[redacted] denies having any relationship to the Taliban or Al Qaeda, and specifically denies having taken up arms at any time on behalf of any nation or organization. He hates the Taliban [redacted]

[redacted] He also opposes USAMA BIN LADEN and MULLAH MOHAMMAD OMAR, as he feels they kill innocent people. According to [redacted] ninety percent of the people in Afghanistan opposed BIN LADEN and OMAR. Most Afghans, including himself, want to become part of the world and not be isolated from it and labeled terrorists.

[redacted] does not consider the U.S. an enemy of Islam. He is of the opinion that the U.S. believes in justice, although he feels justice is not being done in his case. [redacted] complained that he is being treated worse by his American jailers than he was when he was jailed by the Taliban.

[redacted] first heard of the terrorist attacks in the U.S. on [redacted] version of Voice of America radio. He initially could not believe it was true. He had no prior knowledge of the attacks and had not heard any rumors of anything about to occur.

If released from U.S. custody, [redacted] wishes to be returned to Afghanistan, if it is a reasonably safe place to which to return.

[redacted] has no intention of taking up arms against the U.S. or participating in jihad.

[redacted] was shown Photo Books #1, 2 and 3 and did not recognize any photographs in any of those books.
