that children who suffer serious brain injury manifest symptoms pretty quickly after the injury. The training suggested that investigators could use this to help narrow down the pool of suspects. Anyone who describes the child's onset of symptoms was probably around at or very near the time the injury was inflicted. If I am remembering this correctly, can the same time line be applied to an adult? If so, is the injury suffered by this victim sufficiently severe to manifest symptoms very quickly. If so, how quickly? None of the guards describe any type of symptoms at the time of the blow to the head at 0600. Nor does the doc.

Reading the statements, there appears to be an appropriate level of detail about the events prior to death. But at the time of death, details become sketchy, ie we were there, we looked, he was dead. Makes me a little suspicious. I'm wondering if the head injury was inflicted at or near the time of death, and not 12 hours prior to death as is claimed in the statements? This would require a conspiracy on the part of several (8-10) people. While not impossible to maintain the story, it is hard to keep it all straight, and not have someone give up the truth.

On a related note, [redacted] is the one who places the MRE/Tobasco Bomb in the cell with the victim, and is there with [redacted] when the victim is found dead. [redacted] and [redacted] describe how they would stress the victim throughout their guard shift, but near the time of death, they left him alone. Sounds a little convenient.

Anyway, you get the picture. Can you get with Dr. [redacted] and run the medical questions down? If we can determine the injuries were more likely inflicted near the time of death and not 12 hours prior, then we can narrow the pool of suspects down by quite a bit.

The 15-6 concludes that at least 3 enlisted soldiers are guilty of detainee abuse related crime. If [REDACTED] mentioned in the 15-6 is in fact [REDACTED] then we already know he was identified as trouble by the Taguba report, and Taguba said he lied and went about "setting conditions" for interrogations. And, it is appearing highly likely that [REDACTED] was also present in Afghanistan and involved in some way with the CIA contract employee who assaulted and most likely killed a detainee at Asadabad Fire Base (0094-03-CID369). According the 15-6, [REDACTED] is the last guy seen with Dababa before he dies.
