RECOMMENDATION

1	RESOLVED, That the American Bar Association urges the United States government to
2	ensure access by the International Committee of the Red Cross, the U.N. Special
3	Rapporteur on Torture, and independent human rights monitors to all [non-U.S.]
4	detainees held in U. S. custody;
5	
6	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Association urges the government to report in detail
7	[to the U.N. Committee Against Torture], consistent with requirements of the Convention
8	Against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment, on
9	the techniques that the government is using in its interrogations;

1	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Association urges the United States government to
2	ensure that persons acting on its behalf do not engage in interrogation techniques that
3	constitute torture or cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment; and
4	
5	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Association urges the United States not to transfer
6	persons whom it has detained to countries where there is a substantial likelihood that
7	those persons would be in danger of being subjected to torture.
