Other than routine administrative support, IA [redacted] provided the military with information regarding FBI interviews and other FBI investigative information as requested.

b7C -1 IA [redacted] was not a member of any interview or interrogation team, did not witness any aggressive interrogation techniques used on detainees, and has no first hand knowledge of any improper techniques being used on detainees. IA [redacted] advised he was not aware of Department of Defense (DOD) policy regarding interrogation techniques, is not aware of any violation of DOD policy, and cannot identify anyone who might be aware of any violation of DOD or FBI/DOJ interview/interrogation policy.
