My knowledge of this incident began around the second week of Jul04, here at Camp Al-Qaim. On that occasion, we were receiving an Iraqi citizen who was disembarking a UH-60 (Blackhawk) helicopter on a medical litter sometime around dusk to early evening. While receiving that patient, I observed the patient of the patient as he was preparing his camera at the time. I'm not too sure but I believe the patient was being search is when I observed the patient from the helicopter. As the patient was being search is when I observed the patient of the patient of the camera away and explained to him that it was not appropriate to take pictures of the detainee patients. I believed the situation to have been taken care of and didn't think anything else of the matter.

About a week later at night, I was in the treatment tent and observed with a video camera filming some of the detainee patients we had at the time. I approached and began to verbally counsel him for his videotaping and that he should not, again, take any pictures of the detainees. I instructed him to erase the images that he had just taped and I stood there while watching him erase it. He did this by recording over the images while he aimed the camera at the walls and floors of the tent. As I counseled I had USMC. standing there with me. I informed the two that the next time this occurred it would result in a "charge-sheet". The next day, we had our normal formation and I took the opportunity to remind everyone that there is not to be any photo taking of the detainee patients for any reason. In the past, we have been informed that we could take photographs of the U.S. military patients who wish to have photographic documentation of their injuries and we could photograph patients to assist with identification of those who had none. I didn't want there to be any confusion and I made sure to inform the personnel that there is not to be any photograph taking of any detainee. Due to different duty assignments, I cannot say for sure that , USMC, was in the formation or was in the formation. Around 2130-2200, 09Aug04, we received an Iraqi citizen patient who I do not know the identity because we rarely have the identification of the Iraqi patients. He had a lower back injury that was suspected to be shrapnel but turned out to be a bullet wound. During treatment, which is the duty of being the primary guard. Once they are recovering, we move into a "watch bill". We wanted to give security a real high priority because we understood that particular patient as being injured by counter-battery fire due to him allegedly firing mortars in a local surrounding area. It was determined a couple of days later that he was actually shot by somebody.

As soon as noticed that I seen the camera, he reached down and picked it up. At that time, I seized the camera from him. Although I did not asked his permission, I believed he would have deleted any pictures he had taken if he had the chance. I believed that due to his past track record of taking pictures and my informing him that he was going to get a "charge sheet" the next time he took pictures of a detainee. I knew that if there were any incriminating pictures on the camera, I had to protect them so he could not delete them. Although I was standing in front of I began to look around the room and made eve contact with the others present to include them with the counseling. Also present was JSN, and USN. I then exited the tent with the camera. At one point in time, I remember entering the tent but I do not recall if he entered at the time I did or, the time I was counseling the group.

After exiting the tent, I stood there for a moment to calm down and then went to my

After viewing the images, I realized that the situation was much bigger and that would, also, be included in the "charge sheet". Initially, I was going to request charges for dereliction of duty and disobeying an order but it has, obviously, grown much larger.

do not recall if the patient was awake while I was in the tent and the images on the camera were too small for me to notice his eyes but his face is plainly on the images. I did not download any images from the camera and maintained it in my custody until I released it to USMC, CSSG-15, who escorted and is back to Camp Al-Taqaddum, IZ. I maintained a chain of custody and had sign for the camera on 11Aug04. While in my custody, the camera was in my cargo pocket unless I was in my living quarters, which has no identify markings. While in my living quarters, I was there, as well, and it was locked in my wall locker. Beau of the paneles questioning, both Magnes were advised of their rights in I do not knowlif the detainee patient was aware of the photographs being taken but I do know that he had strong doses of morphine as a result of his injuries. To the best of my knowledge, the patient was transferred out that night as a mater of routine.

My parent command is Naval Medical Center San Diego, CA.

My direct knowledge of and bosing in pictures while aiming their weapons at detainee patients comes from some events that took place during the evening of 09Aug04. Sometime around 2200, on 09Aug04, we received an Iraqi Enemy Prisoner of War (EPW) with a wound to his right flank meaning his right lower back area. I was not involved in his actual treatment but I did observe while doing the documentation for his treatment. Later that night around midnight, I was walking by the treatment tent where he was recovering. I noticed a bright flash shining from around the cracks of the tent zipper door. I stepped inside for a moment and saw placing his rifle over his should like he was putting it to "sling arms". As the detainee was laying on a litter in the center of the room with ms head towards the door and his feet away from the door, and was to the left of the detainee. Also, and were in the tent as well. They were standing to the right of the detainee near his feet. I believe they were doing treatment care to the detainee. I remember asking aloud if everything was "OK" and the group generally nodded in the affirmative and, I think, said, "Yes". I stepped back outside of the tent and zipped the door shut. I waited a couple of seconds and saw about three to four more flashes of light. I believe all the flashes I saw were from a camera but I did not see a camera for the brief moments I was in the tent's door opening

After seeing the flashes, I immediately went to the tent next door and found our fractions, and told him, "I think our Marines are taking pictures of the EPW". Immediately got up and went to the treatment tent. I then went and sat down at a lounge area just outside of the treatment tent; which was about fifteen to twenty feet away. I heard work was saying, I do voice yelling from inside the tent. Although I could not understand much of what he was saying, I do recall hearing him say something to the effect of, "now give me that camera". I wanted to stay in the area just in case I was needed for anything. The next day, 10Aug04, I provided a typed statement as to what I observed.

Tam a Corpsman assigned to the Shock Trauma Platoon-4, Camp Al-Qaim, IZ. Around 2230, on the night of 09Aug04, I was performing duties as a litter bearer when we received a wounded Iraqi citizen. We set the litter and patient on the ground in front of the vehicle headlights so, he could be searched before we carried him into the resuscitation/treatment tent. Once we carried him into the tent, the doctors began to evaluate his injuries and determined that the patient needed to go to an Alpha Surgical Company for X-Rays and surgery. The doctors put bandages on the patient. I was assigned to stay with the patient from 2300-2400 and get him prepared for a medivac flight to Al-Asad IZ.

At one point in time, I remember and the second was attempting to get the last set of vital signs for the patient the "pro-paq" had been shut down. I remember what the vital signs were so, I walked over and provided them to him. As the patient lay on his back on the litter with his to the head pointing towards the main tent door and his feet towards the opposing end, was standing to the right hand side of the patient's feet. I was standing to at the end of the litter at the patient's feet. I then returned to preparing the patient for the flight. Part of that preparation involved the need to use the litter straps to secure the patient to the liter. The straps on that particular litter were missing so, I decided to get a roll of gauze, called a "Kerlix roll", from a medical supply can, called a AMAL can, and use that as a strap. After getting the Kerlix roll, I returned to the patient's left hand side at about his waist area and was still at the patient's right side of his feet area. moved up towards the left side area of the patient's head. Although I would like to have souvenirs, I don't want to jeopardize my career for a picture After talking with Special Agent **and the problems** that these kind actions can cause but I don't understand why and I are getting in trouble. I know may have violated an order if he was told not to take any more photographs but people need to understand that taking these kind of photographs are very common at the STP and it is excepted by everyone. As an example, I was taking a videotape of a couple of 7-ton trucks loaded with EPW's. I remember telling me something like, "I don't think you should be taping that because they might not like it". After the convoy left, USMC, told me, "Well, now that you got away with it, I would like a copy". Anyone should be able to hear the conversation on the video because the camera was still recording. About ten minutes later, I was in my living tent and came up to me and gave me his thumb drive. I copied the video for him and gave it back to him I would like to apologize for my actions and say that I will never do anything like that again nor, will I allow myself to be put in a position for that to happen. I had my digital camera with me and I gave it to **Sector Construction**, USN, and asked him to take a picture of me guarding the EPW. My digital camera is a Olympus Stylus 300 digital camera. In the picture, I was pointing my M16 at the EPW. The butt stock of the rifle was in the area of my right shoulder. For some reason, I remember having my weapon in Condition 4 during this picture.
