TREATMENT OF DETAINEES IN GUANTANAMO

- Q: Please update guidance rebutting allegations of the inhumane treatment of the prisoners in Cuba. Do we have a interpretation of the Geneva Convention that allows us to designate the detainees as "unlawful combatants" as opposed to prisoners of war?
- ALL DETAINEES IN THE CONTROL OF THE UNITED STATES
 ARE BEING TREATED HUMANELY. THEY ARE VERY
 DANGEROUS PEOPLE WHO ARE PROPERLY HELD AS
 CRIMINALS PENDING INVESTIGATION AND QUESTIONING TO
 PREVENT FURTHER TERRORIST ACTS.
- THE INTERNATIONAL COMMITTEE FOR THE RED CROSS
 WILL HAVE ACCESS TO THE DETAINEES AT GTMO TODAY TO
 INSPECT CONDITIONS.
- -- THE DETAINEES AT GTMO DO NOT QUALIFY AS PRISONERS
 OF WAR UNDER THE GENEVA CONVENTIONS. THEY ARE
 UNLAWFUL COMBATANTS WHO HAD NO LEGAL RIGHT TO
 ORGANIZE THEMSELVES TOGETHER FOR THE PURPOSE OF
 CONDUCTING HOSTILITIES AGAINST THE UNITED STATES.

- ALL DETAINEES IN THE CONTROL OF THE UNITED STATES
 ARE BEING TREATED HUMANELY.
- -- EACH DAY THE DETAINEES ARE GIVEN THREE CULTURALLY APPROPRIATE MEALS.
- -- THEY HAVE DAILY OPPORTUNITIES TO SHOWER, EXERCISE AND RECEIVE MEDICAL ATTENTION.
- -- WE EXPECT REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE
 INTERNATIONAL COMMITTEE FOR THE RED CROSS TO VISIT
 THEM LATER THIS WEEK.
- -- REFER YOU TO THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE FOR FURTHER INFORMATION.

TREATMENT OF DETAINEES IN GUANTANAMO

Q: Any comment on Amnesty International's report criticizing detentions in Guantanamo Bay?

- -- THE INDIVIDUALS BEING DETAINED AT GUANTANAMO
 ARE BEING TREATED HUMANELY CONSISTENT WITH THE
 PRINCIPLES OF THE GENEVA CONVENTIONS.
- -- EACH DAY THE DETAINEES ARE GIVEN THREE CULTURALLY APPROPRIATE MEALS.
- -- THEY HAVE DAILY OPPORTUNITIES TO SHOWER, EXERCISE AND RECEIVE MEDICAL ATTENTION.
- -- IT IS OF COURSE THE CASE THAT THESE DETAINEES ARE
 VERY DANGEROUS PEOPLE, AND ALL APPRORIATE
 SECURITY PRECAUTIONS ARE BEING TAKEN.
- WE ARE CONTINUING TO INVESTIGATE THE CONNECTION
 BETWEEN THE DETAINEES AND AL QAEDA, AND ARE
